MEDIA INFORMATION

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All media must apply for a daily credential at least 48 hours in advance via the Durham Bulls credential online request form. Individuals must provide a government-issued photo ID to pick up a credential. Daily credentials are available for pick-up at the front lobby via the PNC Triangle Club entrance. Credentials will be available from 2.5 hours from first pitch until first pitch.

CLUBHOUSES + DUGOUT ACCESS

Media will have access to the main press box and the concourse of Durham Bulls Athletic Park. Field photo passes may be requested through the Durham Bulls Media Relations Department via the credential online request form. Photographers may only access the camera wells at the ends of the dugouts via the gates closest to the camera wells. At no time may photographers be inside the dugout or walk in front of either dugout. Photographers must be “up to date” on their COVID-19 vaccinations as defined by MLB.

NO AUTOGRAPHS

Autograph seeking by media is prohibited at Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

PRESS BOX

The press box is open to accredited members of the media on assignment only. Proper etiquette must be maintained at all times. Children are not permitted in the press box. Game notes and statistics are available in the press box approximately two hours prior to game time. Anyone needing the information earlier or needing additional information should contact the Media Relations Department.

PLAYER + MANAGER AVAILABILITY

Post-game press conferences with Manager Brady Williams will take place right approximately 15 minutes after the conclusion of that day’s game. Special requests for interviews will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Please submit requests to agreeen@durhambulls.com at least 24 hours in advance. Post-game interviews with Bulls players may also be requested. Media must be “up to date” on COVID-19 vaccinations as defined by MLB to conduct in-person interviews.

JIM GOODMAN

CEO/CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD, CAPITOL BROADCASTING COMPANY

Jim Goodman is President of Capitol Broadcasting Company, Inc., the parent company of the Durham Bulls. A Triangle institution, CBC owns five television stations, ten radio stations, one minor league baseball team, a Coastal Plain League Collegiate team-Holly Springs Salamanders, a satellite data provider and several real estate ventures.

Since purchasing the Bulls in 1991, Goodman has overseen the team's relocation to the Durham Bulls Athletic Park in 1995, the ballclub's jump to Triple-A in 1998 and the renovations done to the DBAP prior to the 2014 season. In addition, he has seen Durham's first professional baseball championships in 33 years when the Bulls won back-to-back Governors' Cup Titles in 2002 and 2003, 2009, 2013, and again in 2017 and 2018. The Bulls also won a Triple-A National Championship in 2009 and 2017.

Today more than 50 Durham Bulls and USA Baseball games are broadcast digitally on Time Warner Cable Sports Channel 323 and Me TV 50.2. Goodman is also a key figure in the redevelopment of the American Tobacco District, including the construction of the Diamond View Buildings located in the outfield of the Durham Bulls Athletic Park, the historic restoration of the American Tobacco Complex, located across from the ballpark on Blackwell Street.

A well-respected member of the business and social community in the Triangle, Goodman has received numerous awards and recognitions in his career, including the Raleigh News and Observer's 2003 Tar Heel of the Year due to his involvement and influence in two arenas: The redevelopment of Durham's American Tobacco complex and the national debate about how many television and radio stations a single media company should be allowed to own.



MICHAEL GOODMAN

SENIOR VICE PRESIDENT, CAPITOL BROADCASTING COMPANY

Michael Goodman leads one of the country's most dynamic urban mixed-use developments, the American Tobacco Campus in Durham. As senior vice president of real estate for Capitol Broadcasting Company, Inc., the campus' owner and master developer, Michael manages the day-to-day activities of approximately 1,000,000 square feet of class A office, restaurant, residential and retail space. He scopes and develops new projects and opportunities including Rocky Mount Mills, the American Underground startup hub (three locations in Durham, one in Raleigh), as well as solar/alternative energy real estate investments.

He earned a B.S. in Mathematical Economics from Hampden-Sydney College and a Masters in Trust and Investment Management from Campbell University. Michael is an advocate and leader of the Durham and Triangle communities and serves on several boards to encourage growth, entrepreneurship and community development. These boards include: AJ Fletcher Foundation; Fletcher Academy; BioLabs Advisory Board; East Durham Children's Initiative; CAHEC; Music Relief Foundation, NCIMED, and Leadership Triangle.



GEORGE HABEL

VICE PRESIDENT SPECIAL PROJECTS, CAPITOL BROADCASTING COMPANY

Based at Durham Bulls Athletic Park, George Habel has worked with numerous teams in Capitol's sports portfolio, including Atlantic Coast Conference universities, the NFL and the Carolina Hurricanes, as well as NASCAR. Prior to his current role, he served as Vice President of Capitol Sports.

George is chairman of the Greater Durham Chamber of Commerce and vice chair of the new Durham Sports Commission. He is a board member of N.C. Amateur Sports and the Carolina Hurricanes' Kids 'N Community Foundation. George volunteers with Durham Meals-on-Wheels and the United Way of the Greater Triangle. He is a member of Church of the Good Shepherd.



MIKE BIRLING

VICE PRESIDENT, BASEBALL OPERATIONS - CAPITOL BROADCASTING COMPANY

Mike Birling is in his 26th year with Capitol Broadcasting Company, and is in his sixth year as Vice President – Baseball Operations. Previously, Birling served as the Bulls' general manager from 2003 through 2017, and joined the franchise as assistant general manager at the conclusion of the 1998 season. Over the last five seasons alone, the organization has recorded its five highest single-season attendances, earned the John H.

Johnson President's Award and hosted the 2014 Triple-A All-Star Game in addition to the 2015, 2016 and 2018 ACC Baseball Championships.

Prior to joining the Bulls, Birling worked for the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers in the Single-A Midwest League from 1994 through 1998, serving his last three seasons as general manager. In 1998 he captured Midwest League Executive of the Year, and has earned the International League Executive of the Year award in both 2003 and 2015. A Wisconsin native, Birling is married to his wife Amy, and has two sons, Ty and Alec.



PATRICK KINAS

RADIO ANNOUNCER

Patrick Kinas moved to Raleigh in 1999 from Chicago. After broadcast stints with Clinton and Kane County in Single-A and the Carolina Mudcats in Double-A, 2020 will mark Patrick's ninth season with the Bulls. In the offseason, Kinas calls college football and basketball for ESPN, Inc., college football's East-West Shrine Game, NC State women's basketball, and state championships for the NCHSAA. In 2018, Kinas broadcast his first winter Olympic Games in Pyeongchang, South Korea.

Previously he broadcast the 2016 Summer Olympic Games in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil for Westwood One. A native of Pontiac, IL, Kinas earned his undergraduate degree from Millikin University, and Master's from Northwestern University in Evanston.

ANDREW GREEN

SOCIAL/DIGITAL CONTENT MANAGER

Andrew Green is in his third year with the Durham Bulls as Social/Digital Content Manager. Prior to Durham, Green has prior experience in a media relations capacity with the Omaha Storm Chasers, Tennessee Smokies, Jacksonville Suns, Pensacola Blue Wahoos and Indianapolis Indians. He is a graduate of the University of Miami with degrees in Broadcast Journalism and Religious Studies.

JEREMY WRIGHT

MEDIA RELATIONS TRAINEE

Jeremy Wright joins the Bulls as Media Relations Trainee after serving as a Sports Information Intern for two years at Freed-Hardeman University prior to graduating. Wright was the main sports information contact for the FHU women's basketball squad, while assisting in other sports, including baseball. A Durham native, Jeremy is also currently studying for his Master's Degree in Sports Management at North Carolina Central University.



2022 DURHAM BULLS BROADCAST INFORMATION

RADIO

All home games of the 2022 season can be heard on the flagship station for Bulls baseball - Buzz Sports Radio. All 150 games will be aired live on 96.5 FM in Durham and 99.3 FM in Raleigh, with a 15-minute pre-game show leading to the first pitch.

TELEVISION

More than 50 home games throughout the season will be hosted on the home of the Durham Bulls, Me-TV 50.2, which is available free over-the-air on WRAZ Channel 50.2, Channel 50.2 and in high-definition on Time Warner Cable Sports Channel 323. EXPLORER POST 50

Explorer Post 50 is a youth-based television broadcasting program that provides students, ages 14-20, with an invaluable opportunity to gain exceptional experience in the field of television broadcasting.

All members have the opportunity to learn: Camera Operation, Directing, Producing, Audio Board Operation, Video Tape/Instant Replay Operation, Camera Control Unit Operation, and Graphic Computer Operation.

The Explorer Post is designed to make every opportunity a learning opportunity. While we take great pride in teaching the skills needed to produce a television broadcast, we believe our greatest responsibility is to mold our young people into well-adjusted, productive and responsible individuals.

Explorer Post 5 and Explorer Post 50 are members of the Learning for Life program, a subsidiary of the Boy Scouts of America, and are associated with the Occoneechee Council of Boy Scouts here in Raleigh. Youth between the ages of 14-20 are eligible to participate in Post 5 to learn about broadcasting.

Explorer Post 5 was chartered in 1969 by Jim Goodmon, President and CEO of CBC, and then WRAL-TV engineer Powell Kidd. Post 5 is the oldest continuous post in the country. Hundreds

of youngsters have been introduced to broadcasting through the post and a number of current outstanding employees got their start in the post. ...and many, many more who are working throughout the country.

The students of Explorer 50 have been producing a closed-circuit broadcast for Bulls' home games since 1999. In the 2001 season, the Bulls and FOX 50 expanded the program to broadcast 32 home games on WRAZ-DT, FOX 50's digital channel. Explorer Post 50 were nominated for a Student Production Emmy by the Midsouth Region for their work in producing Bulls games that inaugural year.

EXPLORER POST 50 HISTORY

Capitol Broadcasting Company CEO Jim Goodmon created Explorer Post 50 in the fall of 1998 to provide area youth with a positive and productive way to spend their summer. The following spring, Bulls fans were able to enjoy live game action on television sets throughout the ballpark and inside the skyboxes.

- Beginning in 2001, the Durham Bulls could be seen more than thirty times per year on WRAZ-DT, Time Warner digital cable channel 251.
- On November 16th, 2001 it was announced that Explorer Post 50 was nominated for an Emmy in the Student Production Category for the Mid-South region. A select group of Post 50 members were chosen to attend the banquet and awards ceremony on February 2nd, 2002 at the Gaylord Opryland Hotel in Nashville, Tennessee.
- On May 2nd, 2002 WRAL-TV hosted the Occoneechee Council of the Boy Scouts of America Learning for Life Recognition Banquet where Post 50 was named Explorer/Learning for Life Post of the Year.
- On September 6th, 2002, the very first out of market broadcast of a Bulls game was seen in Toledo, Ohio, when the Toledo Mud Hens came to Durham to play game three of a five-game playoff series against the Bulls.
- In 2005 Post 50 began airing games on MiLB.com.
- On September 10th, 2007, FOX 50 launched RTN, the Retro Television Network on their digital cable channel, WRAZ-DT 251, and became the official home of the Durham Bulls.

With the excitement of a National Championship baseball team, world-class concerts and shows, and plenty of dining options, American Tobacco is always a destination for fun-seekers.

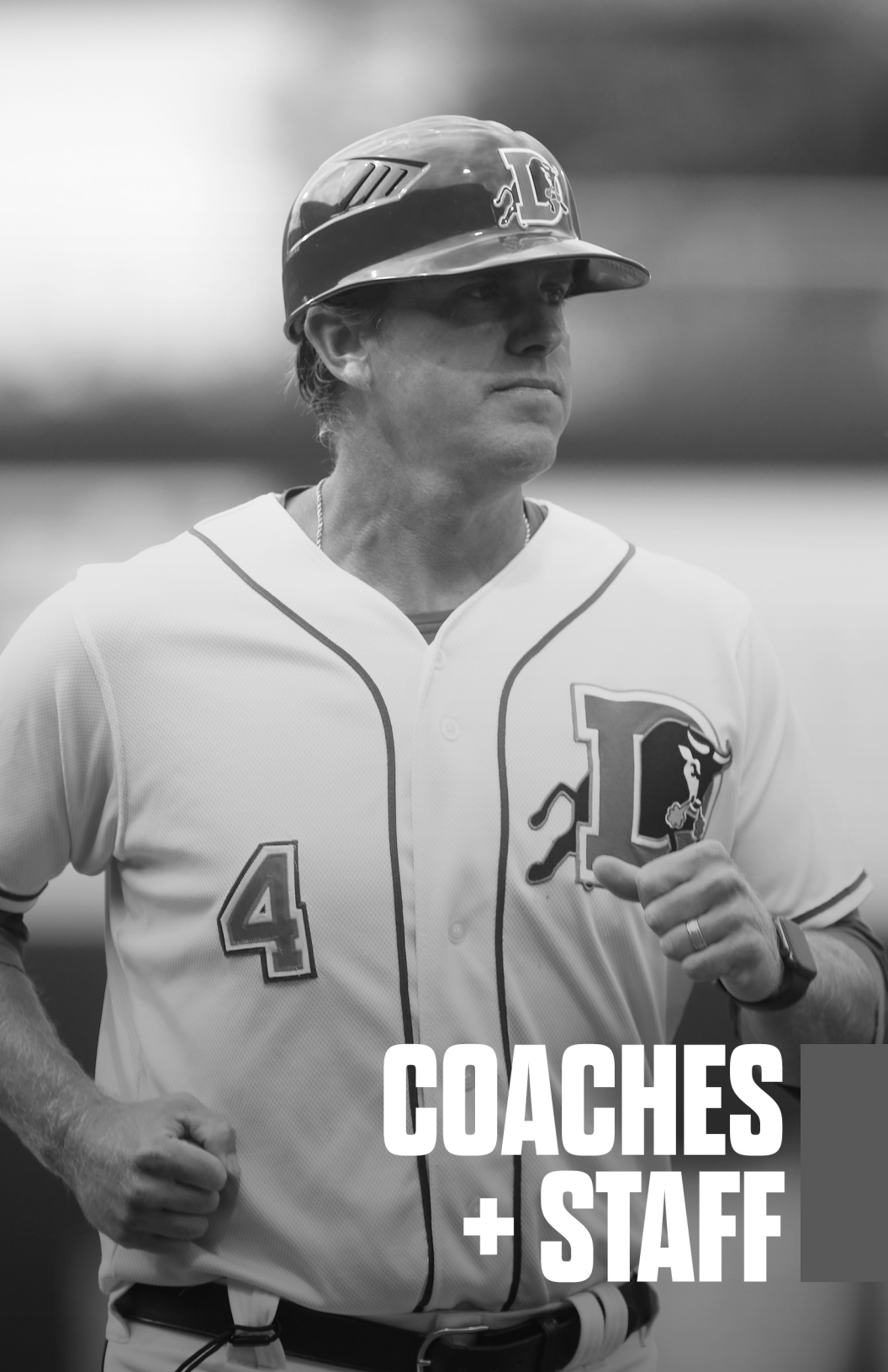

BRADY WILLIAMS DURHAM BULLS MANAGER

Brady Williams is back for his third season as the manager of the Durham Bulls. Williams led the team to a minor league-best 86-46 record and their second Triple-A National Championship, along with the Triple-A East and Triple-A East Final Stretch postseason titles.

Williams joined the Bulls in 2019 after spending the previous five seasons as manager of the Rays' Double-A affiliate Montgomery Biscuits. The 40-year-old led the Biscuits to the playoffs in each of his last four seasons with the team, including a 79-win 2018 campaign, which was the franchise's highest since 2007.

Prior to his time in Montgomery, Williams managed the previous five seasons with stops in Advanced-A Charlotte (2013), Single-A Bowling Green (2010-2012) and Short-Season Hudson Valley (2009).

Before joining the managerial ranks he coached as hitting coach in Advanced-A Vero Beach (2008), Single-A Columbus (2007) and Single-A Southwest Michigan (2006). Williams has spent his entire managing and coaching career in the Rays system.

PLAYING CAREER: Williams was selected in the 45th round of the 1999 MLB Draft by the Boston Red Sox out of Pasco-Hernando Community College. Williams spent three seasons in the Red Sox system, before being traded to the Minnesota Twins in exchange for outfielder Brian McMillan. Williams reached Double-A New Britain with the Twins, before joining the Tampa Bay Rays on a minor league deal.

Williams later played three seasons of Independent baseball from 2003-2005 with the Berkshire Dukes (Northeast League), Pennsylvania Road Warriors (Atlantic League) and Bridgeport Bluefish (Atlantic League).

Over the course of five minor league seasons, Williams hit .218 with 22 home runs and 103 RBI (264 games) across three organizations. Williams also hit .243 with 34 home runs and 145 RBI in three independent league baseball seasons.

PERSONAL: Born on October 18th, 1979, in Salt Lake City, Utah, Williams is the son of former Major League infielder and manager Jimmy Williams. Williams is also the brother of Shawn Williams, who spent last season managing the Reading Fightin Phils (Philadelphia Phillies Double-A).

WILL BRADLEY

HITTING COACH (FIRST SEASON)

Bradley joins the Bulls as hitting coach after serving as a hitting coach in the Los Angeles Angels organization, including stints with Low-A Burlington (2019-20) and High-A Tri-City (2021). Prior to his time with the Angels, he served as a coach at Saint Louis University (2007-18), where he was responsible for hitting and recruiting.

BRIAN REITH

PITCHING COACH (FIRST SEASON)

Knapp, 59, returns for his third season as pitching coach with the Bulls. Knapp brings a great deal of experience to the Bulls thanks to four seasons (2008-11) as the pitching coach of the Detroit Tigers, where he worked with future Cy Young winners Justin Verlander, Rick Porcello and Max Scherzer. Knapp has also served as the minor league pitching coordinator for the Minnesota Twins, Kansas City Royals and Los Angeles Dodgers.

PLAYING CAREER: Reith was selected in the 6th round of the 1996 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees out of Concordia Lutheran High School in Fort Wayne, Indiana. Reith pitched in the Majors over the course of three separate seasons with the Cincinnati Reds, appearing in 73 games. He accumulated a 54-52 record & 3.65 ERA in 208 career appearances in the minor leagues, including 6 years in the International League with Louisville and Indianapolis

REINALDO RUIZ

BILL EVERS

MANAGER (1998-2005)

Evers, 66, served as the manager for the Durham Bulls from 1998-2005, leading the team's transition into Triple-A. Evers compiled a career record of 1381-1206 from 1987-2005, including a record of 613-533 while managing Durham. Evers currently serves as the Catching Coach for the Minnesota Twins under former Durham Bull Rocco Baldelli, and has made managing stops with Clinton (A), Shreveport (AA), Phoenix (AAA), Greensboro (A), Albany (AA), Columbus (AAA), GCL Rays (Rk) and St. Petersburg (A). Evers was inducted into the International League Hall of Fame on January 31st, 2012, becoming the first Durham Bull to do so.

PLAYING CAREER : Evers spent four seasons playing minor league baseball in the Chicago Cubs organization, after being selected by them in the 6th round in the 1976 MLB Draft out of Eckerd College (FL). Evers reached Triple-A Wichita on two separate occasions and hit a combined .251 with 11 home runs and 147 RBI in 274 career MiLB games.

CHARLIE MONTOTO

MANAGER (2007-2014)

Montoto, 54, served as the manager for the Durham Bulls from 2007-2014, notching two Governors' Cup titles, six division titles and two International League Manager of the Year Awards. Montoto surpassed Bill Evers to become the winningest manager in Durham Bulls history, recording a 633-515 record while managing the Bulls. Over the course of his coaching career, Montoto managed Princeton (Rk), Hudson Valley (SS), Charleston (A), Bakersfield (A+), Orlando (AA), Montgomery (AA) and Durham, before joining the Tampa Bay Rays as their Third Base coach and later Bench Coach. Montoto earned his first manager job in the Major League's when he was named the manager of the Toronto Blue Jays on October 25th, 2018. For his efforts, Montoto was named to the International League Hall of Fame on January 26th, 2016.

PLAYING CAREER : Montoto was selected in the 6th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the Milwaukee Brewers out of Louisiana Tech University. Montoto reached Triple-A with Milwaukee before being traded to the Montreal Expos in 1993, earning his first Major League callup in the process. Montoto would go on to play until 1996 in the Expos and Philadelphia Phillies systems. In his brief MLB career, Montoto hit .400 (2-for-5) with three RBI in four games for Montreal, and hit a combined .266 with 38 home runs and 400 RBI over 1,028 MiLB games.

Ace Parker was a player-manager for the Bulls from 1949-52, compiling a 303-266 record while the team played in the Piedmont League. Prior to that, he enjoyed a successful football career with the Brooklyn Dodgers (NFL), Boston Yanks (NFL) and New York Yankees (AAFC) from 1937-46. The quarterback/halfback led the Dodgers to a second-place finish in 1940 and was crowned NFL MVP that season.

These rules can differ based on the amount of time an individual spent with one organization, before being released and joining another. 2021 DURHAM BULLS SEASON IN REVIEW

The 2021 Durham Bulls (86-44) will go down as one of the greatest teams in franchise history after securing the best winning percentage in a full season in the club's illustrious history. The squad left an incredible first impression in their inaugural campaign in the Triple-A East, posting the best record among all 30 Triple-A teams while also claiming the Triple-A East League and Triple-A National Championship titles. The Bulls also won 9 of their 10 final contests to claim the Triple-A Final Stretch postseason tournament. Durham's +263 run differential also matched fellow Rays affiliate Charleston for the best among all minor league clubs in 2021.

The Bulls' domination in part came from tremendous pitching, pacing all Triple-A clubs in earned-run average (3.40) and strikeouts (1,326), while owning not just the lowest WHIP (1.10) among Triple-A squads, but of all 120 full-season minor league teams in 2021, while also tying for the lowest batting average against (.212). Only one team in that company also had an ERA lower than Durham.

Offensively the Bulls ranked at or near the top in the Triple-A East League, including first in doubles (262), second in runs scored (732) and slugging percentage (.456), and third in home runs (183), as well as third in stolen bases (142) and on-base plus slugging percentage (.800).

Outfielder Josh Lowe, tabbed by the Rays as the organization's Minor League Player of the Year and Durham's Most Valuable Player, was a force the entire season with Durham, becoming the first Bulls player since 2007 to hit 20 or more home runs and steal 20 or more bases in a season. He finished the 2021 campaign second in the Triple-A East in extra-base hits (52), as well as third in runs scored (76) and RBI (78), tied for fourth in total bases (215), and tied for fifth in home runs (22), doubles (28) and walks drawn (61). It was Lowe who hit a go-ahead eighth-inning home run in Durham's second-to-last game of the season, propelling the Bulls to the Final Stretch title.

In addition to Lowe, some of the most talented and exciting prospects in baseball wore a Bulls jersey, including consensus top overall prospect Wander Franco, along with pitchers Shane Baz, as well as infielders Taylor Walls and Vidal Brujan. All would go on to make their respective Major League debuts with Tampa Bay over the course of the 2021 season.

Franco in his 40 games with the Bulls was excellent in his first taste of Triple-A ball, posting a .313 average (51-163), adding 31 runs, 11 doubles, 6 triples, 7 homers & 35 RBI, along with a .372 OBP, .583 SLG and .955 OPS.

Brujan, meanwhile, led the Triple-A East League stolen bases (44), in addition to ranking tied for first in doubles (31) and second in runs scored (77). Both he and Lowe earned Triple-A East League Post-Season All-Star honors, while manager Brady Williams was named the circuit's Co-Manager of the Year along with Buffalo's Casey Candaele. Williams became the first Bulls skipper to earn Manager of the Year honors since Charlie Montoyo was named International League Manager of the Year in 2013.

DURHAM BULLS CHRONOLOGY

MARCH 18, 1902

The North Carolina League is formed at a meeting in Raleigh. The Durham club is secured by Mr. W. G. Bramham, the owner of the team. The league is scheduled to begin on May 5 and play for four months.

MAY 5, 1902

Durham Tobacconists play their first official regular season game in Charlotte. The Bulls lost to Charlotte, 12-2. Brucker took the loss.

MAY 12, 1902

Durham plays its first home game against New Bern.

JUNE 12, 1902

Bulls' owner Judge William G. Bramham refused to send his team to play at New Bern, stating that as far as the home team was concerned, the league was at an end. Professional baseball didn't return to Durham until 1913.

DECEMBER 12, 1912

Durham joins the newly formed North Carolina State League

APRIL 24, 1913

The Durham team played its first game as the Bulls at Hanes Field on the Trinity College Campus (now Duke East Campus). Lee Meadows pitched a complete game as the Bulls defeated the Raleigh Capitals, 7-4.

MAY 30, 1917

North Carolina State League folds due to the start of World War I. Bulls win North Carolina State League, though it was a shortened season of only 36 games.

OCTOBER 31, 1919

The Piedmont League is officially formed. Teams will be placed in cities throughout Virginia and North Carolina.

JULY 7, 1926

Bulls play their first game at El Toro Park.

JULY 26, 1926

In ceremonies presided over by North Carolina Governor Angus W. McLean and Commissioner of Baseball Judge Kenesaw Mountain Landis, El Toro Park is dedicated. Judge Landis stole the show by mounting the Bulls' mascot, a real bull, and riding it on the field. Durham loses to Raleigh, 3-2.

1932

Durham begins its first major league affiliation with the Philadelphia Phillies.

1933

After the 1933 season, John Sprunt Hill and his wife donate \$20,000 to the city. The city purchases El

Toro Park and renames it Durham Athletic Park.

1934-1935

Durham Bulls are unable to operate due to the Great Depression.

JUNE 17, 1939

Durham Athletic Park burns to the ground, resulting in over \$100,000 in damage. The Bulls had defeated Portsmouth, 7-3 just hours earlier. Groundskeeper Walter Williams, who slept under the stands, escapes through the center field gate.

JULY 2, 1939

After a remarkable two-week construction period, DAP is functional. New and old parks are similar in design except that the wooden grandstand is replaced by steel and concrete. Stadium has a 1,000-seat grandstand and temporary bleachers. The Bulls beat the Charlotte Hornets, 11-4.

APRIL 7, 1940

During the off-season, DAP is completely rebuilt and is debuted during an exhibition game between Cincinnati and the Boston Red Sox.

APRIL 17, 1940

The Bulls' first home game at the rebuilt DAP takes place against the Winston-Salem Twins. Only 1,587 fans attend, almost 4,000 less than the crowd that came for the exhibition game 10 days earlier (5,574).

SEPTEMBER 5, 1943

Last-place Durham defeats Richmond 15-5 in the last Piedmont League game played at the DAP.

1944

The Piedmont League becomes an all-Virginia league; no baseball in Durham.

APRIL 27, 1945

Durham plays its first game in the new Carolina League, defeating the Burlington Bees, 5-0.

SEPTEMBER 15, 1948

Former Bulls' outfielder Tom Wright becomes the first player from the Carolina League to make it to the major leagues when he makes his debut with the Boston Red Sox.

AUGUST 10, 1951

Durham loses to the Danville Leafs 5-4. However, this game marks the debut of Percy Miller Jr., the first black player in the Carolina League, who plays for the Danville Leafs.

APRIL 18, 1957

3B Bubba Morton and LHP Ted Richardson became the first African-Americans to play for the Durham Bulls. Morton went hitless and Richardson took the loss to Greensboro, 4-1.

JULY 10, 1957

First Carolina League All-Star Game played in Durham. All-Stars beat Durham 7-6 with 1,964 fans in attendance.

1968

Durham Bulls merge with Raleigh to form the Raleigh-Durham Mets. The team plays half its games in DAP and half at Raleigh's Devereaux Meadow.

1972

Just before the start of the 1972 season, the Raleigh-Durham team folds. There would be no professional baseball in the Triangle until 1980.

APRIL 15, 1980

Minor league baseball returns to Durham for the first time since 1971. 4,418 show up at the DAP on a cool, 45-degree night.

JUNE 22, 1980

Durham's CBS affiliate broadcasts the Bulls' game on local TV. It's the first Bulls' game ever broadcast on television.

NOVEMBER 1987

Kevin Costner, Susan Sarandon and Tim Robbins star in Ron Shelton's movie *Bull Durham*, which is filmed at DAP and surrounding Triangle locations. The movie's release in 1988 brings the Durham Bulls national attention. The Durham Bulls' famous "snorting bull" was originally to be used only as a prop for the movie, but has remained a Bulls' staple ever since.

FEBRUARY 1988

Miles Wolff meets with Durham officials to discuss building a 10,000 to 12,000 seat stadium to win a Class Triple-A baseball franchise for Durham.

MAY 9, 1990

Miles Wolff grants Jim Goodman, president of Capital Broadcasting Company, an option to buy the Bulls. Goodman announces plans to move the Durham Bulls to Triangle Central Park, a sports complex he envisions in eastern Durham County, near the Raleigh-Durham International Airport.

AUGUST 30, 1990

A crowd of 6,202 at the DAP pushes Durham's attendance to 300,499, making the Bulls the first Class-A Team ever to pass the 300,000 mark.

JULY 17, 1992

The Bulls unveil their new mascot, Wool E. Bull. In a local contest, Jim Vickery of Durham submits the winning moniker chosen from a pool of more than 500 entries. The "E" in Wool E. Bull stands for "Education."

JUNE 17, 1993

The Bulls retired the jersey number 18 of Hall of Fame second baseman Joe Morgan.

SEPTEMBER 1993

After the Bulls' highly touted "last season" at DAP, construction bids for the new ballpark come in more than \$4 million over budget, and the project runs into numerous delays. Opening Day is pushed back one year, to April 1995.

SEPTEMBER 5, 1994

Winston-Salem won the final game at Durham Athletic Park, 6-2, in Game One of the Carolina League's South Division playoffs.

APRIL 6, 1995

Seven years after Miles Wolff's original proposal, the Durham Bulls Athletic Park opens its gates for its inaugural season in front of 10,886 fans.

AUGUST 30, 1997

The Bulls lost to Winston-Salem 6-4 in 10 innings, their last game in 45 seasons in the Carolina League.

APRIL 9, 1998

Bulls begin their inaugural season as the Triple-A affiliate of the Tampa Bay Devil Rays. The Bulls defeated the Norfolk Tides, 6-1 at Harbor Park.

SEPTEMBER 12, 2002

The Bulls win their first league title in 33 years with a 2-0 victory vs. Buffalo, completing a six-game post-season sweep of Toledo and the Bisons.

SEPTEMBER 11, 2003

Durham defeats the Pawtucket Red Sox, 3-2, to claim its second consecutive Governors' Cup Championship. It is the first time an IL team won back-to-back titles since the Columbus Clippers in 1990 and 1991.

JUNE 8, 2004

Bill Evers, the Bulls' only Triple-A manager in team

history, records his 500th win as Durham's skipper with a 10-1 victory at Syracuse.

AUGUST 1, 2005

ESPN's SportsCenter broadcasts live at the Durham Bulls Athletic Park as part of their "50 States in 50 Days" promotion. Kenny Mayne interviews UNC Football coach John Bunting and Duke Basketball Coach Mike Krzyzewski on the 1st Base Party Deck before a paid crowd of 10,837, the third largest crowd in history. The Bulls beat the Charlotte Knights, 5-0.

AUGUST 29, 2005

The Bulls set a paid attendance record of 520,371, shattering the old record of 505,314 set in 2001.

APRIL 14, 2006

The Bulls set a single-game attendance record of 11,060 for the 2006 home opener. B.J. Upton hit a walk-off grand slam to defeat Toledo 5-4.

AUGUST 18, 2006

Kevin Witt slams his 36th home run at Columbus, setting a new Triple-A Bulls season home run record. Scott McClain had held the record since Durham's inaugural Triple-A year in 1998 when he hit 34.

SEPTEMBER 1, 2007

With a crowd of 11,070, the Bulls set a single game and single season record for attendance (520,952).

SEPTEMBER 3, 2007

Justin Ruggiano homers at Charlotte, becoming first Bull since Ron Gant (1986) to collect at least 20 homers and 20 steals in a season.

SEPTEMBER 7, 2007

The City of Durham names the field at the Durham Bulls Athletic Park "Goodmon Field" after Capitol Broadcasting Company President/CEO Jim Goodmon.

JULY 4, 2008

Bull Durham star Kevin Costner returned to the Bull City with his band, Modern West, to host an Independence Day Celebration at the DBAP. A few hours into the show, strong thunderstorms knocked out the power at the ballpark, cancelling the remainder of the show and fireworks.

MAY 15, 2009

Chris Richard smashes an International League Record

two grand slams, the last of which sends the Bulls home with an 11th inning, 13-9 victory over Louisville.

SEPTEMBER 17, 2009

John Jaso laced an RBI double in the top of the 12th and Julio DePaula closed the door as the Bulls clinched their third championship in team history with a 3-2 victory over Scranton Wilkes-Barre.

SEPTEMBER 22, 2009

The Bulls defeat the Pacific Coast League's Memphis Redbirds 5-4 (11 innings) to win the Triple-A National Championship. It is the first for the Bulls and the International League.

AUGUST 29, 2010

The Bulls defeat Charlotte 8-5, thanks to a seventh inning three-run homer from Chris Richard, to set a new Triple-A franchise record for wins with 84. They would go on to finish the season with 88 wins.

AUGUST 2, 2011

With a smashing 18-3 win over interstate and division rival the Charlotte Knights, the Durham Bulls notch their 6,000th franchise victory. Rays #1 prospect Matt Moore led the team to the win by striking out nine in five scoreless innings.

JANUARY 31, 2012

The International League announced that former Bulls Manager Bill Evers will be inducted into the circuit's Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2012. Evers is the winningest manager in the history of the club. Evers has been added to the IL Hall of Fame plaque display and will be presented with "The Curtain Call" statue on May 19th, during a Bulls home game.

SEPTEMBER 18, 2012

Durham Bulls Athletic Park hosted the 2012 Triple-A National Championship Game. This marked the first time the game was hosted at an International League park and east of the Mississippi River.

MAY 25, 2013

The University of North Carolina defeats North Carolina State University at the DBAP in 18 innings in the ACC Tournament in front of 11,392 fans, setting the tournament record for highest attendance.

AUGUST 20, 2013

The Bulls retire the No. 10 jersey in honor of former Braves third baseman Chipper Jones in a ceremony prior to first pitch. The eight-time National League All-Star and 1999 N.L. Most Valuable Player batted .277 for the Bulls over 70 games in 1992.

SEPTEMBER 14, 2013

After posting the league's best regular season record, the Bulls capture their fourth Governors' Cup title, defeating the Pawtucket Red Sox 7-0 to win the series three games to one. The squad went 6-1 in the I.L. playoffs after sweeping West Division champion Indianapolis in the first round.

APRIL 26, 2014

Mike Montgomery and Brad Boxberger combine to no-hit Scranton/WB in a 5-0 win at the DBAP. The no-hitter marks the third in Durham's Triple-A history.

JULY 16, 2014

Durham Bulls Athletic Park hosts the 2014 Triple-A All-Star Game, becoming just the second stadium to host both the All-Star Game and Triple-A National Championship game in its current format.

JULY 21, 2014

Charlie Montoyo earns his 614th win as Bulls manager with a 5-1 win over Rochester at the DBAP, becoming the franchise's all-time wins leader, passing Bill Evers who won 613 games from 1998-2005.

AUGUST 31, 2014

With an announced crowd of 11,104, the Bulls set a new all-time, single-season paid attendance record, surpassing the mark of 520,952 in 2007. With 7,834 fans the following day, the 2014 final mark is 533,033.

JULY 4, 2015

The Bulls set a new single-game paid attendance record with a crowd of 11,871 fans.

SEPTEMBER 5, 2015

With two games left in the season, the Bulls break their all-time single-season paid attendance record for the second year in a row, with a crowd of 10,016 pushing the season-long total to 536,359. The record would extend to 554,788 after the final two games.

JANUARY 26, 2016

The International League announces that former Durham Bulls manager Charlie Montoyo has been elected into the IL Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2016. Montoyo is the winningest manager in franchise history, after compiling a 633-515 record over eight seasons from 2007-2014. Montoyo was honored in a pre-game ceremony at the DBAP on May 19, 2016.

JULY 16, 2016

LHP Justin Marks throws a nine-inning no-hitter, beating the Syracuse Chiefs 2-0 in New York. The southpaw becomes the first player in the team's Triple-A history to throw a complete-game no-hitter,

and tosses the fourth no-hitter in the franchise's Triple-A history. He strikes out seven, walks two and throws 130 pitches in the win.

JANUARY 31, 2017

The International League announces the former Bulls pitcher Lee Gardner has been elected into the IL Hall of Fame as a member of the Class of 2017. Gardner saved a franchise record 77 games for Durham across parts of five seasons.

JULY 4, 2017

The Bulls set their all-time single-game paid attendance record with a crowd of 11,897 fans.

SEPTEMBER 15, 2017

The Bulls defeat Scranton/Wilkes-Barre 6-4 to capture the franchise's fifth Governors' Cup crown.

SEPTEMBER 19, 2017

The Bulls defeat Memphis 5-3 behind a Kean Wong grand slam to win the team's second Triple-A National Championship.

SEPTEMBER 15, 2018

The Bulls defeat Scranton/Wilkes-Barre behind four RBI and a home run from Joe McCarthy to win the franchise's sixth Governors' Cup title.

JULY 5, 2019

Jake Cronenworth, Luis Santos and Cole Sulser combine to no-hit Gwinnett in a seven-inning, 5-0 win. The no-hitter marks the fifth in Durham's Triple-A history.

AUGUST 7, 2019

Arturo Reyes, Ricardo Pinto, Jose Alvarado and Hoby Milner combine to no-hit Syracuse in a 2-1 win at the DBAP. The no-hitter marks the sixth in Durham's Triple-A history.

AUGUST 30, 2020

Minor League Baseball announces the 2020 season will not be played due to the COVID-19 pandemic. It is the first year without Bulls baseball since 1979.

MAY 4, 2021

The Bulls play their first game in 500 days, resulting in a 7-5 win in Memphis.

MAY 11, 2021

The Bulls play their first home game in 507 days, falling to Jacksonville 4-3.

OCTOBER 2, 2021

With a 5-3 win in Norfolk, the Bulls clinch the Triple-A Final Stretch postseason tournament with their 11th straight win.

FIRST TRIPLE-A BATTER: The first Triple-A batter at the DBAP was Louisville CF Greg Martinez, who homered into the new Diamond View seats in right field off Dave Eiland.

SITE: The stadium was built on an eight-acre plot of land that was previously a parking lot owned by a pharmaceutical company.

NAME: The name for the park was chosen by the Durham City Council during a meeting on March 20, 1995, which was a mere 17 days before the stadium officially opened.

PLAYING FIELD: The playing field is officially known as Goodman Field in honor of Jim Goodman, after the Durham City Council voted to name the field after the man who bought the team for an estimated \$2 million in 1991.

BLUE MONSTER: Original plans for the left field wall called for an eight-foot fence 325 feet from home plate, but when construction work began crews realized that the renderings didn't account for the presence of a street that would have to be closed to make a normal distance possible. Since neither closing Dillard Street nor altering its path was possible, the distance to left field was shortened by 20 feet. To compensate for the short porch, the wall was made to be 24 feet high. In 1998, the Monster got a little taller when it was raised to 32 feet and it has remained at that height ever since.

ACC TOURNAMENT: The stadium has hosted the ACC Baseball Championship tournament 11 times (1996, 1998, 1999, 2009, 2011, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 & 2019). On May 25, 2013, UNC squared off against NC State in the tournament semifinals in front of 11,392 fans - the largest crowd to ever see a collegiate baseball game in the state - in an 18-inning marathon, the longest game in ACC Tournament history. UNC prevailed 2-1.

DURHAM BULLS DBAP HISTORY

A LONG TIME COMING: Plans for a new ballpark began in 1989 after the commercial success of the film “Bull Durham.” Then in 1990, Jim Goodmon, president and CEO of Capitol Broadcasting Company, buys the team and plans to move it to a sports complex in eastern Durham County near the Raleigh-Durham airport. After reaching an agreement with the City of Durham, the Bulls instead decided to build their new stadium in Downtown Durham, less than one mile away from Durham Athletic Park, which had hosted the team since the 1920s. Originally scheduled to open in 1994, DBAP construction bids came in over budget and pushed back the ballpark opening a full season to 1995.

REVITALIZATION OF DOWNTOWN DURHAM: In 1987, American Brands closed the American Tobacco warehouse on Blackwell St. in Durham, closing the doors on a building that had produced Lucky Strike and Bull Durham tobacco. In 2004 though, Capitol Broadcasting re-opened the former tobacco campus, located directly across the street from Durham Bulls Athletic Park, ushering in a renaissance in Downtown Durham. The company invested over \$200 million to renovate the factory buildings, laying the groundwork for a cutting-edge office, entertainment and residential area. With the success of the over 100 companies that call the American Tobacco Campus home, business growth expanded north of the campus and ballpark, leading to the erection of Durham Performing Arts Center, cementing the area as a restaurant and entertainment district. Today, over 100 businesses call the American Tobacco Campus home, encompassing over 4,000 employees.

COMMITMENT TO BASEBALL: In addition to 70 Bulls games a season, Durham has hosted a portion of Duke University’s home schedule since 2010, USA Baseball games, the 2012 Triple-A National Championship Game, the 2014 Triple-A All-Star Game, the 2009, 2011, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018 & 2019 ACC Tournaments.

2014 RENOVATIONS: Prior to the 2014 season, the Bulls upgraded the DBAP, installing \$20 million in renovations to the stadium. Included in the renovations was a new video board and sound system, playing surface, concessions, club level, picnic areas, seat upgrades and lighting. Following the season, Ballpark Digest recognized the upgrade to the stadium as the “Best Ballpark Renovation Over \$2 Million” in its annual awards.

THE SNORTING BULL: The Snorting Bull that stands atop the Blue Monster in left field - baseball’s most iconic home run target - is actually the third iteration of the Snorting Bull. The original sign made famous in “Bull Durham” was a prop designed for the movie and soon deteriorated. Upon the team’s move to the DBAP the second sign was placed in right field, where it sat at Durham Athletic Park, but was later destroyed in a hurricane.

DUKE BASEBALL: After hosting a portion of Duke University’s home schedule since 2010, the 2016 season marked the beginning of a seven-year deal that allows Duke to play up to 36 exhibition and home games at the DBAP each year. The Blue Devils also host a limited number of practices at the DBAP each season, and have a new, permanent locker room at the stadium.

EXPANDED SAFETY NETTING: After extending the protective netting from behind home plate to the outfield edge of both dugouts in 2016, the Bulls extended the net further to increase fan safety in 2020. The netting now extends from behind home plate to both foul poles in response to injuries from foul balls and bats.

The Bulls defeat the Buffalo Bisons 2-0, winning the series 3-0 and claiming their first International League title.

AUGUST 31, 2003:

Lee Gardner records his 30th save in a win against Charlotte, the highest single-season total in franchise history.

AUGUST 1, 2005

ESPN's "SportsCenter" broadcasts live at the DBAP as part of its "50 States in 50 Days" promotion.

JULY 16, 2006

Pitchers Jason Hammel and Juan Salas combine on a no-hitter as the Bulls defeat the Columbus Clippers 4-1.

SEPTEMBER 7, 2007

The stadium's playing surface is named "Goodmon Field" in honor of Jim Goodmon, the president and CEO of Capitol Broadcasting Company.

JULY 4, 2008

Kevin Costner and his band Modern West perform at Durham Bulls Athletic Park to celebrate the 20th anniversary of "Bull Durham."

MAY 15, 2009

Chris Richard hits two grand slams against Louisville,

becoming the first IL player to hit two grand slams in one game since Mike Baxes in 1957. His second grand slam was a walk-off winner, as the Bulls won 13-9 in 11 innings.

SEPTEMBER 6, 2010

The Bulls conclude the 2010 season with a 6-5, 12-inning victory over Norfolk, establishing a single-season Triple-A franchise record with 88 victories.

SEPTEMBER 18, 2012

The DBAP hosts the Triple-A National Championship Game, when the Reno Aces defeated the Pawtucket Red Sox 10-3. It marked the first Triple-A National Championship Game played east of the Mississippi River.

APRIL 26, 2014

Pitchers Mike Montgomery and Brad Boxberger combine to no-hit the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders in a 5-0 victory.

JULY 16, 2014

The DBAP hosts the Triple-A All-Star Game for the first time, as the International League defeats the Pacific Coast League 7-3. The DBAP becomes just the second ballpark to host both the Triple-A National Championship Game and All-Star Game in its current format.

JULY 21, 2014

Charlie Montoyo wins his 614th games as Bulls manager, setting the franchise record for most wins.

SEPTEMBER 7, 2015

The Bulls conclude the 2015 season with a paid attendance mark of 554,788, shattering the franchise's previous attendance record of 533,033 in 2014.

JULY 4, 2017

The DBAP welcomes a 11,897 fans for Independence Day, breaking the single-game franchise record of 11,871 from July 4, 2015.

APRIL 23, 2018

Willy Adames went 4-for-5 and recorded the first Bulls cycle in Triple-A DBAP history in a 8-1 win over Buffalo.

AUGUST 7, 2019

Pitchers Arturo Reyes, Ricardo Pinto, Jose Alvarado and Hoby Milner combine to no-hit the Syracuse Mets in a 2-1 victory.

THE GOVERNORS' CUP

Frank "Shag" Shaughnessy, who served as International League President from 1936 until 1960, introduced a playoff system to the league in 1933 and the Governors' Cup was born.

Shaughnessy, enshrined in the International League's Hall of Fame upon its formation in 1947, saw the need to maintain interest for more than one or two clubs to the conclusion of each season and his playoff format filled that bill. After viewing the success of this format in the International League, several other leagues were soon to follow.

After 55 years of service and many homes, the original Governors' Cup trophy was given a permanent home in Cooperstown, N.Y. at the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum following the 1988 season. The original trophy, which was the oldest rotating trophy at the time of its retirement, consists primarily of solid silver and has been appraised at more than \$3,000. Because of a new playoff format, the formation of

the Triple-A Alliance, and the retirement of the original Governors' Cup, the International League forged a new Governors' Cup trophy.

PLAYOFF FORMAT

Playoff spots are awarded to each division winner, along with a Wild Card team holding the best winning percentage among the non-division winning teams.

The first round is a best-of-five series. The West Division winner will play the South Division winner, while the North Division champion will take on the Wild Card winner. Home field advantage is determined before the season, with the Wild Card winner and one of the division winners hosting the first two games of each series and the other two division winners hosting game three and, if necessary, games four and five.

The Governors' Cup Final will place the winners from the first round against each other in a best-of-five series. Home field advantage is determined by the same method as the semifinals.
