**MAY 22<sup>nd</sup> ROCHESTER (28-20) at WORCESTER (23-23) 6:05 pm**

Rochester Red Wings RHP Jack Sinclair (2-0, 4.91) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Jack Anderson (0-1, 10.38)

**Back Where We Started** – The Worcester Red Sox (at 23-23 on the year) look to avoid falling below .500 for only the second time all season (and the first since March 29) and get in the win column in this series for the first time when they face the Rochester Red Wings (AAA-Washington) in game four of their 6-game set tonight at 6:05 pm on Star Wars Night at Polar Park (with UniBank Fireworks set to Star Wars music following the game). The WooSox have lost 8 of their last 10 games to drop to .500 for the first time since March 31 when they were 2-2. They have been 1-game under only two times all year – after an Opening Day loss and on March 29 at 1-2. Rochester, meanwhile, remains red hot having won 6 straight and 14 of their last 17 games since May 2. Tonight’s game is live on NESN+ and on NASH 98.9 FM.

**What a Difference a Year Makes** – Last season the WooSox won 18 of the 24 meetings with Rochester to post their best-ever season series record against an opponent (18-6). Thus far this season, however, the Red Wings have won the last five meetings in a row and lead the season-series, 6 games to 3. Worcester and Rochester are scheduled to play 24 games against each other this year...the most the WooSox will play against any opponent this season. The teams play another 6-game series in Rochester from June 9-14 and the Wings return to Worcester for another 6-game set from July 7-12 in their final meetings of the year.

**Wings To Go** – The Red Sox and Red Wings are meeting this week/weekend in Worcester for the first time this season. The Wings grabbed two close victories to begin this series (7-6 on Tuesday and 7-2 in 11-innings on Wednesday) and then made it three in a row with a come-from-behind, 9-4 win yesterday afternoon. The clubs split a 6-game series in Rochester from April 28 – May 3. The teams play tonight at 6:05 pm and then over the Memorial Day weekend on Saturday at 4:05 pm and Sunday at 1:05 pm.

**Wings are Unstoppable** – The red hot Rochester Red Wings, winners of 6 straight, 11 of their last 12 games, and a Triple-A best 14-3 since May 2 have surged past the WooSox and into 1<sup>st</sup> place in the International League East division since this past weekend. Worcester, meanwhile, has lost 6 of their last 7 and they are 2-10 in their last 9 games to go from 1<sup>st</sup>-place and +1½ games to a tie for 5<sup>th</sup>-place and -4 GB of front running Rochester. Worcester had been alone or had a share of 1<sup>st</sup> place in the International League East division between April 30 – May 15.

**Series Matters** – Worcester – down 0-3 in this 6-game set vs. Rochester - has a 4-3-1 series record thus far...4 wins, 3 losses, and 1 split. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

**May “Drake Maye” May** – Worcester is 6-11 in May batting .242 this month (137-for-565) with 30 doubles and 18 HR in those 17 games while WooSox pitchers have a 5.01 ERA (83 ER in 149 IP) with 20 HRA. The Sox have been out-scored by their opponents, 90-81 this month. As a gentle reminder, the WooSox will be in Moosic, PA playing the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders on Sunday, May 31<sup>st</sup>, but Polar Park will be hosting the inaugural MayeDay Celebrity Softball Classic, benefitting Drake and Ann Michael Maye’s MayeDay Family Foundation, that evening. Polar Park gates open at 5:00 pm, there will be a HR Derby at 6:00 pm, the game at 7:00 pm, and then fireworks follow. Former Patriot Julian Edelman along with current Pats Christian Gonzalez, Hunter Henry, and Will Campbell along with USA Hockey gold medalist Megan Keller and celebrities Dave Portnoy and Matt Rife are just some of the name folks who will join Drake and Ann Michael for this special charity event at Polar Park. Tickets are selling fast (over 7,500 sold). Fans can visit MayeDay.org for more information.

Is 8 <sup>th</sup> in the International League with his .424 OBP. Leads WooSox with a .350 batting average in 19 road games (21-for-60).
<b>Allan Castro</b>	Has a 3-game hitting streak (5-for-12).
<b>Jason Delay</b>	Has hit safely in 8 of his last 10 games (12-for-38, .316) with 3 2B, 3 RBI, 4 runs scored.
<b>Nate Eaton</b>	Has hit in 6 of his last 7 games (9-for-28, .321) and in his last 22 games is 27-for-89, .303 with 6 2B, 2 3B, 3 HR, 12 RBI, and 12 runs scored.

<b>Tayron Guerrero</b>	Promoted to Boston today. In 15 relief appearances with the WooSox he had allowed 2 runs in 19.2 IP. In 6 RA at home did not allowed a run – 9.2 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 10 SO.
<b>Tommy Kahnle</b>	In his last 10 relief appearances he has gone 1 scoreless inning in each – 10 IP, 7 H, 0 R, 5 BB, 12 SO. In 10 RA at home has a 0.87 ERA – 10.1 IP, 10 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 6 BB, 12 SO.

**Six Pack** – The Sox (currently 23-23) have been a season-high 6-games over .500 four different times this season...April 10 (9-3) & April 12 (10-4) and May 2 (18-12) & May 8 (21-15). They were a season-low 1-game under on March 27 (0-1) & March 29 (1-2).

**Winners at Home but Not Away** - The WooSox are 12-11 at home at Polar Park compared to 11-12 on the road.

**Homer Happy** – The WooSox are 16-6 when they homer in a game this season.

**Season Series vs. Rochester** – Rochester leads, 6 games to 3. The WooSox and Red Wings split a 6-game series in Rochester from April 28 – May 3. The Wings rolled in the opener, 10-1, but then after a rainout on April 29, the Sox rattled off three straight victories including both games of the make-up doubleheader on April 30 by scores of 4-3 & 7-3 and rallied to win the next night, 10-5. Rochester came back to gain the split with, 7-5 and 6-3 victories over the weekend of May 2 & 3. The Wings have won each of the first three games here at Polar Park this week...7-6 on Tuesday, 7-2 in 11-innings on Wednesday, and 9-4 on Thursday.

**Stats vs. Rochester This Season** – WooSox batters are hitting .237 vs. Rochester in the first 9 games of the season series (70-for-295) with 8 HR & 42 runs scored while Sox pitchers are 3-6 with a 6.39 ERA (54 ER in 76 IP) with 13 HRA and 57 runs allowed.

**Best Wings Ever** - Worcester posted their best record in their history against any International League opponent in a single season last year vs. Rochester going 18-6 vs. the Red Wings (8-4 in Rochester and 10-2 at home at Polar Park) for a .750 winning pct. In 2024, the WooSox went 16-7 vs. Lehigh Valley and that .696 winning pct. was their best against any IL foe (of more than six games) since they came into existence in 2021 before last year's dominance of the Red Wings. During their inaugural 2021 Covid-impacted season, the WooSox only faced five different opponents all year and they had their most success against Lehigh Valley going 22-13 (.629).

**Earning Their Flowers** - Worcester has won 20 of their last 29 games in Rochester and they are 35-15 there since the latter stages of the 2021 season. The WooSox are 36-20 all-time in Rochester which is affectionately known as the Flower City.

**Worcester/Pawtucket vs. Rochester**– Worcester leads Rochester in the all-time series (since 2021) with 66 victories compared to 52 for the Wings. Worcester is 30-32 all-time vs. the Wings at Polar Park while the WooSox are 36-20 in Rochester. Furthermore, Worcester/Pawtucket is up on Rochester, 390-375 in the remarkably close last 46½ years of facing each other since 1979.

**All Good Things Come to an End** – Saturday May 9<sup>th</sup> marked the first home postponement (now cancellation) at Polar Park this season after the WooSox were able to successfully play each of their first 19 scheduled home games between March 27 – May 8. That marked their longest stretch to open a season without a home postponement since their inaugural 2021 campaign. Due to Covid-restrictions that year, the WooSox had to wait to open Polar Park until May 11, 2021 and it took until their 28<sup>th</sup> home game before they finally had a home game postponed (July 2 vs. Scranton/WB). In 2022 the Sox had their third home game postponed due to rain and in both 2024 & 2025 the WooSox had their second home games each year postponed due to inclement weather. To open the 2023 season the Sox were able to play their first 16 scheduled Polar Park games until a rainout on May 3, 2023 vs. Buffalo.

**An Enjoyable April** – After going 2-2 to begin the season from March 27-31, Worcester posted a winning April going 15-10. The Sox finished April alone in 1<sup>st</sup>-place in the International League East Division. Last year on April 30<sup>th</sup> the WooSox were 14-14, tied for 4<sup>th</sup>-place in the division and already 6½ games behind. The 15 wins this April equal the most Worcester won in any month last season when they went 15-10 in June and 15-13 in August.

**April Stats Leaders** – As a club the WooSox batted .252 in April with 19 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.63 ERA with 24 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents during the month, 127-122. Vinny Capra led the Sox in average in April hitting .322 in 18 games with 7 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, and a team-high 18 runs scored. Matt Thaiss (.324 in 11 games with 2 HR & 11 RBI), Nate Eaton (.301 in 23 games with 5 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR & 10 RBI), and Kristian Campbell (.294 in 23 games) all enjoyed fine Aprils. Leading pitchers during the month were Payton Tolle (2-0, 0.82 in 2 GS) and Jake Bennett (2-0, 1.00 in 4 GS) – although both are currently or reportedly in Boston – while Tayron Guerrero was the best out the bullpen posting a 1.13 ERA in 7 relief appearances with 2 saves.

**Low Five After a High Five** – The WooSox had a season-high 5-game losing streak from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). It was their first 5-game losing skid since April 25-30 of last year. Prior to going to Nashville, the Sox had not dropped back-to-back games all season (they went their first 15 games before losing two in a row in Nashville on April 14 & 15). Worcester had a season-best 5-game winning streak from March 31 – April 5 all in St. Paul, Minnesota.

**A Winning Tradition** – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under former manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

**How the WooSox Have Won** - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

**Fun Fact** – Of the 287 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their 5+-year history (up to today), a total of 211 of them have played in the Major Leagues (73%) including 142 with the Boston Red Sox (50%).

**Portland Sea Dogs Update** – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs (20-21) edged Reading, 1-0 yesterday thanks to three pitchers who combined to strike out 20 (not so) Fightin' Phils. Blake Wehunt (1-2) was the starter and winner – 5 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 11 SO. Patrick Halligan followed and went 2 innings with 6 strikeouts (all 6 of his outs). Cooper Adams earned SV #3 chalking up 3 more punchouts in his 2 scoreless innings. The Sea Dogs scored the game's only run in the 3<sup>rd</sup> inning on an RBI groundout by Nate Baez.

**WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES** – The Boston Red Sox announced this morning that they have selected RHP **Tayron Guerrero** from Worcester and optioned RHP **Zack Kelly** to Worcester. Kelly has not yet been added to the WooSox roster as of early this afternoon.

Guerrero, 35, has recorded a 0.92 ERA (2 ER/19.2 IP), 0.97 WHIP and .191 opponent batting average (13-for-68) in 15 games with Worcester this season. Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Diego Padres in 2010, the right-hander owns a 5.77 ERA (68 ER/106.0 IP) with 111 strikeouts in 113 career Major League games with the Padres (2016) and the Miami Marlins (2018-19). The Colombia native was signed by the Red Sox as a minor league free agent on January 9, 2026, and posted a 0.96 ERA (1 ER/9.1 IP) with four saves in nine Grapefruit League appearances for Boston during Spring Training.

Kelly, 31, has pitched in 17 games for Boston this season, posting a 3.31 ERA (6 ER/16.1 IP) with 14 strikeouts. The right-hander has also pitched in two games for Worcester, striking out two and allowing one hit in 3.0 scoreless innings. Signed by the Red Sox as a minor league free agent in January 2021, the Virginia native owns a 4.04 ERA (59 ER/131.1 IP) in 115 career Major League games (three starts), all with Boston (2022-26).

Worcester has made at least one player move during 33 of the last 46 days (including today) between April 7 – May 22 for a total of 62 moves during that stretch. The WooSox have not gone three consecutive days without a player transaction since the first four days after the season-opener (March 28-31).

The WooSox have used a total of 43 players already this season (28 pitchers and 15 position players). Catcher Juan Montero would add to that number if/when he makes his WooSox debut.

Furthermore, 12 different WooSox players have been promoted directly from Worcester to Boston this season (not counting rehabbers). The lucky list: RHP Zack Kelly, RHP Tyler Uberstine, LHP Tyler Samaniego (twice), RHP Jack Anderson (twice), LHP Eduardo Rivera, LHP Payton Tolle, OF Nate Eaton, LHP Jake Bennett, LHP Alec Gamboa, C/INF Mickey Gasper, INF Nick Sogard, and RHP Tayron Guerrero. In addition, the WooSox had their manager, Chad Tracy and hitting coach, Collin Hetzler both promoted to Boston for those same roles with the Red Sox on April 26.

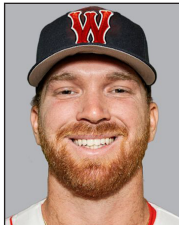
