Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Yorman Gomez** to the mound today, looking to avoid an 0-2 series start for the first time since 7/18 vs. Indianapolis. The Indians will counter with RHP **Noah Davis**. Columbus is 52-38 (.578) versus right handers this year. Davis has pitched against the Clippers five times in his career, going 0-1 with a 4.76ERA (17.0IP, 12H, 10R, 9ER, 12BB, 12K).

vs. the Indians

Columbus is 7-9 against Indianapolis this year, posting a -23 run margin (9-9, +13 in 2025; 12-5, +45 in 2024; 10-8, -23 in 2023; 12-8, +53 in 2022). Since the start of the 2022 season, the Clippers are 18-10 (.643) in games against Indianapolis that are decided by at least five. Individually, **Cooper Ingle** is 19x66 (.288) with 3HR, 9RBI in 19G vs. Indy in his career (**Milan Tolentino** has 6HR, 21RBI in 33G).

Start with a Bang

Over the last 23G, the Clippers have plated 177 runs (most in the IL, 7.7 per), with 118 (67%) tallied in the first four innings of the game, including nine innings of 5+. The opposition has only 54 in the first four innings of the last 23G, but is outscoring the Clippers 90-59 thereafter. Columbus is the only undefeated team in the IL when leading after the 7th (48-0, 58 straight since 8/22/25 vs. Omaha).

Homer Time

Last night marked the first homerless game for Columbus since 8/15 and the third in the last 25G (0HR in each of 3G prior). Dating to 7/28, they have hit more homers (57) than any team in pro ball, while giving up the 5th most (48; leads IL). Clipper games have seen 4.6 homers per contest in the last month with only one completely homerless game (8/15 vs. Omaha; 18G with 0HR among first 98).

Ingle is Back

In 33G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 42x128 (.328), drawing 30BB (.453OBP) with 16XBH (6HR, .547SLG). He is the only batter in the IL hitting .300/.400/.500 (16PA from permanently qualifying for rate statistics), but is just 8x48 in his last 14G (.167; has drawn 19BB for a .403OBP, also has 21K in 67PA). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.298OPS (15HR) in 45G (.627OPS, 3HR in 38G between DH and LF).

Little Heaters

Daniel Schneemann has six multi-hit games since 8/15 (14x29, 483) and, dating to 4/25/24, he has played 53G in the IL, batting .330/.451/.576 with 50 runs scored (21 runs in last 17G) and 37RBI (6RBI in last 17G). **Kyle Manzardo** has hit safely in each of 8G since 8/15 (.333, 11x33, 2HR, 12RBI) and with his pair of doubles last night giving him 64XBH in his Clipper career (50 singles, .560SLG).

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralph Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (16, +6), RBI (33, +8) and SLG (.964, +214). In fact, his 16HR (in 22G) are as many as Indy has hit since 7/28 (24G). He is the reigning IL Batter of the Week (.455, 6HR and 12RBI vs. St. Paul), has reached in 16 straight (.472OBP since 8/4) and, aside from going 0x21 in 6G at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .345/.419/.721 since 6/18 (19HR, 47RBI).

All or Nothing

Over his last 22G, since 7/25, **Kody Huff** is mired in a 15x77 (.195) slump, though he has connected for 6HR (19HR on the season; had 18HR in career prior). He leads the team in runs (73) and RBI (68) and is set to become the fourth 70-70 Clipper since 2019 (**Johnathan Rodriguez**, **Jhonkensy Noel**, **Juan Brito**). He was 4x4 Sunday and enters today on a 15G on base streak (.354OBP since 8/2).

Rough Stuff

In the last 10 days, **Milan Tolentino** (.120, 3x25), **Blake Perkins** (.095, 2x21), **Alfonsin Rosario** (.125, 2x16) and **Dayan Frias** (.000, 0x13) have combined to hit .093 (7x75), though Tolentino has a pair of bombs (38 since start of '25, 2nd most in IL) and Perkins has one. The quartet has managed only 5BB (6%) against 35K (43%) in 81PA. Last night, sans Rosario, they were a combined 0x12 (7K).

Problems on the Back End

Since allowing 7ER in 4.1IP at Lehigh Valley on 7/12, the Clipper bullpen has registered an IL-worst 7.71ERA in 33G (140.0IP, 120ER). Clipper relievers have surrendered 37HR in that time (most in the IL, +4 on 2nd) and they have not put together a scoreless outing since back to back games vs. Louisville (7/4-7/5). Columbus starters have a 4.95ERA since 7/12 (10th in the IL; 32HR allowed is most, +7).

This Date in Clipper History

8/26/1981

Steve Balboni clubbed his 30th HR of the season as Columbus topped Toledo 2-0. **Gene Nelson** kept the Mud Hens in check, striking out 10 in 8.1IP. Balboni became the 1st Clipper ever to top the 30HR plateau, eventually setting the franchise record at 33 in the '81 season (currently 2nd to **Brian Dayett**, 35HR in 1983). To date, only eight Clippers have ever hit 30HR in a season, with Balboni accomplishing the feat twice.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,494 to 1,439).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 178-140 (.560) in pitch reviews, with batters going 92-84 (.523) and pitchers/catchers going 86-56 (.606). They have run out of challenges in 47G and have not challenged in 6G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 845, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 145 through 124G (on pace for 172SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 43CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (51; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 175 runs while crafting a .888OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 118 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +57 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 291-183 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 80 grand slams and 1,989RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.51 through 124G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 211HR (2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 67G this season (40-27, .597), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 12th most games decided in the last at bat (27, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 101G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-53 (.475, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 452-464 (.493), 422-418 with Columbus (.502).

500K

Gomez surpassed 500K in his career last time out (504K, 488.0IP). He has seen his strikeout rate tick up this season (25.1%, 59K to 235BF between Rookie League and Triple-A; 24.7% in career prior), but his walk rate has increased with it (12.8%, 30BB; was at 9.1% prior). Nearly a month ago, on 8/1 vs. Toledo, **Trenton Denholm** picked up his 500th career strikeout (542.1IP; **Logan Allen** collected his 500th minor league strikeout two days prior, 7/30 vs. Toledo, 399.0IP).

Injury Delay:

Gomez was slated to make his Triple-A debut during the season-opening series at Iowa, but injured his shoulder in his last preseason bullpen to wind up on the shelf (missed 72G; Clippers went 40-32). He was sent to Arizona at the end of May to rehab, appearing in 4G for the Guardians.

Bad Bookends:

On 7/19 vs. Indianapolis, Gomez gave up a career worst 7ER to add over two runs to his season ERA (5.06 to 7.08). He then locked in at St. Paul on 7/25 (5.1IP, 0ER) and 7/31 vs. Toledo (5.1IP, 1ER) to shave over two runs off his ERA (7.08 to 4.94), before allowing a new career worst of 9ER at Syracuse on 8/8 (ERA jumped back to 6.82). Gomez surrendered 4HR to the Mets on 8/8 (20BF) and gave up 2HR in each of 3GS from 7/2-7/19 (59BF; had 0HR to 40BF from 7/25-7/31).

Racking Up Strikeouts:

Since his Triple-A debut on 6/20, Gomez has averaged 9.4K/9IP, good for the 8th best rate in the IL (45K, 43.0IP; **Trenton Denholm** is 7th at 9.7K/9IP). In terms sheer numbers, his 45K rank 18th in the IL (Denholm is 1st, 58K, and **Logan Allen** is 19th, 44K). As a team, the Clippers have the 8th most strikeouts in the league since 6/20 (452K in 52G, 8.8 per game; ranked 12th in the IL prior, 630K in 72G, 8.8 per).

House of Horror:

Through his first six weeks in the IL, Gomez pitched at Omaha, Lehigh Valley and St. Paul, accumulating a 1.93ERA (14.0IP, 3ER) and holding hitters to a .146 average (7x48) with a .333SLG (2HR). He was then greeted rudely in a loss at Syracuse on 8/8 (3.1IP, 9ER, 4HR). Gomez has also struggled in Huntington Park, registering a 7.36ERA (25.2IP, 21ER), while opponents have hit .293 (29x99) with a .586SLG (8HR).

Right Stuff:

While in the Rookie League, Gomez mowed down opposing right-handers, racking up 10K against 21BF (48%; 4K to 23BF on the left side, 17%). When they did put the bat on the ball (5x20, .250), righties notched 3XBH (all doubles; .400SLG), compared to 0XBH from lefties (5x17, .295). His strikeout rate in Triple-A is fairly even (23K against 99BF from the left and 22K vs. 92BF from the right), but right handers are still teeing off when they do connect (21x78, 8HR, .654SLG).
