Reading Fightin Phils 2025 End of Season Notes

General

- 2025 was the 58th year of Reading Fightin Phils baseball as an affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies (since 1967)
 - o 70th year of affiliated baseball at America's Classic Ballpark
- Finished with a 55-81 record, which was 12th in the Eastern League
 - Went 25-42 in the first half and 30-39 in the second half
- 2025 was the fifth-straight season the Fightin Phils finished under .500 and the fifth year in a row that Reading did not qualify for the postseason (last playoff appearance was 2019)
- 2025 marked the 75th Anniversary of FirstEnergy Stadium (formerly Municipal Stadium and GPU Stadium)
- Posted the second-fewest wins (55) in a single-season in franchise history
 - o The 2021 team won 48 games, but only played 113 games
 - o 2008 R-Phils won 53 games
- As a Phillies affiliate, Reading has played 8,063 games and holds a 4,035-4,028 record (.501 winning percentage)
- Including the Reading Indians and Reading Red Sox, the franchise has played 9,877 games and holds a 4,988-4,889 record (.505 winning percentage)
- The Fightin Phils welcomed 396,455 fans to FirstEnergy Stadium this season, which finished second amongst all Double-A teams for the second-straight season
 - o That marked ranked as 19th out of 120 full-season Minor League teams
 - o Reading welcomed an average of 6,007 fans per game
 - o Six-of-66 openings saw 8,000+ fans in attendance
 - o 23-of-66 openings saw 7,000+ fans in attendance
 - o The highest attended game was 9,691 fans vs New Hampshire on May 17
 - Ranked as the 21st-most attended game in ballpark history
 - The night featured the first-ever post-game drone show

Roster Breakdown

- In total, 66 players suited up in at least one game for the Fightin Phils this season, which is down from the 71 who played for Reading in 2024
 - o 32 hitters and 34 pitchers
- 19 players from the Fightin Phils were promoted to Triple-A Lehigh Valley during the 2025 season
- No players from the 2025 Fightin Phils made it to the major leagues this season
 - But three players from prior R-Phils teams made their debuts this season: Otto Kemp ('24), Mick Abel ('22-'23) and Robinson Pina ('24)
- Five players with prior MLB service time played for Reading this season

- o Seth Beer, John McMillon, Matt Manning, Wil Crowe and Jose Rodriguez
- The Fightin Phils received no major league rehabs from the Phillies this season
- Of the Phillies Top-30 prospects (as of 10/1/25), 11 of them played for the Fightin Phils in 2025
 - Aidan Miller (2), Aroon Escobar (5), Dante Nori (6), Moises Chace (8), Jean
 Cabrera (11), Carson DeMartini (13), Keaton Anthony (15), Caleb Ricketts (22),
 Kehden Hettiger (23), Eiberson Castellano (24) and Dylan Campbell (28)

Offense

- The Fightin Phils finished the season with a .239 average, which was tied for third in the Eastern League
 - Reading's other offensive ranks were: fourth runs (602), fourth hits (1,058), second doubles (245), tied for eighth triples (21), third home runs (118), fifth RBI (551), fifth walks (518), third fewest strikeouts (1,138), fourth stolen bases (173), fourth on-base percentage (.324), third slugging percentage (.385) and third OPS (.709)
- Reading's 245 doubles were the most in a season since 2016 (270) and ranked as sixth most in a single-season in franchise history
- 118 home runs were the fewest in a season since 2015 (101)
- Nine sacrifice bunts were the second-fewest in franchise history
 - o Seven in 2023
- 173 stolen bases were the second most in a single-season in franchise history
 - o Stole 272 bases in 1983
- Led the Eastern League in times caught stealing (53)
 - o Most in a season since 2019 (56)

Pitching

- The Fightin Phils finished 12th in the Eastern League in ERA (4.58) for the secondstraight season
 - Reading's other pitching ranks were: 12th shutouts (3), ninth saves (31), second-most hits (1,104), most runs (693), most home runs (134), sixth-most walks (516), fifth-most strikeouts (1,219), 11th WHIP (1.39) and second-highest average against (.247)
- Posted the third most strikeouts in single-season franchise history (1,219)

Fielding

- The Fightin Phils finished the season tied for 10th in the Eastern League in fielding percentage (.973)
 - o Committed the second-most errors in the league at 129
 - Was tied for ninth in double plays turned with 86

• Catchers threw out 17.5% of would-be base stealers (38-217)

Al Pedrique

- Was named the John Vukovich Award winner by the Philadelphia Phillies
- Through three seasons, 11 players who played under Pedrique went on to play in the Big Leagues following their times in Reading
 - Drew Ellis, Johan Rojas, Orion Kerkering, Oliver Dunn, Tyler Phillips, Max
 Lazar, Seth Johnson, Sam Aldegheri, Mick Abel, Otto Kemp and Robinson Pina
- Through three seasons, has 173 wins, which ranks as ninth in R-Phils history
- Is one-of-nine managers to lead the Fightin Phils for three-or-more seasons
- Has a 173-236 overall record, which is tied with Tony Taylor (1985) for a .423 winning percentage, the lowest in franchise history

- Assigned to Lehigh Valley (AAA) on Apr. 17 and placed on 7-day IL with left wrist hamate bone fracture (transferred to 60-day IL on May 16)

Keaton Anthony

- Appeared in 49 games with Reading, slashing .330/.380/.522 (.902 OPS), with 23 runs, 21 doubles, one triple, four home runs and 29 RBI

 - o .362/.406/.543 (.949 OPS), 11 doubles12 RBI
 - o Was the sixth-longest on-base streak in the Eastern League this season
- On May 7 at Binghamton, had four hits, two doubles, a home run and five RBI

Zach Arnold

- Appeared in seven games with Reading, slashing .148/.138/.185 (.323 OPS), with one run, one double and five RBI
- Assigned to Reading on Aug. 5 and re-assigned to Jersey Shore (A+) on Aug. 20 for remainder of the season
- Over 83 games with Jersey Shore, hit .202 (56-277), with 33 runs, eight doubles, nine home runs and 29 RBI
- Had two hits twice, going 4-7 in those two games, and went 0-20 in other five games
- Hit a game-winning double on Aug. 12 vs Akron

Seth Beer

- Appeared in 30 games with Reading, slashing .190/.283/.314 (.597 OPS), with 15 runs, four doubles, three home runs and 10 RBI
- Signed by the Phillies on May 13 and assigned to Reading; released on July 1
- Also played in 66 games with Long Island of the Atlantic League
- Posted a six-game hit streak from May 15-21; had a seven-game hit streak from June 4-13
- Hit a game-winning home run on May 18 vs New Hampshire

Colton Bender

- Appeared in one game (Apr. 30 vs Harrisburg), going 0-3 with a strikeout
- Signed by the Phillies on Apr. 18 and assigned to Lehigh Valley (AAA)
- Assigned to Reading on Apr. 22 and released on May 5

Alex Binelas

- Received R-Phils Clutch Player Award as he hit .339 (20-59) with runners in scoring position
- Appeared in 68 games with Reading, slashing .265/.372/.425 (.797 OPS), with 34 runs, 10 doubles, one triple, eight home runs and 37 RBI
- Posted a nine-game hit streak from June 29-July 12; hit .294 (10-34) over the streak
- Had a season-high 17-game on-base streak from July 25-Aug. 30, which was tied for the third-longest on-base streak on Reading this season
 - O Also posted two 10-game on-base streaks (9/3-14 and 6/6-19), along with a nine-game on-base streak (6/29-7/12)
- Had two home runs on June 19 vs Hartford
- Began season with Worcester (AAA) in Boston's system, was released on May 23
- Signed with the Phillies on May 26 and was assigned to Reading, where he remained for the season

Josh Breaux

- Appeared in 14 games, slashing .209/.277/.372 (.649 OPS), with five runs, two doubles, one triple, one home run and three RBI
- Began season with Lehigh Valley (AAA) and assigned to Reading on May 6; was reassigned to Lehigh Valley on June 9 for remainder of the season
- Posted three hits, including a triple, on May 8 at Binghamton
- Hit his lone home run with Reading on May 17 vs New Hampshire

- Posted two hit-streaks of seven games (July 30-Aug. 6 and Aug. 12-21)
- Had a season-high 12-game on-base streak from July 29-August 12 and a 10-game on-base streak from Aug. 31-Sept. 11
- Posted a season-high three hits on Aug. 1 at Hartford
- Hit his first Double-A home run on July 4 at Somerset
- Appeared in 58 games in CF and five in LF; had one error over 181 total chances (.994 fielding percentage)
 - o Posted a team-high eight outfield assists (7 CF and 1 LF)

Carson DeMartini

- Appeared in 66 games, slashing .202/.291/.288 (.579 OPS), with 37 runs, 10 doubles, three triples, two home runs, 22 RBI and 27 stolen bases
- Began season with Jersey Shore (A+), assigned to Reading on June 9 for remainder of the season
- Placed on the 7-day IL on Sept. 5 and missed remainder of the season
- Selected to play in the Arizona Fall League
- From the time of his promotion on June 10 through the end of the season, had the fifth most steals in the Eastern League (27)
- Amongst all Phillies Minor Leaguers, ranked seventh in hits (106), tied for second in triples (4), tied for sixth in walks (59), ninth in total bases (164), tied for eighth in runs (71) and fourth in stolen bases (45)
- Had a season-high seven-game hit streak from Aug. 6-13; hit .323 (10-31) over the streak
- Posted a season-best 16-game on-base streak from June 20-July 11; was tied for the fifth longest on-base streak on the team this season
- Had a season-high three hits on June 12 vs New Hampshire
- Compiled two doubles on June 24 at Richmond
- Hit his first Double-A home run on July 6 at Somerset
- Stole a career-high three bases on three occasions (all within five days): Aug. 2 at Hartford; and Aug 6 and 7 at New Hampshire
- Appeared in 52 games defensively at 3B and 11 at SS

- Began season with Tacoma (AAA) in Seattle's system; traded to Phillies on June 14 for cash considerations and assigned to Reading
- With Lehigh Valley (AAA) from June 19 to July 9; remained with Reading for remainder of the season
- Had a season-high seven-game hit streak from Aug. 12-21 (.321 AVG)
- Posted a 12-game on-base streak from Aug. 6-21 (.426 OBP)
- Had a season-high three hits, along with a home run and two RBI on Aug. 6 at New Hampshire
- Hit two home runs on Aug. 20 at Altoona; also had four RBI in the game
- Slugged a walk-off grand slam on Sept. 12 vs Somerset in the bottom of the 13th inning

Aroon Escobar

Trent Farquhar

- Appeared in 37 games, slashing .197/.333/.283 (.616 OPS), with 15 runs, five doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI and 11 stolen bases
- After beginning season with Reading, was re-assigned to Jersey Shore (A+) on May 27 for the remainder of the season
- On the 7-day IL with BlueClaws from June 7 to August 1
- At the time of his reassignment, was sixth in the Eastern League in walks (25) and tied for 10th in stolen bases
- Had a seven-game hit streak from Apr. 13-22
- Posted a 10-game on-base streak from May 15-25, was active at time of reassignment
- Hit a grand slam home run on May 10 at Binghamton

- On 7-day IL from Apr. 10 to May 6, which included a rehab assignment with Jersey Shore (A+)
- Promoted to Lehigh Valley (AAA) on Aug. 27 for remainder of the season
- Posted a season-high 11-game hit streak from July 3-26
 - o Slashed .462/.523/.692 (1.215 OPS) over streak
- Had an 18-game on-base streak from June 21-August 1, which was the second-long onbase streak by a Fightin Phil this season
 - o Slashed .406/.479/.609 (1.088 OPS) over streak
- Hit .308 (33-107) over 29 home games
- Over 14 July games, slashed .388/.464/.571 (1.035 OPS)
- Appeared in 38 games at catcher, had four errors over 329 total chances (.988 fielding percentage)

Hendry Mendez

- Named an Eastern League All-Star as an outfielder
- Appeared in 85 games for Reading, slashing .290/.374/.434 (.808 OPS), with 44 runs, 13 doubles, three triples, eight home runs and 46 RBI
- Traded to the Minnesota Twins on July 31, along with Geremy Villoria for Harrison Bader
- Selected to play in the Arizona Fall League after the season
- With Wichita (AA), hit .324 (36-111), with a .911 OPS over 33 games to finish the season
- At time of trade to Minnesota, Mendez was fourth in the Eastern League in batting average (.290), fifth on-base percentage (.374), 10th slugging percentage (.434), eighth OPS (.808) and tied for seventh hits (86)
- Was tied for seventh amongst Phillies Minor Leaguers in triples with three
- Posted a season-high 15-game on-base streak from May 11-27, had a .390 OBP over streak
- Also posted two 10-game on-base streaks (7/12-29 and 6/6-17)
- Hit for what is believed to be the first cycle in Fightin Phils history on June 20 vs Hartford; was a season-high four hits
- Had 12 games with three-or-more hits
- Posted 32 multi-hit games over 85 games played (38%)

Aidan Miller

- Named an Eastern League All-Star at Shortstop
- Received Pepsi Stolen Base Leader Award
- Finished with 52 stolen bases, which led the Eastern League and ranked seventh in single-season franchise history
 - o First Fightin Phil to steal 50+ bases since Jose Leiva in 1987
 - First Fightin Phil to lead the league in stolen bases since Anderson Machado (49) in 2003
 - o Fifth R-Phil in franchise history to lead the league in stolen bases
- Led the Eastern League in walks with 73; first Fightin Phil to lead the league in walks since Oliver Dunn (82) in 2023
 - o Was the fifth player in franchise history to lead the league in walks
- Appeared in 108 games with Reading, slashing .259/.382/.427 (.809 OPS), with 74 runs, 25 doubles, two triples, 13 home runs, 41 RBI and 52 stolen bases
- Promoted to Lehigh Valley (AAA) on Sept. 9 for remainder of season; hit .333 (9-27), with one home runs and seven stolen bases over eight games with IronPigs
- Selected to play in Arizona Fall League after the season
- Finished the season third in the Eastern League in on-base percentage (.382), 7th OPS (.809), tied for eighth doubles (25), first walks (73), ninth extra-base hits (40), 10th total bases (173), second runs scored (74) and first stolen bases (52)
 - Had the second most stolen bases amongst all Double-A players
- Amongst Phillies Minor Leaguers, was fifth in average (.264), tied for seventh home runs (14), second on-base percentage (.392), fourth slugging percentage (.433), third OPS (.825), fifth hits (114), third doubles (27), first walks (82), third extra-base hits (43), fifth total bases (187), tied for second runs scored (82) and first stolen bases (59)
- Posted a season-high 10-game hitting streak from May 11-24; hit .333 (12-36) over streak
 - O Also had a nine-game hit streak from 8/14-24 and 7/27-8/6
- Had a season-best 17-game on-base streak from Aug. 14 to time of promotion on Sept. 7
 - Over on-base streak, slashed .403/.543/.726 (1.269 OPS)
- Named Phillies Minor League Hitter of the Month of August
- Named Eastern League Player of the Week on Aug. 11 and 25
- Hit a career-high two home runs on Aug. 21 at Altoona
- Posted 11 games with two stolen bases

Robert Moore

- Over 81 games with Reading, slashed .199/.284/.320 (.604 OPS), with 36 runs, 17 doubles, one triple, five home runs and 31 RBI
- With Lehigh Valley (AAA) from Aug. 4-20; hit .222 (6-27) with a home run and four RBI over eight games
- On Apr. 15 vs Binghamton, had three hits, three runs, two home runs and five RBI
- Other three hit came on May 8 at Binghamton
- Appeared in six games defensively at center field, which were the first games in the outfield in his career
- Also appeared in games at 2B (33), 3B (25) and SS (12)

Andrick Nava

- Appeared in 24 games with Reading, slashing .176/.278/.221 (.499 OPS), with four runs, three doubles and seven RBI
- Traded to Milwaukee Brewers on July 17 and assigned to Wisconsin (A+)
- Hit .219 (14-64) over 19 games with Timber Rattlers
- Had a season-high three hits and two RBI on May 22 at Portland

Dante Nori

- Appeared in five games with Reading, hitting .190 (4-21), with a triple and two stolen bases
- Began the season with Clearwater, slashed .262/.363/.381 (.744 OPS) over 109 games, with 16 doubles, 11 triples, four home runs, 43 RBI and 37 stolen bases
- Promoted to Jersey Shore (A+) on Aug. 26 and hit .279 (12-43) over 11 games with BlueClaws, along with 13 stolen bases
- At time of promotion to High-A, was fourth in Florida State League in average (.262), third on-base percentage (.363), sixth slugging percentage (.381), fourth OPS (.744), first hits (111), second triples (11), tied for fourth walks (66), tied for sixth extra-base hits (31), third total bases (161), third runs (63) and tied for fifth stolen bases (37)
- Finished the season tied for the third most doubles amongst all full-season Minor Leaguers with 12
- Amongst all Phillies Minor Leaguers, had the sixth-highest batting average (.261), seventh on-base percentage (.361), third hits (127), first triples (12), fourth walks (75), sixth total bases (181), tied for sixth runs (72) and second stolen bases (52)
 - o His 12 triples were eight ahead of second place in the Phillies organization
- Selected to play in the Arizona Fall League after the season
- Had three hits, along with a triple on Sept. 14 vs Somerset in the final game of the season

Leandro Pineda

- Appeared in 105 games, slashing .211/.320/.364 (.684 OPS), with 46 runs, 22 doubles, one triple, nine home runs and 37 RBI
- Was tied for eighth in doubles amongst Phillies minor leaguers
- Posted a season-high nine-game hit streak from May 15-23
 - Over the streak, slashed .433/.485/.633 (1.118 OPS), with six doubles and three RBI
- Had a season-best 16-game on-base streak from Aug. 10 to Sept. 5 (.492 OBP)
- On May 17 vs New Hampshire had a season-high three hits, along with two runs, a double and RBI
- Hit his lone triple of the season on Aug. 17 vs Akron
- Drove in a season-high three runs three times (6/17, 8/17 and 8/21)
- Stole a season and career-high three bases on Aug. 7 at New Hampshire

Elio Prado

- Appeared in 23 games with Reading, slashing .200/.278/.275 (.553 OPS) with nine runs, three doubles, one home run and eight RBI
- Assigned to Jersey Shore (A+) on May 13, where he hit .222 (30-135) over 43 games
- Released by the Phillies on July 19
- His lone home run came on Apr. 15 vs Binghamton

Felix Reyes

- Named an Eastern League All-Star as an outfielder
- Named FirstEnergy R-Phils MVP
- Received R-Phils Big Stick Award
- Posted the third-highest single-season batting average in Fightin Phils history (.335)
 - Had the highest single-season average by a Fightin Phil since Randy Ruiz (.349 in 2005)
 - o Led the Eastern League and all of Double-A in batting average
 - o Posted the sixth-highest batting average in all of Minor League Baseball (.331)
 - Won the first batting title since Tagg Bozied in 2010 and the fifth by a R-Phil all time
- Led the league in doubles with 34, was the first Fightin Phil since Darick Hall in 2019 to lead the league in doubles
 - o Sixth player in R-Phils history to lead the league in doubles
