TONIGHT'S GAME: The Quakes continue a crucial six-game road trip today, with the third game of a six-game set against the Fresno Grizzlies (COL) at Chukchansi Park in Fresno. After this six-game set, the Quakes will return to LoanMart Field for the final three games of the first half, as part of a six-game series against the Inland Empire 66ers on Tuesday, June 18. Tickets are available at requakes.com.

VS THE GRIZZLIES: Today's game is the third of 12 against the Grizzlies in 2024 and the third of six at Chukchansi Park in Fresno. Last season, the Quakes went 5-7 against the Grizzlies, just 1-5 here in Fresno. Including the two in this series, the Quakes have won just four of 20 games in Fresno since the Grizzlies joined the Cal League in 2021. **LAST GAME:** The Grizzlies got strong starting pitching and capitalized on ten Rancho Cucamonga walks and four defensive errors, defeating the Quakes on Wednesday night by a final of 8-2 at Chukchansi Park. Fresno starter Bryan Perez (3-2) allowed a bunt single to Kendall George on the first pitch of the game and then a solo homer from Jeral Perez (8) in the fourth. Other than that, the right-hander was dominant over seven innings in the win. Rancho starter Alex Makarewich (0-2) was only able to retire two of the six hitters he faced, as he was pulled due to pitch count with two outs in the first, getting charged with two runs on one hit with two walks and a hit batter. Rancho finished with

just four hits on the night and has now dropped two straight. The Grizzlies have won five straight. **ROSTER MOVES:** Left-hander Garrett McDaniels was placed on the Injured List on Tuesday and right-hander Gabe Emmett hit the Injured List on Wednesday. Taking one of those two spots on the roster is right-handed reliever Pedro Santillan, who joins the club from the Arizona Complex League.

SERIES WINS AND LOSSES: Sunday's win gave the Quakes a split of the six-game set and kept them from their

third straight series loss overall, after suffering losses in five of six to Modesto followed by six straight at Lake Elsinore. The Quakes only lost one other six-game series prior to this tough stretch that has seen Rancho drop 16 of their last 20 games overall. The last series win for the Quakes was in Visalia, back in early-May, when they took four of six. **APRIL 12:** Rancho Cucamonga entered first place in the South on April 12 and stayed there until May 31, when the were knocked out by the Lake Elsinore Storm. After making up a game last week, the Quakes entered this series against Fresno two games out, but are now three games out with seven to play after last night's loss, Rancho's second straight. Rancho's last seven games of the first half will be on the road at Fresno (4), then finishing at home with Inland Empire (3). The Storm are at home against Stockton (4) and then at Visalia (3) to end the half.

UP NORTH: With their fifth straight win last night, Fresno pulled to within 2.5 games of first-place Modesto, who dropped their fifth straight last night. Fresno will finish this series with Rancho and then continue their home stand with three against Stockton to finish the half. Modesto is in Visalia, before heading home to face San Jose for three. **PATRICK COPEN:** Patrick Copen makes his 11th start and 12th appearance of the year, his first against Fresno. AUSTIN EMENER: Lefty Austin Emener makes his tenth start of the year and first against the Quakes. In his last outing, he allowed three runs (two earned) on six hits over seven innings in a loss at Modesto on June 6. Emener was drafted in the 16th round of the 2023 draft by Colorado out of East Tennessee State.
