RHP ANTHONY MOLINA (0-4, 9.17) vs. RHP Casey Kelly (0-1, 5.65)

TODAY'S GAME: Reno holds a 3-0 series lead after the Aces won 8-4 yesterday afternoon ... Reno has won seven-straight games over the Isotopes ... Anthony Molina is slated to take the hill for the Isotopes while Casey Kelly is expected to start for the Aces.

LOSING STREAK: Albuquerque has lost four-straight games, tied for the longest losing streak of the season (also: April 24-27).

@ RNO: The Isotopes have lost seven-straight games in Reno, the second-longest losing streak at Greater Nevada Field in team history (longest: 12, June 22, 2021-September 21, 2024) ... Albuquerque has lost 23 of their last 27 games in Reno.

FIRST THREE: Albuquerque has lost the opening three games of a series for the first time since dropping the first five in Reno from September 17-21, 2024, which is also the club's last five-game losing streak.

QUALITY: The Aces' Tommy Henry spun 6.0 innings of two-run ball yesterday, the seventh quality start by an opposing hurler this season and Henry's second (also: April 27 at Reno). It's also the fifth quality start by an opponent in May ... Henry is the third pitcher in the last two years to toss two quality starts against the Isotopes in the same season (also: Tacoma's Blas Castano and Rouk's Adrian Sampson).

RISP: Albuquerque went 1-for-10 with runners in scoring position Thursday, and have gone 6-for-31 over the first three games of the set

THREE BAGGERS: Albuquerque has connected on a triple in six-straight games for the first time since a seven-game stretch from August 2-9, 2021.

HOMERS ALLOWED: Albuquerque has allowed a homer in nine-straight contests, the longest stretch since July 13-August 6, 2024, an 18-game streak.

GRAND SLAM: Reno's A.J. Vukovich belted a grand slam in the fourth inning yesterday, the second relented by the Isotopes in 2025 (also: Collin Price, at Sugar Land April 13.

UNDER .500: The Isotopes are nine games below .500, the furthest the club has been under .500 in 2025.

GIDP: Over the Isotopes last seven games, the club has grounded into a doubleplay in six contests, totalling nine during the stretch ... Albuquerque grounded into a season-high three doubleplays on May 15 vs. Tacoma.

RIT: Ryan Ritter went 2-for-4 Thursday with his ninth homer of the year, an RBI and a walk. Has five homers in May ... Has an extrabase hit in seven-straight games, tied for the second-longest streak in Isotopes history (eight times; last: Sean Bouchard, May 16-23, 2024). During that stretch, is slashing .516/.571/1.065 with seven doubles, two triples, two homers and 10 RBI.

-Has a double in five-straight games for the first time in his career. ... Has 13-game on base streak and eight-game hit streak.

KESTDADDY: Keston Hiura has an eight-game hitting streak, tied for the sixth-longest active streak in PCL. During stretch is slashing .367/.472/.567 with three doubles, one homer and eight RBI ... Has eight RBI in his last five games.

-Hiura has a hit in 14 of 15 games played in May ... During the month, is slashing .351/.431/.596 with a triple, three doubles, three homers and 12 RBI after hitting .141 over first 24 games ... Has 15-game on-base streak, fourth-longest active streak in PCL.

WARMING UP: Warming Bernabel has a hit in six of his last seven contests. Is 11-for-30 with two doubles, one homer and four RBI during stretch.

YF: Yanquiel Fernandez collected a single Thursday to extend his hit streak to five games. During the stretch is slashing .450/.522/.600 with three doubles and two RBI.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard has reached base in 34 of 35 games started on the year ... Has an RBI in six-straight games for first time since a seven-gamer from April 18-27, 2019, with ABQ.

IT'S DREW: Drew Romo went 1-for-4 Wednesday with two strikeouts in his first game with Albuquerque since Aug. 13, 2024, at Round Rock (placed on IL to begin 2025 season ... Also threw out Kaiser in his first caught stealing attempt of the season.

MR. BRUIN: Sean Bouchard singled yesterday and has a hit in three-straight games and four of his first five contests with Albuquerque. Has reached base in 12 of 24 plate appearances with the Isotopes in 2025.

MLB REHAB: Rockies infielder Thairo Estrada is expected to begin a rehab assignment (fractured right wrist in spring training).

PCL LEADERBOARD: Ryan Ritter is 4th in runs scored (35), 5th in total bases (85) and OPS (.939), 6th in XBH (21), 7th in walks (30), 9th in OBP (.404) and 10th in slugging (.535) ... Sam Hilliard is T-1st in triples (5), T-7th in XBH (20) and 7th in slugging (.543) ... Warming Bernabel is T-9th in doubles (12).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

AARON MUNOZ: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
