**Karpathios Walks it Off**  
Braedon Karpathios emerged as a hero in the tenth inning for the San Antonio Missions (2-6) as his line drive single brought automatic runner Kai Roberts home to walk-it-off against the Corpus Christi Hooks (4-4). The Missions trailed 3-1 in the bottom of the ninth, but a pair of runs sent the game to extras, where the Missions eventually earned their first win at the Wolff this season in front of a sold-out crowd by a score of 4-3.

**Getting the Party Started Again**  
Yesterday marked the first walk-off win of 2026 for the Missions. In 2025, the Missions won 10 games on walk-offs, meaning just about 15% of their home games ended with a win on their final at bat.

**Never Done**  
After falling in Friday's game despite leading in the ninth, the Missions reversed that immediately and won despite trailing in the ninth. In 2025, the Missions were 5-63 when trailing after 8 innings.

**Caught a Karp**  
Braedon Karpathios hit his first walk off for the Missions in his 29th game with San Antonio. Karpathios, who got called up August 19 last year, is the 12th ranked prospect in the Padres system according to MLB Pipeline.

**Call the Police**  
Kai Roberts played a huge part on the bases last night, stealing 2 bases including 3rd base in the 10th inning to allow him to score the game-winning run. Roberts is already 4-4 on stolen base attempts after going 35-42 last year. In 2024, Roberts stole 14 bases without being caught for Single-A Lake Elsinore.

**Free Baseball**  
That's now 2 extra innings games within the first 8 for San Antonio. Last year, the Missions went 7-6 in 13 extra-inning games.

**Improvements Being Made**  
The Missions have walked the 2nd most batters in all of Double-A baseball at 52, but the last 2 nights they have only walked 3 in each game. Only the Tulsa Drillers, who the Missions just played, have walked more at 59.

**Immediate Impact**  
Carson Tucker didn't play until pinch running for Romeo Sanabria in the ninth inning, and he went on to be right in the middle of everything. He scored the game-tying run on a wild pitch in the ninth, and then in his first game in right field for San Antonio, he threw a strike to throw out Yamal Encarnacion at home and keep the game tied.

**Double Dip**  
22-year-old Luis Gutierrez makes his 2nd start of the series. Gutierrez joined the Missions last year in Springfield. The Cabimas, Venezuela native threw 5 scoreless innings against the Cardinals with 2 hits, 2 walks and 4 strikeouts. Gutierrez actually spent time at all 4 levels of the organization, but most of it was split between Single-A Lake Elsinore and High-A Fort Wayne. He went 2-3 with a 2.88 ERA in 10 games (six starts) across 50 innings with 20 walks and 46 strikeouts at Lake Elsinore and 2-3 with a 3.74 ERA in 13 games (13 starts) across 65 innings with 22 walks and 59 strikeouts at Fort Wayne. His one start at Triple-A El Paso went 5 innings with 6 hits, 4 R (3ER), no walks and 6 strikeouts. The Padres signed Gutierrez as a free agent in 2019, and he is now ranked as the No. 20 prospect in their system according to MLB Pipeline.

**From the Top This Time**  
Trey Dombroski gets the start for the Hooks after throwing 2 scoreless innings on Wednesday in the bullpen with a hit, a walk and a strikeout. The 25-year-old from Manasquan, New Jersey went 9-5 with a 3.61 ERA in 28 games (19 starts) for the Hooks last year with 49 walks and 116 strikeouts in 112.1 innings. He did make 2 starts at Triple-A Sugar Land, allowing 8 runs on 8 hits in 8.1 innings. The Houston Astros drafted Dombroski in the 4th round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Monmouth University.

**Need to Feel at Home**  
This week is the first for the Missions back home in San Antonio for the 2026 season. The differences between home and road performances ultimately defined the Missions in 2025. At home, the Missions hit just .207 and scored 213 runs (3.08/game). On the road, the Missions hit .252 and scored 314 runs (4.68/game). In the second half especially, the Missions were just 9-21 at home compared to 17-20 on the road.

**Continuing to Impress**  
After not playing in affiliated baseball since 2023, Carson Tucker has made a great early impression by recording hits in each of his first 4 games. His 6 total hits are 2nd most behind Romeo Sanabria for the most on the team in 18 fewer at bats. He has also driven in a run in 2 games. The Cleveland Guardians drafted Tucker in the 1st round of the 2020 MLB Draft, but injuries and struggles out of the gate forced him out of MiLB. In 2025, Tucker played with the Ogden Raptors of the Pioneer League at the same time as Chris Sargent Jr.

# San Antonio Missions Coaches

## Manager - Chris Tremie

Chris Tremie begins his first season in the San Diego Padres organization and as manager of the San Antonio Missions. He spent 13 seasons as a manager in the Cleveland Guardians organization and the last seven seasons as the minor league field coordinator for the Cincinnati Reds.

“Fans should expect to come out and see a team that’s going to compete on a daily basis,” Tremie said. “It will be a good brand of baseball. We’re going to play the game the right way.”

Tremie debuted as a catcher for the Chicago White Sox in 1995. He later played for the Texas Rangers, Pittsburgh Pirates and Houston Astros across a total of 22 Major League Baseball games. Tremie retired in 2005 as a member of the Round Rock Express, the Astros’ Triple-A affiliate at the time, and began his managing career in 2006 with the Cleveland organization. His time with Cleveland included two years of managing Double-A Akron and six years leading Triple-A Columbus.

The Houston native attended the University of Houston, where he helped lead the Cougars to two 40-win seasons before being drafted by the White Sox in the 39th round of the 1992 MLB Draft. As a minor leaguer in the White Sox organization, Tremie played with NBA legend Michael Jordan on the Double-A Birmingham Barons as Jordan attempted to play professional baseball.

### Hitting Coach Eric Del Prado

Eric Del Prado returns for his second season as hitting coach in San Antonio. He previously worked as a hitting coach at the Arizona Complex League (ACL) in 2023 before taking on the hitting coach role with Single-A Lake Elsinore during the 2024 season.

A native of El Segundo, California, Del Prado attended Willamette University and coached for four years at Lewis & Clark College in Oregon.

### Pitching Coach Erick Abreu

Erick Abreu, a native of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, pitched for nine years in the minor leagues with the New York Yankees and Houston Astros, even making a stop with the Texas League’s Corpus Christi Hooks. Abreu then became a pitching coach in the Astros’ system for nine seasons, spending time in six different levels.

Over the last two seasons, Abreu served as the major league bullpen coach for the Atlanta Braves.

### Bench Coach Brian Burres

Brian Burres brings recent leadership acumen from within the Padres organization, working as the manager for Single-A Lake Elsinore in 2025, as a pitching coach at the Arizona Complex League in 2024 and as an assistant coach with High-A Fort Wayne in 2023.

Burres also boasts the most extensive major league playing career on the staff, pitching in over 100 games for the Baltimore Orioles, Toronto Blue Jays and Pittsburgh Pirates across six big-league seasons.

### Strength Coach Chandler Craig

Chandler Craig continues for a second season with the Missions after two seasons as strength and conditioning coach with High-A Fort Wayne. This will be his fourth season in the Padres organization.

Craig previously spent two seasons with the Red Sox organization, including time with Single-A Salem. Craig is a native of Lubbock, Texas and graduated from Texas Tech University.

### Athletic Trainer Juan Peña

Juan Peña embarks on his second season with the Missions and second with the Padres organization. In 2024, Peña won one of only 14 Minor League Baseball Athletic Trainer of the Year awards for his work with Single-A Lake Elsinore.

Peña worked in the Detroit Tigers organization from 2018-2023, with most of his time spent at the Florida Complex League. He is from Lakeland, Florida, and graduated from East Central University.
