EXECUTIVES



LOU DIBELLA

MANAGING PARTNER

Lou DiBella currently serves as Managing Partner of the Richmond Flying Squirrels, overseeing all aspects of the Flying Squirrels operations in Richmond over the past 15 years, including creating the Flying Squirrels' current ownership group and formalizing the franchise's move to Richmond from Norwich, Conn. Prior to the relocation of the franchise, DiBella served as President & Managing Partner of the Connecticut Defenders and, previously, the Norwich Navigators. In that role, which he held from 2005-09, he fostered the relationship that continues today between the Flying Squirrels franchise and the San Francisco Giants.

While he led baseball's return to Richmond, DiBella's name continues to be synonymous with World Championship Boxing. He enjoyed an outstanding 11-year run at HBO Sports, where he was the backbone of the division that vaulted HBO Boxing to signature programming status. HBO Boxing flourished under his leadership, televising many of the biggest prizefights in the history of the sport. DiBella recruited and signed a bevy of boxing stars for HBO, including such champions as Oscar De La Hoya, Roy Jones Jr. and Lennox Lewis. He also revolutionized the sport as creator of the critically acclaimed "Boxing After Dark" television series, providing underexposed fighters the opportunity to advance their careers on a national stage.

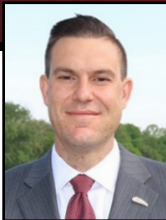
In May of 2000, he launched DiBella Entertainment (DBE), a full-service sports and entertainment company. DBE continues to be one of the most successful companies in boxing, and DiBella has been lauded in the boxing community for fighting the contractual exploitation of boxers by promoters. DBE adheres to the following mission: to create a business model that shifts the balance of power from promoters to boxers and establishes a legacy of matchmaking excellence to elevate the sport of boxing. Past and present boxers represented by DiBella Entertainment include current WBC Middleweight champion Sergio Gabriel Martinez, former middleweight world champions Jermain Taylor and Bernard Hopkins, former junior welterweight titleist Paulie Malignaggi, and WBC Welterweight champion Andre Berto.

In January 2005, DBE launched DBE Productions. Through that outlet in 2007, DBE Productions produced the documentary, "Magic Man," which depicted the life of Paulie Malignaggi and his rise in the world of boxing. In 2006, DiBella made his acting debut, depicting himself as a boxing promoter in "Rocky Balboa." In 2008, he added the credit of Executive Producer to his list of accomplishments with the 2009 film "Love Ranch," starring Academy Award winners Helen Mirren and Joe Pesci. In 2010, he was credited as Associate Producer of the critically acclaimed film "The Fighter," starring Mark Wahlberg and Christian Bale. The film centers around the early life of "Irish" Micky Ward, who cemented his legacy with three legendary fights against Arturo Gatti, while a fighter with DBE. In 2019, DiBella was named to the International Boxing Hall of Fame.

BRENDON PORTER

PRESIDENT

Brendon Porter became the Flying Squirrels' President prior to the start of the 2024 season. He was a member of the Richmond front office from 2010-2017, most recently serving as Assistant General Manager of Sales. He also worked with the Flying Squirrels' predecessor, the Connecticut Defenders, for four seasons before relocating to Richmond along with the franchise in 2009.

In addition to his role with the Flying Squirrels, Porter is the Chief Operating Officer of the Montgomery Biscuits, the Double-A affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays in the Southern League. He has been with the Biscuits since 2017.



BEN ROTHROCK

CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER

A charter member of the Flying Squirrels front office, Ben Rothrock is in his fourth season as the team's Chief Operating Officer and his 25th overall in Minor League Baseball. He also served as the Flying Squirrels' general manager for eight years from 2017-2025.

Upon joining Richmond in 2010, Rothrock oversaw the Squirrels Nest Team Store and helped build the Flying Squirrels into one of the top-selling brands in all of Minor League Baseball. In 2011, Rothrock took over the reins of the Food & Beverage operation while overseeing the Merchandise Department. Then, after serving as Assistant General Manager of Operations for three seasons and guiding the Flying Squirrels through various ballpark renovations and enhancements, he earned the role of General Manager during the 2017 season. Rothrock became the Flying Squirrels' Vice President in 2020. His career in baseball began as an intern with the Altoona Curve, where he later worked as the Director of Merchandise. He also previously worked as the Director of Merchandise for the State College Spikes and Myrtle Beach Pelicans prior to joining the staff in Richmond.

The Lewistown, Pa., native is a graduate of Liberty University in Lynchburg, Va., where he received a B.S. in Sport Management and a minor in Business Management while playing linebacker on the Flames' football team.



ANTHONY OPPERMANN

GENERAL MANAGER

Anthony Oppermann was named the Flying Squirrels' General Manager in March 2025. A member of the Flying Squirrels original staff, he served as the Director of Media and part of the original broadcast team from 2009-2012. Oppermann returned to Richmond as the Executive Director of Marketing from 2017-2022 and was the Chief Marketing Officer from 2023-2025.

Oppermann has spent parts of 16 seasons in professional baseball including time with the Round Rock Express, Daytona Cubs, Potomac Nationals, Reading Fightin Phils and Houston Astros. Prior to returning to the Flying Squirrels in 2023, he was the Communications and Marketing Manager for the Galveston Bay Foundation in Kemah, Texas.

A native of La Grange, Texas, Oppermann is an alum of TCU.



PARNEY

SENIOR ADVISOR

Todd "Parney" Parnell serves as the Senior Advisor for the Richmond Flying Squirrels.

One of the most recognizable figures in Minor League Baseball, Parney helped guide the Flying Squirrels to prominence as one of the top franchises across the country from the team's first season in 2010, regularly leading Double-A and the Eastern League in attendance while building a reputation locally as a valued community partner.

Parney is a three-time Eastern League Executive of the Year, earning the honor with Richmond in 2013 and 2019. He also won the award in 2004 while serving as the General Manager of the Altoona Curve, a role he held for seven seasons from 2002-2008. Parney was also named Baseball America's Minor League Executive of the Year in 2012 with Richmond.

Prior to the effort to bring baseball back to Richmond, Parney was the President of Greenberg Sports Group (GSG), which managed the overall operations of the State College Spikes (New York-Penn League) and the Myrtle Beach Pelicans (Carolina League). He was previously the president of both franchises. Prior to those roles, Parney was the Vice President/General Manager of the Kannapolis Intimidators (South Atlantic League), previously the Piedmont Boll Weevils, from 1997-2001, where he was the 1999 South Atlantic League General Manager of the Year.

Parney graduated from Messiah College in 1988 with a degree in physical education and a minor in business. He resides in Richmond with his wife, Tonia, and their three daughters, Lindsay, Samantha and Madison.

Dennis Pelfrey returns to the Flying Squirrels as the club's manager for the 2026 season, his fifth year managing at the Double-A level. He spent the 2021 season as the manager for the Eugene Emeralds, champions of the High-A West. He is the first manager to lead the Flying Squirrels for four or more seasons and holds the franchise record for the most managerial wins in team history.

Pelfrey was born in Arlington, Texas. He graduated from Bowie High School in Arlington, where he played baseball and football and was teammates with former major leaguer Vernon Wells. He attended Northwood University's Cedar Hill, Texas campus for his collegiate career. Pelfrey played six professional seasons in independent leagues from 1999-2004. He was a manager and coach in independent leagues beginning in 2011 prior to joining the Giants organization in 2020.

PLAYING CAREER

Pelfrey played collegiate baseball as a shortstop for the Northwood University Knights, which was an NAIA program in Cedar Hill, Texas.

He began his professional playing career as a shortstop in 1999 with the Rio Grande Valley WhiteWings of the independent Texas-Louisiana League at the age of 21, hitting .225 with three homers and 16 RBIs in 53 games.

The following season, Pelfrey signed with the Dubois County Dragons in Huntingburg, Ind., for the team's second season in the independent Frontier League. That year, he moved over to primarily playing second base.

Pelfrey returned to Dubois County for the 2001 season under new manager Greg Tagert and played most of his games at third base while also spending time at second base and shortstop. He hit .290 with six homers as the Dragons won the western division title and reached the Frontier League playoffs for the first time.

In 2002, Pelfrey spent a third season with Dubois County under new hitting coach Andy Haines, brother of current Giants Director of Player Development Kyle Haines and now the hitting coach for the Milwaukee Brewers. That season, Pelfrey had the best offensive year of his career, hitting .297 with five homers and 55 RBIs. The Dragons repeated as champions of the Frontier League's western division that year.

Following the 2002 season, the Dragons moved to Wisconsin and became the Kenosha Mammoths. Heading into the 2003 season, Pelfrey transitioned to a new defensive position as a catcher. He won the starting catcher job to begin the year, but he missed part of the season with a broken collarbone after a collision at home plate. He was selected as a Frontier League All-Star that season.

Pelfrey returned to his home state of Texas in 2004, signing with the Fort Worth Cats of the independent Central League. He played 52 games before rejoining Tagert with the Springfield/Ozark Ducks, which had moved to Missouri from Wisconsin that year, to finish the season and his playing career.

Over six professional seasons, Pelfrey played 412 games and hit .256 with 26 homers and 182 RBIs.

MANAGERIAL/COACHING CAREER

In 2006, Pelfrey began his coaching career at South Grand Prairie High School in Texas, where he also taught a business computer class. He held that position for eight years through 2015.

He continued that role as he moved into his professional coaching career in 2011. That year, Pelfrey joined Greg Tagert, his former manager for most of his playing career, with the Gary SouthShore RailCats in Indiana as the club's hitting coach. Current Giants' Director of Player Development Kyle Haines was an infielder for Gary in 2011 and 2012. He spent four seasons with the RailCats, including the team's American Association championship run in 2013, when they defeated the Wichita Wingnuts in the title series.

Pelfrey earned his first managerial job in 2015 when he was hired to lead the Florence Freedom in Kentucky of the independent Frontier League, a role he held for five seasons through 2019. Under his direction, the Freedom posted a .500-or-better record in four seasons.

In his first season in 2015, the Freedom edged the Evansville Otters for a spot in the postseason, but fell late in a one-game playoff to the River City Rascals. The following year in 2016, Florence posted the lone losing record of Pelfrey's managerial career to date, going 46-49.



In 2017, the Freedom posted a league-best 61-34 record in the regular season. After beating the Washington WildThings in the opening round of the playoffs, Florence fell to the Schaumburg Bombers, managed by Pelfrey's former teammate Jamie Bennett, in the championship series.

Florence narrowly missed the playoffs in 2018, going 49-47 in the regular season.

Pelfrey led Florence back to the postseason in his final Frontier League season in 2019, tying the top record in the league at 57-39. The Freedom swept the Lake Erie Crushers in the first round of the Frontier League playoffs, but dropped a decisive fifth game in the finals to the River City Rascals.

Entering the 2020 season, Pelfrey was hired by the San Francisco Giants to manage the organization's High-A affiliate in San Jose. The onset of the COVID-19 pandemic canceled the season and delayed his affiliated baseball managerial debut.

Pelfrey pivoted back to Kentucky for the summer. Like the Minor League Baseball season, the pandemic canceled Frontier League play in 2020. Teams in Florence and Lexington created a four-team league dubbed the "Battle of the Bourbon Trail," which included the Florence Freedom, Florence Y'all's, Lexington Legends and Lexington Layendas. Pelfrey managed the Freedom. The league included Giants minor leaguers Logan Wyatt, Tyler Fitzgerald and Simon Whiteman.

Minor League Baseball went under a significant realignment entering the 2021 season, and the Giants picked up a new High-A team with the Eugene Emeralds in Oregon. After initially being hired to manage San Jose in the canceled 2020 season, Pelfrey was named the manager of the Emeralds for 2021.

The Emeralds went 69-50 in the inaugural High-A West regular season, finishing in first place, a half-game ahead of the Spokane Indians. Eugene cruised by Spokane in the High-A West Championship Series, three-games-to-one, closing out the title with a 5-0 shutout in Game 4.

On March 3, 2022, Pelfrey was officially announced as the Flying Squirrels' manager.

In his first season with Richmond, he led the team to their first postseason appearance since 2014, a feat they accomplished again in his second year in 2023. It was the first time in franchise history the Flying Squirrels reached the playoffs in consecutive years.

In 2024, Pelfrey was appointed to manage the Scottsdale Scorpions of the Arizona Fall League, comprised of prospects from the Giants, Tigers, Mets, Pirates and Blue Jays organizations. After starting the season 5-12, Pelfrey guided the Scorpions to an 11-2 finish over their final 13 games to reach the AFL postseason.

Pelfrey became the first manager in the franchise's history to lead the team for a fourth season in 2025. On May 23, 2025, the Flying Squirrels picked up a 6-1 win at Binghamton for Pelfrey's 217th win in Richmond, passing Dave Machemer for the most managerial victories in the team's history.

Paul Oseguera returns to the Flying Squirrels for his fifth season in Richmond. He previously served in the same role with the Low-A San Jose Giants in 2021.

Oseguera was hired by the Giants in 2020 and assigned as the pitching coach for the short-season Salem-Keizer Volcanoes before the Minor League Baseball season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He spent the 2021 campaign as the pitching coach for the Low-A West-champion San Jose Giants. Under his direction, San Jose's pitching staff led the league in ERA (3.59) and strikeouts (1,439). In 2022, Richmond's pitching staff set a franchise record for strikeouts (1,367), the fourth-most for a team in Eastern League history. Flying Squirrels pitchers

set a team record with a .236 opponents' batting average in 2023.

As a player, Oseguera was selected in the 16th round of the 2006 MLB Draft by the Giants out of UCLA. A native of La Jolla, Calif., he spent four seasons in the Giants system from 2006-2009, reaching as high as Double-A Connecticut. He spent part of 2010 with the Oakland Athletics organization. He played three seasons with the independent Bridgeport Bluefish from 2010-2012, earning an Atlantic League All-Star selection in 2012. Oseguera was also a Mexican League All-Star with Broncos de Reynosa in 2013 and 2015. He also played with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks in Japan in 2013 and 2014. He was selected in the 47th round of the 2002 MLB Draft by the Texas Rangers out of La Costa Canyon High School, but opted to attend UCLA.

In 2024 and 2025, Everidge was the minor league hitting coordinator for the Washington Nationals. He spent the 10 years coaching with the Oakland Athletics organization from 2014-2023, serving as a minor league hitting coach from 2014-2021, including stops with short-season Vermont Lake Monsters (2014-15), High-A Stockton Ports (2016-17), Double-A Midland RockHounds (2018-20) and Triple-A Las Vegas Aviators (2021). In 2022 and 2023, he was the Athletics' major league hitting coach under manager Mark Kotsay.

As a player, Everidge played at Sonoma Valley High School in the Bay Area before an All-American career at NCAA DII Sonoma State University. He was selected by Oakland in the 10th round (307th overall) of the 2004 MLB Draft and spent seven years in the minors with the Athletics from 2004-10. Everidge hit at least 20 homers in four consecutive seasons from 2006-09, including leading the California League with 26 homers in 2007 with Stockton. In 2008, he led the Texas League with 115 RBIs with Midland. He was a Northwest League All-Star in 2004 with Vancouver, a Texas League All-Star in 2008 and 2009 with Midland and was named the MVP of the Kane County Cougars in 2005. Everidge reached the majors with the Athletics in 2009 and played 24 games after being called up in late-July. His first MLB hit came in his debut on July 28, 2009, against the Red Sox at Fenway Park, when he drove an RBI double against Jonathan Papelbon in a three-run ninth to help force extras in an Oakland win. In 2010, he split the year between Triple-A Sacramento (Oakland), Tacoma (Seattle) and Round Rock (Houston). Everidge played two seasons with the independent Lancaster Barnstormers to conclude his career in 2011 and 2012. He was named the 2011 Atlantic League Player of the Year and set a league record with 69 extra-base hits.

Lippo Nava enters his 19th year with the Giants organization and his sixth overall on the Richmond coaching staff, his third consecutive year in the role of fundamentals coach. He also coaches first base during Flying Squirrels games.

He was previously Richmond's fundamentals coach in 2019 with manager Willie Harris. He first joined the Flying Squirrels' coaching staff in 2017 as their hitting coach on Kyle Haines' staff. Nava was the fundamentals coach with Eugene in 2021 on Dennis Pelfrey's staff as they won the High-A West (Northwest League) title. In 2022, he managed the Low-A San Jose Giants, his fourth stint with that team, and led them to an appearance in the California League playoffs. Prior to his first run with the Flying Squirrels, Nava was San Jose's manager in 2016 and the club's hitting coach from 2013-15. He was the hitting coach for Low-A Augusta from 2008-10 and managed the team from 2011-12, leading the GreenJackets to the SAL postseason in 2011. Nava began his coaching career as the hitting coach for the independent Newark Bears in 2007, helping the team to a championship as it set an Atlantic League record with a .302 team batting average.



Nava has also spent several seasons as the manager of Águilas del Zulia of Liga Venezolana de Béisbol Profesional (Venezuelan Winter League) in his hometown of Maracaibo. He is one of only six managers in the league's history to win the Manager of the Year Award twice, earning the recognition after leading the team to a championship in the 2016-17 season and again in 2024-25 after the team returned to the post-season after a five-year drought. In the 2022-23 season, Nava was the bench for for Leones del Caracas as they won the LVBP championship. In 2026, he was the third-base coach for Team Italy in the World Baseball Classic.



As a player, Nava was selected by the Seattle Mariners in the 14th round of the 1990 MLB Draft out of Miami Dade College. An infielder, he played with the Mariners organization through 1994, reaching as high as Double-A. He joined the Boston Red Sox organization in 1995 and spent part of the year in the Eastern League with the Double-A Trenton Thunder. After playing in 1996 with the Rio Grande Valley WhiteWings of the independent Texas-Louisiana League, he signed with the Chicago Cubs in 1997 and spent the year with Triple-A Iowa. He played in the independent Atlantic League for the Somerset Patriots from 1998-2000, the first three years of the franchise. Nava split the 2001 season between Rojos del Aguila de Veracruz and Algodoneros de Union Laguna of the Mexican League before returning to the Atlantic League with the Camden Riversharks in 2002 and 2003. He briefly played for the Macoto Cobras of the Chinese Professional Baseball League in Taiwan in 2004 before a stint in 2005 with the Langosteros de Cancun in Mexico. Nava closed his playing career with two more Atlantic League seasons, returning to Camden in 2005 and the Newark Bears in 2006. His last official professional playing appearances were over 10 games with Caribes de Oriente of the LVBP in the 2006-07 season.

RICHMOND PROFESSIONAL BASEBALL PARKS

VIRGINIA PARK (1884-1885): Located within the bounds of present-day Monument Avenue, Stuart Circle, Park Avenue and Allen Avenue, Virginia Park hosted the Richmond Virginias of the American Association in 1884, Richmond's lone season of major league baseball. The Virginias played one more season in 1885 as a member of the Eastern League.

MAYO ISLAND PARK/ISLAND PARK (1890, 1892): The first ballpark on the island opened in 1890 and hosted a variety of teams as well occasional major league exhibitions.

WEST END PARK (1894-1896): Located near the end of the Main Street car line around present-day Laurel Street, it hosted the Richmond Crows of the Virginia League in 1894 and the Richmond Bluebirds for the next two years, also in the Virginia League.



BROAD STREET PARK I (1897-1912): Located on Broad Street between Lombardy and Allen, this 6,000-capacity ballpark was 295 feet to left field, 560 feet at one point in center and 340 feet in right. The ballpark hosted crowds reported as high as 19,000. During its time, the first Broad Street Park hosted the Richmond Johnnie Rebs/Giants of the Atlantic League in 1897, the Richmond Bluebirds of the Atlantic League in 1898 and 1899, the Richmond Colts (which also went by the Laymakers for part of a season) of the Virginia League from 1906-1912. It also served as the site of the Philadelphia Phillies' spring training in 1903.

BROAD STREET PARK II (1913-1916): Built on railroad-owned land at the corner of Addison and Broad, the second Broad Street Park was first home of the Richmond Colts of the Virginia League in 1913 and 1914. In 1915, the Richmond Virginians, or Climbers, of the International League moved in and played there for two seasons. Following the 1916 season, the railroad needed the land to build a new terminal, which is now the Science Museum of Virginia, and the team moved to the Boulevard.



LEE PARK/BOULEVARD FIELD (1912, 1917-1920): In 1912, Richmond added a team in the "outlaw" United States League and Lee Park was built to serve as the club's home. The league folded in June, ending the Richmond Rebels' brief run. Five years later, the park was purchased, renovated and expanded as the new home of the Richmond Virginians, or Climbers, and it was renamed Boulevard Field. The Richmond Colts returned as a member of the Virginia League in 1918 and played there through 1920. The ballpark was located at the corner of Boulevard and Moore Street between Summit Avenue.



MAYO ISLAND PARK/TATE FIELD (1921-1941): Baseball returned to Mayo Island as the new home of the Richmond Colts of the Virginia League in 1921. The ballpark was located on the east side of the island near the Mayo Island Bridge (14th Street Bridge) against the railroad tracks. The ballpark was named for Pop Tate, a former major league catcher, in 1926. The Virginia League Colts played there through 1928 before returning in 1932 and playing Richmond's first night game that year. From 1933 to 1941, the Colts played at Tate Field as members of the Piedmont League. In 1931, the Richmond Byrds of the Eastern League played at Tate Field in 1931 but had to move some games to City Stadium because of flooding.



MOOERS FIELD (1942-1953): Located in a plot between Rosenath, Norfolk, Belleville and Carlton in the northern corner of Scotts Addition, the 4,000-capacity ballpark was home of the Richmond Colts of the Piedmont League from 1942-1953. The ballpark was named for owner Eddie Mooers, who was also a player and manager for the team at one time. The stadium was used for auto racing after Parker Field opened in 1954.



PARKER FIELD (1954-1984): When the St. Louis Browns relocated to Baltimore, the International League Orioles moved to Richmond and became the Virginians in 1954. Parker Field, located at the current location of The Diamond and at the old state fairgrounds, was converted for baseball that year. The Virginians later became the Triple-A affiliate of the New York Yankees and played at Parker Field through 1964. When the Milwaukee Braves relocated to Atlanta in 1966, their top affiliate, the Atlanta Crackers, moved to Richmond and played at Parker Field through 1984.



THE DIAMOND (1985-2025): The Diamond was built at the site of Parker Field during the 1984-1985 offseason and served as the home of the Richmond Braves through 2008. In 2010, the Richmond Flying Squirrels, Double-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants, played their first season. Spanning four decades, The Diamond operated longer than any ballpark in the city's history.



CARMAX PARK (2026-present): A new home for professional baseball in Richmond is set to open for the Flying Squirrels' 2026 season. It will also host hundreds of events year-round. CarMax Park will blend nods to Richmond's history with modern, state-of-the-art amenities.

The Flying Squirrels and Gray Media have partnered to televise six games during the 2026 season on CW Richmond, beginning with the team's home opener on April 7.



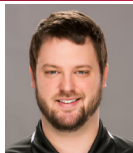

BROADCASTERS

Trey Wilson (Eighth Year)

Trey Wilson returns for his eighth year in Richmond dating back to the 2019 season and his 16th overall in Minor League Baseball.



Prior to coming to Richmond, Wilson spent the previous four seasons as the Director of Communications and Broadcasting for the Altoona Curve (Double-A - Pittsburgh Pirates) from 2015-18. Wilson began his minor-league broadcasting career with the Appalachian League's Bluefield Blue Jays (Rookie - Toronto Blue Jays) and spent 2014 with the Midwest League's Lansing Lugnuts (Single-A - Toronto Blue Jays).

He held multiple positions in the athletic department at Bluefield College from 2010-15, spending parts of six years as the school's lead broadcaster for football, basketball, baseball and volleyball while helping launch the Rams Digital Sports Network and serving as the Assistant Director of New Media & Sports Information.

Wilson also previously wrote for Fox Sports-affiliated Scout.com, covering minor league prospects in the Appalachian League. He also spent parts of two years as an intern in the sports department at WVVA, an NBC-affiliated television station, where he covered Virginia Tech, Marshall and West Virginia University among other collegiate and high school programs. Wilson has also done freelance work voicing collegiate national championship events across the United States and high school state championship events in Virginia, Maryland and Washington, D.C. From 2021-2024, Wilson was the television play-by-play broadcaster for Longwood University's men's basketball program on ESPN+.

A native of Portsmouth, Va., Wilson enjoys traveling, U.S. history and playing music. He earned a bachelor's degree in communication and journalism from Bluefield University. Wilson currently resides in Goochland.

Blaine McCormick (Sixth Year)

Blaine McCormick is back with the Flying Squirrels for his sixth season in Richmond dating back to the 2021 season and his seventh broadcasting in Minor League Baseball.



McCormick spent the 2019 season as a broadcaster and media relations coordinator for the Boise Hawks (Short-season affiliate of the Colorado Rockies) in Boise, Idaho. In 2017 and 2018, McCormick was with the Bourne Braves of the Cape Cod Baseball League as a field reporter and play-by-play broadcaster. McCormick called multiple sports for BlazeRadio and Pac-12 Plus while at Arizona State University. He also served as a sports reporter for Arizona PBS/Cronkite News. In the non-baseball season, McCormick broadcasts multiple sports for the University of Richmond. He called each of the last three NCAA Tournament appearances for the Spiders women's basketball team.

A Grand Junction, Colo. native, McCormick enjoys the outdoors, golfing and exploring Virginia. He graduated with honors with a bachelor's degree in sports journalism and a minor in geography from the Walter Cronkite School of Journalism and Mass Communication at Arizona State University. He and his wife, Valerie, reside in Midlothian.

Riley Trapp (First Year)

Riley Trapp joins the Richmond booth for his first season with the Flying Squirrels and first in Minor League Baseball.



Trapp spent the 2024-25 seasons as the Broadcast Director and Media Relations Coordinator for the Martinsville Mustangs of the Coastal Plain League. In 2024, Trapp was named the CPL Broadcaster of the Year. Trapp led the Mustangs broadcast crew to the League's 2025 Broadcast Stream of the Year Award. He was a broadcaster and media relations intern for the Burlington Bees of the Prospect League in 2023. Trapp called multiple sports for KCOU 88.1 FM, the student voice of the Missouri Tigers. He was also a reporter and producer at KMOU, an NBC affiliate if Columbia, Mo.

A Barrington, Ill. native, Trapp enjoys fishing, golfing, collecting baseball cards and watching the Missouri Tigers, where he has been a football season ticket-holder for six years. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in Broadcast Journalism from the Missouri School of Journalism at the University of Missouri.
