LHP SEAN SULLIVAN (5-3, 5.60) vs. LHP MITCH BRATT (1-2, 3.29)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes have a 2-0 series lead after an 8-5 victory last night ... The club has won three-straight and four of their last five contests. It's the fourth win streak of at least three in the second half (last: three, August 26-28, at Round Rock).

-Albuquerque has one win streak of four-plus in the second half: July 28-August 2, a six-game sweep over El Paso.

2-0: Albuquerque holds a 2-0 series lead for the sixth time this season (last: July 28-29 at El Paso). The club has won three of the previous five sets (series losses: July 21-26 vs. Round Rock, 4-2; May 12-17 vs. Oklahoma City, 4-2).

-It's the first 2-0 series lead in Reno since April 22-23, 2025, club lost series, 4-2.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: With one more win this week, Albuquerque will finish above .500 on the road for the third time in club history (also: 2005 and 2009).

DUBS IN A SEASON: With 10 games left this season, the Isotopes are two wins away from tying for the most victories in a campaign since the club became a Rockies affiliate in 2015 (71, 2016).

-The club needs to go 7-3 over the final 10 games of the season to record its first winning season since 2013 (76-68).

@ **RENO:** The Isotopes have won five-straight in Reno (final three of 2025) after dropping seven-straight.

HOMERS HIT: The Isotopes belted three homers last night, the 13th road game of 2026 with at least three dingers (last: August 2 at El Paso, four).

-The Isotopes have registered 172 homers on the year, the 8th most in all of Triple-A ... At home the club has belted 71 dingers (12th fewest) and 101 on the road (2nd most).

STER IT UP: Sterlin Thompson went 3-for-5 Wednesday with his 11th dinger, a double and an RBI, his fifth multi-hit game in his last six contests (11x24 with four doubles, one homer and six RBI).

-He also extended his on-base streak to 16 games ... Was his eighth game of 2026 with three-plus hits (last: August 23 vs. Las Vegas, three).

-Since July 28 (20 games), he is slashing .418/.585/.746 with eight doubles, one triple, four homers, 23 walks and 15 RBI, reaching base in 55 of his last 94 plate appearances.

JULIEN: Edouard Julien went 2-for-3 last night with a double, two walks and three RBI, his second-straight multi-hit game. Has back-to-back multi-hit games for the third time this season (last: April 23-26, two).

-Tied season-high with three RBI (two others; last: June 9 vs. Chicago, NL). Drawn a walk in eight of his last nine games (10).

GEORGIA BOY: Charlie Condon went 1-for-4 yesterday with a double and walk, his fourth-straight contest with a knock (8x17 with two doubles, three homers and 11 RBI). Over his last 13 games, he is slashing .333/.433/.608 with five doubles, three homers, seven walks and 15 RBI.

-Condon has 90 RBI, the most for an Isotopes player in a season since Wynton Bernard finished with 92 in the 2022 campaign ... His 25 home runs are the most in a single-season since Carlos Pérez blasted 31, also in 2022.

-Has five multi-homer games in 2026, tied with Pat Valaika (2019) for the most in a season in club history.

CHAD: Chad Stevens, playing in his first game last night since August 26, went 2-for-4 with a walk and RBI, extending his hit streak to seven. During stretch, he is slashing .407/.529/.481 with two doubles, six walks and four RBI.

RIT MAN: Ryan Ritter went 1-for-5 Wednesday, pushing his modest hit streak to five (9x23) ... Over his last 20 Triple-A games (since July 28), he is slashing .392/.478/.557 with five doubles, one triple, two homers, 12 walks and 14 RBI.

BB: Bryant Betancourt went 1-for-3 Tuesday with a double, walk and two RBI, his fifth-straight contest with a hit (7x19). Over his last 14 contests, he is slashing .365/.400/.558 with seven doubles, one homer and 13 RBI, raising his batting average from .190 to .270.

THE ROC: Roc Riggio went 0-for-4 Tuesday, snapping a modest five-game hit streak (9x20) ... Despite the hitless night, he is slashing .375/.423/.750 (9x24) in six September games with three doubles, two homers, two walks and five RBI.

PCL LEADERS: Sterlin Thompson: 8th, BB (69) ... Drew Avans: 6th, SB (27) and 11th, BB (64) ... Chad Stevens: 4th, OBP (.412) and AVG (.319); 11th, OPS (.874).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 22nd year as a minor league manager and fourth guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history and is in his sixth year overall with the club, becoming the longest-tenured coaching staff member in franchise history. Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, when the Isotopes defeated the Bees 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CRAIG BJORNSON: Begins his first season as Isotopes pitching coach, and 27th year in the professional coaching ranks ... Was previously in the Rockies organization from 2009-11 as the pitching coach for the Casper Ghosts of the Rookie Level Pioneer League ... Most recently spent three seasons in the Braves organization as a pitching coach (Triple-A Gwinnett, 2023), roving pitching instructor (2024) and bullpen coach (Gwinnett, 2025). Was in the Major Leagues as a bullpen coach for the Houston Astros (2012, 14-17) and Boston Red Sox (2018-20) ... Won back-to-back World Series championships with the Astros in 2017 and Red Sox in 2018 ... Spent a total of 13 seasons as a Minor League pitching coach from 1999-2011 in the Montreal/Washington, Kansas City, Los Angeles (NL), and Colorado organizations. Signed as a free agent by the Astros in 1991 and pitched for parts of three seasons in their Minor League system. Attended Arizona Western Junior College where he was teammates with Pedro Lopez, and also played collegiately at Nicholls State University.

LUIS LOPEZ: Joins Albuquerque as bench coach after spending the past four seasons in the same role with the Double-A Hartford Yard Goats ... Began his coaching career as a Minor League hitting coach in the Red Sox organization from 2008-11. Was the Braves' Minor League infield coordinator from 2012-17, then managed the Gulf Coast League Tigers in 2018 and 2019. Appeared in parts of 11 MLB season from 1993-2005 with San Diego, New York (NL), Milwaukee, Baltimore and Cincinnati.

MATT SNYDER: Enters his first season in the Colorado Rockies organization as the Isotopes hitting coach ... Previously had stints in the Marlins system as hitting coach with High-A Beloit (2021-22) and Double-A Pensacola (2023) before serving as Minor League hitting coordinator in 2024. Last season, he was the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore Blue Claws in the Phillies organization ... Was a 10th round pick by the Yankees in 2012 and played eight Minor League seasons with New York-AL (2012-18) and Miami (2019). Reached Triple-A with New Orleans in 2019.

CHECK-SWING CHALLENGE: Starting May 5, the Check-Swing Challenge will be used in the PCL. In addition to being able to challenge ball/strike calls, players will also be able to challenge the umpire's call of swing or no-swing. A batter will be judged to have offered at a pitch when the bat head gets ahead of the knob and creates an angle greater than 45 degrees. The 45-degree threshold allows umpires to use the baselines as a visible point of reference.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the fourth-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 21) will host the second half winner (beginning June 23) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 26. The Isotopes have not reached the playoffs since 2012, tied with Charlotte for the second-longest drought among all 30 Triple-A teams. Only Louisville has gone longer without reaching the postseason, as they last qualified in 2010.
