**YESTERDAY:** The Flying Squirrels lost to the RubberDucks, 10-3. Akron took a 1-0 lead in the second on a run-scoring groundout by Juan Benjamin, snapping **Joe Whitman's** scoreless streak at 24 consecutive innings, tying the Flying Squirrels franchise record. Akron added two runs on singles by Alex Mooney and Joe Lampe in the fourth to open a 3-0 lead. In the fifth, Richmond scored a run on an error to cut the deficit to 3-1. In the seventh, **Diego Velasquez** and **Ty Hanchey** hit RBI singles to tie the score, 3-3. Akron scored seven runs in the eighth to pull ahead, 10-3. Whitman threw six innings and allowed three runs with a season-high nine strikeouts.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a six-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. This series features a match-up of the top two teams in the Southwest Division this season. The Flying Squirrels won five-of-six against the RubberDucks at CarMax Park from May 5-10. Richmond is looking for a series win with a win this afternoon.

**STRONG START:** The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 34-15 start is the best in team history through 49 games, passing a 27-22 start in 2010 and 2022. Richmond has won five series and split three so far this year. Seven-of-15 Richmond losses have been by one run.

**RELENTLESS:** In their 34 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 15 of them. In 11 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron. On May 20 against Binghamton, **Ty Hanchey** hit a game-tying homer in the bottom of the ninth and Harber won the game with a walk-off single.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** went 2-5 from May 14-May 21 but are 5-3 in their last eight games since May 22. They have the best record in Double-A. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Richmond offense ranks second in doubles (111) and tied for fourth in batting average (.284). Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average, hits (471), doubles and triples (16) and ranks tied for first in runs (313), second in OBP (.366), second in SLG (.460) and second in OPS (.826).

**THE RUBBERDUCKS** are tied for second place in the Southwest Division standings. After dropping five-of-six in Richmond from May 5-10, Akron went 8-2 from May 12-23, but is 2-5 in its last seven games since last Sunday. Akron's roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects list, including RHP Khal Stephen (No. 8), OF Jaison Chourio (No. 9), C Jacob Cozart (No. 14), OF Alfonso Rosario (No. 24) and LHP Josh Hartle (No. 25). MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects list includes six Akron players, including Stephen (No. 5), Chourio (No. 10), Rosario (No. 14), Cozart (No. 18), RHP Justin Campbell (No. 22) and Hartle (No. 26).

**FOR RICHMOND:** Right-hander **Trystan Vrieling** makes his 10th start of the season and the fifth appearance of his career against the RubberDucks. He started the series opener on Tuesday and allowed one run over 3.2 innings, working around a career-high five walks. He also faced Akron on May 6 at CarMax Park and pitched five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with four strikeouts. Last year, he missed the start of the season before joining Double-A Somerset in May. After going 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA in 12 outings, he was traded at the deadline on August 1 to the Giants from the Yankees reliever Camilo Doval. The trade happened in the middle of a Richmond series at Somerset. In 2024, he made professional debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 7 at TD Bank Ballpark to close opening weekend and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with six strikeouts. Vrieling was selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga. **For more on Vrieling, see page two.**

**FOR AKRON:** Right-hander Justin Campbell makes his fifth Double-A start and his third against the Flying Squirrels. He pitched at CarMax Park on May 8 and threw four scoreless innings in his Double-A debut. He worked the first game of this series on Tuesday and allowed one run over five innings with four strikeouts. He began the season with High-A Lake County and went 0-1 with a 2.40 ERA in six starts. Campbell was selected by the Guardians in the first round (37th overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Oklahoma State, where he was a two-way player and a finalist for the John Olerud Award in 2021. He is rated by MLB.com as the No. 22 Guardians prospect. Campbell is in his first season of game action after missing 2023 after elbow surgery to relieve pressure on the ulnar nerve, Tommy John surgery in April 2024 and wrist surgery in October 2024.

**COX ROCKS:** **Jonah Cox** leads MiLB in batting average (.400) and ranks second in OPS (1.097) and fifth in SLG (.644). He has 27 stolen bases this year, which leads the Eastern League and is tied for seventh in MiLB. The 27 steals are tied for sixth-most in a season in Flying Squirrels franchise history, even with Jalen Miller (2019). Cox reached base in the first 23 games he played this season to begin his Double-A career before an 0-for-3 outing on May 5. He opened the season on a 12-game hit streak and has at least one hit in 40-of-43 games he has played, adding a 10-game hit streak that was also snapped on May 5. He had an 11-game hit streak from May 6-19 and had his last streak, seven games, snapped on Friday. On May 1 (G1) at Altoona, he became the fifth player in Flying Squirrels history to hit three triples in a single game.

**PARKS & WRECK:** **Parks Harber** has homered six times and picked up 22 RBIs in his last 20 games since May 7. Last week, he hit a solo home run on Wednesday night before driving a game-winning single in the bottom of the ninth, his second walk-off hit for the Flying Squirrels this year. He has driven in at least one run in six-of-his-last-10 games since May 20.

**TOP SKIPPER:** Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 294 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

**PACKING THE HOUSE:** In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,131).

**IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS:** In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.400), first in OBP (.453), first in SLG (.644), first in OPS (1.097), first in hits (64), first in triples (5), first in stolen bases (27), second in total bases (103), fifth in RBIs (35), tied for sixth in extra-base hits (22). **Parks Harber** is eighth in batting average (.317), eighth in OPS (.941) and ninth in SLG (.561). **Scott Bandura** is fifth in batting average (.324) and second in OBP (.430). **Joe Whitman** is first in strikeouts (65), second in WHIP (0.97), tied for second in wins (5), third in innings pitched (50.1), fifth in BAA (.198) and sixth in ERA (3.22). **Matt Wilkinson** is first in WHIP (0.83), first in BAA (.154), second in ERA (1.87) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (49). **Jack Choate** is tied for second in wins (5). **Tyler Vogel** is second in saves (6). **Mitch White** is tied for third in saves (5). **Cesar Perdomo** is tied for seventh in BAA (.220) and ninth in WHIP (1.20).

**PROSPECT WATCH:** Richmond's roster features six players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 13), **Joe Whitman** (No. 18), **Jonah Cox** (No. 21), **Matt Wilkinson** (No. 25) and **Diego Velasquez** (No. 29). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and Cox is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), Harber (No. 14), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

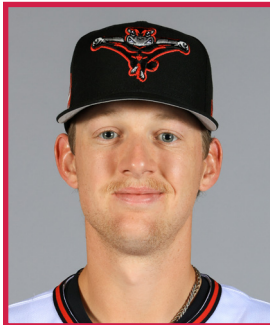
### THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

**1957:** The Richmond Virginians beat the Columbus Jets, 9-6, at Parker Field. After trailing 6-0 through four, the Vees scored four runs in the seventh and four more in the eighth to pull ahead, 9-6. Tom Carroll hit a three-run double in the eighth to break the tie. **1976:** The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 3-1, at Parker Field. Jeff Greach hit a two-run homer to open the scoring in the seventh, backing pitcher Preston Hanna to his first win of the year. Jack McKeon used three relief pitchers to work through the ninth. **1991:** The Richmond Braves beat the Iowa Cubs, 10-1, at The Diamond. The game was tied, 1-1, in the fifth inning before rain delayed play for 90 minutes. Following the delay, Richmond scored three runs in three straight innings from the sixth through the eighth. Victor Rosario had three hits and drove in three runs. Deion Sanders had two hits and scored a run. **2018:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 7-6. Down by a run with two outs in the bottom of the ninth, Ronnie Jebavy drove home Dillon Dobson and Dylan Davis with a two-run, walk-off single.

- Traded from the Yankees to the Giants on July 31, 2025 along with C Jesus Rodriguez, INF Parks Harber and LHP Carlos De La Rosa in exchange for RHP Camilo Doval
- Had 14 wins with Somerset over two seasons, setting the record for the most career wins in the franchise's Double-A history
