GWINNETT SERIES: The Bulls won their second straight series, defeating Gwinnett 4-games-to-2, while knocking the Stripers out of first place. The Bulls claimed the series thanks to a comeback victory on Sunday when Durham trailed 5-0 and 6-1. Tatem Levins hit a go-ahead homer in the eighth inning and Dominic Niman earned a save in his Triple-A debut after being added to the staff from High-A Bowling Green Sunday morning. The Bulls hit .271 with nine homers and 12 steals in the series, and pitching to a 4.50 ERA. Durham outscored Gwinnett 37-29. Sunday's win was Durham's first when trailing after seven innings (1-21).

SOUNDS IN TOWN: The Bulls play their first six games of a 18-game season-series against the Sounds. The Bulls were 9-9 against Nashville in 2025 after winning the season series 10-8 in 2024; 12-6 in 2023 and 8-10 in 2022. Nashville joined the International League in 2021 as Milwaukee's Triple-A affiliate. Nashville has won three league championships: 1979 (Double-A Southern League, Reds), 1982 (Double-A Southern League, Yankees) and 2005 (Triple-A Pacific Coast League, Brewers). In 2022, the Durham Bulls blanked Nashville 13-0 to win the International League title in Las Vegas.

UPCOMING: The Bulls head out to Harbor Park to face off against the Norfolk Tides in a six-game series set to begin next Tuesday.

TRANSACTION WIRE: Tampa Bay optioned RHP Chase Solesky to Durham after Monday's game. The Rays outrighted RHP Aaron Brooks to Durham. Solesky made his major league debut on Monday night against Baltimore. RH Joe Boyle was reinstated from his major league rehab and optioned to Durham. Dominic Niman was added to the Bulls' roster ahead of Sunday's game from High-A Bowling Green, collected a save in his Triple-A debut, then returned to the Hot Rods on Tuesday. Late Tuesday, Joe Rock was traded to the Chicago White Sox for IF Oliver Dunn, who had his contract selected and joined the Rays in advance of Wednesday's game against Baltimore.

CONNECTIONS: RHP Easton McGee (2021-2022) and OF Greg Jones. McGee was originally drafted by Tampa Bay in 2016 and appeared in 28 games (23 starts) going 6-9, 5.19 for the Bulls. Jones was Tampa Bay's first round pick in 2019 and appeared in 51 games in 2023 hitting .278 with seven homers and 12 stolen bases.

BLAKE SABOL 6'4 L/R 1/7/98 7(19) USC MLB TIME: 1.048

2026: Made his first Durham Bulls opening day roster.

Bio: 7th round pick (PIT) in 2019 from Southern Cal.

Other: Signed as free agent in Jan, 2026 with Tampa Bay. Prepped at Aliso Niguel HS in Aliso Viejo, CA. Made MLB debut March 30, 2023 with San Francisco. Played three years at USC. Brother Stefan was drafted by Mets in 2012, playing five years in minors. Second cousin to NFL safety Troy Polamalu. First and thus far only MLB Opening Day roster was with San Francisco in 2023 – remained on roster all year after being selected as Rule V pick from Cincinnati. Dad (Rob) played baseball at Long Beach State.

DOM KEEGAN 5'11 R/R 8/1/00 4(22) Vanderbilt MLB TIME: 0.000

2026: Second season with Durham after hitting .241 with 10 HR and 36 RBI in 69 games with Bulls in 2025.

Bio: 4th round (TB) in 2022 from Vanderbilt.

Other: Spent 4 years at Vanderbilt, landing on 1st-team SEC squad. Was injured from Opening Day thru May 12th last season, making his debut in the Florida Complex League before his first game with Durham on May 26th.

TATEM LEVINS 6'1 L/R 5/29/99 8(22) Pitt MLB TIME: 0.000

2026: Made his season (and Triple-A) debut on April 23rd in Lehigh Valley, hitting a solo home run in his first AB (2-0 pitch). Levins then homered in Game 2 of a doubleheader two days later. Matched career-high with 5RBI at Gwinnett May 16 (2-4, 2B, 1B, SF).

Bio: 8th round (Seattle) in 2022 from Pitt.

Other: Acquired by TB from Seattle in November, 2023 in trade for Blake Hunt. Levins spent 2025 at Double-A Montgomery, appearing in 100 games (244-7-54-2) with 77 walks for an OBP of .405. Levins also threw out 40 baserunners (139 SBA). Levins spent his first three collegiate seasons at LaSalle before Explorers program was discontinued. Was a freshman All-American at LaSalle and A-10 Rookie of Year. Three-time all-state swimming selection at Notre Dame HS (PA).

COOPER KINNEY 6'1 L/R 1/27/03 1(21) Baylor School (TN) MLB TIME: 0.000

2026: Started season in Montgomery, hitting .341 in 22 games. Hit 4HR with 13RBI while playing 2B (13) and 3B (6). Had first 2-HR game of career May 16th at Gwinnett (3-4, 2HR, W, 3RBI).

Bio: 1st round (TB) in 2021 from the Baylor School in Chattanooga, TN.

Other: Played 117 games at Double-A Montgomery in 2025, hitting 13HR with 62RBI and an average of .242. He played 14g at 1B, 59 at 2B and 28 at 3B. Missed all of 2022 with torn labrum in right shoulder resulting from injury in spring training diving into first base. Injured another shoulder in 2024 while diving in field which led to another labrum surgery. Tennessee HS Player of Year. Had signed LOI to play at South Carolina.

TONY SANTA MARIA 5'11 R/R 4/6/02 19(24) Rutgers MLB TIME: 0.000

2026: Started season at Bowling Green (A), hitting .289-2-23-15 in 28 games. Promoted to Durham on May 13th.

Bio: 19th round (TB) in 2024 from Rutgers.

Other: Spent first collegiate year at Iona before transferring to Rutgers for final three seasons. Grew up in Absecon, NJ. MAAC all-Rookie team at Iona (.286-1-5-2). Missed most of junior season at Rutgers with injury. Hit .315-.24-126-22 over 3 years in Piscataway, primarily playing 3B.

LOGAN DAVIDSON 6'1 S/R 12/26/97 1(19) Clemson MLB TIME: 0.042

2026: Made first Opening Day Bulls roster.

Bio: 1st round (Oakland) in 2019 from Clemson.

Other: Signed as free agent by Tampa Bay in off-season. Split time in 2025 between Triple-A Las Vegas (Athletics) and Sugar Land (Houston), along with LA Angels (10g) and Athletics (9g). Played HS ball at Providence High in Charlotte. Was everyday shortstop at Clemson. Made major league debut May 24, 2025 with Athletics. Dad (Mark) played baseball at Clemson. Logan was NC Gatorade HS Player of Year.

RAYNEL DELGADO 6'0 L/R 4/4/00 6(18) Calvary Christian HS (FL) MLB TIME: 0.000

2026: Regular in Bulls lineup, making starts at 3B and SS. Drove in season-high 3 runs 4/24 at Lehigh Valley.

Bio: 6th round pick (Cleveland) in 2018 from Calvary Christian HS (FL).

Other: Was Nashville Sounds team MVP in 2025 (281-5-53-40) in 125 games. Hit for cycle on August 19, 2025 against Louisville. 40 stolen bases (8CS) in 2025 were career high. Reached Triple-A Columbus in 2023 & 2024 before spending last season with Milwaukee.

VICTOR MESA JR 6'1 R/R 1/6/02 13(23) Michigan St MLB TIME: 0.000

2026: Opening Day roster with Durham. Placed on IL 4/16 (hamstring). Returned May 20th after three rehab games with Charleston (Low-A).

Bio: Free agent (Miami) in 2018.

Other: Son of Victor Mesa Sr, a longtime player/manager in Cuba (CNS). Brother of Victor Victor Mesa. Both Mesa brothers defected from Cuba in 2018 (Victor Victor, 21/Victor Jr 16), with both signing originally with Miami in 2018. Made MLB debut May 26, 2025. Traded to Tampa Bay on February 6, 2026 (Angel Brachi). Became US citizen February, 2024. Father played in CNS for two decades (late 1970s into the 1990s), played for Cuban national team, managed in Mexico & managed Victor Victor in WBC in 2017.

BRYAN BROECKER 6'1 R/R 1/6/02 13(23) Michigan St MLB TIME: 0.000

2026: Triple-A debut for Bulls catcher came as a pitcher on Opening Night in Charlotte, when got the final out of the eighth inning of an 19-2 loss to Charlotte (0.1IP/OR). Retired LaMonte Wade on flyout to center. Made offensive debut on April 8th as DH v Lehigh Valley (0-4). Made 2nd pro pitching appearance 5/15 @ Gwinnett (1IP/0H/OR/0W/1K). First pro strikeout was against DaShawn Keirse in 8th inning. Made 3rd appearance v Nashville May 20 (1IP/0H/OR/1W/0K).

Bio: 13th round pick (TB) in 2023 from Michigan State. Spent three years in East Lansing, earning all-B1G Freshman honors. Led B1G in CS (20) in 2023.

Other: Prepped at Notre Dame College Prep in Chicago. Spent 2025 at Bowling Green (A+): 209-2-13-1 (63g) playing C and 1B.

HOMER BUSH JR. 6'2 R/R 10/13/01 4(23) Grand Canyon U MLB TIME: 0.000

2026: Opened season on Durham injured list, making one rehab appearance for Charleston (April 18th) before joining Bulls for Triple-A debut April 21 in Lehigh Valley (3-4, RBI, SB). Matched career-high with 4H (4-5) 5/13 at Gwinnett.

Bio: 4th round (SD) in 2023 from Grand Canyon University.

Other: Hit .301 at Double-A Montgomery in 2025 with 57 stolen bases in 69 attempts. Father Homer Sr, spent between 1997 and 2004 in MLB, winning a World Series with the Yankees in 1998. Career spanned New York, Toronto, Florida and culminated back with the Yankees in 2004 (9g).

BROCK JONES 6'0 L/L 3/8/01 2(22) Stanford MLB TIME: 0.000

2026: Opened season at Double-A Montgomery before being assigned to Durham on April 14th.

Bio: 2nd round (TB) in 2022 from Stanford.

Other: Spent nearly two months with Durham in 2025 (April 22nd-June 15th), hitting .151-5-13-5. Spent remained of year at Double-A, hitting .189-8-33-19. Spent freshman season at Stanford also on football team as safety, seeing game time on special teams.

JUSTYN-HENRY MALLOY 6'0 R/R 2/19/00 6(21) Georgia Tech MLB TIME: 1.040

2026: Opening Day roster for Bulls. Began season on 0-29 skid. DFA'd May 9.

Bio: 6th round (Atlanta) in 2021 from Georgia Tech

Other: Acquired by Rays in January (\$) from Detroit. Played in 2023 Futures Game. Spent 2019 & 2020 at Vanderbilt with current Bulls catcher Dom Keegan before transferring to GT. Made major league debut June 3, 2024 with Detroit. Was recalled to Detroit four separate occasions in 2025, appearing in 52 games with the Tigers. Malloy hit .322 with nine homers in 72 games with Triple-A Toledo.

CAM BOOSER 6'3 LHP 5/4/92 MLB: 1.105

2026: Made Opening Day roster for Durham. Had escalator clause in contract at end of spring, leading to Rays placing him on 40-man roster and optioning to Durham.

Bio: Originally signed as free agent (Minnesota) in 2013 after career finished at Oregon State.

Other: Signed by Rays as a free agent in January, 2026. Made MLB debut for Red Sox April 19, 2024. Split 2025 between Chicago (AL) (39g: 2-4, 5.52) and Charlotte (16g: 2-1, 7.36)

ALEX COOK 6'2 RHP 3/29/01 MLB 0.000

2026: Made Bulls Opening Day roster. Placed on injured list May 20th.

Bio: 12th round (TB) in 2022 from Colby College (KS)

Other: Added to 40-man roster at end of 2025 season. Limited to 20 innings in 2025 (R shoulder injury). Appeared in 13g with Double-A Montgomery (1-1, 2.30) after making his Biscuits debut on July 9th.

JOE BOYLE 6'8 RHP 8/14/99 MLB: 1.005

2026: Opening Day Roster for Tampa Bay before IL with R elbow strain after April 8th start vs. Chicago Cubs. Started rehab for May 6th. Is 0-1, 5.17 in 3gs with Rays. Optioned to Durham May 18.

Bio: 5th round (CIN) in 2020 from Notre Dame.

Other: Traded from CIN to OAK in July, 2023 (Sam Moll), then acquired by TB in Dec, 2024 for Jacob Lopez and Jeffrey Springs. Made MLB debut September 17, 2023 for Oakland. Split 2025 between Durham (8-4, 1.88 in 18g/17gs) and Tampa Bay (1-4, 4.67 in 13g/9gs)

MASON ENGLERT 6'4 RHP 11/1/99 MLB: 1.168

2026: Made Opening Day roster for TB. Placed on injured list April 20th with right forearm tightness. Was 0-1, 5.63 in 10g for Rays. Optioned by Rays May 9th.

Bio: 4th round (TEX) in 2018 from Forney (TX) High School.

Other: Made MLB debut March 30, 2023 with Detroit. Claimed on waivers by DET (from TEX) in December, 2022. Rays acquired Englert from DET in February, 2025 for Drew Sommers. Made 29 appearances for Rays in 2025 (0-1, 3.83). Made 14 appearances for Durham in 2025 (1-0, 1.23).

LUIS GUERRERO 6'0 RHP 8/5/00 MLB: 0.155

2026: Made Durham Opening Day roster.

Bio: 17th round (BOS) in 2021 from Chipola JC (FL)

Other: Made MLB debut September 8, 2024 for Boston. Acquired by Rays in November, 2025 for Tristan Gray. Endured knee surgery resulting from throat infection at 1-year-old, spending nine months in hospital, resulting in limited, permanent mobility in right knee. 2023 Futures Game.

JON HEASLEY 6'3 RHP 1/27/97 MLB: 1.029

2026: Rays signed as free agent April 11 after being released in spring training by Kansas City.

Bio: 13th round (KC) in 2018 from Oklahoma State.

Other: Made MLB debut September 17, 2012 with Royals, then made 21 starts in Kansas City rotation in 2022 (4-10, 5.28) in rookie season. Pitched just 16 2/3 innings in 2025 between NW Arkansas/Omaha due to injury.

CAM HILL 6'1 RHP 5/24/94 MLB: 1.112

2026: Made Durham opening day roster.

Bio: 17th round (CLE) in 2014 from Redlands CC (OK)

Other: Made MLB debut July 26, 2020 for Cleveland, appearing in 18 games (2-0, 4.91). Last affiliated game prior to 2026 with Durham was September 30, 2021 pitching for Columbus against Louisville. Induced out of retirement twice. Spent one season as a fill-in pitching coach for University of Illinois in 2024.

BRODY HOPKINS 6'4 RHP 1/18/00 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made first career Triple-A roster. Threw career-high 100 pitches May 16th at Gwinnett (4.2IP/3H/1R/0ER/5W/5K). Had only one start of 90+ pitches in career.

Bio: 6th round (SEA) in 2023 from Winthrop University (SC)

Other: Acquired by TB on July 26, 2024 from Seattle in Randy Arozarena trade. Futures Game selection in 2024. Was OF/P in college, where career started at College of Charleston (2yrs). Played his final year of college ball at Winthrop. Spent 2025 at Double-A Montgomery (5-7, 2.72 in 25 starts). Fanned 141 in 116IP.

KC HUNT 6'3 RHP 7/14/00 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made Rays' organizational debut on March 31 in start against Lehigh Valley.

Bio: Free agent (MIL) in 2023 from Mississippi State

Other: Acquired by TB on March 24, 206 from Milwaukee (Jake Woodford). Spent four years at MSU. Was 7-9, 4.45 in 25 starts at Double-A Biloxi in Brewers organization in 2025. Won 2021 national championship at Mississippi State. Drafted PIT 12 (22), but elected to return to MSU for final season.

EVAN REIFERT 6'4 RHP 5/14/99 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made Opening Day Durham roster for second straight season.

Bio: Free Agent (MIL) in 2020 from Central Missouri.

Other: Spent two seasons at Iowa Western CC before heading to Central Missouri. Acquired by TB for Mike Brosseau ahead of 2022 season. Reifert was selected by Washington in Major League Rule V draft in Dec, 2024, but did not make team and offered back. Was 2-2, 5 with 2.48 ERA in 31 games with Durham in 2025.

CHASE SOLESKY 6'3 RHP 9/26/97 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made first Opening Day roster for Durham. Solesky was selected by the Rays on May 5th, optioned May 8 and did not pitch during his first MLB call-up. Recalled by Rays, then made MLB debut May 18th v Baltimore.

Bio: 21st round (CWS) in 2019 from Tulane.

Other: Acquired by TB as free agent in off-season. Was 6-5, 5.03 in 25 games for Rochester (WASH) in 2025. Solesky pitched for three years at Tulane University.

ANDREW WANTZ 6'4 RHP 10/13/95 MLB: 2.069

2026: Made Opening Day roster for Durham.

Bio: 7th round (LAA) in 2018 from UNC-Greensboro

Other: Grew up in nearby Holly Springs, NC playing for the Golden Hawks baseball team. Made MLB debut on July 4th, 2021 for LAA, spending portions of 2021-2024 seasons with Los Angeles. TB signed to two-year minor league deal as Wantz recovered from right elbow injury, making his Rays organizational debut on August 16th at Bowling Green, then for Durham on September 1, 2025.

KODI WHITLEY 6'3 RHP 2/21/95 MLB: 1.157

2026: Made Opening Day roster for Durham. Placed on injured list May 17th.

Bio: 27th round (STL) in 2017 from Mt Olive College

Other: Grew up in Clayton, NC, about an hour's drive from DBAP. Made MLB debut on July 26, 2020 for St. Louis, appearing in 43 games over three seasons. Signed by Tampa Bay to minor league deal after release from St Louis as recovered from injury that cost him all of 2024 and half of 2025. Made Durham debut July 20, 2025.

LOGAN WORKMAN 6'4 RHP 12/6/98 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made second straight Opening Day roster for Durham. Was Durham's Opening Day starter in Charlotte.

Bio: 7th round (TB) in 2021 from Lee University (TN).

Other: Workman was #2 in ERA, #2 in IP, 3rd in HRA and #1 in K in International League in 2025.

DOMINIC NIMAN 6'5 RHP 12/15/00 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made Triple-A debut May 17th (Save v GWN) after being added from High-A Bowling Green (0-0, 3.60). Season started with Low-A Charleston (2-0, 4.85) in first month. Reassigned to Hot Rods on May 20th. Collected save in Triple-A debut at Gwinnett May 17th.

Bio: 18th round (TB) in 2024 from Kentucky

Other: Spent four years at Central Connecticut State before transferring to Kentucky for his graduate year.

TREVOR MARTIN 6'5 RHP 12/15/00 MLB: 0.000

2026: Made first Opening Day roster with Durham. Selected to make his MLB debut April 20th v Cincinnati. Recalled again May 14th.

Bio: 3rd round (TB) in 2022 from Oklahoma State

Other: Grew up in Asher, OK, a town of less than 1,000. Father, Michael, made first-ever flight to Tampa to see his son make debut (2.1IP/2H/1ER/0W/2K). Was added to Rays' 40-man ahead of selection.

TY JOHNSON 6'6 RHP 9/25/21 MLB: 0.000

2026: Activated from IL on May 6th and made his debut 5/7 v Round Rock (3.1IP/3H/0R/1W/5K).

Bio: 15th round (CUBS) in 2023 from Ball State

Other: Was 7-6, 2.61 in 26g/20gs at Double-A Montgomery in 2025 (110IP/149K). Was #2 in Southern League in ERA, #2 in Ks, #2 in WHIP (0.94) and #1 in BA (.174). Was 15-8, 5.39 over three seasons at Ball State. Acquired by TB in July, 2024 from Cubs in Isaac Paredes trade. Attended Lawrenceville North HS (IN)
