CHIHUAHUAS BITES

SERIES FINALE FIGHTERS: The Chihuahuas are 9-13 in series finales this season. El Paso in 1-3 in their last four series finales.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT | ELP 2 OKC 3: The El Paso Chihuahuas were held to two runs in their loss to the Oklahoma City Comets on Saturday night. Carlos Rodriguez recorded a three-hit night, hit third multi-hit performance of the series. Jagger Haynes pitched 5.0 scoreless innings, and struck out five batters.

SOUGHT-AFTER A SERIES WIN: The Chihuahuas have not won a series since the start of July when they took four games from the Sacramento River Cats. Since the, El Paso has lost six of its last seven series. The Chihuahuas have not won a road series since mid-June against Round Rock.

HOT ROD IN EL PASO: Carlos Rodriguez is batting .550 (11-for-20) with three RBI this series and .447 in nine games against Oklahoma City this season. He is 5th in the PCL in hits (131), and has reached in 69 of the last 74 games since May 16. He is on an 12-game hit streak since August 15 and batting .383 in that span.

SALAS' SECRET RECIPE: Since joining El Paso on July 29, Ethan Salas leads PCL catchers in RBI (17) and total bases (35), and is tied-1st in hits (21). He has reached safely in 21 of his 23 Triple-A games, and boasts a .426 OBP.

HANGING ON: Each of El Paso's last four wins have been decided by one run. There have been seven games between the Chihuahuas and Comets this season that have been decided by three runs or less. El Paso is 13-17 in one-run games this season.

CRUSHING THE COMETS: Marcos Castanon is batting .314 with four RBI in nine games against Oklahoma City this season.

RECORD CHASING: Clay Dungan is tied-3rd in franchise history in games played (326), and is one game from passing Rocky Gale.

MCLOVIN' IT: In the last 15 games, Mason McCoy is batting .327 with eight stolen bases and a .397 on-base percentage. He is 3rd in the PCL in stolen bases (33), and has hit safely in six of the last seven games.

TWO-OUTS? NO PROBLEM: El Paso had 11 two-out base runners in Thursday's win. Four of their five runs were also scored with two outs. The Chihuahuas are 4th in all of Triple-A with a .289 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs.

DYNAMIC DUO: Ethan Routzahn and Alek Jacob rank among the PCL leaders in pitching. Routzahn has made the second most pitching appearances (50) in the PCL (tied-3rd in Triple-A). Jacob's nine saves are 4th while Routzahn's seven saves rank 8th.

TURNING TWO: El Paso has turned 136 double plays this season, the most in all of professional baseball. El Paso's season high is 143 (2014).

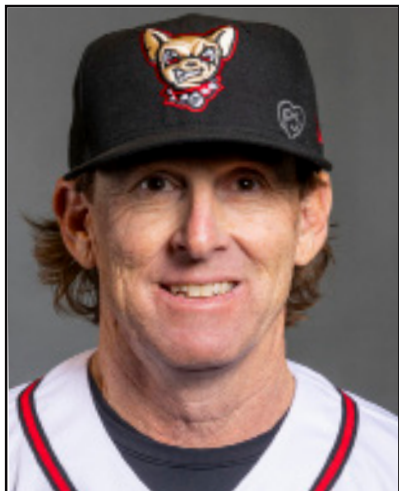

ON THIS DAY IN BASEBALL HISTORY

August 30: 1996 - San Diego Padres pitcher Scott Sanders allowed just one hit over 8.0 innings while striking out 10 batters as the Padres defeated the Montreal Expos 6-0. Montreal's David Segui notched the only hit against San Diego.



MANAGER: PETE ZAMORA

3RD SEASON AS MANAGER (4TH OVERALL)

THE SKIPPER: Pete Zamora, 50, enters his third season as manager of the El Paso Chihuahuas. Zamora is entering his 11th season in the San Diego Padres' organization and his fourth season as a manager. He first arrived in the Padres' organization when he was a pitching coach for the AZL Padres in 2016, before becoming the pitching coach for the Single-A Lake Elsinore Storm from 2018 to 2019. He was set to be the pitching coach for the Chihuahuas for the 2020 season, prior to it being canceled. He was the pitching coach for the Double-A San Antonio Missions from 2021 to 2022. Zamora earned his first manager role in 2023 with Lake Elsinore before being promoted to El Paso in 2024.

The Chihuahuas' 2026 staff will also include pitching coach Scott Mitchell, assistant pitching coach Jimmy Jones, hitting coach Ben Rosenthal, bench coach Miguel Del Castillo, bench coach Morgan Burkhart, athletic trainers Carlos Olivas and Micah Gerhart, strength coach A.J. Russell and performance analyst Chris Turrisi.

TWO-WAY TALENT IN THE CITY OF ANGELS: Zamora played three years of college baseball at UCLA (1995-1997), where he was a two-way star for the Bruins. The California native hit .295 with 15 doubles as a freshman, before posting a 6-1 record with a 4.89 ERA in his sophomore year. He flourished in his junior year going 6-2 with two saves while swinging a .379 clip with 16 home runs and 74 RBI as the Bruins' everyday first baseman critical to the program punching its ticket to the 1997 College World Series.

ZAMORA IN THE MINORS: Zamora's playing career spanned eight seasons across six organizations. He was drafted by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 20th round of the 1997 June Amateur Draft out of UCLA. Zamora continued to pitch and hit in his first professional season in 1997 with the Great Falls Dodgers. From 1998 and on, his role was as a pitcher. Zamora posted a 34-31 career record and a 3.93 ERA. He would go on to pitch in the Philadelphia Phillies, New York Mets, New York Yankees, Milwaukee Brewers and Arizona Diamondbacks organizations. Zamora played three seasons in Triple-A for the Phillies and Mets organizations.

He appeared in 307 games (53 starts), compiling 707.1 IP from 1997 to 2004. On June 7, 2000, Zamora pitched a seven-inning perfect game. It marked the first perfect game in the history of the Double-A Reading Phillies. It was only the second perfect game in the history of Reading professional baseball since Jake Northrop did so in 1911.

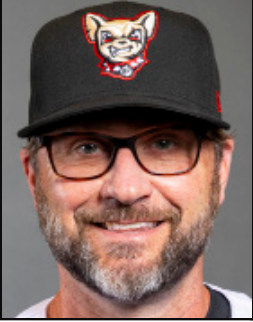

PITCHING COACH: SCOTT MITCHELL

Scott Mitchell, 53, enters his fourth season in the San Diego Padres' organization as the Chihuahuas pitching coach.

The former right-handed pitcher began his coaching career in the Florida Marlins' organization from 2003 to 2010, including time in the Pacific Coast League with the Triple-A New Orleans Zephyrs (2009-2010). Mitchell then joined the Pittsburgh Pirates' organization, serving as an assistant pitching coordinator from 2011 to 2020. He joined the Chihuahuas in 2023.

A native of San Pablo, California, Mitchell was drafted in the 22nd round of the 1995 MLB Draft by the Montreal Expos. He pitched in MiLB from 1995-2001, climbing as high as Triple-A Ottawa. Mitchell held a 36-25 career record with a 3.92 ERA and 555.0 IP over the course of his seven-year playing career.



ASSISTANT PITCHING COACH: JIMMY JONES

Jimmy Jones, 61, enters his 18th season in the San Diego Padres' organization and his fourth season with the Chihuahuas.

After two seasons coaching in the Arizona League, the Dallas, Texas native was promoted to Double-A San Antonio in 2011, where the pitching staff led all of Double-A in ERA (3.43), ranking first in the Texas League in strikeouts (1,087), fewest walks allowed (387), fewest home runs allowed (85). The staff finished second in shutouts (12) and had three 10-game winners for the first time since 2003. The Missions led the Texas League in ERA in four of the eight years Jones was in San Antonio. Jones had a brief coaching stint in MLB in 2012 as the interim bullpen coach for the Padres. He would go on to coach for the Amarillo Sod Poodles and the Fort Wayne TinCaps before joining the Chihuahuas in 2023.

Jones was drafted third overall by the Padres in the 1982 MLB Draft. He pitched in MLB from 1986-1993 with the Padres, New York Yankees, Houston Astros and Montreal Expos. In his MLB debut, Jones pitched a one-hit shutout against the first-place Astros on Sept. 21, 1986. He finished with a 43-39 record and a 4.46 ERA across his eight years in the major leagues.



HITTING COACH: BEN ROSENTHAL

Ben Rosenthal, 46, enters his first season in the San Diego Padres' organization.

Rosenthal began coaching in minor league baseball in 2017 with the Houston Astros' Single-A affiliate Quad Cities River Bandits. He was then named hitting coach of the Buies Creek Astros in 2018 when the team won the Carolina League. In 2019, Rosenthal coached in Round Rock, where the Express advanced to the Pacific Coast League Championship series, but lost to the Sacramento River Cats. After a canceled season due to COVID-19, he became the hitting coach for the Sugar Land Skeeters in 2021. Rosenthal joined the Boston Red Sox major league coaching staff as assistant hitting coach from 2022 to 2025.

Rosenthal's playing career started in the independent leagues, before being signed by the St. Louis Cardinals in 2004. He spent two seasons in their farm system, reaching High-A Palm Beach. He then played two seasons with the independent El Paso Diablos (2005-2006).



BENCH COACH: MIGUEL DEL CASTILLO

Miguel Del Castillo, 34, enters his eighth season as a coach in the Padres' organization.

His coaching career began in 2018 when he was the manager of the DSL Padres. He held the role for two seasons before managing the ACL Padres in 2021. Del Castillo then became the team's hitting coach from 2022 to 2023 before being promoted to bench coach for the Double-A San Antonio Missions in 2024 and 2025.

As a player, Del Castillo spent nine years in the minor leagues, all in the Padres' organization. He played 20 games in Triple-A with the El Paso Chihuahuas team that won the Pacific Coast League in 2016.



BENCH COACH: MORGAN BURKHART

Morgan Burkhardt, 54, enters his 14th season as a coach in the Padres' organization.

After coaching for six years outside of affiliated baseball, Burkhardt returned to affiliated baseball when he became the hitting coach for the Fort Wayne TinCaps from 2013 to 2014. He was with the San Antonio Missions in 2015 before a stint as the El Paso Chihuahuas' hitting coach from 2016 to 2019. In the Chihuahuas' 2016 PCL Championship run, the team led MiLB in batting (.295) and hits (1,468), while leading all Triple-A teams with 156 home runs. In 2019, Burkhardt coached alongside his brother, Lance, who was the team's fielding coach. Burkhardt was named the Padres' batting practice/hitting instructor from 2022 to 2023 before being promoted to major league coaching assistant in 2024 and 2025.

His playing career began in 1995 with the Richmond Roosters in the Frontier League. After four seasons, he was signed by the Boston Red Sox in 1999. He played in MLB for three seasons (2000-2001, 2003) for the Red Sox and the Kansas City Royals before playing part of 2004 in the Chicago White Sox organization. He also played in Japan (2002) and Mexico (2004-2006).



CARLOS OLIVAS Athletic Trainer

Olivas enters his second season in the Padres' organization. He has been an athletic trainer in professional baseball for over 25 years and has worked for the Texas Rangers, LA Dodgers, Atlanta Braves and Tampa Bay Rays' organizations. Olivas was named Triple-A West Athletic Trainer of the Year in 2021 with Round Rock.



Micah Gerhart Athletic Trainer

Gerhart enters his eighth season in the Padres' organization since joining in 2019. Last season, he was named the Midwest League Athletic Trainer of the Year with High-A Fort Wayne. Prior to joining the organization, he was a member of the Philadelphia Eagles' athletic training staff that won Super Bowl LII in 2018.



A.J. RUSSELL Strength & Conditioning

Russell enters his 15th season as the Padres' Triple-A affiliate strength and conditioning coach. He first started with the Tucson Padres from 2011-2013, and has been with El Paso since its inaugural season in 2014.

OVERVIEW: Signed by the San Diego Padres as a free agent in February 2025.

- Pivetta began the season with the Padres before being placed on the injured list in April with right elbow inflammation. In four starts with San Diego, the right-handed pitcher posted a 1-2 record with a 4.50 ERA.
- He has made two rehab assignment appearances this season, both with Single-A Lake Elsinore. Pivetta recorded two outs across 14 pitches in his first rehab outing on August 4. He last pitched on August 25 with the Storm. He pitched 3.0 innings and allowed three runs on four hits and a walk. Pivetta struck out four batters and allowed two home runs.
- Pivetta has spent 10 years in MLB. He was drafted by the Washington Nationals in the 4th round of the 2013 MLB Draft out of New Mexico Junior College. Pivetta pitched with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-2020) and the Boston Red Sox (2020-2024) before signing with the Padres as a free agent in February 2025.
- In his first season with San Diego, Pivetta went 13-5 with a 2.87 ERA across 31 starts. He struck out 190 batters in 181.2 innings pitched. He surrendered 129 hits and 50 walks. Among National League pitchers, he ranked 2nd in WHIP (0.99), 3rd in batting average against (.195), 6th in ERA (2.87), 7th in innings pitched (182.1), and 10th in strikeouts (190). He finished 6th in National League Cy Young voting.
