#### **ROUND ROCK EXPRESS (15-15) AT ALBUQUERQUE ISOTOPES (9-22)**

Saturday, May 4, 2024 • 6:35 p.m. (MT) • RGCU Field at Isotopes Park • Albuquerque, NM Game #32, Home Game #20

#### RHP Gerson Garabito (0-2, 5.00) vs. LHP Josh Rogers (1-1, 5.82)

**TODAY'S GAME**: The Isotopes need to win the final two games of the series to avoid their fifth series loss of the year ... Round Rock has won 11 of the last 12 meetings between the clubs ... Josh Rogers is slated to take the rubber for Albuquerque while Gerson garabito is scheduled to start for the Express.

AIN'T LIFE GRAND?: Karl Kauffmann allowed a grand slam in the first frame to the Express' Trevor Hauver yesterday, the fifth slam relented on the year, most in Triple-A (six tied with two). It's the first slam permitted since Sugar Land's Pedro Leon completed the feat April 13.

**DOUBLE TROUBLE**: The Isotopes allowed double-digit runs for the 11th time this year, first since relenting 21 vs. OKC April 25 (six games). The 13 runs permitted tied for the 6th-most in 2024.

**TWO HOMER GAME**: Sam Huff's two homer game yesterday is the fifth by an opposing player and second of the series (last: Derek Hill April 30 vs. Round Rock).

**MARGINS**: The 12-run loss is tied for the second-largest margin in defeat of the season with the 21-9 defeat April 25 vs. OKC (largest: 14, April 12 vs. Sugar Land, 16-2).

**FIRST FRAME**: In the first inning yesterday, Kauffmann surrendered five runs, tied for the most tallies allowed in the opening frame in 2024 (also: April 7 at Oklahoma City).

**XBH**: Offensively, the Isotopes were limited to one extra-base hit (Romo's second inning double) yesterday, tied for a season low (three times). The pitching staff, however, allowed eight extrabase hits (three homers and five doubles), the seventh time the club has yielded eight-plus extra-base hits in a contest this year, two off the season-high (twice).

**ONE TALLY**: Albuquerque was limited to one run last night for the second time this year, a season low (also: April 5 at OKC).

**THREE-BAGGERS**: Sam Hilliard and Grant Lavigne each tripled Thursday, giving Albuquerque 16 for the season, the most in MiLB. It was the Isotopes fourth contest with multiple three-baggers in 2024, and first since April 4 at Oklahoma City (two). They've tallied a triple in 11 of 31 games.

**BASES JUICED:** Albuquerque drew their sixth bases-loaded walk of the season yesterday, tied for third-most in the Pacific Coast League (most: Sugar Land, 10).

**ERROR 404**: The Isotopes have committed an error in 10 of their last 11 contests.

HITTING STREAKS: Drew Romo extended his hit streak to 18-games—the longest active streak in Minor League Baseball—with his third three hit game of the season. It's also tied for the longest streak in Minor League Baseball this season (also: 18, Andy Perez, Single-A Fresno, April 5-27). Additionally, it's the longest hit streak for an Isotope since Rio Ruiz' 18-gamer June 10-July 2, 2021 (next: Daniel Castro, 24, April 6-June 7, 2018).

TONY: Drew Romo is three games away from tying a career-high hitting streak (21) set in 2021 with Low-A Fresno ... During the current streak he is slashing .459/.461/.649 with nine doubles, one triple, one homer and 14 RBI ... Has an extra-base hit in five-straight. Additionally, has seven hits over his last eight at-bats.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk finished 3-for-5 Thurday, his second three-hit game in his last five contests. Schunk has compiled a .357/.410/.529 slash line with nine doubles, a home run and 15 RBI in 17 games dating back to April 10, raising his season average from .086 to .267 during the span.

**TAKE FLIGHT**: Jimmy Herron has a hit in 18 of 19 games played in 2024 with two multi-hit contests ... Dating back to June 25, 2023, Herron has reached base in 63 of his last 69 ballgames.

**ON-BASE STREAK**: Jimmy Herron tallied a hit and two walks to extend his on-base streak to 19, every game he's played in 2024. His on-base streak is tied for the second-longest active streak in Triple-A (longest: 20, Mike Ford, Louisville).

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes tallied his 12th multi-hit contest of the year and his fifth in his last eight games yesterday. He has a hit in seven of those games and is 13x32 with two doubles, a triple, two homers and five RBI.

**HOME RUN KING**: Sam Hilliard did not tally a hit for the first time in five games. He has just one stretch of multiple games without a knock (three, April 16-18 at El Paso).

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 1st in average (.389) and T-3rd in doubles (10) ... Aaron Schunk is T-3rd in doubles (10) ... Coco Montes is 1st in OBP (.442) and 6th in walks (22) ... Sam Hilliard is 4th in OPS (1.002), T-4th in runs (25), T-5th in hits (35), T-6th in stolen bases (8), 8th in slugging (.610), 9th in OBP (.415) and T-9th in XBH (15) ... Julio Carreras is T-5th in triples (3).

ROUND ROCK TIES: Jesus Tinoco pitched in 65 games for the Isotopes between 2019-21. Express bench coach Chase Lambin spent the entire 2008 season with Albuquerque, was teammates with Isotopes coaches Chris Michalak and Michael Ryan.

#### **NUCLEI NOTES**

**SKIPPER**: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**HOMETOWN KID:** Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

**BALLS AND STRIKES**: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- Designated for assignment by Washington on Aug. 2, 2022, elected free agency
- Signed a Minor League contract with Miami on Aug. 10, 2022 and finished the campaign at Triple-A Jacksonville
- Played for the Bourne Braves of the Cape Cod League in 2014 and 2015
- 2014 and 2015 NCAA Louisville Regional All-Tournament Team
- 2015 All-ACC Second Team
