A WIN FOR THE AGES ON SUNDAY

The Express hung on for a 9-8 win in Reno on Sunday in 11 innings. With the Express trailing 6-4 in the sixth, Round Rock stole the lead behind a SS Alan Trejo two-run triple and a De Goti RBI double, bringing the score to 7-6. Lawlar homered in the bottom of the eighth for the Aces and the game was tied at 7-7. After the clubs traded zeroes in the ninth, the Express moved to extras for the fourth time this year. Trejo sent a fly ball to center field in the 10th and Barnhart scored on the sacrifice fly. Reno countered with a single from Alexander that scored 2B Ildemaro Vargas in the bottom of the inning. Foscue smashed his sixth extra-base hit of the series with a double off the wall in the bottom of the 11th. Carter came around to score and the Express led 9-8. Despite allowing two singles in the 11th, LHP Michael Plassmeyer shut the door and earned his first win with the E-Train.

GOING WITH GAR

Round Rock RHP Ryan Garcia is set to make his 2025 Express debut in Game 2 today. Garcia opened this season on the 7-Day Injured List. After starting 2024 with Doule-A Frisco, Garcia was promoted to Round Rock on August 4 and made eight starts with a 3.77 ERA (16 ER/42.0 IP) with 17 walks and 50 strikeouts. The 27-year-old was a second round selection by the Rangers in the 2019 MLB Draft out of UCLA.

EXPRESS KEEPS ROLLING

The Express have won back-to-back games. After taking four of six with Reno last week, they are now above the .500 mark for just the second time (April 6). They have won six of their last nine games.

THE STREAK CONTINUES

2B Justin Foscue extended his hitting streak to 10 games Sunday and he has reached base at least twice in nine of those games. He went 2-for-5 with a double, a run scored and an RBI while knocking in the winning run in the 11th inning. He is tied for the league lead in hits (29). During his hitting streak, he is slashing .425/.500/.700/1.200 with five doubles, two home runs, 10 RBI, nine runs scored, seven walks and seven strikeouts.

WINN KEEPS IT GOING

RHP Cole Winn has not allowed an earned run in his first 13.2 innings and six appearances this year. He is one of only two Triple-A relievers to throw at least 10 IP and not allow an earned run. The only other reliever without an earned run this year with over 10 IP is E-Train RHP Matt Festa (10.2 IP).

CLOSE CALLS

The Express have played in five one-run games this year and four extra-inning games while 13 of their 20 games have been decided by three runs or less. They own a -20 run differential this year.

BIG LEAGUE EXPERIENCE

EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.

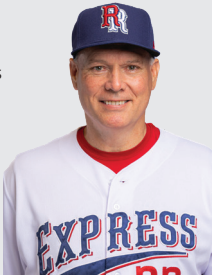
In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.
