26 DAYS LATER: Ahead of Friday's regularly scheduled game between Dunedin and Bradenton, the two teams resumed a suspended contest from June 29 at TD Ballpark, which was tied 3-3 entering the 11th inning. Jay Schueler, who had tossed a scoreless 10th and was on the mound when weather halted play nearly a month ago, picked up right where he left off by striking out two and picking off the ghost runner to end the top of the 11th. In the bottom half, Lizandro Rodriguez laid down a bunt single to move Dunedin ghost runner Tucker Toman to third, and Jean Joseph followed with a sacrifice fly to right to score Toman and give the Blue Jays a walk-off win on the road, their third walk-off of the season.

FISH ON: The Blue Jays swept the Tarpons in their rain-shortened four game series, with Wednesday's game postponed and Thursday's suspended entering the 5th inning scoreless. Dunedin outscored Tampa 29-11 in the four completed games of the series, where they homered ten times.

YARD WORK: Entering the Tampa series, Dunedin's sole two-homer performance came from Bryce Arnold on 4/19 vs. LAK. On Saturday in the Jays 12-4 win, Yhoangel Aponte launched a three-run homer in the 3rd and a solo blast in the 8th for his first professional multi-homer game. The next day on Sunday in their 7-1 win, Tucker Toman swatted his first professional multi-homer game with a solo homer in the 5th and two-run homer in the 7th.

INTO THE VARSH: On Tuesday, Blue Jays CF Daulton Varsho launched a solo homer in the 5th for his second long ball in as many games on MLB rehab assignment. His solo shot left the bat at 102.1 MPH. Varsho has hit safely in all three games of his rehab stint with Dunedin, going 4-for-8 (.500) with two homers and five RBI. In his first game on Friday he went 1-for-2 in four innings in CF, and on Saturday launched a go-ahead three-run homer in the 5th inning. He also brought home the first run of the ballgame on an RBI groundout in the 3rd. Varsho landed on the injured list June 1 with a strained left hamstring.

BIG LEAGUE BOPPERS: Vladimir Guerrero Jr. doubled twice and scored a pair of runs as the Toronto Blue Jays defeated the Detroit Tigers 6-2 Friday night. The AL-leading Blue Jays are 7-1 since the All-Star break, while the Tigers have lost five straight and 11 of 12. José Berrios (7-4) picked up the win, giving up two runs on five hits and two walks in six innings. For the first time in more than 30 years (1992), the Toronto Blue Jays own the best record in Major League Baseball four months into the season.

PLAYOFFS ALREADY?: The FCL Blue Jays won 4-1 Wednesday and the FCL Orioles lost both games of their doubleheader allowing the Blue Jays to grab the lone wild card spot. They defeated the Astros 4-3 today in the FCL semifinals. Drew Jemison and Aldo Gaxiola hit RBI singles in the top of the 10th. Troy Guthrie threw five scoreless innings as the starter. The Jays advance to the best-of-three finals which start tomorrow. Last season the FCL Jays went 12-44, the worst record in the circuit.

NEW HALF NEW JAYS?: The D-Jays concluded the first half 33-31, fourth place in the FSL West. Lakeland clinched the FSL West first-half championship and St. Lucie took the FSL East. After Dunedin went 4-13 from May 14-June 1, they fell from two games up in first place on May 13, to as far as 5.5 games out of first place in the FSL West on June 3.

SCOUTING BRADENTON: The Blue Jays have taken 6-of-12 vs. Bradenton entering the series, having split vs. the Marauders in their first set from May 13-18, and second set from June 25-29 in a series that saw three games suspended and four effected by weather.

Gil Kim | Manager *Year with Toronto: 10 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Pottsville, PA*

First-year Manager Gil Kim provides a wealth of experience as a player, coach, and executive to Dunedin. Hired in 2016 as the Blue Jays Director of Player Development, Kim transitioned from the front office to a coaching role with the organization in 2020 when he joined Toronto's major league field staff under the same job title, before becoming the Blue Jay's major league field coordinator in 2022, a position he held until 2024. Before joining Toronto, Kim spent seven seasons with the Texas Rangers in several scouting roles, culminating as Director, International Scouting. A native of Pottsville, PA, Kim also had a six-year international professional playing career as an infielder, which included stops in the Netherlands, China, Australia, Spain and Venezuela. He played one season of collegiate baseball at D3 Middlebury before transferring to Vanderbilt, where he played under Tim Corbin. In 2008 while playing in Venezuela, Kim slept on a mattress in the bathroom in the locker room to save money and learn Spanish.

Cory Riordan | Pitching Coach *Year with Toronto: 5 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Killingworth, CT*

Cory Riordan enters his third season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach, after he held the same role with the FCL Blue Jays in 2021-22. He joined the Blue Jays organization in 2020, where he spent the 2020 shutdown assisting with the club's pitch design framework. Riordan pitched collegiately at Fordham University and went on to play 13 professional seasons, spending time with the Colorado Rockies and Detroit Tigers organizations, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time in the independent Atlantic League, and played internationally in South Korea and Taiwan, and three winter ball seasons in Venezuela and the Dominican Republic.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach *Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Denton, TX*

Nash Knight enters his second season with the Dunedin Blue Jays and Jays' organization. Under Knight's guidance in 2024, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League leaders with 101 HR (3rd), 34 3B (T-1st), and a .359 SLG (3rd). Knight made the transition to coaching following a seven-year playing career where he spent six seasons in Toronto's farm system, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sep. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

Ashley Stephenson | Position Coach *Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Mississauga, ON.*

Stephenson is in her first season as Position Coach, after she spent the prior two seasons with the High-A Vancouver Canadians in the same role, helping to claim a 2023 Northwest League championship. Inducted to the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. Initially a star hockey player at the collegiate level at Wilfrid Laurier, she claimed four conference titles and a CIS National Championship, before joining the pro ranks in the original National Women's Hockey League and the Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson starred for Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004 to 2018. She was twice named the team's MVP, earned an All-Star nod at third base in the 2008 IBAF World Cup Tournament and won the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was renamed in her honor. She was tabbed as the 2022 recipient of the Baseball Canada Lionel Ruhr Elite Coach of the Year Award after she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team when she led the women's national team to two wins over Team USA in the Friendship Series then coached Ontario teams at the Women's Invitational and 16U Girls Championships ahead of joining the Blue Jays organization. Became the second female coach in the Jays system, following Jamie Lever.

Rodrigo Vigil | Position Coach *Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: David, Panama*

Vigil joins Dunedin for his first season as a Position Coach. A former catcher, Vigil enjoyed an 11-year professional playing career. He spent 10 seasons in the Miami Marlins farm system before finishing with the Blue Jays in 2021, where he hit .275 in 34 games between Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo. Overall, Vigil played 550 career minor league games, where he hit .251. He began his coaching career as a bench coach for the ACL Mariners in 2022 before returning to the Blue Jays system, where he spent the past two seasons as a rehab position coach.

Antonio Caceres | Ast. Pitching Coach *Year with Toronto: 25 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cotui, DR*

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995-1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

As a sophomore at CSN in 2023 Registered a career-high .358 batting average for the Coyotes with 1 HR and 30 RBI. Also pitched 57 IP with a 4.11 ERA over 12 GS, going 5-3 with 54 K. Transferred to the University of Nevada Las Vegas for his junior year. Focused solely on pitching and cemented himself as the Rebels' Friday night starter, earning All-Mountain West 1st Team. CAREER NOTES: Selected in the 7th round (217th overall) by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 2024 MLB Draft, signed for \$222,500. Besides Toronto, the Houston Astros, Texas Rangers and San Diego Padres expressed interest and invited him for workouts. Austin was drafted on a Monday and was in Florida by Friday.

PERSONAL NOTES: Said he considered being a two-way player at the D1 level but significantly improved on the mound once he gave up hitting. Added that he misses the grind of playing both sides of the ball. His JUCO conference used wood bats, so would have loved to use metal bats. Enjoys golfing, put himself as the third best golfer on the team to begin the season behind Peyton Powell and Khal Stephen. Favorite player growing up was Greg Maddux, rooted for the Astros. Lists favorite non-baseball athlete as David Goggins. Coming out of Coronado High School in Henderson, NV., Cates originally committed to play ball at the University of Hawaii, but shifted his commitment to stay close to home at the College of Southern Nevada. Jacob Sharp, acquired by the Blue Jays from the Mariners in last year's Yimi Garcia trade, is also a UNLV alum.
