## FABIAN HOMERS AS RIDERS DROP SATURDAY GAME:

The Frisco RoughRiders stranded the tying run aboard in the bottom of the ninth, as the Corpus Christi Hooks hung on to take Saturday's game at Riders Field, 3-2. Right fielder **Sandro Fabian** knocked his 10th home run of the season in the bottom of the third inning to lead the Riders offense. Riders starter **Tim Brennan** (1-3) struck out four batters and gave up three runs on seven hits in a season-high five innings Saturday night. Corpus Christi broke a scoreless tie and took an early lead with two consecutive hits in the top of the third on Brennan to take a 1-0 lead. The Hooks added two more in the fourth with a run-scoring double from Grae Kessinger and an ensuing single from Edwin Diaz to stretch the Hooks lead to 3-2. Fabian's home run put the Riders on the scoreboard with their first hit of the night in the bottom of the third inning to move Saturday's score to 3-1. Frisco cut into the lead in the bottom of the eighth, beginning with a single from **Kellen Strahm** to extend his on-base streak to 20 games. Strahm joins **Justin Foscue** as the only Riders hitters to reach base in 20 consecutive games this season. Frisco reliever **Kevin Gowdy** tossed his third scoreless outing in his last four with two innings of shutout baseball. Southpaw **Josh Smith** struck out two batters in the final two innings on the mound. **J.P. Martinez** walked with one out in the bottom of the ninth and **Blaine Crim** singled to put runners at the corners. Outfielder **Josh Stowers** entered to run for Crim at first and Frisco attempted a double-steal in the following at-bat, but Martinez was caught stealing at the plate for the second out and preserved the 3-2 Hooks lead.

## ANOTHER BLANKING:

The RoughRiders used **Owen White** and **Seth Nordlin** to pitch their fifth shutout of the season on Friday. Through 74 games, the Riders are on pace for nine shutouts on the year. Last season, the Riders had eight shutouts on the season. In 2021, the Riders had a 3.98 ERA while this year's club has a 4.86 team ERA.

## J.P. STANDS FOR JUST PERFORM:

Riders outfielder **J.P. Martinez** has been lethal at the plate this season for the Riders. After cracking his ninth home run on Friday, Martinez now has an active-team-high .897 OPS while leading the team in OBP (.409), runs (52), triples (5) walks (40) and stolen bases (25). His OBP is also ninth in the league while he is second in triples and stolen bases and ninth in runs.

## JONNY ON THE SPOT:

Riders infielder **Jonathan Ornelas** has been on fire at the plate all season long, but recently, he has been even better. Over his last 18 games, Ornelas is hitting .338 (26-for-77)/.358/.468 with two doubles, a triple, two home runs, nine RBIs and seven runs. This season, he leads the Riders with 30 multi-hit games and 14 games with three or more hits. Ornelas is the second-leading active hitter in the Texas League with a .330 batting average while he is first in hits (92). He is tied for second in hits in MiLB.

## IT'S ABOUT STRAHM TIME:

Riders outfielder **Kellen Strahm** started off slowly, but he has started to turn his offensive game around. Since May 27th, over his last 27 games, Strahm is hitting .374 (34-for-91)/.462/.516 with four doubles, three home runs, 15 walks, 19 runs and eight RBIs. In that stretch, Strahm has raised his average from .148 to .267 and his OPS from .528 to .762. The Eugene, Oregon native is riding an 20-game on-base streak (tied with **Justin Foscue** for the longest streak on the Riders this season), in which he is hitting .351/.429/.527 with 10 walks. The streak is the longest active in the Texas League and the second-longest active in Double-A. In his last 33 games, he is batting .336/.427/.451/.878.

## WHAT(LEY) IN THE WORLD:

Riders catcher **Matt Whatley** is currently riding a career-best 10-game hitting streak at the plate. Over his last 10 games, he is hitting .333 (13-for-39)/.325/.359 with four RBIs and five runs. During the stretch, Whatley has raised his average from .188 to .243. The Oklahoma native had a career-high .295 batting average in 2017 after being drafted in the third round.

## THREE IS A MAGIC NUMBER:

Frisco has played a lot of close games this season and when scoring or allowing three runs, the Riders have seen a pretty predictable result. This season, the Riders are 4-22 when scoring three runs or fewer and 20-3 when allowing three runs or fewer.

## NO ONE MAN SHOULD HAVE ALL THAT POWER:

The RoughRiders have relied heavily on the home run ball this season. Through 74 games, Frisco has hit 96 long balls (1.3 per game) which is the third-most in the Texas League. At this rate, the RoughRiders would finish the season with 179 home runs, a mark which would be the most in franchise history (topping 2007 when Frisco hit 176 home runs). Out of their 74 total games, the Riders have hit home runs in 50 games, which means that when they hit a home run, they are averaging 1.9 home runs per game when they hit them. In the 24 games that the Riders have not hit a home run, Frisco is just 11-13. **Trey Hair** and **Dustin Harris** have the team lead with 13, tied for seventh in the league.

### ABOUT ZAK

-Grew up never playing travel ball, always played Little League baseball and never started on the All-Star teams. After making the varsity team his freshman year at Northumberland High School, he was cut. He was "heartbroken" and wanted to prove to everyone that he could play varsity. Made the team his sophomore season, playing third and pitching, but pitching was his passion.

-Around midway through his SO year in HS, decided he wanted to play in college, so decided to try travel ball. During his first time with the Richmond Braves, he was cut after the tryout. Mom encouraged him to tryout again in two weeks and made the team.

-Mom went to Liberty, so he wanted to go there, but went to camp and saw players that were a lot better than him when he was a junior. Went to a showcase and was the last one to throw. VMI was the only school interested and Kent only said he wanted to go there when he heard they were D1. At the time, he was only throwing 82-84 on a good day, but had a high spin rate. Played QB on football team in HS for three years and lettered one year in golf. Pfeiffer (D2) was only other team that recruited him.

-At VMI, finished 2019 season 5-5 with a 4.64 ERA, striking out 132 over 97.0 innings while walking just 30. Those strikeouts led the Southern Conference and was ninth in the nation (also a school record). Was second in the country in strikeouts at the end of the regular season, but was passed when others pitched in the postseason.

-Teammates with Josh Winder (started 2021 season with Wichita Wind Surge) at VMI. He was a big inspiration to Kent throughout his career.

### 2022 SEASON

-Entered the season as the No. 21 prospect in the Rangers system per MLB.com.

-Made sixth start against Corpus Christi as the opener (just one inning) before Justin Slaten.

-Threw longest start of season for Riders on June 3rd at Wichita, matching a career-high seven innings with nine strikeouts and no walks. It was the first ultra-quality start for Frisco on the season and the fourth quality start.

-Came off of the IL on July 3rd after arm soreness (one week on IL).

### 2021 SEASON

-Finished third among Rangers farmhands in strikeout rate (31.9 percent), only behind Avery Weems (34.5) and Cole Winn (32.2).

-Began season in the bullpen, throwing five-straight scoreless outings (18.2 IP, 10 H, 0 R, 3 BB, 26 K) before transitioning into a starting role with Hickory.

-As a starter, went 4-2 with a 4.10 ERA over nine starts, but finished out time with Crawdads with best start on August 5th against Greensboro: 7.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 1 BB, 13 K. Won High-A Pitcher of the Week for his efforts.

-In Double-A debut, threw first career complete game in game one of the doubleheader at Northwest Arkansas, but took the loss in a 1-0 game. Kent went 6.0 innings, allowing just one run on a solo home run, ceding three hits while striking out seven and walking two.

### 2020 SEASON

-Tied with Cody Bradford for most strikeouts in the Fall Developmental League (25 K/17.0 IP) among Rangers farmhands.

### 2019 SEASON

-Though he started seven games, he never pitched more than three innings in a game. Finished last eight outings, six starts, with a 0-1 record and 3.45 ERA.
