**FIRST HALF CHAMPS!:** With the win over Hill City on June 7, the FredNats secured the Carolina League North's first-half title, the only first-half championship in Fredericksburg history. The title is the first for the franchise since the Potomac Nationals' 2018 win, a roster that featured many future Major Leaguers (and some current big leaguers rehabbing), including Juan Soto, Andruw Monasterio, Anthony Rendon, Ryan Zimmerman and Adam Eaton.

**STARTING THE SECOND HALF:** Yesterday marked the first game of the second half for the FredNats. After not dropping any of their first four games in the first half, the FredNats fell just short of a comeback effort on Friday, stranding the bases loaded in the ninth inning to fall 7-6.

**TITLE DEFENSE:** Since moving to Fredericksburg, the franchise has traditionally been stronger in the second half. Qualifying for the playoffs for the fourth time since moving to FXBG this season, 2026 was the first season since relocation where the FredNats have brought home the Carolina League North's first-half title. Now, the FredNats seek to defend their second-half title from last season.

**BACK TO BACK:** The FredNats have rarely lost back to back games this season, especially at home. All three times, however, the FredNats have dropped back to back home games to fellow Virginia teams. Salem has more road wins against the FredNats than any other team this season, beating the FredNats at VACU Stadium in back to back games twice this season.

**A GRAND SLAM FOR THE SECOND HALF:** Monday's transaction brought a familiar face back to Fredericksburg, as INF Jorgelys Mota rejoined the FredNats on a Minor League rehabilitation assignment. Mota, who just turned 21 years old, is responsible for one of the most memorable moments in FredNats history, a walk-off grand slam to secure last season's Carolina League second-half title against the Carolina Mudcats, sending Fredericksburg through to the playoffs during the final series of the regular season.

**BIG LEAGERS:** The FredNats have also added two higher-profile pitchers to the roster, with Alex Young and DJ Herz joining the team. Young first debuted in the Major Leagues with Arizona in 2019, later playing for Cleveland, San Francisco, Cincinnati, and New York (NL). Young returned to Cincinnati last season before surgery took his entire 2025. After electing free agency, he signed with Washington for 2026. Herz is the first Major League rehabber to play for the FredNats this year, coming off Tommy John surgery in 2025. Herz first debuted for Washington in 2024 after being acquired in a trade with the Chicago Cubs, starting 19 games after 10 appearances with Triple-A Rochester.

**A RECORD BREAKING FIRST HALF:** The FredNats' first-half was filled with records in 2026, with final record falling in game 65. Clinching a title on June 7 with a win against Hill City, the FredNats followed their title by winning their 46th game of the first half on Wednesday, besting the 1982 Alexandria Dukes' 45-20 first half to break the franchise's all time wins record in half one.

**SHUTTIES:** The FredNats picked up their seventh shutout of the season Wednesday, again topping the Carolina League. The FredNats' four shutouts in the month of June leads Single-A, one ahead of the Hickory Crawdads.

**THE FRIENDLY CONFINES:** The FredNats have been the top team at home in the Carolina League this year, holding a 23-8 record in FXBG. The FredNats also got off to one of their best starts overall and at home this season, beginning the year 12-1 at home.

**ABOUT LAST YEAR:** The FredNats finished last season at 65-64 overall, winning the North division's second-half title to advance to the playoffs for the second straight year. The FredNats' season ended in a 2-0 series loss to Hill City in the Division Series.

**FREDNATS BASEBALL NETWORK IS BACK:** Once again, all 132 FredNat games this season will be broadcast live on the FredNats Baseball Network, with Luke West Poley and Adam Gotkin beginning their first seasons calling the action in Fredericksburg. Home games are broadcast on MiLB.tv and the Bally Sports Live App to go along with the audio-only stream at frednats.com/broadcast or the MiLB App. For road games, the radio broadcast is available at the same link. In addition, all FredNats games preceded by a 20 minute pregame show and postgame coverage following each night of action.

**A LASTING LEGACY:** The Fredericksburg Nationals adopt the franchise history of their predecessors in the Carolina League dating back to 1978...the Alexandria Dukes (1978, 1980-83) and Alexandria Mariners (1979) played at Four Mile Run Park in Alexandria, Virginia... the Prince William Pirates (1984-1986), Prince William Yankees (1987-1988), Prince William Cannons (1989-1998), Potomac Cannons (1999-2004) and Potomac Nationals (2005-2019) played at G. Richard Pfitzner Stadium in Woodbridge, Virginia...the franchise has won six Carolina League championships, as the Dukes in 1982, as the Yankees in 1989, and as the Potomac Nationals in 2008, 2010 and 2014. The franchise won its first league title as the Fredericksburg Nationals in 2024, defeating the Kannapolis Cannon Ballers and winning the title at Virginia Credit Union Stadium. The franchise has appeared in the Carolina League playoffs in three out of the last four seasons.

# Chris O'Neill - MANAGER

#4

1st Season | Previously: Hitting Coach/Recruiting Coordinator, Virginia Commonwealth University

O'Neill, 36, joins the Nationals organization after two seasons (2024-25) as a hitting coach/recruiting coordinator at Virginia Commonwealth University. Prior to that, he served as an assistant coach and assistant recruiting coordinator at George Washington from 2022-24.

O'Neill is credited with helping fuel major offensive surges at both VCU and George Washington, as both schools set offensive records and contended for Atlantic 10 championships under his watch. O'Neill spent the 2021 season as the director of operations at Duke University and prior to that, he served as an assistant coach at Bucknell University (2020), Marshall University (2018-19) and the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore (2017).

This season will be O'Neill's first time managing since he led the Grand Lake Mariners (Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League) in the summers of 2016 and 2017. A Pennsylvania native, he received his Bachelor's degree in Education from King's College in 2012. O'Neill and his wife Kate have two boys, Easton and Callum.



## Luke Dziados - PITCHING COACH

1st Season | Previously: Pitching Trainer - Driveline Baseball (Tampa, Fla.)

Dziados (D-Zay-Dis), 27, comes to the Nationals organization after spending the last two years as a pitching trainer at Driveline Baseball in Tampa, Fla. He capped his college pitching career at Villanova University in 2023 after pitching at Binghamton University from 2018-20. Dziados earned his Bachelor's degree from Binghamton in 2021 and also earned a Graduate Certificate in Leadership from Villanova in 2023.



## Jake Scheiner - HITTING COACH

1st Season | Previously: INF/OF - Hiroshima Toyo Carp (Nippon Professional Baseball)

Scheiner, 30, played seven seasons (2017-23) in the Phillies and Mariners organizations. He appeared in 658 Minor League games before signing in 2024 with Hiroshima Toyo Carp of Nippon Professional Baseball in Japan. A native of San Mateo, Calif., Scheiner was drafted in the fourth round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft by the Phillies out of the University of Houston.



## Luis Villanueva - ASSISTANT PITCHING COACH

1st Season | Previously: Performance Coach - LAVR Performance

Villanueva, 24, was a performance coach at LAVR Performance where he designed and led throwing programs to improve overall pitching performance for more than 50 athletes prior to joining Washington's coaching ranks. Villanueva attended and played baseball for both Kansas Wesleyan University and MidAmerica Nazarene University.



## Anthony Ray - DEFENSIVE COACH

1st Season | Previously: Hitting/Outfield Coach - Rocky Mountain Vibes (Pioneer League)

Ray, 30, joins Washington after spending the 2025 season as a hitting and outfield coach with the Rocky Mountain Vibes of the independent Pioneer League. He transitioned to the coaching role after 487 professional games across 10 seasons between the St. Louis Cardinals system and independent leagues.



## Isaac Kim - HITTING COACH

1st Season | Previously: Player Development Assistant, California State University, Northridge

Kim, 23, comes to the Nationals organization from California State University, Northridge, where he spent the fall of 2025 as a Player Development Assistant, with a focus on video. As a player, Kim was a First Team All-American and SCIAAC Player of the Year in 2024 at Division 3 Pomona College before transferring to finish his playing career at UC Santa Barbara in the spring of 2025.

ALUMNI UPDATE:

RP - Jose A. Ferrer



**FredNats Career:**

Jose A. Ferrer played for the Fredericksburg Nationals in 2022. The left handed pitcher was lights out, pitching to a 1.42 ERA across 13 games. In 19 innings, Ferrer struck out 24 batters while walking only one. He had a WHIP of 0.68, before being sent up to High-A, and making it all the way up to Double-A Harrisburg before the end of the season. In 2023, Ferrer became one of the first Fredericksburg Nationals to be called up to the Washington Nationals.

**Current Success:**

Ferrer, now with the Seattle Mariners has been one of the best relief pitchers in all of baseball. After being traded from Washington for Harry Ford in December, the LHP has an ERA of 2.87 across 35 appearances with Seattle. The flame throwing lefty has played a big part in the Mariners season so far, as they currently sit in first place of the American League West Division. Ferrer made his big league debut in Washington back in 2023 and has been a consistent bullpen arm in the Majors ever since.
