TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and Oklahoma City Baseball Club meet for game two after Oklahoma City overcame a ninerun defecit to win, 17-13 ... Albuquerque has dropped fourstraight to Oklahoma City ... Thomas Ponticelli is expected to start for the Isotopes while Dodgers' right-handed pitcher Walker Buehler is slated to make a rehab start for Oklahoma City.

BLOWN LEAD: The Isotopes held a nine-run lead, 12-3, after five frames, matching the biggest blown lead in a loss in team history (other: Sept. 1, 2010 vs. lowa; Held 12-3 lead in sixth inning and scored nine in ninth frame for 15-13 triumph).

COMBINED RUNS: The 30 combined runs last night are tied for the 7th-highest scoring game in Isotopes history (other: June 12, 2011, vs. Nashville, 16-14 win; Aug. 20, 2012, vs. New Orleans, 20-10 loss).

DOUBLE-DIGITS: Last night was the 81st time, third time in 2024, both teams scored double-digits runs at Isotopes Park in team history and fall to 40-41.

HITS: The Isotopes registered a season-high 21 hits yesterday, the most since Sept. 9, 2023, vs. Reno when they tallied 23 ... The 40 combined hits were three short of the team record set three times (last: June 24, 2017, vs. El Paso, 14 innings).

RUNS IN A FRAME: The nine runs allowed in the eighth inning last night are tied for the season-high relented in a frame (April 12 vs. Sugar Land, 7th inning).

BACK-TO-BACK: The Isotopes hit back-to-back blasts in the first frame last night (Sam Hilliard followed by Hunter Goodman) for the first time since July 3, 2023, vs. El Paso when Jonathan Morales and Aaron Schunk completed the feet.

SWIPES: Albuquerque swiped three bags last night, giving them a stolen base in five-straight games, second-longest streak of the year (long: seven, March 29 – April 5). They have stolen multiple bases three times during the stretch and nine times on the year. ... Tallied 32 swipes on the year, the fourth-most in Triple-A.

THREE-BAGGERS: Drew Romo tripled in the 5th inning last night, the team's Triple-A-leading 13th three-bagger of the year. The club has a three-bagger in nine of 22 games.

BY WAY OF THE K: The Isotopes' 226 punchouts are third-most in Triple-A (most: Norfolk, 229).

NO WALKS: The Isotopes drew no walks last night for the first time since Aug. 17, 2023, vs. El Paso.

IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman tied career-highs with four hits and five RBI last night. Belted his seventh homer and doubled twice, his eighth career game with two doubles. Has a six-game hitting streak, slashing .379/.400/.1.103 with three doubles, six homers and 15 RBI. It was his eighth multi-hit game of the year. Has driven in multi-RBI in six of his last eight contests. ... Has 21.5 percent barrel rate (14 barrels/65 BBE).

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck ended a three-game hitless streak with three base knocks yesterday, all singles. It's his fourth contest of the year with at least three hits and first since tying a career-high with four hits April 18 at El Paso ... Has 15.6 percent barrel rate (10 barrels/64 BBE) ... Has 14 barrels lead all of Triple-A. His 10 barrels are tied for 5th in all of Triple-A

TONY: Drew Romo extended his streak to 11 games (team lead) with a double and a triple. The 11-game streak is also tied for the fourth-longest active hit streak in Triple-A (longest active: 15 Orelvis Martinez, Buffalo). During the stretch, he is slashing .386.400/.500 with three doubles, a triple and seven RBI.

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes registered a season-high three hits with one RBI over five at-bats. It's his eighth multi-hit contest of the year and first since April 18 at EI Paso.

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron singled and has hit safely in all 10 games he has appeared in this season, setting a new career-high. Has just one knock in his last nine contests. Herron's previous longest streak was nine, reached from Sept. 2-10, 2023 with the Isotopes ... During this stretch, he is slashing .297/.409/.486 with two doubles, one triple, one homer and seven RBI. The 10-game streak is also tied for the sixth-longest active hit streak in Triple-A (longest active: 15 Orelvis Martinez, Buffalo).

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk tallied a hit last night to extend his hitting streak to 10 games. During the stretch, he is slashing .366/.413/.488 with five doubles and 10 RBI.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard connected on his third homer of the year last night and first since April 14 vs. Sugar Land. He is now just one shy of tying Jordan Patterson's team record for homers.

TRIPLE-A LEADERBOARD: Jordan Beck is T-3rd in runs (20), T-7th in XBH (13), T-8th in RBI (21) ... Hunter Goodman is 1st in XBH (18), T-2nd in doubles (10), 3rd in total bases (58), T-6th in homers (6) and 7th in RBI (22) and slugging (.690) ... Julio Carreras is T-3rd in triples (3).

RUNS: The 13 runs plated by Albuquerque last nightare the second-most this season (most: 15, March 31 vs. El Paso).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
