Rochester Red Wings RHP Seth Shuman (1-2, 5.51) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Brian Van Belle (4-1, 2.45)

Good Morning – For the third time this season, the Worcester Red Sox play a morning game when they host the Rochester Red Wings (AAA-Washington) today at 11:05 am at Polar Park. The WooSox won their first morning start of the season on May 6 at Lehigh Valley, 6-4 in 10-innings. They were scheduled to face Durham at home on the morning of May 22, but the game was rained out. And last week in Moosic, PA, the WooSox beat Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, 5-4 in a series-opening morning start on May 28. Today is the last 11:05 am (and morning) game that Worcester will play this season and will be televised live on NESN+ and heard on NASH 98.9 FM and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network. The WooSox are 13-12 in day games compared to 16-16 at night thus far.

Red Sox vs. Red Wings – Last night in the series-opener, Worcester won arguably their most exciting game of the season by rallying in the 9th to tie the game (on Roman Anthony's solo HR) and in the 10th to retie (on Ryan Noda's 2-run HR) before winning it on a walk-off sac bunt (Worcester's first of the year), 6-5 in 10-innings. It was Worcester's 14th come-from-behind win of the season, their 10th in their last at-bat of the game, and their 4th walk-off. They improved to 6-1 vs. the Red Wings this season (easily their best mark against any IL opponent thus far this year) and in the process ended Rochester's season-high 7-game winning streak.

The Rest of This Series - This series marks Rochester's first visit to Worcester this season. Their other trip to Polar Park come in 15 weeks when they close out the 2025 regular season with a 6-game set here vs. the WooSox from September 16-21. After this morning's game two, this series will resume tomorrow & Friday evenings at 6:05 pm, and conclude over the weekend on Saturday at 4:05 pm and Sunday at 1:05 pm.

What Have You Done For Me Lately – The WooSox have won 2 in a row and 4 of their last 5 home games. They are 7-5 in their last dozen games and 11-8 since May 13. Over a longer stretch they are 15-19 since April 25 after winning 10 of their previous 11 games from April 13-24. Rochester comes into play winners of 7 of their last 8 games.

Win More Than They Lose – Worcester is 29-28 on the year and today have a chance to go 2-games over .500 for the first time since May 7 when they were 18-16. The WooSox have been at the .500 mark 15 different times this season...1-1, 2-2, 3-3, 8-8, 9-9, 14-14, 16-16, 18-18, 20-20, 21-21, 24-24, 25-25, 26-26, 27-27, and 28-28. The WooSox were a season-low 4-games below .500 (4-8) on April 11, but turned things around to reach a season-high of 5-games above .500 on April 24 (14-9).

Better Being Home– Worcester is 14-13 at home compared to 15-15 on the road. Their 29-28 record overall puts them in 4th-place and they remain a season-high 12½ GB of 1st-place Lehigh Valley who have the best overall record in the league at 42-16 and are closing in on the first half championship with less than three weeks remaining in the 1st half (which ends after games of June 22).

Hot Sox

-OF **Roman Anthony** has reached base safely in 45 of his last 47 games since April 9. Among those 45 games on base he has had 38 games with at least one hit and the other 7 games with at least one walk. He had a 24-game on-base streak from May 1-28 and also had a 17-game on-base streak from April 9-29. The only times he has not reached base in 47 games came on April 30 vs. Toledo (0-for-4) and May 29 at Scranton/WB (0-for-5). He has reached base safely in 34 of his last 77 plate appearances (16 games) with 18 hits and 16 walks. Roman had his 10-game hitting streak snapped on May 21 (going 0-for-3 with 2 walks), but he has hit in 19 of his last 22 games (26-for-84, .310). He has also hit safely in 30 of his last 36 games (42-for-131, .321) with 30 walks, 6 2B, 1 3B, 5 HR, 11 RBI, and 29 runs scored.

-OF **Jhostynxon Garcia** has hit in 10 of his first 11 games since joining the WooSox on May 20 going 18-for-46 (.391) with 2 2B, 4 HR, 9 RBI, and 7 runs scored.

-INF/OF **Tyler McDonough** has hit safely in 11 of his last 15 games (18-for-53, .340).

-1B/OF **Ryan Noda** has hit in 7 of his first 9 games with the WooSox (10-for-29, .344) with 1 2B, 1 HR, 7 BB, 8 RBI, and 3 runs.

-OF **Trayce Thompson** has hit in 11 of his last 16 games (20-for-61, .328) with 3 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, and 11 runs scored.

Among the League Leaders – Several WooSox are among the Top Ten in the International League in a variety of categories.

Roman Anthony is 1st in walks (46), 3rd in runs (42), 5th in hits (60), 5th in OBP (.429), 9th in OPS (.932), and 5th in total bases (100).

Nate Eaton is 9th in hits (54), 4th in doubles (16), and 5th in extra-base hits (22).

Isaiah Campbell is 5th in saves (5).

RHP **Robert Stock** is 6th in SO (63), T9th in IP (55.1), and 5th in lowest batting average against (.206).

May June Be Better and not Wetter – Worcester is 2-0 in June and they are scheduled to play 25 games in the 30 days in June (12 at home and 13 on the road). The WooSox finished 13-14 in the month of May after going 1-1 in March and 13-13 in April.

Month to Month - WooSox hitters batted .246 in May with 29 HR & 114 runs scored while Sox pitchers were 13-14 with a 4.84 ERA during the month with 32 HRA and 132 runs allowed. Worcester hit .273 in April with 25 HR & 145 runs scored and WooSox pitchers were 13-13 in April with a 4.74 ERA along with 26 HRA and 128 runs given up.

Season Series vs. Rochester – Back in mid-April, the WooSox took 5 of 6 from the Red Wings in Rochester. Worcester grabbed the series-opener on April 15, 7-2. The clubs were snowed-out the next afternoon. Worcester swept the make-up doubleheader on April 17 throwing a 7-inning no-hitter in an 8-0 whitewashing in Game 1 and then needing extra innings (8) to edge the Red Wings, 4-3 in the nightcap. Worcester's 20-7 win on April 18 set a WooSox franchise-record for most hits in a game (26) and tied their club-high for runs in a game (20) while their 6 HR were a season-high. The Red Wings turned the tables the next afternoon scoring 4 runs in

both the 1st & 2nd innings en route to a 12-3 victory for their only win of the series. The Sox made it 5 out of 6 with a 7-0 shutout win on April 20.

Stats vs. Rochester – Worcester batters are hitting .326 in the first 7 games of the season-series with the Red Wings (84-for-258) with 27 2B, 1 3B, 12 HR, and 55 runs scored along with an OPS of 1.007. Sox pitchers are 6-1 with a 3.45 ERA (23 ER in 60 IP) giving up 29 runs and 9 HR allowed.

Rolling in Rochester – Worcester went 5-1 in Rochester this past April 15-20 and have won 29 of their last 38 games in Rochester since the latter part of the 2021 season.

Worcester/Pawtucket vs. Rochester– Worcester leads Rochester in the all-time series against each other (since 2021) with 51 victories compared to 41 for the Wings. The Red Wings are 27-21 all-time at Polar Park while the WooSox are 30-14 in Rochester winning 29 of their last 38 games in the Finger Lakes region. Furthermore, Worcester/Pawtucket is up on Rochester with 375 wins against 364 losses in the remarkably close last 45½ years of facing each other since the 1979 season.

Series Matters - Worcester is 3-4-3 in their first ten series played this season...three wins, four losses, and three splits.

Doing One Better – The WooSox have won their last four 1-run decisions since May 23 and are now 8-8 in 1-run games on the year after starting the season by dropping 8 of their first dozen 1-run decisions.

Home Run Derby – The WooSox have maximized their use of the long-ball all season as 32 of their total 62 HR on the year have come with runners on base. Worcester batters have belted (30) solo HR, (20) 2-run homers, (7) 3-run blasts & (5) grand slams.

Streaks Appeal – The WooSox have had a pair of season-high 5-game winning streaks (from April 13-18 and again from April 20-24). Worcester had a season-high 5-game losing streak from April 25-30 and they have also had a 4-game losing streak (May 8-11) and a 3-game losing skid (April 5-9).

A Winning Tradition – The 2024 Worcester Red Sox went 79-71 to post a winning season for the fourth time in as many years of existence and for the third year in a row under manager Chad Tracy. Trace is only the second Red Sox Triple-A manager to ever post three consecutive winning seasons. Darrell Johnson did so from 1971-73 (the first two years when the Red Sox Triple-A club was in Louisville before moving to Pawtucket in 1973). Worcester finished 35-40 during the first half last year but then improved to 44-31 in the second half. Overall the 2024 WooSox went 40-34 at home and 39-37 on the road. The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, and the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark.

2024 WooSox Batters Led the Way – Worcester led all 20 International League clubs in a host of team offensive categories last season. The WooSox led the league with 869 runs scored (Scranton/Wilkes-Barre was next with 846 runs scored). The Sox also led the IL with 786 walks (Toledo was a distant 2nd with 676 walks). Worcester paced the league by a wide margin with an impressive .369 on-base pct. as the WooSox were the only team in the IL with an OBP of over .359 (Scranton/WB was 2nd at .358). Furthermore, Worcester had the 2nd best OPS in the league at .795 (Columbus was 1st at .804).

2024 Rankings – Worcester finished 5th in the IL in team batting with a .259 average. On the pitching side, the Sox were 10th in team ERA (4.84). Sox pitchers allowed the 2nd fewest HR in the league (141 HRA while Nashville had 139 HRA). Defensively, the WooSox were 11th with a .979 field pct. (107 errors in 5126 total chances).

Players Aplenty - The 2024 WooSox built on a pair of all-time Red Sox Triple-A records (previously set by the 2023 WooSox) as they made 281 player transactions during the 2024 campaign and set a new all-time Red Sox Triple-A record for players appearing in a single season. The WooSox used 84 different players in 2024 (37 position players and 47 pitchers) to better the mark of 79 players in 2023. Ironically, the 2021 WooSox broke a long-standing Red Sox Triple-A record when they used 72 different players to beat the 1995 Pawtucket Red Sox (during a strike year when replacement players were used for the first month+ of that season) and the 2006 PawSox who each employed 70 different players. When Chad Tracy made his Worcester debut in 2022, the WooSox quickly set a new record using 75 different players (that was immediately topped first in 2023 and again in 2024).

WooSox to BoSox - The WooSox sent 28 different players to Boston during the 2024 season (not counting rehab players). A total of 22 different players were promoted from Double-A Portland to Triple-A Worcester last season.

PORTLAND SEA DOGS (AA) GAME RECAP – The Portland Sea Dogs (28-21) won at home vs. Hartford last night, 6-3. Max Ferguson (#4) smacked a solo HR to tie the game, 3-3 in the 5th-inning and Allan Castro (#2) cracked a 2-run HR later in the inning to make it 5-3. Dalton Rogers (1-0) allowed 3 runs in 4 innings of relief for the victory.

WOOSOX PLAYER MOVES – The WooSox today added INF/OF **Nate Eaton** and RHP **Richard Fitts** following their options from Boston on Monday and Tuesday respectively. They also have added RHP **Isaac Coffey** from Double-A Portland and Coffey will start for the WooSox tomorrow night. He began this season on Worcester’s Development List before joining Portland on May 20 where he made two starts for the Sea Dogs going a total of 6 innings allowing no runs with 3 BB and 9 SO.

And in one other move today, the Red Sox put WooSox catcher **Yasmani Grandal** on the restricted list as Grandal returned home during Worcester’s offday on Monday.

Nate Eaton, 28, was selected to Boston on Sunday but did not play and was optioned on Monday. He has played 53 games for Worcester this season, batting .277 (54-for-195) with 16 doubles, one triple, five home runs, 27 RBI, 24 walks, and an .810 OPS. The right-handed hitter has made 20 starts at third base, 18 at center field, 10 at right field, two as the designated hitter, and one each at second base, shortstop, and left field. Originally selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 21st round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, he signed with the Red Sox as a Minor League free agent this past off-season.

Richard Fitts, 25, started Monday night’s game against the Los Angeles Angels at Fenway and allowed 3 HR and 6 runs (5 earned) before getting out of the 1st-inning in taking the loss, 7-6. His season ERA jumped from 2.70 after his first four starts to 4.71. The right-hander is 0-3 with a 4.71 ERA (11 ER/21.0 IP) in five starts for Boston this season. Richard was on the Red Sox injured list from April 13 – May 27 with a right pectoral strain. He made a rehab start for Double-A Portland on May 22 and tossed 3 scoreless innings vs. Reading – 3 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 2 SO – throwing 38 pitches (31 for strikes) in a game Portland won, 6-3. Fitts, 25, was removed from his Red Sox start on April 12 at the Chicago White Sox with the pectoral strain after pitching 5.0 scoreless innings with two hits, one walk, and five strikeouts. Originally selected by the New York Yankees in the sixth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft, the Alabama native was acquired by the Red Sox from the Yankees along with RHP Greg Weissert and RHP Nicholas Judice in exchange for OF Alex Verdugo on December 5, 2023. Fitts owns a 3.24 ERA (15 ER/41.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts in nine career Major League games, all starts for the Red Sox (2024-25). He went 9-5 with a 4.17 ERA in 24 games (23 starts) for the WooSox last season.

Blaze Jordan became the 53rd different player used by Worcester already this season (30 pitchers and 23 position players). Last year at the end of May the WooSox had used 50 different players (29 pitchers and 21 position players) on their way to a Red Sox Triple-A record 84 players used during the 2024 season.

Since the start of the season (9½ weeks) the WooSox have sent RHP Hunter Dobbins (three times), RHP Robert Stock, C Blake Sabol, RHP Josh Winckowski, RHP Michael Fulmer, NF Nick Sogard (twice), RHP Luis Guerrero (three times), RHP Cooper Criswell (four times), INF Abraham Toro, RHP Nick Burdi (twice), Marcelo Mayer, Zack Kelly (twice), and Nate Eaton to Boston. Stock, Winckowski, Sabol (DFA), and Sogard are all back with Worcester. The Red Sox have also recalled rehabbers RHP Lucas Giolito, C Connor Wong, and INF/OF Romy Gonzalez from Worcester thus far this season.
