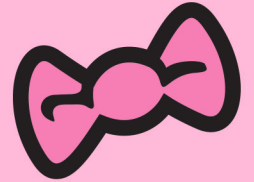

**YESTERDAY:** The Flying Squirrels lost to the RubberDucks, 12-5. **Parks Harber** hit a two-run homer in the first, his first at Double-A. In the second, **Wuifredo Antunez** hit a solo homer to cut the score to 2-1. In the third, **Alfonso Rosario** hit a three-run homer to give the RubberDucks a 4-2 lead. Akron scored two runs in the fourth, four runs in the sixth and two runs in the ninth to pull away. The Flying Squirrels brought in a run on a groundout by **Diego Velasquez** and a two-run single by **Scott Bandura** in the fourth. The loss snapped a four-game winning streak overall and an eight-game winning streak at CarMax Park.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play the finale of a six-game series against the Akron RubberDucks, Double-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians. It is the first series between the two teams this season. Richmond is 15-2 at CarMax Park this year. The Flying Squirrels have already clinched their fifth series win out of six match-ups this season.

**STRONG START:** The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 24-5 start is the best in team history through 31 games, passing the 19-12 starts in 2010 and 2022. Richmond has won five series and split one so far this year. Five-of-seven Richmond losses have been by one run.

**RELENTLESS:** In their 24 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 14 of them. In nine of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** have the best record of all 150 teams across Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball, ahead of a 24-8 record for High-A Eugene (Giants). The Richmond offense leads all 120 full-season MiLB teams in batting average (.297) and doubles (76). Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average, runs (225), hits (318), doubles, RBIs (207) and OBP (.382). In 14 road games this year, the Flying Squirrels are batting .313 (164-for-524) and have scored 122 runs (8.7 runs per game). In 17 home games at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .282 (154-for-547) and have scored 103 runs (6.1 runs per game).

**THE RUBBERDUCKS** are 17-15 this season, tied for third in the Eastern League Southwest Division. Last week, they split a six-game series with Harrisburg in a battle for second place in the division. Akron's pitching staff leads the Eastern League in ERA (4.25), which is third-best in Double-A. Akron's roster features five players included in Baseball America's top-30 Guardians prospects list, including 1B **Ralph Velazquez** (No. 3), RHP **Khal Stephen** (No. 8), OF **Jaison Chourio** (No. 9), OF **Alfonso Rosario** (No. 24) and LHP **Josh Hartle** (No. 25). There are six Akron players on MLB.com's top-30 Guardians prospects list, including **Velazquez** (No. 4), **Stephen** (No. 6), **Chourio** (No. 11), **Rosario** (No. 15), **C Jacob Cozart** (No. 19) and **Hartle** (No. 26).

**FOR RICHMOND:** Left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes his seventh start of the season and the sixth of his career against Akron. He pitched the series opener on Tuesday and allowed one hit over six scoreless innings, striking out a season-high seven batters. In his last three starts against Akron dating back to last season, Whitman is 3-0 with a 1.04 ERA (2 ER/171 IP). He started 26 games for the Flying Squirrels last season. In his first Double-A campaign, Whitman ranked tied for second in the Eastern League in games started, fifth in strikeouts (124) and eighth in innings pitched (117.1). He was named EL Pitcher of the Week for a perfect outing against Somerset on May 3 at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced while recording 10 strikeouts. He also recorded 11 strikeouts at Binghamton with five scoreless frames pitched on May 21. Whitman closed his season with seven scoreless innings on September 12, tying the longest outing of his career. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 8 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. **For more on Whitman, see page two.**

**FOR AKRON:** Right-hander **Josh Hartle** makes his seventh start of the year and his second in his career against Richmond. In his last start on Sunday against Harrisburg, he allowed a career-high nine runs over 4.1 innings in a no-decision. Prior to that start, he opened the year going 2-1 with a 3.24 ERA (9 ER/25.0 IP) in his first five starts. On August 28, 2025, Hartle started at The Diamond and allowed two runs over six innings with five strikeouts in a losing decision, a 6-0 shutout by the Flying Squirrels. He spent most of last season with High-A Lake County, going 10-2 with a 2.35 ERA in 22 starts before a late promotion to Double-A Akron. Hartle was selected by the Pirates in the third round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of Wake Forest. He was traded to the Guardians on December 10, 2024, along with two other pitchers for 1B **Spencer Horwitz**.

**COX ROCKS:** **Jonah Cox** reached base in the first 23 games he played this season to begin his Double-A career before an 0-for-3 outing on Tuesday night. The streak was the second-longest in the Eastern League this year. He opened the season on a 12-game hit streak and has at least one hit in 25-of-27 games he has played, adding a 10-game hit streak that was also snapped on Tuesday. He went 3-for-3 on Wednesday with a game-tying, two-run homer in the ninth. For the year, he leads MiLB in batting average (.429) and OPS (1.204), and ranks second in SLG (.714) and fifth in OBP (.490). His 18 steals are tied for second in the Eastern League after swiping 58 bases each of the last two seasons. On May 1 (G1), he became the fifth player in Flying Squirrels history to hit three triples in a single game.

**IT'S BO TIME!:** After batting .200 (11-for-55) in his first 15 games of the season through April 28, **Bo Davidson** is hitting .385 (15-for-39) with three doubles, a homer and 10 RBIs in his last 10 games since April 30, adding four multi-hit games in that stretch. He has struck out six times in his last 39 plate appearances. His nine-game hit streak was snapped on Saturday night, but he has reached base in 11 consecutive games since April 29.

**JUST HOW WE DREW IT UP:** **Drew Cavanaugh** has reached base multiple times in 13-of-his-19 games started this season and ranks second in the Eastern League in on-base percentage (.465). He has at least one hit and one walk in 12 starts. On April 24, he entered as a pinch-hitter in the ninth and hit the first walk-off home run in CarMax Park history, a two-out, two-run shot for a 7-6 win. On Wednesday, he broke a 4-4 tie with a walk-off double to beat Akron.

**SABIN SOARING:** **Sabin Ceballos** hit his sixth homer of the season on Tuesday, tying his total from 2025. Of his six homers, three have been on Tuesdays and three have been on Wednesdays. Over his last 20 games since April 14, he is batting .308 (24-for-78) with four doubles, six homers and 12 RBIs with 12 walks. He homered twice in the April 15 win at Hartford and finished the night 3-for-4 with four RBIs and four runs scored. Prior to this stretch, he opened the season batting .160 (4-for-25) in his first seven games from April 3-12. Last season, Ceballos hit .311 (46-for-148) with five homers, 11 doubles and 27 RBIs over final 43 games from July 3-September 6.

**TOP SKIPPER:** Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 284 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

**PACKING THE HOUSE:** In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,117).

**IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS:** In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.429), first in OBP (.490), first in SLG (.714), first in OPS (1.204), first in hits (39), tied for second in RBIs (26), tied for second in stolen bases (18), tied for second in triples (3) and tied for fifth in total bases (65). **Scott Bandura** is tied for second in hits (37), fifth in runs (27), tied for fifth in RBIs (25), tied for fifth in doubles (9), ninth in OBP (.421) and 10th in batting average (.316). **Drew Cavanaugh** is second in OBP (.456) and ninth in OPS (.971). **Darien Smith** is first in ERA (1.52), tied for second in wins (4), third in WHIP (0.94), tied for third in BAA (.185) and tied for seventh in innings pitched (29.2). **Jack Choate** is first in saves (5). **Joe Whitman** is tied for seventh in strikeouts (35) and eighth in WHIP (1.16). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for first in saves. **Mitch White** is tied for first in saves (3). **Cesar Perdomo** is sixth in BAA (.198) and ninth in WHIP (1.19). **Greg Farone** is tied for first in games started (7).

**PROSPECT WATCH:** Richmond's roster features three players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and **Joe Whitman** (No. 25). **Adrián Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and **Jonah Cox** is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including **Davidson** (No. 7), **Harber** (No. 14), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and **Whitman** (No. 26).

In Game 1, **Ryan Lollis** hit a grand slam and **Ty Blach** pitched a complete game in a 5-3 win. In Game 2, **Matt Duffy** hit a solo homer and finished with four RBIs in a 6-3 victory.
