Dayton Dragons (12-17) at Lake County Captains (18-11)

RH Johnathan Harmon (0-2, 6.00) vs. RH Trenton Denholm (2-0, 3.20)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Lake County Captains (affiliates of the Cleveland Guardians) in the third game of a six-game series.

Last Game: Wednesday: Lake County 8, Dayton 1. Four Lake County pitchers combined to limit the Dragons to four hits. The Captains took command with a four-run fourth inning as they built a 6-1 lead. The Captains hit two home runs accounting for five of their eight runs.

Current Series (May 7-12 at Lake County): Dayton is 0-2 in the series.

Dayton team stats in the series: .197 batting average (12 for 61); 3.0 runs/game (6 R, 2 G); 1 home run; 0 stolen bases; 9.00 ERA (16 IP, 16 ER); 3 errors.

Last Series (April 30-May 5 vs. West Michigan): Dayton went 3-3 in the series.

Dayton team stats in the series: 227 batting average (45 for 198); 5.5 runs/game (33 R, 6 G); 5 home runs; 10 stolen bases; 5.07 ERA (55 IP, 31 ER); 4 errors.

In the Standings: The Dragons are in fifth place, seven games behind Great Lakes, the division leader in the East Division of the Midwest League.

Transactions: Starting pitcher Rhett Lowder has been promoted to Double-A Chattanooga. Lowder, the Reds first round draft pick in 2023, made five starts for the Dragons, going 2-0 with a 2.49 ERA. The Dragons received relief pitcher Andrew Moore from Chattanooga. Moore is a hard-thrower who reached 100 mph with his fastball with the Dragons late in the 2023 season. On Tuesday, the Dragons received reliever Vin Timpanelli from Chattanooga and placed reliever John Murphy on the Development List.

Team Notes

- The Dragons have lost three straight games after winning the previous three. Their longest losing streak in 2024 is four (April 18-21 vs. Fort Wayne).
- The Dragons have averaged 6.1 runs per game over their last 11 games (67 R).
- The Dragons rank tied for second in the MWL in home runs with 27 and have the league co-leader in homers (Cam Collier, 7).
- The Dragons bullpen ERA stands at 5.92, which ranks 113th of 120 teams in the minor leagues. The Dragons bullpen ranks 118th in Opponent Batting Average at .286. However, in the last six games, the Dragons bullpen ERA is a greatly improved 3.62 (27.1 IP, 11 ER).
- The Dragons rank first in Minor League Baseball (120 teams) in average attendance (7,923).

Player Notes

- Entering Wednesday's games, Jay Allen II led the MWL in OPS at 1.194 and batting average at .387. However, after Wednesday's games, Allen temporarily dropped below the minimum number of required plate appearances to qualify for league leadership (Allen missed 11 games with a knee injury in April). Allen has hit six home runs in 17 games played this season, one off the league lead (two homers below his career total entering this season in 141 games). In his last eight games, Allen is 15 for 31 (.484) with three home runs, six RBI, 10 runs scored, and five stolen bases. Allen has improved his contact rate dramatically in 2024, and when he has made contact, he has improved his production rate. From 2023 to 2024, Allen's strikeout rate has improved from 38 % to 18%, and his BABIP (batting average on balls in play) has improved from .154 to .387.
- Cam Collier has been named Cincinnati Reds Minor League Player of the Month for April. In the month, he batted .298 with seven home runs and 25 RBI in 20 games, posting a .933 OPS. Collier is tied for the lead in the MWL in home runs (7) and ranks second in RBI (28).
- Leo Balcazar over his last eight games is batting .382 (13 for 34) with two doubles and five RBI.

Prospecting in Dayton: Four players currently ranked among the Reds top-10 prospects by *Baseball America* are on the Dragons 30-man roster. They are center fielder Carlos Jorge (Reds #6 prospect); third baseman Sal Stewart (Reds #7 prospect), shortstop Leo Balcazar (Reds #8 prospect); and third baseman Cam Collier (Reds #10 prospect). Note that the *MLB Pipeline* rankings produced by *MLB.com* have Stewart at #6, Collier at #7, Jorge at #8, and Balcazar at #19. Additionally, shortstop Victor Acosta is ranked #19 by *Baseball America*, and outfielder Hector Rodriguez is ranked #20, giving the Dragons six players ranked among the Reds top-20 by *Baseball America*. Outfielder Ethan O'Donnell and Jay Allen II do not appear on the *Baseball America* Reds top-30 list, but they are both on the MLB Pipeline top-30 list, with O'Donnell #23 and Allen #25, giving the Dragons eight players within the top-25 on the MLB Pipeline list.

- The average age of MWL position players in 2024 is 22.2. The Dragons have three position players age 19 (Acosta, Collier, Balcazar) and four who are 20 (Jorge, Rodriguez, Serrano, Stewart). None of the Dragons seven youngest players have had an at-bat in 2024 against a younger pitcher.
- The Dragons roster includes four players selected by the Reds in the first two rounds of the draft including Cam Collier (1st round, 2022); Jay Allen II (Supplemental 1st round, 2021); Sal Stewart (Supplemental 1st round, 2022); and Logan Tanner (2nd round, 2022).
- Two Dragons players are continuing the long list of recent Dayton prospects who were acquired in trades for major league players. Outfielder Hector Rodriguez was acquired in 2022 as part of a trade deadline deal that sent MLB outfielder Tyler Naquin from the Reds to the Mets, and shortstop Victor Acosta was acquired the same week from the Padres for MLB infielder Brandon Drury. Dayton players from 2022-23 acquired in trades for major league players included Connor Phillips, Chase Petty, Noelvi Marte, Edwin Arroyo, Jose Acuna, Andrew Moore, and Steve Hajjar.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

New Dragons manager Vince Harrison Jr. brings 10 seasons of minor league managing/coaching experience to the Dragons in 2024. He served as a coach with the Reds Triple-A club, the Louisville Bats, in 2023. Harrison also enjoyed a nine-vear professional career as a player, playing in the Rays, Mets, and Marlins systems as a third baseman. Harrison, 44, has previous success as a manager in the Midwest League. In 2019, he was the manager for Kane County, an Arizona Diamondbacks affiliate, and led the club to an outstanding record of 81-58, tying for most victories in the league that season. After Harrison's playing career ended following the 2011 season, he was hired as a coach by the Pirates. He joined the Diamondbacks organization as a hitting coach in 2014 and spent five years in that role before becoming a manager. He managed for three years in the Diamondbacks system before joining the Reds organization in 2023 as a coach with Louisville. Harrison played at Princeton High School in Cincinnati before starring in both baseball and football at the University of Kentucky. He was drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in 2001 and spent four years as a player in their farm system, reaching the Double-A level. His best seasons came in 2003 with Charleston (.275 batting average with 19 home runs) and 2004 with Bakersfield and Montgomery (.275, 16 home runs, .838 OPS). Harrison is part of a big baseball family. His younger brother, Josh Harrison, is an active Major League player with more than 1,000 career base hits and has been selected to play in the MLB all-star game two times, both while with the Pittsburgh Pirates. Their uncle, John Shelby, spent 11 years in the Major Leagues as a center fielder, mostly with the Orioles and Dodgers, and reached the 20-home run mark two times. Two cousins also played professionally.

Brian Garman returns to the Dragons as pitching coach. The Wapakoneta, Ohio native filled the same role with Double-A Chattanooga in 2023. Garman was the Dragons pitching coach in 2021 and '22 when he amazingly worked with 10 future major leaguers over those two seasons in Dayton including Andrew Abbott, Graham Ashcraft, Lyon Richardson, Connor Phillips, and Joe Boyle among others. Under Garman's leadership, the 2021 Dragons pitching staff set club records for most strikeouts per game and fewest hits allowed per game. Garman served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for two seasons, working at Orem (Utah) in the Pioneer League in 2019 and Inland Empire in the California League in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level in his final year in 2013.

José León joins the Dragons as hitting coach in 2024, his third season in the Reds organization and sixth year as a professional coach/manager. He was the hitting coach for the Arizona Complex League (ACL) Reds in 2023. León began his coaching career in the St. Louis Cardinals organization in 2018 and served as a manager in their system in both 2019 and 2021. León, a native of Puerto Rico, reached the Major Leagues as a player with the Baltimore Orioles for parts of three seasons from 2002-'04, appearing in 88 games. He played in the Minor Leagues from 1994-2009, enjoying a 16-year playing career as a corner infielder.

Jefry Sierra, a former Dragons player, joins the club as a coach in 2024. Sierra becomes the second former Dragons player to return to the team in a coaching role (Luis Bolivar was the first). Sierra appeared in 176 games with the Dragons in 2011-'12 as an outfielder. His 46 career stolen bases with the Dragons ranks among the top-10 in franchise history. Sierra was a key player for the Dragons in 2011 when the team posted an all-time franchise best record of 81-59 with a roster that also featured Billy Hamilton, Tucker Barnhart, and Donald Lutz among others. The 2024 season will be Sierra's 10th year as a coach in the Reds organization. He served as a coach with Double-A Chattanooga in 2023 after coaching at Single-A Daytona in 2022.

Memorable Moments

On April 17 against Fort Wayne, Luis Mey fired a fastball at 103 mph to break the record at Day Air Ballpark of 102 by Hunter Greene in 2018.

On April 26 in a 14-10 win at Lansing, the Dragons collected 20 hits for the first time since they had 24 on July 4, 2012 and reached a season-high for runs in a game as 2023 #1 draft pick Rhett Lowder picked up his first professional win. The Dragons offense was led by Carlos Jorge, who became the first Dayton player to collect three extra base hits in a game since Mat Nelson last August. Jorge had a home run, two doubles, and four RBI. Sal Stewart added a home run, double, four RBI, and three walks. Cade Hunter had four hits. Hector Rodriguez and Leo Balcazar each had three hits. The Dragons built a 14-1 lead going to the bottom of the eighth inning and held on to win. Dayton was 20 for 41 (.488) as a team and had eight hits with men in scoring position. The Dragons had three sacrifice bunts after collecting only one in the first 18 games. This was the first time the Dragons won a game in which the opponent scored at least 10 runs since August 22, 2016 (11-10 over Lansing in what is recalled as the "skunk game." A skunk ran on the field in the 9th inning, causing a delay, before a Dragons comeback).

On April 28 at Lansing, Jay Allen II tied a club record with five hits in a game. The last player to do it was Jose Barrero (then known as Jose Garcia) in 2018.

Basics for 2024

This is the fourth year in which the league is classified at the High-A level of Minor League Baseball. The Midwest League was a Low-A league prior to 2021. The 12-team Midwest League operates with two six-team divisions...Each team in the Midwest League is scheduled to play a 132-game schedule in 2024 (66 home games)...The Midwest League will continue to utilize a Pitch Timer to encourage a quicker pace of play. Pitchers are required to deliver each pitch within a 15-second time limit (or 18 seconds with a runner on base). Defensive positioning rules require at least two infielders on each side of second base, with at least four infielders positioned on the infield dirt. Pitchers are limited in the number of unsuccessful pick-off throws they can make to a base. The third pick-off throw must result in an out, or the runner will be awarded the next base...Roster limits in 2024 are set at 30 players, the same as in 2021-23, after teams had played with 25-player limits in previous years.
