**MY BETTER HALF:** The Great Lakes Loons have clinched a spot in the Midwest League playoffs for the ninth time in their 16-year history. Great Lakes became the second team in MiLB to secure a postseason berth. The Loons secured their best half in franchise history with a 45-20 mark, a .692 winning percentage in the first half. Besting the 2010 Loons who went 47-23 in the second half - a .671 winning percentage.

This year is the third season the Loons attained 30 wins through the first 50 games of the season (35). The other two, 2019 (31-19) and 2010 (30-20).

**TEN... AGAIN! :** The Loons won 10 consecutive games from May 24 to June 3, matching a franchise record. It was the fourth time in franchise history Great Lakes has achieved a double-digit winning streak. The three other instances were all 10 straight. April 26-May 6, 2019, June 3-15, 2015 and June 11-20, 2009.

**SHATTERING RECORDS IN ROCK COUNTY:** Great Lakes made history on Tuesday, May 30 setting four franchise records in their 20-0 win over the Beloit Sky Carp. The most runs scored in a game, the largest margin of victory, the most doubles as a team in a single-game with 10 and the most extra-base hits notching 13. Seven Loons had multi-hit games and every player in the starting lineup had at least one hit.

**SERIES SUCCESSION:** The Loons won seven straight series from April 25th to June 11th going 33-12 over that time. It is the first time the Loons have done that since the six-game series schedule was instituted in 2021. April 25th to May 23rd, 2019 was the last time Great Lakes won seven straight, four three-game sets and three four-game series.

**WINS TOP TO BOTTOM:** The Los Angeles Dodgers minor league affiliates have the best combined record in baseball. The Loons have the best mark in High-A and are the first team to 60 wins. Great Lakes has a .638 winning percentage and a +101 run differential.

**Fever Pitch:** Great Lakes Loons pitching has the lowest ERA (3.46) in High-A. The Loons are second behind the Hudson Valley Renegades (High-A New York Yankees) for the fewest hits allowed (649) and the lowest opponents batting average (.215).

**Oh What a RUSH:** Dalton Rushing currently ranks first in the Midwest League in OBP (.419) and tied for second in OPS (.867) in 68 games played. The 22-year-old represented the Dodgers and the National League at the 2023 MLB Futures Game in Seattle on July 8th.

**CROWN JEWEL FOR CHRIS NEWELL:** Chris Newell has powered 21 home runs in 82 games. Newell has six through his first 41 games with Great Lakes after being called-up on May 30th. The 22-year-old started the season with the Low-A Rancho Cucamonga Quakes where he hit 14 homers in 41 games.

Newell ranks tied for sixth in home runs in Minor League Baseball. Shay Whitcomb and Tyler Hardman leads the Minors with 26 home runs. Whitcomb is currently on the Sugar Land Space Cowboys (Triple-A Houston Astros) and Hardman plays for the Somerset Patriots (Double-A New York Yankees).

## Loons Coaching Staff

### MANAGER

#### **Daniel Nava**

The Los Angeles Dodgers announced Daniel Nava as the Loons' tenth manager in the 16-year history of the franchise. Nava, 39, enters his third year coaching in the Dodgers organization after managing the ACL Dodgers in 2021 and serving as bench coach for Single-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2022. The switch hitting outfielder played parts of seven seasons in the Major Leagues and won a World Series in 2013 as a key contributor for the Boston Red Sox. In that championship season for Boston, Nava finished eighth in the American League in batting average (.303). He famously powered a grand slam on the first pitch he saw in his Major League debut in June 12, 2010 for the Red Sox. Nava, a native of Redwood City, CA, also played in the big leagues for the Tampa Bay Rays (2015), Los Angeles Angels (2016), Kansas City Royals (2016) and Philadelphia Phillies (2017). He finished his Major League career with a .266 batting average, .357 on-base percentage, 29 home runs and 206 RBIs. His final professional season as a player was in 2019 with the independent Kansas City T-Bones. After playing baseball at St. Francis High School in Mountain View, California, Nava enrolled at Santa Clara University. He attempted to walk-on to the baseball team unsuccessfully and became the equipment manager. After two years, Nava enrolled at the College of San Mateo, a junior college, due to no longer being able to afford Santa Clara's tuition. Santa Clara would bring Nava back on a full scholarship after being an All-American at San Mateo. Despite a stellar senior season, Nava went undrafted, and signed with the Chico Outlaws of the now defunct Golden Baseball League in 2007. His 1.100 OPS there led to the Red Sox discovering and signing Nava to a minor-league deal, after Boston paid the one dollar rights fee.

### PITCHING COACH

#### **David Anderson**

David Anderson continues his rise through the ranks of the Dodgers organization as the pitching coach for the Loons for a second season. Anderson, 27, joined the L.A. system as a development coach in 2020, and was assigned as the pitching coach for the organization's Arizona Complex League team in the 2021 season. He led his staff to the fourth-lowest ERA in the ACL at 4.06, the third-most strikeouts (617 in 488.0 innings pitched), and the second-best walks and hits per innings pitched. Anderson, a 2015 graduate of Muhlenberg College, got his start in coaching at his alma mater, serving as pitching coach for the NCAA Division III school in Allentown, Pa., for two years immediately after his graduation. After that, he became a volunteer assistant for Cornell in 2017 before landing at Atlanta's Emory University, serving as the school's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. While in the college ranks, Anderson also got head coaching experience in summer collegiate ball as manager of the Watertown (N.Y.) Rapids of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League in 2018, leading the team to a 26-21 record in its inaugural season. He then went on to manage the now-defunct Fayetteville (N.C.) SwampDogs of the Coastal Plain League in 2019. Anderson, a native of Syracuse, N.Y., tossed four seasons at Muhlenberg. As a junior in 2014, he posted a 3.14 ERA over 63.0 innings, all as a starter. He walked just seven batters that season while striking out 28. He served as team captain as a senior, and led the team that year in innings pitched and strikeouts. After college, Anderson tested the waters in independent baseball. He appeared 16 times for the Newburgh Newts of the North Country Baseball League, with a stellar 2.38 ERA and seven saves. He then threw to a 2.67 ERA with the Bridgeport Bluefish of the Atlantic League, an MLB Partner League.

### PITCHING COACH

#### **Richard De Los Santos**

Richard De Los Santos returns for a second year as a member of the coaching staff after serving as Assistant Pitching Coach last season. This year, Anderson and De Los Santos will share the title of Pitching Coach. The 38-year-old De Los Santos had a nine-year minor league career as a right-handed pitcher, mostly in the Tampa Bay system. He played a portion of the 2005 season for the Southwest Michigan Devil Rays in Battle Creek, who would be purchased in 2006 by the Michigan Baseball Foundation and become the Loons in 2007. De Los Santos pitched in 36 games over three seasons for Triple-A Durham, racking up 99 strikeouts in 169 1/3 innings at MiLB's highest level. Over the course of nine seasons in affiliated baseball, the Dominican Republic native accumulated up over 400 strikeouts on the mound.

### HITTING COACH

#### **O'Koyea Dickson**

O'Koyea Dickson, 33, returns to Dow Diamond in a coaching role after spending the 2012 season as a player with the Loons. He was drafted in the 12th round of the 2011 draft by the Dodgers, and made his Major League debut with the club in 2017. 2023 marks Dickson's second year coaching in the Dodgers organization after he worked with Manager Nava with Single-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2022 as the team's Hitting Coach. The 2022 Rancho Cucamonga team had the most hits and RBIs in the California League under Dickson's direction. The California native made his Major League debut in September of 2017 for the Dodgers, and appeared in a total of seven games after an injury cut his time in Los Angeles short. His lone hit in the big leagues came off Madison Bumgarner of the San Francisco Giants on September 23, 2017. He hit 24 home runs and drove in 76 runs in that 2017 season for Triple-A Oklahoma City. For the next two years, Dickson had stints in Nippon Professional Baseball, the Atlantic League, the Mexican League and the Pacific Association before entering coaching. Notably in 2007, as a fifteen year old sophomore at George Washington High School, Dickson became the first high-schooler to hit a home run at Oracle Park, then AT&T Park.

### BENCH COACH

#### **Elían Herrera**

Former Loon Elían Herrera is back for a third season as the bench coach for Great Lakes. Herrera, a four-year big leaguer, begins his fifth season as a coach within the Dodgers' organization. The second baseman played over 20 games with the Loons in a span of two separate seasons, including the inaugural 2007 Great Lakes Loons, along with nine other future Major Leaguers. He also returned to the Loons for a portion of the 2009 season. From 2012-2018, Herrera played in 324 games at the AAA level, holding a .310 batting average in nearly 1200 plate appearances. Herrera made his major league debut on May 15, 2012 at Dodger Stadium, in a game where Kirk Gibson managed the Arizona Diamondbacks vs. Don Mattingly's Dodgers. Before joining the Loons staff in 2021, Herrera was the bench coach for the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in 2019, helping lead the team to the playoffs after an 81-57 finish in the regular season, good for first in the South division of the California League.

**Stuff:** Fastball works 90-94 and plays up due to a high release point. Changeup is a split-finger grip that looks very similar out of his hand compared to the fastball. Curveball is a big over-the-top 12/6 style breaking ball that works 76-79 and has been considered his best secondary pitch from most of his career. Slider was developed in high school and works 81-84.

**Acquired:** In a 2020 MLB trade deadline deal on August 31 from the Toronto Blue Jays for major league pitcher Ross Stripling. Williams was one of two PTBNLs acquired by the Dodgers in the deal (1B/OF, Ryan Noda).

**Draft:** Taken in the 2nd round of the 2019 draft by the Toronto Blue Jays with the 52nd overall pick. Signed for \$1.55 million (slot: \$1.4M). Williams decided to sign with the Blue Jays forgoing a commitment to pitch at Vanderbilt - a commitment he made very early in his HS career just after his freshman season.

**High School:** Relocated from his home in Mississippi halfway through his sophomore year in January of 2017 to IMG Academy in Bradenton, Florida. In the fall of 2016, Williams was in Jupiter, FL for a tournament and a scout from IMG was there and asked if Kendall and his family wanted a tour of the facility. Within a few months, he was enrolled. Pitching at IMG accelerated his pro process especially after posting a 0.91 ERA and earning 2nd team All American honors from MaxPreps.

**Social Savant:** Williams is very active on instagram with over 60,000 followers at just 22 years old. He is currently partnered with Rawlings and New Balance. Some of his content features his dog Kodak, a husky mix.

**Hometown:** Olive Branch, MS is in the NW corner of Mississippi right on the MS/TN border outside of Memphis.
