YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Curve, 10-6. Altoona scored three runs in the first, including a single by Termarr Johnson and a two-run homer by Nick Cimillo. In the second, Sabin Ceballos hit a two-run homer to close the score to 3-2. The Curve responded with a three-run homer by Esmerlyn Valdez in the third to open a 6-2 lead. In the fourth, Ceballos drove in two runs with a single and Diego Velasquez hit a two-run homer to tie the game, 6-6. Carter Howell hit a go-ahead double in the fifth. Victor Bericoto hit an RBI single in the sixth and Scott Bandura opened a 10-6 lead with a two-run double later in the frame. The Richmond bullpen combined for six scoreless innings and allowed two hits with nine strikeouts. Ian Villers picked up his first Double-A win.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the third of a six-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. This series is the second of three between the two teams this year. In Altoona from June 18-22, the Flying Squirrels went 3-2 for their first series win of 2025. One of the games was canceled. The two teams will also meet for six games in Altoona from September 2-7, Richmond's final road trip of the season.

PACKING THE HOUSE: This season the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,551 fans per home game, which leads Double-A and ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history. Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance was the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are in second place in the Southwest Division second-half standings, 1.5 games behind Altoona. They won last week's series in Erie, going 4-2, to cap a 6-6 road trip. After going 10-2 from July 4-20, they dropped six of seven from July 22-30 before going 7-5 in their last 12 games dating back to August 1. Of Richmond's 65 losses this season, 37 of them have been by two runs or less (23 by one, 14 by two). Their 23 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL, even with Reading. Richmond's +18 run differential in the second half is third-best in the league.

THE CURVE are leading the Southwest Division second-half standings by 1.5 games over the Flying Squirrels. They split last week's six-game series against the Yard Goats in Altoona. Altoona roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects, including INF Termarr Johnson (No. 7), RHP Antwone Kelly (No. 12), RHP Wilber Dotel (No. 13), OF/INF Mitch Jebb (No. 20), OF/IB Esmerlin Valdez (No. 22) and C Omar Alfonzo (No. 25). MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list features five Altoona players, including Johnson (No. 6), Valdez (No. 15), Jebb (No. 18), Alfonzo (No. 19) and Dotel (No. 28).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander John Michael Bertrand makes his 21st start of the season and the eighth of his career against the Curve. Last time out, he threw five scoreless innings and allowed three hits in a win at Erie last Friday night. In his last five starts since July 4, Bertrand has gone 3-1 with a 0.67 ERA (2 ER/27.0 IP). After going 0-4 with a 5.91 ERA (14 ER/21.1 IP) in five April starts, Bertrand has gone 5-4 with a 2.15 ERA (20 ER/83.2 IP) in his last 15 starts since May 4. Tonight marks the 59th start of his Richmond career, which is third-most in franchise history. He has also thrown the sixth-most innings (303.0) in team history, trailing Edwin Quirarte (306.1). In the Eastern League this year, Bertrand ranks third in innings pitched (105.0), third in ERA (2.91), sixth in BAA (.242) and seventh in WHIP (1.27). Since the start of the 2024 season, Bertrand ranks third among all MiLB pitchers in innings (261.0) and first in double play groundouts (34). Last year, he was named the Flying Squirrels' Pitcher of the Year after going 7-9 with a 4.32 ERA in 28 outings (27 starts). Bertrand also won the team's Community Service Award. He made two starts with Triple-A Sacramento to close the season. For the year, Bertrand led all Eastern League pitchers with 10 scoreless starts, all at least five innings. He also led all MiLB pitchers defensively in assists (31) and ranked second in total chances (38). He finished the season ranked first among all MiLB pitchers in double plays induced (23), five ahead of the next closest pitcher. Bertrand was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week twice last year, first for throwing seven perfect innings against the Baysox on April 27 and then for working six hitless innings in Bowie on May 23. Entering 2025, he is rated by Baseball America as having the best control in the Giants system for the second straight year. Bertrand began his collegiate career at Furman University in South Carolina before playing his final two seasons at the University of Notre Dame. FOR ALTOONA: Right-hander Wilber Dotel makes his 22nd start of the season and his second against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched on Friday against Hartford and surrendered one unearned run over six innings in a no-decision. He last faced Richmond on June 18 in Altoona and threw six scoreless innings, allowing two hits with eight strikeouts. For the season, he ranks tied for fourth in the Eastern League in strikeouts. Dotel signed with the Pirates as an international free agent in 2020. He is in his first Double-A season. With High-A Greensboro last year, he went 9-5 with a 5.33 ERA in 25 starts.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan and Onil Perez have combined to catch 56 stolen base attempts this season, which first among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 40 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has set a franchise record for the most caught stealing in a season in Flying Squirrels history, passing Jackson Williams' mark of 35 set in 2015 with his 36th on July 26 against Portland. For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 53 runners caught stealing for his career is second-most in franchise history, even with Eliezer Zambrano (53, 2010-2017). He is six behind the Flying Squirrels career record of 59, set by Williams (2010-11, 15).

BERI BOMBS: Victor Bericoto hit his ninth homer of the season in the second game of the August 1 doubleheader at Somerset, which leads active Richmond players for the year. It was the 31st homer of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into third place on the franchise's all-time home run list, passing **Jarrett Parker** (2013-14). He is now two homers behind **Jacob Heyward** (2019, 21-22) for second place on the list and six behind **Ricky Oropesa's** (2013-16) franchise record of 37. He also drove the 118th RBI of his Richmond career in the first game of Friday's doubleheader, moving him ahead of **Hunter Cole** (2015-17) for second place on the franchise's all-time RBI list. Bericoto now has 125 career RBIs with Richmond, trailing only Oropesa's record of 165. In 11 August games, Bericoto is batting .324 (12-for-37) with a homer, two doubles and eight RBIs.

UNTUCK: Tyler Myrick recorded his 10th save of the season on August 6 in a 6-3 win at Erie. It was his second straight day closing out a save. For the year, he leads the EL in saves. It was the 22nd save of his Flying Squirrels career, moving him into a tie for fifth place on the franchise's all-time saves list with **Josh Osich** (2013-16). His next save will tie him with **Rafael Cova** (2010) for fourth on the franchise's all-time saves list with 23. Myrick has converted six of his eight save attempts since July 1 over 12 appearances. He picked up his first win of the season on July 25 against the Sea Dogs, working the final four outs.

KING OF THE HILL: In his last 12 games since July 30, **Turner Hill** is batting .385 (15-for-39) with three doubles, five walks, a homer, four RBIs and nine runs scored. Last Saturday night at Erie, he tied his Double-A career high with four hits and set a Double-A career high with three runs scored. On Tuesday night, he hit a three-run homer, his second this season.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked tied for fifth in walks (55), fifth in hits (97) and seventh in OBP (.358). Turner Hill is tied for fifth in triples (5). Seth Lonsway is fifth in ERA (3.52). John Michael Bertrand is third in innings pitched (105.0), third in ERA (2.91), seventh in WHIP (1.27) and sixth in BAA (.242). Jack Choate is tied for fourth in strikeouts (103). Joe Whitman is seventh in strikeouts (97). Tyler Myrick is first in saves (10).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 245 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Bo Davidson (No. 3), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Joe Whitman (No. 11) and Jack Choate (No. 30). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 5), Whitman (No. 14) and Velasquez (No. 21).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1962: The Richmond Virginians beat the Buffalo Bisons, 6-3, at Parker Field. Down, 3-2, in the fifth, Joe Pepitone hit a two-run homer to give the Virginians a 4-3 lead. It was believed to be one of the longest homers hit at Parker Field in the Virginians rac, clearing the football scoreboard, which was 365 feet from home plate, 15-feet tall and on top of a 10-foot fence. It was estimated at least 425 feet. After the game, Pepitone said to Shelly Roffe of the Richmond Times-Dispatch, "I got under the ball," and said he didn't hit it well. "Mickey Mantle used to say even when he hit the ball 500 feet, he didn't hit it very good." Paul Erickson took over for Vees starter Jim Bronstad in the fourth and did not allow a Buffalo run the rest of the game. 1967: The Richmond Braves beat the Toronto Maple Leafs, 3-2, at Parker Field. With the bases loaded and one out in the eighth, Bobby Cox hit a go-ahead, two-run single to give Richmond the lead. Pinch-runner Skipp Guinn scored the winning run. 1968: The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 3-2, at Parker Field. Van Kelly and Dave Nicholson hit homered to give Richmond an early 2-0 lead. Toledo tied the score with a two-run homer by Gary Neibauer in the eighth. Santiago Rosario won the game with a walk-off single to the left-field fence in the bottom of the ninth inning. 1997: The Columbus Clippers beat the Richmond Braves, 13-3, at The Diamond. Making a rehab appearance, Darryl Strawberry hit two homers and drove in seven runs. He left the next morning to rejoin the Yankees. He was working his way back from tearing cartilage in his knee during spring training, leading to surgery in June. 2015: The Richmond Braves beat the Altoona Curve, 5-4, at The Diamond. Engel Beltre brought in Mitch Delfino with a groundout for a 1-0 Richmond lead in the second. In the third, Steven Brault singled, advanced on a sacrifice bunt by Adam Frazier and scored on a wild pitch to tie the game. Austin Slater hit an RBI single in the third for a Medina, Rando Moreno tied the game with a single and Austin Slater worked a walk from Medina to bring home the walk-off winning run.
