Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders LHP Kyle Carr (0-1, 4.30) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP John Brebbia (1-0, 3.72)

Sunday Series Finale – The Worcester Red Sox and the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders play the finale of their 6-game set this afternoon at 1:05 pm at Polar Park with the WooSox needing a win to earn a split of the series. The Red Sox and Yankee Triple-A affiliates have been playing at Polar Park since Tuesday with the RailRiders (off back-to-back victories) now ahead, 3 games to 2. Meanwhile, 167 miles to the southwest at Yankee Stadium in the Bronx, NY, the Boston Red Sox and the New York Yankees will play the finale of their important 4-game series this afternoon at 1:35 pm (live on NESN). Today's game at Polar Park concludes Worcester's penultimate homestand of the year and is live on NESN+ and on NASH 98.9 FM.

Results This Series – Scranton/Wilkes-Barre gained the advantage in the series thanks to their 7-1 victory yesterday. That win came on the heels of a 2-0 shutout of the WooSox on Friday night. Worcester won the series-opener on Tuesday, 8-5 and the teams traded 7-1 victories on Wednesday (Scranton/WB) & Thursday nights (WooSox).

Series Setbacks – The WooSox – down 3-2 in this current 6-game set vs. Scranton/WB – are in danger of losing their third straight series for the first time all year. They are already coming off consecutive series defeats for only the second time all year. The Sox went 1-5 in Syracuse from August 18-23 after dropping 4 of 6 vs. Buffalo in their prior series at home from August 11-16. Their only other consecutive series losses came back in May when they lost 4 of 6 at Buffalo from May 12-17 and then were swept in an abbreviated 5-game series at home vs. Rochester from May 19-23. From June 30 – August 9 Worcester won five consecutive 6-game series. Worcester is 11-9-2 in their 22 series thus far...11 wins, 9 losses, and 2 splits.

Reverse Course – Worcester is only 3-games over .500 in the 2nd half (29-26) for the first time since July 4th when they were 4-7 to begin the 2nd half. They peaked at 11-games above .500 in the 2nd half twice – the latest on August 13 at 26-15. As far as their overall record, the WooSox are only 4-games above for the season (65-61) and that's their lowest level since July 28 when they were 51-47. Worcester's high for the season was 12-games over .500 twice – the latest on August 13 at 62-50.

The Looooong Road Ahead – During their customary Monday off-day to end the month of August tomorrow, the WooSox will actually get on the road to Buffalo, NY in advance of opening a two-city, 12-game roadtrip to begin the month of September. The Sox will be in Buffalo for 6-games vs. the Bisons from September 1-6 and then head to Allentown, PA for a 6-game series against the Lehigh Valley IronPigs from September 8-13 to conclude their road schedule.

Extension Cords - Worcester went 4-7 on their other two-city roadtrip in June to Rochester (abbreviated 5-game series) and Lehigh Valley from June 9-21. The WooSox were 6-6 on their only extended homestand of the year from August 4-16 vs. Lehigh Valley & Buffalo (the same two cities they will face over the next two weeks).

Follow the Records - On the year, Worcester is 36-30 at home compared to 29-31 on the road. The WooSox are bidding for their 6th winning season in this their 6th year in Worcester.

Two Bad - Worcester has not won two in a row since they beat Buffalo on August 12 (2-1) and August 13 (10-3).

Rehab Central - Boston Red Sox outfielder **Roman Anthony** is 4-for-14 with 2 walks, 2 singles, 1 double, 1 homer & 4 RBI while playing four games in leftfield (this past Tuesday – Thursday and again on Saturday). Boston Red Sox INF **Trevor Story** is 6-for-35 in 10 rehab games with 1 2B, 3 RBI and 2 runs scored since August 16 while fellow rehabbing Red Sox INF **Isiah Kiner-Falefa** is 6-for-26 in his 8 rehab games with 1 2B, 6 walks, 1 RBI, and 4 runs scored since August 19.

The probable pitching match-ups for the upcoming series in Buffalo later this week and next weekend are TBD at this point.

Countdown from 7 (and 19)...Including this afternoon, the WooSox have 7 home games left among their 19 games remaining this season (including 12 on the road). Worcester's one remaining homestand won't come for more than 15 days until September 15-20 when they end the regular season with 6-games vs. the Durham Bulls. That will be Fan Appreciation Week/Weekend at Polar Park.

What Have You Done for Me Lately – Worcester is 2-3 in their last five games, but they have lost 7 of 9, 11 of their last 14 games, and they are 5-13 since August 9 following a 4-game winning streak from August 4-8. The 5-13 skid comes after the WooSox went 15-2 between July 22 – August 8. Furthermore, between June 28 and August 8, the WooSox won 24 of 30 games.

August Adversity – After a month+ of outstanding play, the WooSox have fallen into a funk going 5-13 since August 9. Their team stats during this current 17-game stretch - the WooSox are batting .214 (123-for-576) with 62 runs scored (3.4 per game). That compares to 8.1 runs per game while they won 15 of 17 before this slump (138 runs total). Sox pitchers are 5-13 with a 4.65 ERA in their last 17 games (82 ER in 158.2 IP). On the other hand, while winning 15 of 17 games between July 22 and August 8, Worcester's stats during that impressive stretch were outstanding. The team batted .302 (171-for-566) with the aforementioned 8.1 runs/game while Sox pitchers were 15-2 with a 3.12 ERA (52 ER in 150 IP).

Month to Month - The WooSox – coming off their best July ever (16-7) – will finish below .500 in August as they are 11-14 with the finale on tap for today. This month the Sox are batting .241 (198-for-820) with 13 HR while Sox pitchers are 11-14 with a 4.20 ERA (104 ER in 222.2 IP) with 27 HRA. Worcester has out-scored their opponents this month, however, 124 runs while allowing 115.

Warm & Hot Sox –

Franklin Arias	Went 0-for-1 entering the game late on Saturday to end his 7-game hitting streak. Now hit in 7 of his last 8 games (8-for-24, .333) with 4 2B & 4 RBI. Had a 9-game hitting streak from July 28 – August 7 that ended on August 9 (0-for-5). Hit in 20 of his last 25 games (30-for-94, .319) with 7 2B, 4 HR, 23 RBI, 14 runs scored. Has 23 HR total on the season (19 with Portland & 4 w/ Worcester) and 76 RBI (52 with Portland & 24 w/ Worcester) in 102 games total.
Kristian Campbell	Had a 20-game on-base streak from July 5 – August 6 (ended on August 7 despite two line-drive outs). Is tied for 8 th in the league with 68 BB. Last 37 games since July 3 is batting .301 (37-for-123) with 25 walks.
Vinny Capra	Is tied for 6 th in league with 74 runs scored. Had his 14-game hitting streak – longest on WooSox this season – end on August 12 (he did walk in the game). So has hit in 18 of his last 26 games (27-for-84, .321) with 4 2B, 2 HR, 9 RBI, 20 runs scored.
Allan Castro	Hit in 12 of his last 16 games (18-for-58, .310) with 5 2B, 10 RBI, 8 runs scored.
Romy Gonzalez	Hit in 11 of his last 14 games (17-for-53, .321) with 2 2B, 1 HR, 9 RBI and 6 runs scored.
Braiden Ward	Leads the league with 54 SB. WooSox club-record for stolen bases in a season is 57 set by David Hamilton in 2023. Has been hit by pitch 28 times to lead Minor League Baseball. Those 28 HBP are a new modern day Boston Red Sox Triple-A record that was held by Pawtucket INF David Eckstein with 20 HBP in 2000.
Angel Bastardo	Last 12 games (all in relief) – 17.2 IP, 9 H, 4 R, 4 ER, 6 BB, 27 SO.
Raymond Burgos	In his last 5 games (4 starts) is 2-0 – 20.2 IP, 16 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 7 BB 16 SO.
Hobie Harris	Last 12 relief appearances is 2-0 with 2 SV –16.1 IP, 10 H, 2 R, 1 ER, 6 BB, 21 SO.

Stats vs. the RailRiders This Season – The season-series between these clubs is tied at 9-9. Worcester is hitting .242 in the 18 games vs. the RailRiders (144-for-594) with 18 homers. WooSox pitchers are 9-9 with a 4.37 ERA (79 ER in 162.1 IP) with 23 HRA vs. the Scranton/WB this season. The Sox have out-scored SWB, 84-82 in the 2026 season-series thus far.

Sox vs. Yanks – The WooSox are 5-5 here in Worcester vs. SWB after finishing 4-4 at PNC Field in Moosic, PA. The Sox won the opener of this current 6-game set on Tuesday, 8-5, the RailRiders rebounded for a 7-1 victory Wednesday, the WooSox got their own 7-1 win on Thursday, and the RailRiders evened matters with a 2-0 shutout win on Friday and Scranton/WB went ahead with a 9-1 rout on Saturday. From May 5-10, the WooSox took 3 of 5 from Scranton/WB in an abbreviated series at Polar Park. The Sox won on May 5, 7-6; lost in 10-innings on May 6, 9-7; won their longest game in club-history on May 7 in 12-innings, 10-8; and won again on May 8, 8-3. The game on May 9 was rained out and eventually cancelled as the teams did not make it up the next day (a 3-2

Scranton/WB victory on May 10 to conclude the series) and did not make it up during their next 6-game set at PNC Field. Worcester won the first four games during that series from May 26-29 by 6-3, 8-1, 1-0, and 6-5 scores before the RailRiders got on the board with a 7-2 win and then a 1-0 victory in the finale on May 31. SWB swept an abbreviated 2-game set on July 17 & 19 with 7-6 and 5-4 victories at PNC Field. The middle game on July 18 was cancelled due to inclement weather.

Against Scranton/WB Last Season – Scranton/Wilkes-Barre won the 2025 season series over Worcester, 15 games to 6 as the RailRiders went 7-2 at Polar Park and 8-4 at PNC Field last year.

Yanks Lead the Rivalry - Worcester is 58-70 all-time vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre including a 33-34 mark at Polar Park compared to 25-36 at PNC Field in Moosic, PA. As mentioned, Scranton/WB won the season-series last year, 15-6. The clubs split their season-series each of the prior two years as they finished 9-9 against each other in 2024 and finished 12-12 during the 2023 season series. Worcester went 10-14 vs. Scranton/WB in 2022 and during their inaugural 2021 season, the WooSox were 11-12 vs. the RailRiders.

Daydream Believer – The WooSox have a 29-21 record in day games compared to a 36-40 mark at night.

Series Matters – The WooSox are 11-9-2 in their 22 series thus far...11 wins, 9 losses, and 2 splits. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

Homer Haven – The WooSox are 48-20 when they homer in a game this season, however, they are next to last in the International League with 108 HR on the year.

Ups and Downs – Worcester has been a streaky team over the last 3 months. The WooSox had a 5-game losing streak from May 19-23, a 4-game winning streak from May 26-29, a 5-game winning streak (June 4-9), a 4-game losing skid right after that (June 10-13), a 5-game losing streak (June 23-27), and right after that a 4-game winning streak from June 28 – July 2. In July the WooSox had another 4-game winning streak from July 5-9, a season-best 6-game winning streak from July 22-26, and a 5-game winning streak (July 29 – August 2). Worcester's 6-game winning streak (July 22-26) was their longest since their club-record 9-game winning streak last year from June 1-11, 2025. They were recently on a 4-game losing streak (August 14-18) and another 4-game skid from August 20-23.

Plead the Fifth – Worcester endured their third 5-game losing streak from June 23-27. They also had 5-game losing streaks from May 19-23 (all at home vs. Rochester) and from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). Worcester's longest losing streak all of last year was also 5 games (April 25-30, 2025). They have not lost 6 straight since a 6-game losing streak from May 22-28, 2024. Their longest losing streak in their 5½-year history came in 2022 when they lost 10 consecutive games from May 5-15, 2022.

Highs and Lows – The WooSox have been a season-best 12-games over .500 at 60-48 on August 8 and again on August 13 at 62-50. They have been exactly .500 a total of 13 times this season. The WooSox dipped to a season-low 4-games under .500 on June 27 at 36-40. Their low point last season was 4-games below on April 11 at 4-8. They have not been 5-games under .500 since August 16, 2024 (56-61).

Weather or Not – The WooSox have had 5 games cancelled due to inclement weather (4 in the 1st half and 1 in the 2nd half) and 5 others postponed this season. Overall they have lost 4 home openings and 6 road openings due to inclement weather. Last year the WooSox set a new club record for most home games either postponed or cancelled in a single season with 9, along with 2 other road games postponed, for a total of 11 PPD.

A History-Making Month – July of 2026 will be a month to remember in both Red Sox and WooSox Nation. The Boston Red Sox, under a certain former WooSox manager, had their best month in their nearly 126-year history going 21-4 in July. Meanwhile, the Worcester Red Sox might not have been able to equal their big brothers in Boston, but they matched the best month in their almost six-year history finishing with a 16-7 record this July.

The End of a Very Fine July – The WooSox finished 16-7 in July to tie for the best month in Worcester club-history. The 2021 WooSox also went 16-7 (.696) during September of their inaugural season. Worcester's winningest month ever in terms of victories was July of 2024 when they went 18-10 (.642). Worcester batters hit .270 this July (199-for-737) with 23 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.72 ERA during the month (103 ER in 196.1). The Sox out-scored their opponents, 145-113 in July. Furthermore, Worcester's 145 runs scored in July were the most of any club in the 20-team International League and their 40 stolen bases during the month were 2nd most in the league (Jacksonville had 45 SB).

July Leaders – **Kristian Campbell** led the WooSox in batting in July with a .379 average in 19 games (22-for-58) with 4 2B, 2 HR, 11 RBI, 13 walks (tied for most on team), and 15 runs scored (to lead the club). **Mickey Gasper** was next with a .367 average in 18 games (22-for-60) with 6 2B, 2 HR, 10 RBI. **Andrew Knizner** at .327 in 15 games (18-for-55, 6 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI) and **Braiden Ward** at .322 in 17 games (19-for-59, 3 2B, 2 3B, 1 HR, 6 RBI, 12 SB) also had excellent Julys. **Vinny Capra** and **Brett Harris** led the team with 14 RBI apiece. **Tyler McDonough**, sent to Double-A Portland on July 28, batted .357 in 14 games with 3 HR & 12

RBI. On the pitching side, **Angel Bastardo** went 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA in 9 relief appearances in July while **Tyler Uberstine** was 1-1 with a 1.88 ERA in 8 games.

June Tune – The WooSox went 11-13 in June suffering their second straight losing month. The WooSox went 10-15 in May after a 17-12 mark in March/April. Worcester pitchers had a 4.65 ERA in June (109 ER in 211 IP) while batters hit .245 (197-for-805) with 26 HR. The Sox were out-scored by their opponents, 124-109 in June.

Final June Leaders – OF **Allan Castro** (.305 in 22 games) led the WooSox in batting in June followed closely by INF **Mikey Romero** (.300 in 19 games). Romero led the team in HR (5) while Castro led the club in RBI (14). Among regular pitchers, RHP **Oswaldo Berrios** was 2-1 with a 0.57 ERA in 7 games while RHP **Wyatt Olds** was 1-1 with a 0.93 ERA in 9 games in June.

May We Skip the Month – Worcester's 10-15 record in May was the second worst month they have ever had behind only a 10-16 month of July during their inaugural season of 2021. Worcester has been remarkably consistent in their history and more recently since August of 2024 they have had just three losing months in their last ten months. The WooSox went 15-10 this April.

Monthly Team Stats for May – Worcester hitters batted .235 this May (193-for-823) with 41 doubles, 4 triples, and 22 HR in 25 games while WooSox pitchers had a 4.85 ERA (118 ER in 219 IP) with 29 HRA. The Sox out-scored by their opponents, 126-110.

Monthly Individual Leaders for May – WooSox May leaders offensively included: **Anthony Seigler** at .344 in 18 games in May with 3 HR & 14 RBI and **Nate Eaton** at .289 in 19 games with 6 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR, 9 RBI. On the pitching side: **Tommy Kahnle** made 11 scoreless relief appearances in May covering 11 shutout innings; **Alec Gamboa** was 1-2, 1.89 in 5 G, 3 GS; **Eduardo Rivera** was 3-0, 2.20 in 8 RA; and **Noah Song** was 1-0, 2.25 in 7 RA.

An Enjoyable April – After going 2-2 to begin the season from March 27-31, Worcester posted a winning April going 15-10. The Sox finished April alone in 1st-place in the International League East Division. The 15 wins this April equal the most Worcester won in any month last season when they went 15-10 in June and 15-13 in August.

April Stats Leaders – As a club the WooSox batted .252 in April with 19 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.63 ERA with 24 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents during the month, 127-122. **Vinny Capra** led the Sox in average in April hitting .322 in 18 games with 7 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, and a team-high 18 runs scored. **Matt Thaiss** (.324 in 11 games with 2 HR & 11 RBI), **Nate Eaton** (.301 in 23 games with 5 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR & 10 RBI), and **Kristian Campbell** (.294 in 23 games) all enjoyed fine Aprils. Leading pitchers during the month were **Payton Tolle** (2-0, 0.82 in 2 GS) and **Jake Bennett** (2-0, 1.00 in 4 GS) while **Tayron Guerrero** was the best out the bullpen posting a 1.13 ERA in 7 relief appearances with 2 saves.

A Winning Tradition – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under former manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

How the WooSox Have Won - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

Fun Fact – Of the 305 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their nearly 6-year history (up to today), a total of 222 of them have played in the Major Leagues (73%) including 149 with the Boston Red Sox (49%).

Portland Sea Dogs Update – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs (29-27)/(64-60) crushed the Richmond Flying Squirrels, 14-3 last night. Catcher Johanfran Garcia had a huge game going 4-for-6 with a pair of 3-run homers giving him 16 HR on the season. Morgan McSweeney (1-0) tossed 5 inning allowing just 1 run with 8 strikeouts to earn the victory.

WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES – The Red Sox today transferred LHP **Michael Sansone** back to Double-A Portland for the 8th time this season and have transferred RHP **Max Carlson** to Worcester. Carlson, 24, has spent all of this season with Portland going 4-2 with a 4.48 ERA in 32 games (30 in relief) with 2 saves – 72.1 IP, 72 H, 38 R, 36 ER, 18 BB, 84 SO. This is Carlson's first time in Triple-A. He was Boston's 12th round pick in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of North Carolina.

The WooSox will soon add RH reliever Wyatt Olds who was optioned from Boston on Saturday. And they will add LHP Raymond Burgos back onto their roster after he was the Red Sox 27th man for their doubleheaders in New York yesterday and last night.

Olds, 27, retired the side in the eighth inning Friday night against the Yankees. He has tossed 6.0 innings without allowing an earned run in six appearances for Boston this season, his Major League debut. The right-hander has also posted a 5.33 ERA (30 ER/50.2 IP) with 74 strikeouts in 39 games this year for Worcester. Selected by the Red Sox in the seventh round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft, the Oklahoma native owns a 5.88 ERA (254 ER/389.0 IP) with 489 strikeouts in 185 career minor league games (42 starts).

Worcester has made a total of 215 player moves thus far this season. The all-time Worcester (and Pawtucket) franchise-record is 281 player moves in 2024.

The WooSox went three consecutive days without a player transaction from May 30, May 31, and June 1 (although they did not play on June 1) for only the second time all year. Just after their season-opener, Worcester did not make a move during four straight days from March 28-31. Otherwise, they have not gone more than back-to-back days without making a player transaction **all season**.

The WooSox have used a total of 70 players this season (43 pitchers and 27 position players). RHP Max Carlson would be #71 if/when he makes his WooSox debut. The all-time Worcester (and Pawtucket) franchise-record is an incredible 84 players used during the 2024 season (47 pitchers and 37 position players).

Furthermore, 21 different WooSox players have been promoted directly from Worcester to Boston this season (not counting rehabbers). The lucky list: RHP Zack Kelly, RHP Tyler Uberstine, LHP Tyler Samaniego (three times), RHP Jack Anderson (twice), LHP Eduardo Rivera (twice), LHP Payton Tolle, OF Nate Eaton (twice), LHP Jake Bennett (twice), LHP Alec Gamboa (six times), C/INF Mickey Gasper (twice), INF Nick Sogard (twice), RHP Tyron Guerrero, INF Anthony Seigler (twice), RHP Tommy Kahnle, INF Tsung-Che Cheng, INF Brett Harris, RHP Brayan Bello, LHP Raymond Burgos (three times), RHP Seth Martinez, RHP Greg Weissert, and RHP Wyatt Olds. In addition, the WooSox had their manager, Chad Tracy and hitting coach, Collin Hetzler both promoted to Boston for those same roles with the Red Sox on April 26.
