**FEARLESS FOSTER:** LHP **Foster Griffin** holds Omaha's longest active scoreless streak at 8.1 innings after tossing 2.0 no-hit innings in yesterday's 8-1 win over St. Paul. The 8.2-inning streak is the longest for the Storm Chasers this season, passing **RHP Colten Brewer's** 8.1-inning streak set in mid April. Since the streak started on April 26, Griffin has a 0.00 ERA in five games with two walks and 11 strikeouts.

**BYE-BYE BALL:** Yesterday's seventh inning grand slam by **LF Brewer Hicklen** was the second bases juiced longball by Omaha this season. After three walks and a hit-by-pitch, Hicklen came to the plate with the score at 3-1 to extend Omaha's lead. **INF Jimmy Govern** hit a walk-off grand slam on May 7 against Columbus to win the game 10-9 in the bottom of the ninth.

**GET ON THE BOARD EARLY:** Omaha has a 14-7 record this season when they score the first run of the game. That record improves to 8-2 in games played inside the friendly confines of Werner Park. When leading after seven and eight innings, the Storm Chasers are a perfect 14-0 this season with only one win coming when Omaha trails after eight innings.

**OFF TO A GOOD START:** The Storm Chasers have won just two series opening games after yesterday's 8-1 win over St. Paul. Omaha has struggled through the first three games of each series so far this year, going a combined 6-13 in games played on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. The Storm Chasers have an opportunity to get their Wednesday record to .500, currently the best non-weekend day for Omaha. The Saints are looking to avoid their ninth straight loss.

**KEEPING IT CLEAN:** During the month of May, the Storm Chasers have committed just eight errors with a .985 fielding percentage, putting Omaha in fifth place in all of Triple-A over that span. Omaha is less than one percentage point behind second-place Sugar Land. The Storm Chasers have not committed an error since last Wednesday at Iowa, leading Triple-A in fielding percentage over the last week.

**COMPETITION BREWING IN INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE WEST:** Seven of the 10 teams in the newly formed International League West are .500 or better in their last 10 games, with Omaha holding a 5-5 record over that span. There are just four games separating the third-place Toledo Mudhens and the eighth-place Gwinnett Stripers. Omaha is currently in seventh place, 8.0 games back of first-place Nashville who holds the best record in the International League at 25-11.

**FOR OMAHA:** LHP **Austin Cox** heads to the mound today still looking for his first win of the season, holding a record of 0-2 with a 4.67 ERA over six starts (seven total appearances) this season while tossing a team-high 34.2 innings heading into tonight's game. In his last outing, Cox pitched 6.0 innings, allowing four earned runs with six strikeouts in a no decision at Iowa. The lone relief appearance for Cox came on April 30 when he threw 4.0 innings of one-run ball out of the bullpen for Omaha. The Macon, Ga. native played college ball at Mercer University. In his final season with the Bears in 2019, Cox was named the team's Friday night starter, earning a 7-4 record in 17 starts with 124 strikeouts over 87.2 innings. Cox was drafted in the fifth round of the 2018 MLB Draft, making professional debut with the Burlington Royals in the Rookie-level Appalachian League. He split time during the 2019 season between Lexington and Wilmington, earning Pitcher of the Week honors in early June with Lexington. In 2021, Cox was initially assigned to Double-A Northwest Arkansas and was promoted to Triple-A Omaha in September of that year.

**FOR ST. PAUL:** RHP **Jake Faria** gets the nod for the Saints today with a record of 0-2 and a 7.17 in seven starts with 21.1 innings. In his last outing, Faria gave up three runs (one earned run) while allowing five hits in 4.0 innings pitched with four strikeouts. The Richard Gahr High School product was selected in the 10th round of the 2011 MLB Draft out of high school by the Tampa Bay Rays. Faria would work his way up the minor leagues and made his MLB debut exactly six years after being drafted, allowing just one run in 6.1 innings against the Chicago White Sox. In July of 2019, he was traded to the Brewers before being released in September of 2020 after the cancellation of the minor league season because of the pandemic. Faria also made stops in the Los Angeles Angels organization and the Arizona Diamondbacks organization before signing a minor league deal with the Minnesota Twins.

### COX NOTES

- Became first Storm Chasers starter to complete 5.0 innings on 4/12 vs. LOU, allowing one run on four hits with three strikeouts and three walks in 5.0 innings
- Allowed five runs (four earned) in season debut on 4/7 (1) @ IND, striking out four and walking none across 4.0 innings
- Earned non-roster invite to 2022 Major League Spring Training, throwing 2.0 perfect innings with three strikeouts
- Enters 2022 as the No. 19 prospect in the Royals organization per MLB Pipeline
- Spent most of 2021 season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas before finishing the year with Triple-A Omaha and making his Triple-A debut
- Made 2021 debut on 5/26 vs. San Antonio after dealing with arm soreness to start the season
- Posted a 5.06 ERA in five Double-A starts in June before recording a 1.80 ERA in five starts in July
- Earned Double-A Central Pitcher of the Week honors with a 7.0-inning complete game on 8/4 @ Arkansas
- Exited game on 8/11 vs. Frisco in the third inning and did not pitch again until 9/10 @ Wichita
- Made final Double-A start in Game 1 of Double-A Central Championship Series, when he allowed three runs on six hits in 4.0 innings
- Made Triple-A debut on 9/26 vs. Indianapolis in Omaha's home runale, recording his first Triple-A strikeout in a scoreless inning before allowing five runs on three homers in second inning of relief
- Allowed five runs on five hits while walking three, hitting two, and striking out two in 3.0 innings in first Triple-A start on 10/2 @ Iowa
- Earned South Atlantic League Midseason All-Star honors in 2019 with Low-A Lexington, earning a promotion to High-A Wilmington in the second half of the season
- Helped Blue Rocks win 2019 Carolina League Championship, throwing 12.0 scoreless innings with 14 strikeouts across two post-season starts
- Spent first professional season with rookie-level Burlington, posting a 3.78 ERA across nine starts
- Pitched three seasons at Mercer University (2016-2018), the same college as fellow Royals minor leaguer and current teammate Brandon Barker
- Became the fifth-highest drafted player in school history in 2018 when he was drafted in the fifth round (152nd overall) of the 2018 MLB Draft
- Recorded the second-best strikeout rate in Division I in 2018 (12.7 K/9) and led the Southern Conference in starts (17)
- Attended Presbyterian Day School, the same high school as fellow Royals minor leaguer LHP Richard Lovelady
- Was a two-sport athlete in high school, lettering in baseball and football and serving as captain of both teams
