The Round Rock Express and El Paso Chihuahuas (San Diego Padres) are set for another 7:35 p.m. CT first pitch for game four of their series on Friday at Southwest University Park.

EXPRESS TAKE GAME THREE

The E-Train earned a 5-4 win on Thursday over the Chihuahuas. Round Rock RF Marcus Smith made a loud entrance with a solo homer in his first at-bat with the Express in 2025 for a 1-0 lead in the third. In the home half, after a pair of walks, DH Tirso Ornelas sent an RBI single into left to tie the score at 1-1. In the sixth, El Paso grabbed a 2-1 advantage as C Luis Campusano scored on 1B Connor Joe's two-out single. The Express put up three runs in the seventh to steal a 4-2 lead. 3B Cody Freeman opened the inning with a double and CF Kellen Strahm got aboard with a walk. DH Chad Wallach scorched a double to left that would score two. LF Alex De Goti singled on the next pitch and Wallach came home. El Paso's response came with two runs in the bottom of the seventh. 3B Mike Brosseau doubled and SS Clay Dungan walked. LF Trenton Brooks sent a high fly ball that evaded 2B Justin Foscoe. Brosseau and Dungan came around on the error and the game was tied 4-4 after seven. Strahm led off the ninth with a single, stole second and moved to third on a balk. De Goti launched a sacrifice fly to right field allowing Strahm to tag and send the Express to its 5-4 victory.

BLACH SET FOR E-TRAIN DEBUT

LHP Ty Blach is slated to make his debut for the Express on Friday night. Blach spent the last three seasons with the Colorado Rockies organization posting a 7-11 record and 6.13 ERA (132 ER/193.2 IP) in the big leagues. The lefty signed a minor league contract with the Rangers on May 2. In one appearance with the ACL Rangers, he tossed five scoreless innings, with three hits, no walks and eight strikeouts.

APRIL AWARDS

INF Blaine Crim was named the Texas Rangers' Player of the Month and RHP Cole Winn was listed as the Reliever of the Month today. Crim batted .313 with seven home runs, one triple, six doubles, 25 RBI, and 17 runs scored in 28 games through the end of April. He was called up to the big leagues on May 2. RHP Cole Winn went 2-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER/17.2 IP) in April. He owned a 0.85 WHIP and a .169 (10-59) opponent batting average in his first eight appearances. Winn was the only Pacific Coast League pitcher to log 15.0-or-more innings without yielding an earned run through the end of April.

CAN'T TOUCH CURVELO

RHP Luis Curvelo earned his first save of the season on Thursday night. Curvelo shut the door with two strikeouts in a three-up, three-down ninth frame. He has not allowed a hit or a run in his last four outings and 4.1 innings for the Express. Curvelo is tied for a team-high 12 appearances and owns the club's second-lowest ERA (2.63).

MASHING IN MAY

INF 3B Cody Freeman went 1-for-4 last night which included a double and a run scored. In the month of May, Freeman leads the PCL in hits (12), batting average (.429) and doubles (5). He has a hit in seven consecutive games and a run in each of his last five.

BIG LEAGUE EXPERIENCE

In total, 22 of the 31 players on the Opening Day roster have logged Major League service time in their careers, including 14 of the 18 pitchers on the staff, Barlow (Rangers), RHP Caleb Boushley (Brewers, Twins), RHP David Buchanan (Phillies, Reds), RHP JT Chargois (Twins, Dodgers, Mariners, Rays, Marlins), Dunning (White Sox, Rangers), RHP Codi Heuer (Cubs, White Sox), RHP Adrian Houser (Brewers, Mets), Latz (Rangers), Pennington (Rangers, Royals), LHP Michael Plassmeyer (Phillies), Robert (Rangers), RHP Hunter Strickland (Giants, Mariners, Nationals, Mets, Rays, Angels, Brewers, Reds, Angels) and Winn (Rangers). EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.

In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.
