Carolina League Championship Series (Best-of-Three) Down East Wood Ducks (0-1) at Charleston RiverDogs (1-0)

RHP Brock Porter (0-0, 3.60) vs. RHP Trevor Martin (0-0, 2.08)

Today's Game: The Charleston RiverDogs (affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays) return home to face the Down East Wood Ducks (affiliate of the Texas Rangers) in Game 2 of the Carolina League Championship Series. The RiverDogs will secure the title with a victory, while Down East aims to force Game 3 on Wednesday. This series is a rematch of the 2021 league championship series, won in five games by the RiverDogs. **RiverDogs-Wood Ducks Season Series in 2023**: **Overall:** RiverDogs 7, Wood Ducks 2. **At The Joe:** RiverDogs 4, Wood Ducks 2.

Last Time Out: The RiverDogs held Down East scoreless over the final eight innings of Game 1 on Sunday afternoon, allowing the offense time to find their footing and secure a 4-2 victory. The Wood Ducks took the lead just two batters into the bottom of the first. Jonny Cuevas walked leadoff hitter Quincy Scott to open his day and JoJo Blackmon followed almost immediately with a two-run blast that put the Wood Ducks on top 2-0. Cuevas would shut them down for his final 4.0 innings on the mound before handing the ball to the bullpen. Cade Halemanu earned the win by tossing a scoreless sixth. Drew Sommers worked the next 1.1 innings without allowing a hit. Gerlin Rosario finished the game by retiring all five batters he faced to earn his first save of the postseason. The offense did not register a hit until the fifth inning when Jhon Diaz singled. Charleston loaded the bases with one out in that inning but did not score. They finally broke through in the sixth when Colton Ledbetter tied the game with a two-run home run off Luis Ramirez. In the seventh, the RiverDogs loaded the bases again, this time with a single from Cristopher Barete and two walks. Down East went to the bullpen as the tarp was brought onto the field, beginning a 37-minute delay. After the rain passed, Paul Bonzagni entered the game and walked both Cooper Kinney and Ledbetter to force in a pair of runs and give the RiverDogs the 4-2 lead.

Rare Air: The RiverDogs are trying to become the first full-season Minor League Baseball team in the last 15 years to finish at the bottom of their division in the first half and rebound to win the championship in the same season. The last team to accomplish that feat was the 2008 Burlington Bees of the Midwest League. The Bees went 30-39 in the first half during that campaign, while the RiverDogs stumbled to a 27-39 mark at the halfway point of this season.

September Staple: The RiverDogs are making their third-consecutive trip to the league's championship series in 2023. The recent success has marked a massive turnaround for a franchise that historically struggled to reach the postseason, much less achieve success in the playoffs. Prior to the 2021 season, the RiverDogs had last reached the championship series in 1988 and the last professional baseball championship won by a Charleston team was in 1922.

Triple Threat: By advancing to the Carolina League Championship Series, the RiverDogs have kept alive their dreams of a three-peat. The last MiLB franchise to win three-consecutive league titles was the Midland Rockhounds from 2014-17, when the Oakland affiliate won four straight in the Texas League. No team has won three-consecutive Carolina League titles.

Top Dog: Infielder Cooper Kinney was voted by fans as the winner of the 2023 Top Dog award. He joins Taj Bradley and Carson Williams as players to receive the honor during the renewed Rays-RiverDogs partnership that began with the 2021 campaign. Kinney consistently ranked among the top hitters in the Carolina League in several offensive categories. Kinney finished the season with 125 hits, the most in the Carolina League. The last time a RiverDogs player led the league in hits was the 2008 season. The 20-year-old also finished second in total bases and doubles, third in RBI, sixth in batting average and tied for sixth in extra-base hits.

Worst to First: The RiverDogs compiled a record of 33-19 in the last 52 games to win the south division title in the second half. That stretch featured four winning streaks of at least four games. From the halfway point on, the RiverDogs outscored their opposition by 69, the largest run differential in the league. The RiverDogs had the league's worst record through 66 games.

Prized Pups: MLB Pipeline recently updated their team Top 30 rankings with recent draft picks added. The RiverDogs roster is now loaded with eight of the publication's Top 30 Rays prospects. The highest ranked of that group are 2022 and 2023 first-round picks Xavier Isaac and Brayden Taylor at #5 and #6, respectively. 2023 second-round pick selection Colton Ledbetter is slotted in at #9. The starting rotation features the next three players listed with Santiago Suarez (#15), Marcus Johnson (#17) and Trevor Martin (#18) viewed as some of the organization's top-rated pitchers. Rounding out the list are infielders Carlos Colmenarez (#24) and Tre' Morgan (#26).

RIVERDOGS FIELD STAFF

Manager: Sean Smedley

Smedley's coaching career began when he was the video coordinator for the rookie-level Princeton Rays in 2016. In 2017, he returned to Princeton, this time as the bench coach. For the next two seasons, Smedley was part of Blake Butera's staff as the bench coach for the Hudson Valley Renegades. The native of Colorado was announced as the manager in Princeton for the 2020 season, but COVID-19 canceled the season and when play resumed he joined Butera in Charleston. During his playing days as a catcher, Smedley was a prep standout at Desert Vista High School in Phoenix, Arizona. He played one year of junior college ball at Yavapai College before transferring to Division II Texas A&M International. He went undrafted at the end of his college career but was signed as a free agent by the Rays shortly after the draft's conclusion. In three professional seasons, he appeared in 24 games total between the Gulf Coast League Rays and Single-A Bowling Green. Smedley was named the RiverDogs manager for the 2023 season.

Pitching Coach: Levi Romero

Romero takes over as the pitching coach at a full-season affiliate for the first time after serving in the same role for the Florida Complex League affiliate in 2021. That squad held opponents to a league-low .204 batting average and finished with a 3.32 earned run average and 514 strikeouts in 460.2 innings. Romero was the pitching coach for one of the Rays two entries in the Dominican Summer League in 2021. His professional career began in 2003 when he was signed out of Venezuela by the Houston Astros. In all, he pitched for five years in Minor League Baseball with the Astros and Texas Rangers before embarking on a seven-year international career that included stops in Venezuela and Japan and ended in 2015.

Hitting Coach: Perry Roth

This season will be Roth's second with both the Rays and RiverDogs after coaching at the college level since 1996. Under his tutelage in 2022, the RiverDogs led the Carolina League in batting average, home runs, hits, triples and slugging percentage. Before joining the Rays, he spent the previous 15 years with UAB's baseball program, also serving as recruiting coordinator, hitting coach and assistant head coach.

Coach: Ronnie Richardson

Richardson is embarking on his third season with the Rays, and first with a full-season affiliate, following two years in the Florida Complex League. He helped guide the FCL Rays to a 39-16 record in the regular season and an appearance in the league's championship series. Richardson previously coached in the Miami Marlins organization, with Hillsborough Community College and in the Northwoods League with the Madison Mallards and Wisconsin Woodchucks. He was selected out of Central Florida University in the 16th round of the 2012 MLB Draft by the San Diego Padres. He played three seasons in their farm system, posting a .262 career batting average.

Athletic Trainer: Halee Williams

Williams begins her fourth year with the Rays and first with a full-season affiliate. She served in the same role with the Florida Complex League Rays in 2022. Williams graduated with her bachelor's degree in athletic training from Indiana Wesleyan University. While in school, she interned with the Arizona Diamondbacks and, after graduating, spent a season with the Oakland Athletics. She began working with the Rays in 2019 while completing her Global master's degree in Sports Management and Legal Skills through Instituto Superior de Derecho y Economía and FC Barcelona in 2020. This winter, Williams worked for the Bravos de Margarita of the Venezuelan Professional Baseball League.

Strength Coach: Mia Salvemini

Salvemini returns as strength and conditioning coach for a third consecutive season. She is also a CrossFit Level One Trainer and spent time working with athletes at Cressey Sports Performance. Salvemini was originally hired by the Rays in 2020 after graduating from the University of Tampa in 2019 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Human Performance with a concentration in Exercise Recreation and Leadership.
