ABOUT LAST NIGHT...

The Marauders won their seventh straight game on Wednesday, downing the Blue Jays 7-1. Starters Brayden Heidel and Jack Anker exchanged scoreless frames to start, before Bradenton exploded for five unearned runs in the 5th inning, capitalizing on two Dunedin errors highlighted by a grand slam from Jordany De Los Santos. Bradenton added two more in the 8th on an RBI single by Murr Gray and a wild pitch to take a 7-0 lead. Dunedin was kept off the board until Addison Barger's solo homer with one out in the 8th, his second homer in three rehab games.

BLAINE'S WORLD

On Saturday, Blue Jays No. 15 prospect Blaine Bullard smacked a walk-off RBI single in the 10th inning. Bullard exploded base in all five games he played vs. Jupiter last week, with a hit and run scored in the first four games. He's gotten his average up from .173 to .226 over his last eight games, after he cashed in a career night Saturday in Ft. Myers, recording a career-high four hits highlighted by an RBI triple in the 5th inning, and solo homer in the 9th.

Bullard also stole three bases on Thursday, the most in a game by a Blue Jay this season, and has 16 bags after not stealing any bases over the first 11 games of 2026.

BLUE BIRD BLUES

The Blue Jays have dropped five of their last six and 11 of their last 13 games since April 22, and are batting just .165 with a .555 OPS over that span.

In three of the Jays four losses last week, they held an early lead that they gave up. They have given up a lead in 11 of their 16 losses this season entering the week.

After leading the Florida State League in power early, launching 17 home runs over their first 14 games, the most by a Dunedin club in the Stat Portal Era (since 2005), the Jays have homered just five times over their last 10 games, with two of them coming off the bat of Addison Barger.

Dunedin has slipped from an 8-6 record on April 18, when they sat in second place and two games back, to last place in the FSL West. The stretch mirrors their toughest run of 2025, when they went 2-12 from May 20 to June 1, including a seven-game losing streak that dropped them from first to fourth place.

BAM BAM BARGE

Blue Jays INF Addison Barger joined the Blue Jays on MLB Rehab Assignment Sunday, and clobbered a two-run homer in his second at-bat in the 4th, 101.4 MPH to the West Jet Flight Deck.

Barger was originally injured on Sunday, April 5, during a 3-0 loss against the Chicago White Sox after landing awkwardly on first base while trying to beat out a ground ball in the top of the third inning. Barger remained in the game for the time being, taking one more at-bat in the top of the sixth inning before being removed in the bottom half of that frame, and replaced by Jesús Sánchez. He was placed on Toronto's 10-day injured list two days later with a left ankle sprain.

Through eight games this season, the 26-year-old was batting .053 with two RBIs over his first 19 at-bats.

Last year, Barger broke out in a big way, batting .243 with 21 home runs and 74 RBIs, trailing only George Springer and Vladimir Guerrero Jr. in long balls. Barger took his game to another level in the postseason, batting .367 with three home runs and nine RBIs, including a grand slam off Anthony Banda during Game 1 of the World Series.

Barger was a 2021 Florida State League All-Star for Dunedin, where he smashed 18 HR in 91 games and posted a .826 OPS. He is the last D-Jay to hit for the cycle, when he did so on May 28, 2021, against the Tampa Tarpons. Barger made his Major League debut with Toronto on April 24, 2024, after advancing through every level of the farm system.

HAMMERHEADS BIT

The Blue Jays dropped four of six last week against the Jupiter Hammerheads. Dunedin fell in the opener after allowing six unearned runs on two errors, then responded with a Wednesday win by capitalizing on four unearned runs off Jupiter miscues. The Jays dropped back-to-back games Thursday and Friday after surrendering early 4-0 and 2-0 leads, before bouncing back with a walk-off win in the 10th on Saturday. Dunedin again let an early 2-0 lead slip away in Sunday's finale to close out the series.

2026 DUNEDIN BLUE JAYS COACHING STAFF

Ryan Casteel | Manager Year with Toronto: 1 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Chattanooga, TN

Casteel makes his managerial debut in 2026, joining the Blue Jays organization after a 14-year professional playing career. Casteel spent time in the Colorado Rockies, Seattle Mariners, and Atlanta Braves farm systems, while also playing winter ball in Australia and Puerto Rico. A four-time minor league All-Star, he was named Australian Baseball League MVP in 2013 after earning California League Catcher of the Year honors that summer with the Mariners' High-A Modesto Nuts. Casteel spent parts of six seasons at the Triple-A level, including the final four years of his career with the Gwinnett Strippers. After being placed on the Gwinnett Development List for much of the 2024 season, Casteel was activated for a July series against Jacksonville and delivered a ninth-inning, walk-off home run on July 12 in his first game in nearly two months, lifting the Strippers to a 7-6 win after entering as a late-game defensive replacement. Two days later, on July 14, he announced his retirement following a nearly 900-game minor league career. Casteel immediately transitioned into a coaching role with Gwinnett and served as a coach with the FCL Braves in 2025 before stepping into his first managerial role. Was Arizona Fall League teammates with Blue Jays Farm Director Joe Sclafani in 2014 for the Salt River Rafterers on a team that won the AFL Championship and also included Byron Buxton, Trevor Story, Taylor Rogers, Max Kepler, and Tyler Heineman.

Brett Kennedy | Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Galloway, NJ

Kennedy enters his first season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach and second with the Blue Jays organization after leading the Complex League Champion FCL Blue Jays pitching staff in 2025. Kennedy enjoyed a nine-year professional playing career, including MLB service time with the San Diego Padres in 2018 and the Cincinnati Reds in 2023. A Fordham University graduate, Kennedy takes over for fellow Ram Cory Riordan, who was named the Blue Jays' Pitching Coordinator after three seasons in Dunedin.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Denton, TX

Knight returns for his third season as Dunedin's Hitting Coach. Under Knight's guidance in 2025, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League's top offensive clubs, finishing fourth in batting average (.244) and home runs (85), second in slugging percentage (.371), and third in OPS (.716). Through the first 46 games of the 2025 season, the Blue Jays led the league in home runs (41), on-base percentage (.368), slugging percentage (.416), OPS (.784), and runs scored (292). Eight position players earned their first promotions to High-A in 2025 under Knight, including JR Freethy, who reached Double-A by season's end. The Denton, Texas native spent six seasons as a player in the Blue Jays organization from 2015–2021, reaching the Triple-A level. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sept. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

Ashley Stephenson | Bench Coach Year with Toronto: 4 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Mississauga, ON.

Stephenson returns for her second season on Dunedin's coaching staff and fourth with the Blue Jays organization. Stephenson spent the 2025 season as a Position Coach for Dunedin, primarily working with the outfielders. She spent the prior two seasons in the same role with the High-A Vancouver Canadians, where she helped guide the club to a Northwest League championship in 2023. Inducted into the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. She starred collegiately in hockey at Wilfrid Laurier University, winning four conference titles and a CIS National Championship before playing professionally in both the National Women's Hockey League and Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson represented Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004–2018, earning two Team MVP honors, an All-Star selection at third base at the 2008 IBAF World Cup, and the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was later renamed in her honor. In 2022, she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team, leading her squad to two victories over Team USA in the Friendship Series, before joining the Blue Jays organization.

Andy Fermin | Position Coach Year with Toronto: 9 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cleveland, OH.

Fermin joins the Dunedin staff as a Position Coach in his first season with the club. A former infielder in the Blue Jays farm system from 2010–2016, Fermin has remained with the organization in a coaching capacity following his playing days. He served as a coach with the Double-A New Hampshire Fisher Cats from 2017-2019 and was part of the 2018 Eastern League championship staff under current Toronto Manager John Schneider. He served as Hitting Coach for the DSL Blue Jays in 2021 and managed the club from 2022–2023. He returned stateside as manager of the FCL Blue Jays in 2024 before serving as the club's Bench Coach in 2025. Fermin returns to Dunedin after spending parts of three seasons at TD Ballpark as a player in 2014-2016. His father, Felix, played mainly shortstop over 903 MLB games from 1987-1996 while with Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Seattle and Chicago (NL).

Antonio Caceres | Ast. Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 26 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Cotui, DR

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995-1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

- Pitched a shutout 6th inning with a strikeout on Thursday.

2025: Assigned to Class-A Dunedin upon being drafted, where Smith batted .259 with 2 HR, 7 RBI, and a .789 OPS in 23 games. Reached base in 20 of his 23 games played and walked out as much as he struck out (12 K/12 BB).

COLLEGE NOTES: Played his freshman year in 2022 at UC-San Diego where he was a two-way player, before transferring to the University of San Diego, where he played three seasons. Over his four collegiate seasons, Smith hit .305 across 213 college games with 20 home runs and 160 RBI. As a left-handed pitcher, he posted a 16-9 record and a 4.12 ERA in 53 college appearances and 28 starts while striking out 168 batters. Smith's final outing as a Torero saw him earn the win after pitching the final seven innings of San Diego's 14-inning thriller in the WCC Tournament Championship, allowing just three runs on four hits as he used 99 pitches to put his team in position to earn a walk-off victory. As a senior in 2025, Smith batted a career-high .353 with 46 runs, six homers, and 48 RBI. His go-ahead 14th-inning home run at No. 14 UCLA on April 6 helped the Toreros stop a 6-24 skid to begin the season and sparked a 10-game win streak. He put together a 26-game hit streak from March 1 to April 16 that included 14 multi-hit performances and ultimately fell just five games shy of the longest streak in program history. Smith earned All-WCC First Team selections in 2024 and 2025 after helping the Toreros hoist a trio of West Coast Conference trophies, including the 2024 WCC Regular-Season and Tournament titles and the 2025 WCC Regular-Season crown. His other career accolades include being named a 2024 All-American by both the ABCA and the NCBWA, a John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award Finalist (2024) and Semifinalist (2025), and 2024 WCC All-Tournament Team honors. His USD career included 98 starts as a designated hitter, 27 starts in center field, 30 starts in left field, and three games in right field in addition to his 28 career starts on the mound. He finished his college career with a .987 fielding percentage that saw him commit just three errors in 232 chances.

CAREER NOTES: Selected in the 10th round (292nd overall) of the 2025 MLB Draft by the Blue Jays, and signed for below-slot value.

PERSONAL NOTES: Father, Brian, was drafted out of Granite Hills High School by the Seattle Mariners in 1995 and played five seasons of professional baseball, including two in Seattle's minor league system. Attended Granite Hills HS in El Cajon, CA, also played football for three seasons, was named team MVP his sophomore year. Sociology Major. Notes that after extensive training he gained 25 pounds during the 2020 season that was canceled due to COVID-19. Enjoys going to the desert and river, golfing, and fishing in his free time. Austin's younger brother is a freshman on the baseball team at Washington State. Hobbies include golf, pickle ball, fishing, snow boarding. Has two labs, Axel and Tyson.
