LAST TIME OUT: Despite 16 strikeouts from starting pitcher Reid Detmers, and 19 strikeouts overall from Rocket City pitching, Chattanooga's Wilson Garcia went 3-4 with a homer and two RBI, finishing a triple short of the cycle, in an 8-6 Saturday evening win. Rocket City led 2-1 in the sixth before the Lookouts got a three-run blast by Brian Rey follow by a solo bomb from Garcia to surge to a 5-2 lead. Rocket City came back with a two-run single from Didder in the seventh and a solo homer by Ibandel Isabel in the eighth to tie the game at five before Chattanooga put three on the board in the bottom of the eighth thanks to an RBI single from Garcia, a throwing error, and a wild pitch. Didder doubled in Torii Hunter Jr. with two out in the ninth to bring the tying run to the plate, however Gavin Cecchini grounded to second to end the game. Detmers did not figure in the decision although he struck out a career-high 16 batters over six innings, which also set a season-high for individual Trash Pandas hurlers. He also allowed all three homers and gave up five runs. The 19Ks between he and Ryan Clark were a season-high for Rocket City pitchers. Clark suffered the loss after allowing the three runs in the eighth. The Trash Pandas were led by Didder who went 3-5 with a double, three RBI and a run scored. MacKinnon finished 2-4 with his homer and two RBI.

GETTING K'S: In addition, the pitchers are racking up the strikeouts against opposing hitters whiffing 482 batters through the first 46 games. That is good enough for second in AA-South. The most the Trash Pandas have struck out in a game was 19, which happened on 6/26 against Chattanooga when starter Reid Detmers set a new season-high for Rocket City pitchers with 16Ks followed by reliever Ryan Clark who punched out three more Lookouts. Twice the Trash Pandas have struck out 16 batters. First on 5/11 when they K'd 16 Smokies in a 10-inning loss then on 6/16 when they shutout Biloxi. The also struck out 15 Smokies in a shutout win on 5/13, 15 more against Birmingham on 5/25, and another 15 against Chattanooga on 6/5. Southpaw Reid Detmers leads the way with 60 K's after he punched out 14 Shuckers on 6/20 in game one of a doubleheader. He and closer Oliver Ortega combined to strike out 15 Biloxi batters in the seven-inning game as Ortega tossed a 1-2-3 seventh for the save with one strikeout.

READY FOR LAUNCH: The Trash Pandas have lived up to the Rocket City nickname by launching 65 homers, which leads AA-South and is one behind NW Arkansas for the lead in all of AA. 12 of those dingers came in the first Tennessee series, including two grand slams in the series finale on 5/16. TEEING OFF ON TENNESSEE: Of the 65 homeruns hit by Rocket City this season, 44 have come against the state of Tennessee. Nay's dinger on 6/12 gave the Trash Pandas 23 homers this season against the Smokies, the most against any team. In addition, the Trash Pandas have done a number on the other Tennessee opponent, Chattanooga, as the Trash Pandas have gone yard against the Lookouts 21 times.

READY FOR LAUNCH: The Trash Pandas have lived up to the Rocket City nickname by launching 65 homers, which leads AA-South and is one behind NW Arkansas for the lead in all of AA. 12 of those dingers came in the first Tennessee series, including two grand slams in the series finale on 5/16. TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Right-hander Cooper Criswell will take to the bump today after tossing the first nine-inning complete game in Trash Pandas history on 6/22. Against Chattanooga, he allowed two runs on six hits and struck out five in a 5-2 win. This is in addition to another sensational performance he game on 6/16 when Criswell fired 6.2 shutout innings, walked none, and struck out 14 batters in a 3-0 win over Biloxi. The 14 strikeouts were, at the time, a season-high for Trash Pandas pitchers, which was tied four days later by Reid Detmers in another win over the Shuckers, then surpassed by Detmers with a 16-strikeout performance on 6/26 against Chattanooga. The performance was needed as Criswell struggled in his two previous outings (6/3, 6/10). In those games the right-hander allowed eight ER on 12 hits over 10 innings (7.20 ERA). Before that, in a three-outing stretch earlier in the season (5/28, 5/21, 5/15), Criswell had allowed only three ER over 12.1 innings on 11 hits (2.19 ERA). 2021 is only Criswell's second season in professional ball. He pitched 2019 at then high-A Inland Empire where he went 4-8 with a 4.60 ERA in 25 games and 21 starts, striking out 111 in 117.1 innings pitched. After an injury derailed his senior season of high school, Criswell pitched two seasons at Southern Union Community College before spending 2018 in Chapel Hill. While at Carolina, Criswell appeared in 26 games including nine as a starter. He went 6-2 with a 2.99 ERA, striking out 86 in 75.1 innings. The highlights included a save in the College World Series against Oregon State when he tossed 2.1 scoreless innings.

The name was chosen in a name-the-team contest and is a reference to the area's association with the space industry and the determination and ingenuity of raccoons, aka trash pandas.

Trash Pandas, slang for raccoon, was included in the original 10 nominations following several Brandiose-led focus groups in Madison and Huntsville. The ballot descriptor read: Our community is known for engineering, and no creature in our galaxy is as smart, creative, determined and ingenious a problem solver - dedicated to the challenge at hand - as our local raccoons!

In July 2018, after the results from several focus groups in Madison and Huntsville, 10 names were selected, based on their uniqueness and how each name relates to the characteristics of the area: (Alphabetically) Army Ants, Comet Jockeys, GloWorms, Lunartics, Moon Possums, Puffy Head Bird Legs, Space Chimps, Space Sloths, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas. The focus groups were led by San Diego-based Brandiose, the Minor League Baseball industry's premiere branding partner.

Over the next few weeks, two rounds of online voting took place. The first round narrowed the list to Comet Jockeys, Moon Possums, Space Chimps, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas.

Trash Pandas won the final round with 44.75 percent of the vote to ThunderSharks 19.25 percent. Moon Possums was Comet Jockeys fifth (11.38 percent).

third (12.57 percent); Space Chimps fourth (12.05 percent); and By the way, Trash Pandas dominated both rounds. More than 28,500 nominations and votes were recorded. According to Brandiose, this represented - by far

- the largest community participation in a Name the Team contest in the history of Minor League Baseball. The team name was announced in a local microbrewery in September 2018 with nearly 1,500 fans on hand. Trash Pandas was nominated by Matthew Higley of Lacey's Spring, Ala. He received two box seats for the first five seasons and will throw out the ceremonial first pitch at a Trash Pandas home game.

The regional identifier was also chosen by the community. Out of 13,559 votes cast, 67.4 percent chose Rocket City over North Alabama (18.09 percent) and Madison (14.51 percent).

Press Release From Major League Baseball - March 11, 2021

Major League Baseball (MLB) announced today the testing of a variety of experimental playing rules at various levels of the Minor Leagues during the upcoming 2021 season. These experimental playing rules have been approved by the Competition Committee and the Playing Rules Committee. MLB will closely monitor and analyze the impact of each rule change throughout the 2021 season and report to Clubs on their effects for further analysis. Consistent with the preferences of our fans, the rule changes being tested are designed to increase action on the basepaths, create more balls in play, improve the pace and length of games, and reduce player injuries.



Below is a summary of the experimental rules that will be tested during the 2021 Minor League season:

Double-A (Defensive Positioning): The defensive team must have a minimum of four players on the infield, each of whom must have both feet completely in front of the outer boundary of the infield dirt. Depending on the preliminary results of this experimental rule change, MLB may require two infielders to be positioned entirely on each side of second base in the second half of the Double-A season. These restrictions on defensive positioning are intended to increase the batting average on balls in play.

NOTEWORTHY

THE CRISWELL FILE: In his third pro season, RHP Cooper Criswell will take the mound for Rocket City for the eighth time. Criswell has spent his entire career with the Angels after being selected in the 13th round of the 2018 draft. He made his pro debut with High-A Inland Empire in 2019 and spent most of the season in the rotation for the 66ers. In his first Rocket City start on 5/9 at Chattanooga, Criswell took the loss at AT&T Field. He was brilliant in three starts after that. On 5/15 vs. Tennessee, he threw a career-high 7.0 innings and gave up just one run while striking out seven to earn the win. He took the tough luck loss after giving up one run on two hits with seven strikeouts over 5.0 innings at Pensacola on 5/21. He gave up just one run for the third straight start on 5/28 to beat Birmingham. However, his strong streak ended after giving up five earned runs in a home loss to the Lookouts on 6/3. He didn't factor in the final decision for the first time after giving up three earned runs over 4.1 innings at Tennessee on 6/10. In his last home start, Criswell had the best start of his career, pitching 6.2 scoreless innings with a career-high 14 strikeouts to beat Biloxi on 6/16. He then threw his first career game on 6/22, giving up just two runs and getting all 27 outs on 101 pitches (71 strikes) to beat the Lookouts.

VS. CHATTANOOGA: Over three starts against the Lookouts this season, Criswell is 1-2 with a 5.30 ERA (11 ER/18.2 IP) with three walks and 16 strikeouts. The first two starts were Criswell's worst this season, as they represent the only two outings where Criswell has given up more than three runs before his complete game victory in Tuesday's series opener.

MORE NOTES

FIRST AWARD: On June 16 vs. Biloxi, Criswell pitched the game of his career. Over 6.2 dominant innings, Criswell gave up just three hits and walked none while recording a career-high 14 strikeouts, including the last three hitters he faced, over 6.2 innings to lead Rocket City to a 3-0 win. The 14 strikeouts were the most by an Angels farmhand since Tyler Skaggs struck out 14 for Triple-A Salt Lake on July 14, 2016. Just four days later on June 20, fellow Trash Pandas starter Reid Detmers struck out 14 and then struck out 16 on June 26 at Chattanooga as the pair hold the top strikeout games in Rocket City history. Criswell was named Double-A South Pitcher of the Week for June 14-20 for his strong outing during that span, the first weekly honor of his professional career.

CAREER DAY: Criswell's best outing of the 2019 season came on June 22 vs. Lake Elsinore as he tossed 5.0 scoreless innings with just three hits against and a then career-high nine strikeouts to earn the win over the Storm. The longest outing of his debut season came on July 20 vs. Modesto, when he gave up three earned runs with one walk and six strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

LIKE FATHER LIKE SON: Cooper's father, Tim Criswell, was a third round pick of the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 1983 draft and went on to play five minor league seasons as a catcher and a pitcher between the Dodgers and Atlanta Braves' organizations, reaching as high as Double-A Greenville in 1986.

<u>NCAA NOTES:</u> Pitched one season for the University of North Carolina in 2018, going 6-2 with one save and a 2.99 ERA (25 ER/75.1 IP) and 86 strikeouts in 26 games (nine starts). Before joining the Tar Heels, spent two seasons at Southern Union State Community College and went 10-1 during his sophomore season with six complete games.
