

# **EXECUTIVE BIOS**



# CHUCK GREENBERG

# President & Managing Partner



The 2004 season will mark Greenberg's third year as the President and Managing Partner of the Altoona Curve. Under his leadership the past two seasons, the Curve has established increased attendance totals both seasons and signed a new four-year major league affiliation agreement with the Pittsburgh Pirates through the 2006 season.

Chuck and his group of investors formed Curve Baseball LP and agreed to purchase the Altoona Curve from Robert F. Lozinak and Tate DeWeese on Oct. 17, 2001. He became the President and Managing Partner of the club when the final sale was approved in March 2002.

The 42-year old Pittsburgh native is a practicing corporate and sports attorney and a Partner in the Pennsylvania-based law firm Pepper Hamilton, LLP, where he's worked since 1998. He also heads the firm's sports practice and is a member of its Executive Committee. Chuck is also the president and CEO of PlayMaker Sports Advisors LLC, a wholly owned subsidiary of Pepper Hamilton that offers a range of services to the sports industry.

Among his work in the sports industry, he was instrumental in helping put together the deal that landed NHL Hall of Famer Mario Lemieux ownership of the bankrupt Pittsburgh Penguins in 1999. In 2001, he represented the purchasers of the Florida Panthers NHL franchise in their acquisition.

Active in the community, Chuck serves on the Board of Directors of the Mario Lemieux Foundation and the Mellon/Mario Lemieux Celebrity Golf Invitational and has been heavily involved in a variety of youth athletic programs.

Chuck graduated from Upper St. Clair High School in 1978 and four years later received his B.A. from Tufts University in Massachusetts. In 1985, he graduated from the University of Michigan Law School. He and his wife Jennifer have been married for 19 years and have three boys; Jeff (17), Jack (15) and Benny (13).

# TODD PARNELL

# GENERAL MANAGER



The 2004 season will mark Parnell's third year as the General Manager of the Altoona Curve. Under his leadership the past two seasons, the Curve has continued to increase attendance totals each season, successfully extended its affiliation agreement with the Pittsburgh Pirates through the 2006 season and has helped to create some of the most innovative promotions in minor league baseball, including last July's "Awful Night", which garnered national attention.

Prior to joining the Curve, the North Carolina native was the Vice President and GM of the Single-A Kannapolis (NC) Intimidators (formerly the Piedmont Boll Weevils) in the South Atlantic League from 1997 to the 2001 season.

During his tenure in Kannapolis, the club set attendance records (either overall or or average) in each of his first four seasons and made the playoffs in 1998 and 2000. For his efforts, Parnell was named the 1999 South Atlantic League General Manager of the Year.

In November 2000, owners Larry Hedrick, Bruton Smith and Dale Earnhardt changed the team name from the Piedmont Boll Weevils to the Kannapolis Intimidators and switched their major league affiliation from the Philadelphia Phillies to the Chicago White Sox. In the club's first season with its new image, the Intimidators again set franchise records in both single-season and per-game attendance, while becoming one of minor leagues baseball's top merchandise sellers. For example, with the help of Dale Earnhardt Jr., the team hosted a live, two-hour "For the Race Fans Only" QVC network broadcast during a home game on May 25. Following the season he was named SAL GM of the Year for the second time in his career.

"Parney" began his minor league baseball career during the 1990 season when he joined the Eastern League's Reading Phillies as the club's Director of Sales and Marketing. He was later promoted to Assistant General Manager, a position he held through the 1996 season. During his tenure with the R-Phils he was instrumental in turning the club into one of the most successful minor league baseball franchises in the country and was part of a Reading staff that took home the prestigious Freitas Award in 1994.

The 37-year-old graduated from Messiah College in 1988 with a degree in physical education and a minor in business. He and wife Kelly are the parents of two daughters; Lindsay (1/29/95) and Samantha(11/11/97).



ON INTERSTATE 99: Take the Frankstown Road Exit #32. Ballpark is located at the exit.

FROM PITTSBURGH: Take I-76/I-376 East to U.S. 22 East. Drive on 22 East for approximately 80 miles. Merge onto I-99/US-220 North six miles from Altoona.

Stay on I-99 North and take the Frankstown Road Exit #32. Ballpark is

located at the exit.

Take Bedford exit. Go North on I-99 approximately 40 miles. Take the FROM PA TURNPIKE:

Frankstown Road Exit #32. Ballpark is located at the exit.

FROM I-80 (Traveling East): Take the Philipsburg/Woodland Exit to U.S. 322 East. After about 25

miles, take U.S. 220 South. 220 South merges with I-99 South. Drive on I-99 South for approximately 20 miles. Take the Frankstown Road Exit

#32. Turn right at the exit, the ballpark will be to your right.

FROM I-80 (Traveling West): Take the Altoona/Milesburg exit and bear onto U.S. 220 South. After

approximately 30 miles merge onto I-99 South. Drive on I-99 South for 20 miles. Take the Frankstown Road Exit #32. Turn right at the exit, the

ballpark will be to your right.

# 2004 CURVE RADIO NETWORK

Once again in 2004, Altoona Curve baseball will be heard throughout Central Pennsylvania on the Curve Radio Network. WFBG-AM 1290 in Altoona will return for its sixth consecutive season as the flagship home of one of minor league baseball's largest networks. All 142 regular season games, as well as any postseason action, can be heard live on the network.

Rob Egan and Jason Dambach return to the Curve broadcast booth for the 2004 season. The duo will share play-by-play duties for the fifth consecutive season.

Egan is entering his sixth season as the lead play-by-play voice of the Curve, having been with the club since the inaugural 1999 season. Overall, the 35-year old enters his 10th season as a minor league broadcaster. The Michigan native, and graduate of Central Michigan University, has also called action for the Charleston (SC) RiverDogs (1997-98), Johnstown Steal (1996) and Salinas Peppers (1995). Egan also serves as the club's Director of Broadcasting and sells corporate sponsorship packages during the off-season.

# 2003 CURVE NOTEBOOK

**PLAYOFF BOUND:** The Curve became the last of the 12 Eastern League franchises to reach post-season play after going 78-63 and earning a wild card berth as the second-place team in the E.L. Southern Division. Despite finishing a distant 10 games behind division champion Akron, the Curve barely had to sweat down the stretch, finishing 6 1/2 games ahead of third-place Bowie. Unfortunately, the Curve was bounced from the playoffs in the Divisional round, falling three-games-to-one to the eventual league champion Akron Aeros.

ANOTHER YEAR, ANOTHER RECORD: Despite having six of its home contests rained out over the course of the season, the Curve set a fourth consecutive attendance record by drawing 365,785 fans to Blair County Ballpark. Among the record-setting total included the franchise's first two 9,000+ crowds on August 10 vs. Harrisburg (9,255) and July 4 vs. Erie (9,137). In 65 home dates, the Curve's average attendance was 5,621, meaning that the club's per night figure had risen by nearly 1,000 fans since the inaugural 1999 season.

SUPER SOUTHPAW: Despite pitching the entire season as a 20-year old, Curve left-hander Sean Burnett was named the Eastern League's Pitcher of the Year after going 14-6 with a solid 3.21 ERA in 27 starts. The Pirates' first round selection in the 2000 June draft became the first-ever Altoona hurler to win the league's Pitcher of the Year Award and became the first Curve pitcher since Wilson Guzman and Sam McConnell in 2000 to earn a spot on the Eastern League's post-season All-Star Team. He also became the first pitcher in Altoona Curve history to be named the club's Most Valuable Player.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Curve players to finish among the Eastern League's statistical leaders: LHP Sean Burnett led the league in wins (14) and ranked 5th in ERA (3.21) and innings pitched (159.2)... LHP Mike Connolly tied for 8th in the league in ERA (3.39)... OF Chris Duffy finished 5th in the E.L. with 34 stolen bases... RHP Landon Jacobsen ranked 2nd in ERA (2.93) and 4th in innings pitched (162.2)... RHP Todd Ozias ranked 2nd in the league with 21 saves

**YOUTH SERVED:** One year after opening the season with just two Double-A rookies, the Curve began the 2003 campaign with 10 players without previous Double-A experience. That total did not include RHP **Jeff Bennett**, who made one start for Altoona at the end of the 2001 season and OF **B.J. Barns** who spent the final month of 2001 with the Curve. Despite the relative youth of the club, all of the newcomers had been teammates with the Lynchburg Hillcats when they cruised to the Class-A Carolina League championship in 2002.

**RE-WRITING THE RECORD BOOK:** Several Curve players etched their names in the Curve single-season record book following the 2003 season: LHP **Sean Burnett** established new club records for wins by a left-handed pitcher (14) and fewest home runs allowed (2), while joining teammate **Landon Jacobsen** in equaling a team mark for most starts in a season (27)... Jacobsen logged 162.2 innings in his 27 starts to set a new single-season team record, while his 11 losses were the most by any right-hander in club history... Closer **Todd Ozias**' 21 saves moved him one past **Chris Spurling** on the Curve's single-season saves list... Despite a down year for Curve hitters, OF **Shawn Garrett**'s 13 home runs were the most by a switch-hitter in club history, while OF **Chris Duffy** established a new club mark in stolen bases with 34.

**TO "THE SHOW":** Six more players with Curve ties made their major league debuts during the 2003 season, including three who spent part of the campaign in Altoona. LHP's **Mike Gonzalez** and **John Grabow** as well as C **J.R. House** all debuted with the Pirates late in the season after playing for the Curve earlier in the year. Of the three, Gonzalez made the biggest contribution, pitching in 16 games in relief after making his big league debut August 11 vs. St. Louis. Curve alums **Chris Spurling** (Figers) and **D.J. Carrasco** (Royals), both of whom were selected in the Rule 5 Major League draft the previous off-season, spent the entire season with their respective clubs, while 1B **Carlos Rivera** played in 78 games for the Pirates, batting .221 with 3 HR and 10 RBI.

**STELLAR STAFF:** Despite having one of the youngest staffs in the Eastern League, Curve pitchers posted a club-record 3.32 ERA. Helping to shape the mark were three Double-A rookies who finished among the league's final leaders in that category--Landon Jacobsen (2nd/2.93), Sean Burnett (5th/3.21) and Mike Connolly (T-8th/3.39). Another factor in the Curve's outstanding staff ERA was a league-low 363 walks in over 1,200 innings.

CLOSING THE DEAL: After entering the season without a clear-cut closer, it didn't take Curve manager Dale Sveum long to settle on his late-inning go-to guy. Todd Ozias, who earlier in his professional career was a top closer in the San Francisco Giants' organization, registered a new franchise-record with 21 saves. The right-hander surpassed the previous club record of 20 saves set by Chris Spurling during the 2002 campaign.

**POWER OUTAGE:** Blair County Ballpark has never had the reputation as a launching pad, and that reputation remained firmly in tact throughout the 2003 season. As a team, the Curve belted just 20 home runs in 69 games at BCB, by far the fewest home longballs in club history. Curve hitters did fare a little better on the road, but the club's total of just 73 home runs in 141 games was an all-time low.

# 2003 CURVE NOTEBOOK



**NO PLACE LIKE HOME?:** Home cooking wasn't tasting so great for the Curve during an early-season stretch that saw the club drop a franchise-record 11 consecutive home games from April 19-May 23. The streak began when closer **Todd Ozias** suffered a rare blown save in a 6-5, 10-inning loss to Bowie on April 19, but came to an end in dramatic fashion when **Ray Navarrete** belted a walkoff solo home run in the bottom of the 11th inning to lift Altoona past Binghamton 4-3 on May 24. Remarkably, despite the prolonged home slump, the club actually finished the season seven games above the .500 mark at Blair County Ballpark (38-31).

**FIVE ALIVE:** Curve infielder **Jose Castillo** became just the fourth player in franchise history to record five hits in one game when he went 5-for-6 in Altoona's 10-2 win at Akron on May 7. He joins **Humberto Cota** (8/13/00 @ Bowie), **Adrian Brown** (5/8/01 vs. Bowie) and **Tony Alvarez** (5/3/02 vs. Bowie) as the only other Curve batters with five hits in one game.

**YANBENSCHOTEN ARRIVES:** After starting the season with a bang in nine starts at Class-A Lynchburg (6-0, 2.22), Pirates' top prospect **John Van Benschoten** joined the Curve's starting rotation after being promoted to Altoona on May 22nd. The 23-year old wasn't fazed by the tougher Double-A hitters, winning his first five decisions with the Curve. A 1-0 loss to New Haven on July 24 was his first of the season in 11 decisions and his first in 27 starts dating back to July 6, 2002 when he was pitching for Low Class-A Hickory.

HITTING THEIR STRIDE: June proved to be the month that vaulted the Curve from a middle-of-the-pack team in the Eastern League's Southern Division to one of the league's best during the second half of the season. After being swept by Portland in a rain-shortened two-game series at BCB June 2-4 which left the Curve with a 27-29 record, Altoona won 19 of its next 24 games to move into sole possession of second place in the Southern Division for the remainder of the season. Included in that stretch was a new franchise-record eight-game winning streak from June 14-20, and the Curve set a club-record with 19 wins during the month.

**DOMINANT EFFORT:** In a season of outstanding performances by Curve starter **Sean Burnett**, perhaps none was as impressive as his effort June 18 against the Trenton Thunder at Blair County Ballpark. The 20-year old, who went on to earn Eastern League Pitcher of the Year honors, needed just 89 pitches to toss a complete game two-hit shutout in a 3-0 win. The two-hit shutout was the lowest-hit nine-inning complete game in Curve franchise history.

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: With the cancellation of the Double-A All-Star Game following the 2002 season, the Eastern League version returned after a 12-year hiatus and was contested at New Britain Stadium in New Britain, CT. The Curve sent a record five players to compete in the game--LHP's Sean Burnett and Mike Johnston, 2B/SS Jose Castillo, 1B/DH Chan Perry and OF Shawn Garrett. Castillo and Garrett each singled and scored a run, Perry scored a run and Johnston struck out two in a relief appearance as their Southern Division squad fell to the Northern Division, 6-5 before a capacity crowd. Burnett did not appear in the game after throwing over 90 pitches in a start just two days earlier.

MR. ALTOONA?: Though Adam Hyzdu is recognized as perhaps the Curve's best player, through the 2003 season, no player took the field in a Curve uniform more than Shaun Skrehot. On July 25 @ Bowie, the 27-year old infielder played in his 323rd game with the Curve, surpassing Rico Washington on the club's all-time games played list. Just a week later on August 2 at Akron, Skrehot also moved past Washington on the Curve's all-time hits list. At the completion of the season, the Houston native had played in 343 games, posting 320 hits and a record 55 stolen bases over his four seasons with the Curve.

**SEALING THE DEAL:** What doubt was left in the Curve's attempt to seal up the second and final playoff spot in the Eastern League's Southern Division race was erased after Altoona went 7-4 in 11 late-season meetings over a 14-day stretch with the third-place Bowie Baysox. The Curve essentially eliminated Bowie from the playoff race after sweeping the Baysox in a three-game series at Blair County Ballpark August 18-20. The series lidlifter was perhaps the most thrilling game of the season, as Curve closer **Todd Ozias** stuck out the side with the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth inning to seal the 1-0 victory.

MAKING IT OFFICIAL: After failing in its first two tries, August 23 and 24 at Bowie, the Curve officially locked up the franchise's first-ever Eastern League playoff appearance with a 7-1 win over Reading in the first game of a doubleheader August 25 at Blair County Ballpark. John VanBenschoten allowed just one run on five hits over seven innings to notch his first career complete game victory. The Curve went on to sweep the fourgame series from the R-Phils by a combined score of 23-2.


**DRAMATIC WIN:** Though the Curve's season came to a disappointing end in the E.L. playoffs, 3B **Kevin Nicholson** provided one of the more exciting moments in club history in Game 2 of the first round series against Akron at Canal Park. The switch-hitter belted his second home run of the game--a go-ahead solo shot in the top of the ninth inning--to lift Altoona to a 4-3 win and even the series at one game apiece. Unfortunately, Akron easily defeated the Curve in Games 3 and 4 at Blair County Ballpark to claim the series victory and a spot in the E.L. Championship Series.

# ALTOONA CURVE: ABRIEF HISTORY

Success of Franchise Began Early and Continues Strong

Like many other decisions in baseball, the latest round of major league expansion had a domino effect on the minor leagues. In 1995, Arizona and Tampa Bay were awarded major league franchises to play their inaugural season in 1998. To keep pace, baseball's rookie level added two teams in 1996. The following year, Class 'A' and Class 'AAA' each increased by two teams.

That left only Class 'AA' in need of expansion to match the number of teams in the big leagues. In 1997, the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues, as it was then called, decided the Eastern League would receive the two new franchises to start play in 1999. Erie was an easy first choice of the NAPBL's expansion committee. After all, the SeaWolves had established short-season attendance records in the new Uht Park as part of the New York-Penn League.

The awarding of the second franchise wasn't easy. For months, it seemed Springfield, Massachusetts would land the team. However, an inability to finalize land and stadium finance deals left the NAPBL looking for another option. Enter Altoona. City native **Bob Lozinak**, Bedford developer **Tate DeWeese**, and a group of Pennsylvania lawmakers put together an eleventh-hour stadium financing package and site plan. The proposal was presented to the expansion committee at an

October 5, 1997 meeting in Las Vegas. It received unanimous approval and Double-A baseball was on its way to Central Pennsylvania.

Ballpark groundbreaking ceremonies took place in March 1998 and the franchise was officially awarded the following month. In June of that year, the Altoona entry selected "Curve" as its nickname. The combination railroad/baseball moniker beat out several choices like "Lake Monsters", "Ridge Runners", and believe it or not, "Fish"!

The next step for the Curve was affiliating with a major league team. Erie seemed to have an inside track on becoming the Pirates' new Double-A affiliate, as the SeaWolves had served as Pittsburgh's short-season club from 1995-98. However, after a series of meetings with potential major league parent clubs, the Curve landed the coveted affiliation with the Pirates. The September 1998 announcement took the franchise to another level as the U.S. 22 pairing seemed an ideal fit. Central Pennsylvania baseball fans, with their strong Pirates' roots, could now cheer for the Buccos' top prospects on their way to Pittsburgh.

Blair County Ballpark under construction

The long-awaited first game in Curve history took place on April 9, 1999 in Reading, PA. The game against the Phillies' affiliate was suspended by rain and completed the next day as part of a double-header. For the record, the Curve lost its first contest, 6-2, but recorded its first win hours later with a 6-4 decision in game two of the twinbill.

# **CURVE FRANCHISE HISTORY**



#### FRANCHISETIMELINE

June 1997 Altoona native Bob Lozinak joins a group led by Bedford County businessmen Tate DeWeese and Mark Thomas that is pushing for a minor league baseball franchise in Blair County.

Oct. 4, 1997 With just hours to spare, the state of Pennsylvania allocates nearly \$11 million in state funds towards the building of a new ballpark that would play host to the proposed new minor league baseball team.

Oct. 5, 1997 The expansion committee of the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues unanimously grants Altoona's bid for a new minor league franchise over the bid submitted by the city of Springfield, MA.

Mar. 7, 1998 Groundbreaking ceremonies take place in Lakemont, the future site of Blair County Ballpark.

Apr. 27, 1998 Altoona is officially granted an expansion franchise by the Eastern League.

July 2, 1998 "Curve" is selected as the new franchise's nickname.

**Sept. 15, 1998** The Curve announces a four-year player development contract with the Pirates.

Apr. 10, 1999 After a rainout the day before, the first game in Curve franchise history is played as part of a doubleheader in Reading—the Curve loses 6-2 in game one, but bounces back for a 6-4 win in game two of the twinbill.

back for a 6-4 win in game two of the twinbill. **Apr. 15, 1999** The Curve's home opener is played before 6,171 fans at Blair County Ballpark with Altoona defeating Bowie 6-1.

Sept. 1, 1999 7,262 fans pack BCB for the final game of the 1999 season--a 4-2 loss to Reading. The franchise draws 323,932 fans in its inaugural season.

May 15, 2000 The Curve defeats its parent club, the Pittsburgh Pirates, 8-5 in front of a then-Blair County Ballpark record crowd of 7,346.

Sept. 3, 2001 The Curve passes the 1 million mark in total attendance by drawing the club's first 8,000+ crowd (8,060).

Oct. 17, 2001 Curve majority owner Bob Lozinak announces that the franchise will be sold to a new group headed by Pittsburgh sports attorney Chuck Greenberg, pending approval. Later, Greenberg would welcome Pittsburgh sports stars Jerome Bettis and Mario Lemieux into the new ownership group.

Apr. 3, 2002 Less than 48 hours before the start of the 2002 season, the ownership transfer officially takes place. Kannapolis Intimidators General Manager Todd Parnell is officially named the club's new GM.

Aug. 5, 2002 The Curve and Pirates announce a four-year agreement extending their affiliation through the 2006 season.

Aug. 8, 2002 The Curve is featured in a full-page article in the sports section of USA Today. The article entitled "Curve Shape a Region's Heart" documents the game-day happenings at BCB.

Jan. 2003 Construction begins on a nearly \$1 million dollar privately financed addition to BCB. The project yielded a left-field Picnic Pavilion, Party Deck and outfield bleacher seating section in time for the '03 season.

Finally, the Curve christened Blair County Ballpark on April 15 with a triumph over the Bowie Baysox. A huge crowd of 6,171 attended the history-making contest despite cold, rainy weather.

After three remarkable seasons, the Lozinak family sold the franchise to a group headed by Pittsburgh attorney **Chuck**

Despite the ownership change, the Curve franchise enjoyed its most successful season to that point, drawing a record 363,871 fans to Blair County Ballpark. On August 5, 2002 the Curve announced a new four-year affiliation agreement with the Pirates, securing one of major league baseball's strongest affiliations through the 2006 season.

Between the 2002 and 2003 seasons, Blair County Ballpark underwent its first major capital expansion project, as a new third-base Picnic Area, left-field Party Deck and outfield reserved seating section were constructed. The additions of the First American Bank Picnic Pavilion, Ansley RV Party Deck and Outfield Reserved seating section brought the seating capacity of the ballpark to just over 7,200 and created enough room to hold nearly 10,000 fans on any given night.

During the 2003 season, the Curve, led by third-year manager **Dale Sveum** took the franchise to new heights on the field, posting a 78-63 regular season record and securing the club's first-ever Eastern League postseason berth, losing to the eventual Eastern League champion Akron Aeros three-games-to-one in the first round of the playoffs. The playoff run helped fuel yet another franchise attendance record as 365,376 fans came through the gates at Blair County Ballpark.







# #16 ADAM HYZDU

It didn't take long for the city of Altoona to show the critics who said the area was too small to support a professional baseball team that it has as knowledgeable and caring fans as anywhere minor league baseball is played. It didn't take Adam Hyzdu long to discover that fact either.

When the minor league veteran signed as a minor league free agent with the Pirates shortly after being released by the Boston Red Sox organization early in the 1999 season, Curve fans were just getting used to their new team and its beautiful new ballpark. Few probably even knew the names of the players they were cheering for. But soon, everyone knew about Hyzdu.

He was the club's Most Valuable Player during the inaugural 1999 season, batting .316 with 24 HR and 78 RBI in just 91 games, before earning a late-season promotion to Triple-A. Most people thought they had seen the last of Hyzdu in a Curve uniform.

However, after a less than intent look from the Pirates in major league spring training, and much to the surprise of the fans of Altoona, Hyzdu returned to the Curve for the 2000 season. Although perhaps initially upset about returning to the Double-A level for the fifth time in his career, Hyzdu tore up Eastern League pitching and in return won the hearts of Curve fans. In 142 games for the 2000 Curve, Hyzdu batted .290 with team records for home runs (31) and RBI (106) and earned the Eastern League's Most Valuable Player Award. By the middle of the season, the entire city of Altoona was campaigning for Hyzdu's promotion to the major leagues.

And just when it appeared as though Adam Hyzdu's 11th season as a professional baseball player would end without a major league at-bat, he had the week of his life. On September 4th, following a season-ending loss to Akron, his number 16 was retired by the Curve--an honor not normally bestowed upon a minor league baseball player. Then, just four days later, Hyzdu received the call he had been waiting for--he was heading to the major leagues! He singled in his first major league at-bat on September 8th and 12 days later hit his first major league home run against the Philadelphia Phillies at Veteran's Stadium.

After returning to the minor leagues to open 2001, he was recalled by the Pirates in May and spent the majority of the season with the major league club. On July 4th that season, in his hometown of Cincinnati, Hyzdu belted two homers against the Reds, bringing his baseball playing career full circle from the days when he was belting home runs at Moeller High School.

Through 2003 Hyzdu had spent parts of four seasons in the big leagues, but it's unlikely he'll be adored anywhere more than he was here in Central Pennsylvania.



☐ The Sounds earned their first Pacific Coast League playoff berth since moving to the league in 1998 and the franchise's first post-season appearance since the 1994 season.

After defeating Albuquerque (Marlins) three-games-to-one in the first round of the playoffs, the Sounds were swept in three games by Sacramento (A's) in the Best-of-5 Championship Series.

Nashville's 81-62 mark was second-best in the PCL and 10.5 games better than its closest competitor in the Eastern Division. However, the Sounds fell 10.5 games shy of Sacramento's leaguebest 92-52 record.

☐ The Sounds finished 8th in the 16-team Pacific Coast League in attendance, drawing 387,345 fans to Greer Stadium.

Among the PCL leaders: OF **J.J. Davis** led the league in slugging (.554), tied for 3rd in HR (26) and ranked 4th in extra-base hits (59)... OF Tike Redman ranked 2nd in stolen bases (42)... RHP Nelson Figueroa ranked 3rd in ERA (2.97), tied for 3rd in wins (12) and ranked 5th in strikeouts (121)... RHP Ryan Vogelsong ranked 2nd in strikeouts (146) and tied for 3rd in wins (12)... RHP Mark Corey tied for 3rd in saves (30)

☐ Two Sounds, OF John Barnes and closer Mark Corey were selected to the PCL's post-season All-Star Team. Corey joined RHP John Wasdin at the Triple-A All-Star Game July 16 in Memphis.

RHP John Wasdin made history when he tossed a perfect game and struck out 15 on April 7 vs. Albuquerque. The 30-year old right-hander became the first pitcher in Sounds' history and just the second in the 100-year history of the Pacific Coast League to toss a nine-inning perfect game.

☐ Sounds pitchers tossed a league-high 16 shutouts, including three each for John Wasdin and Nelson Figueroa. By contrast, Nashville's offense was held scoreless just three times.


☐ Hickory began the season winning 21 of its first 26 games en route to finishing with an 82-54 record. Only Lake County (Indians) finished with a better overall record in the SAL (97-43).

☐ In leading the Crawdads to a second consecutive postseason appearance, second-year manager Tony Beasley was named the Low Class-A Manager of the Year by Baseball America following the season. In his two years as Hickory's manager, Beasley compiled a 165-110 record (.600).

☐ Among the league leaders: OF **Jorge Cortes** led the SAL in on-base percentage (.427), ranked 2nd in hitting (.325) and 4th in slugging (.325)... OF Rajai Davis ranked 3rd in hits (146), runs (84) and stolen bases (40) and 7th in hitting (.325)... 1B Brad Eldred finished 2nd in HR (28), 3rd in slugging (.502), tied for 3rd in RBI (80) and 4th in extra-base hits (50)... OF Chaz Lytle led the league in batting average (.335)... RHP Jonathan Albaladejo led the league in complete games (5)

Despite spending the final month of the season at Lynchburg, OF Jorge Cortes was named the South Atlantic League's Most Valuable Player after hitting .325 with 8 HR and 66 RBI in 98 games. He was joined on the league's postseason All-Star squad by OF Rajai Davis.

Williamsport earned its first outright New York-Penn League championship (shared title in 2001 with Brooklyn) by going a perfect 4-0 in the post-season and sweeping both Auburn (Blue Jays) and Brooklyn (Mets) in a pair of three-game series.
- ☐ After earning the NYPL's wild card berth, the Crosscutters posted a two-game sweep of Auburn, the team that posted the best winning% in the minors (.757), in the first round of the playoffs
- ☐ After winning the first game of the finals against Brooklyn, the Cutters clinched the league title in extra innings of Game Two on Coney Island. Catcher **Milver Reyes** knocked home **Anthony Bocchino** (OF) with a single to left, plating the winning run.
- □ 2B Mike Cockrell was the offensive star of the Crosscutters run through the NYPL playoffs, going 7-for-16 (.438) with a home run and 4 RBI in four games.
- ☐ In earning a third consecutive playoff berth and a league championship, Williamsport drew a franchise-record 83,346 fans (2,253 avg.) to historic Bowman Field.
- ☐ Among the NY-Penn League leaders: OF **Anthony Bocchino** ranked 5th in hitting (.326)... 2B **Mike Cockrell** tied for third in the league in both doubles (23) and extra-base hits (31)... OF **Nyjer Morgan** led the league in hits (92), ranked 2nd in hitting (.343) and on-base percentage (.439), tied for 2nd in stolen bases (26) and tied for fourth in runs (49)... RHP **Yoann Torrealba** ranked 2nd in ERA (2.04)
- ☐ Two Crosscutters, 1B Mike Madrid and OF Nyjer Morgan were named to the NYPL's post-season All-Star Team.
- ☐ 2003 Pirates' first round pick **Paul Maholm** made his prodebut with the Cutters, going 2-1 with a 1.83 ERA in eight starts.

The Pirates' Gulf Coast League affiliate posted the league's best regular season record (36-20, .643) and earned an automatic berth in the GCL Championship Series.


The Baby Bucs attempt at a first-ever league championship was thwarted by the GCL Braves, who won the best-of-three finals two-games-to-none. RHP **Matt Capps** was tagged for five runs on nine hits in 4.0 innings in a 9-1 loss in Game One of the series, while the Braves scored two runs in the seventh inning of Game Two, earning the Atlanta affiliate a 4-3 win and the league crown.

☐ In his 30th season as a minor league skipper and 27th with Bradenton, manager **Woody Huyke** was named the Gulf Coast League's Manager of the Year. The 36 wins he recorded during the season, improved his career total to 747. The 66-year old completed his 45th season in professional baseball and his 35th as a member of the Pirates' organization in 2003.

☐ Two Baby Bucs, RHP Matt Capps (5-1, 1.87) and 1B Brad Rea (.366-2-24), were named to the Gulf Coast League's post-season All-Star squad, while RHP Blair Johnson (4-1, 1.34) was tabbed as the league's #6 prospect by Baseball America following the season.

☐ Among the GCL leaders: RHP Matt Capps tied for 5th in the league in ERA (1.87)... SS Josh Fulton tied for third in runs scored (39)... RHP Blair Johnson led the league with a 1.34 ERA... 2B Solamdi Solano ranked 7th in hitting (.319)

University of Pittsburgh product and Pittsburgh-area native **Brad Rea**, an undrafted free agent signee, was named the GCL Player of the Month in August after hitting .521 (25-for-48) in 13 games during the month. The first baseman graduated from North Allegheny High School in Wexford, a suburb of Pittsburgh.

Beasley enters his fourth season as a minor league manager in the Pirates' organization and his first as the skipper of the Altoona Curve. The 37-year old was originally slated to spend the 2004 season leading high Class-A Lynchburg (Carolina League), but was named the Pirates' Double-A manager on February 3rd, when former Curve manager Dale Sveum accepted a position on the Boston Red Sox major league coaching staff.

Beasley has had nothing but success since starting his managerial career with the Williamsport Crosscutters (SS-A) in 2001, leading his troops to the post-season in each of his three seasons. As a rookie skipper, Beasley guided the Crosscutters to a 46-26 record and a share of the New York-Penn League's championship. Promoted to Hickory (A) for the 2002 season, he helped the Crawdads to an 83-56 record (fifth best in all the minors) and a South Atlantic League title. Not only was Beasley selected as manager for the 2002 SAL Postseason All-Star Team, he was also honored with the first of his two consecutive Baseball America Low Class-A Manager of the Year awards.

Last season, his second straight campaign with Hickory, Beasley and the Crawdads finished 82-54 with a first-half Southern Division crown before losing in the semi-final round of the SAL playoffs to eventual league champion Rome (Braves). Overall, his teams have posted a 211-136 record (608) in his first three seasons as a manager. This past off-season, he was chosen to manage Mesa in the prestigious Arizona Fall League and led the Desert Dogs to the league's championship game.

Originally drafted by the Orioles in the 19th round of the 1989 draft, Beasley joined the Pirates' organization following the 1991 season when he was acquired in a minor league deal. He went on to finish his eight-year playing career in the Bucs' system, ending as a player/coach with Carolina (AA) in 1998. For his career, he hit .260 with 10 home runs and 242 RBIs in 854 games. After retiring as a player following the 1998 season, Beasley spent two seasons as a hitting coach in the Pirates' chain (Bradenton, 1999; Lynchburg, 2000) before becoming a manager.

Last season, he led a pitching staff that was highlighted by Eastern League Pitcher of the Year **Sean Burnett** and Pirates' top prospect **John VanBenschoten** and helped that staff to a franchise-best 3.32 ERA.

Prior to joining the Curve, he spent the 2002 season as the pitching coach for the Lincoln (NE) Saltdogs of the independent Northern League after spending two seasons in the Florida Marlins' system, including a stint as pitching coach for the Portland Seadogs of the Eastern League during the 2001 season. He also has worked as a coach or instructor in the San Diego (1998-99), Seattle (1992-97) and Texas (1987-91) organizations.

He spent the next four seasons playing between Triple-A and the majors before spending his first and only full major league season with Pittsburgh in 1996. The Altoona Curve defeated its parent club, the visiting Pittsburgh Pirates, 8-5 on May 15, 2000 in the only exhibition game played between the two affiliates. A then-Blair County Ballpark record crowd of 7,346 looked on as Adam Hyzdu and Derrick **Lankford** each homered in the Altoona victory.
