TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque claimed a 9-6 series-opening victory last night. The club has won two-straight for the fourth time this year, a season-high ... The Isotopes have not won three in-a-row since the taking the final three games against Oklahoma City to close out the 2023 season ... Josh Rogers and Brett Kerry are expected to start for Albuquerque and Salt Lake, respectively.

SAVE THE DAY: Matt Carasiti registered his sixth save of the year and second-straight last night after closing out the 8-6 win Sunday over Sugar Land. It's the first time the club has tallied a save in back-to-back contests since Sept. 23-24, 2023, against Oklahoma City.

SERIES OPENING DUB: With the win last night, the Isotopes ended their series-opening losing streak at nine-straight, a franchise worst. It's the club's first series-opening win since Sept. 12, 2023, at El Paso (6-3).

VS. SALT LAKE: The Isotopes have won four of their last five games against Salt Lake after dropping the previous five.

DOUBLE-DIGITS: The Isotopes have tallied double-digit hits in seven of their last eight games with 94 knocks during the stretch, which is the most in all of MiLB during span, since May 12. Their 64 runs over their last eight also leads MiLB.

TWO-OUT RALLY: The Isotopes plated eight of their nine runs last night with two outs. The lone tally without two outs came on Romo's solo shot to leadoff the eighth inning.

BIG INNINGS: Albuquerque has scored four-plus runs in two frames in a contest for the second time in the last four games (last: May 17 vs. Sugar Land, four in fifth and six in eighth).

KEEP IT CLEAN: Albuquerque has played error-free baseball for three-straight contests, matching the season-high set March 30 - April 2.

CAUGHT STEALING: Drew Romo nabbed Jason Martin attempting to steal second base in the seventh inning last night, the club's 10th caught stealing of the year (10x63) and Romo's seventh (7x37)

BY THE NUMBERS: Nine of the Isotopes 15 wins on the year have been by a margin of three runs or fewer ... Albuquerque has scored eight-plus runs in 12 of 15 triumphs, including the last 11.

THREE-BAGGERS: Coco Montes collected the Isotopes MiLB-leading 23rd three-bagger on the year last Thursday. Albuquerque has tallied a triple in 16 of 46 games. HITTING STREAKS: Drew Romo and Coco Montes each have eight-game hit streaks, tied for longest active streak in the PCL.

HIS NAME IS DREW: Drew Romo belted his fifth homer of the year and first from the right side of the plate last night. Has four dingers over his last eight games. He also extended his hitting streak to eight. During the stretch, he is slashing .429/.459/.800 with a double, four homer and 10 RBI.

ON A HEATER: Since April 20, Drew Romo is slashing .435/.444/.729 with eight doubles, a triple, five homers, 21 RBI.

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes compiled a single last night to extend his hitting streak to eight. During the stretch, he is slashing .529/.564/.853 with three doubles, a triple, two homers and 11 RBI.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard recorded two knocks last night for his 20th multi-hit contest of the year and third-straight, including third-straight game with two RBI. Has multiple hits in three-straight for third time this year. Has a hit in 12 of his last 14 games (19x55) with three doubles, a triple, five homers, 12 RBI and 11 walks.

MULTI-RBI STREAK: Hilliard has tallied multiple RBI in threestraight games for first time since a four-game stretch from April 21-27, 2019, with Albuquerque.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk recorded his 11th multihit game of the year with a double last night. Has a hit in his last 11 starts. During the stretch, he is 17-for-47 with four doubles, a triple, three homers and six RBI.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia collected his sixth multi-hit contest of the year last night while driving in a run for a second-straight game. He also did not strikeout, ending his strikeout streak at eight games, totaling 16 during the stretch.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Drew Romo is 1st in average (.375), T-7th in hits (51), 8th in slugging (.581), 10th in OPS (.968) and T-10th in doubles (11) ... Aaron Schunk is T-4th in doubles (14) ... Coco Montes is 1st in OBP (.455), T-1st in hits (58), 2nd in average (.369), 3rd in OPS (1.041), 5th in slugging (.586) and 7th in total bases (92) ... Sam Hilliard is 1st in OPS (1.050), 2nd in runs (39) and total bases (103), 3rd in slugging (.624), T-3rd in XBH (24), 4th in OBP (.426), T-4th in walks (30) and homers (11), 5th in hits (54), T-6th in triples (3) and 7th in average (.327).

TEAM STATS: Offensively in MiLB, the club is 1st in slugging (.497), OPS (.871), average (.290), total bases (817) and hits (477), 2nd in doubles (105) and runs (293).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- Played for the Bourne Braves of the Cape Cod League in 2014 and 2015
