TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints were swept in their twin bill yesterday 3-2 and then 8-7. Alex Isola delivered a three-hit effort in game one, but Drew Millas hit a two-run homer in the top of the seventh to give Rochester a 3-1 lead. The Saints had the tying run at third base in the bottom half of the inning, but could not get it across in the loss. In game 2, the Saints fell behind 7-1, but used a six-run fifth to tie the game. Michael Helman homered in his first game off the injured list to knot the game at 7-7. However, Rochester took the lead back in the sixth on a sacrifice fly as the Saints hit into four double plays in game two, the final of which ended the game with the tying run aboard.

DOUBLE PLAYS, FOR FOUR: In game two of the doubleheader on Saturday, the Sains grounded into four double plays, matching the franchise record set on June 28, 2022 against Omaha. It's the first time the club has hit into four double plays in a seven inning contest. It also marks just the ninth time in the Statcast Era (2015) that a team has grounded into four double plays in a seven inning game.

DURAN BRINGING THE HEAT: Jhoan Duran displayed his elite velocity in his second rehab appearance on Saturday. His fastball topped out at 102.9 miles per hour. It's the fastest pitch thrown in any Triple-A game this season, and the fifth-fastest pitch this year between Triple-A and Major League Baseball. Duran's fastball averaged 101.8 miles per hour in his inning of relief.

ISOLA SO HOT: Over his last six games (since April 17), Alex Isola has hit 7-for-17 (.412), walking three times and striking out once in that span. His current four-game streak without a strikeout is the second-longest of the season for a Saints batter, trailing only Diego A. Castillo, who went five consecutive games without one, from April 11-16. The franchise record in 10 games without a strikeouts, held by Williams Austudillo, who went from June 29- July9, 2021 without a strikeout.

DIEGO SAVES THE DAY: Diego Castillo picked up his first save of the season on Thursday in the Saints 3-0 victory. The owner of 35 Major League saves, Castillo picked up his first minor league save since June 1, 2018 against the Pawtucket Red Sox. His six-out save that day was his final minor league appearance before making his Major League debut with Tampa Bay. Castillo has converted 37 of his 55 minor league save opportunities in his career, including 12 of 19 in Triple-A. He's converted 35 of his 47 save opportunities in the Major Leagues.

NO WALKS FOR YOU: In Thursday's 3-0 shutout victory, the Saints pitching staff did not walk a batter, marking the 10th time in franchise history they did not walk a batter. It's the second time in franchise history that Saints pitchers did not allow a walk or allow any runs in a game. The Saints are now 5-5 all-time when not issuing a walk.

PRATO POWER UP: Anthony Prato has displayed his ability to reach base, leading the team with 22 walks, ranking second in the International League. He's hit .289 (11-for-38) in his last 11 games, drawing 11 walks to 11 strikeouts in that stretch. Prato's .479 on-base percentage is the third-highest in the IL. In his Triple-A career, Prato has reached base in 82 of his 94 games. On Wednesday, he became just the fourth Saints batter to hit three doubles in a game and the first since Jermaine Palacios did so on August 3, 2022.

REHAB ROUNDTABLE: The Minnesota Twins added Justin Topa to the list of Major League rehab players in St. Paul on Thursday. He joins Jhoan Duran, who began his assignment Tuesday. Duran has appeared in two games, throwing 2.0 inning, allowing two runs on four hits, striking out five. Topa has thrown once, striking out the side.

WE ALL MAKE SACRIFICES: In Tuesday's 15-9 victory, Diego Castillo drove in a pair of runs on sacrifice flies. He becomes just the second Saints player to record two sacrifice flies in a single game, joining Hernán Pérez, who accomplished the feat nearly one year ago to the day, on April 22, 2023 against Scranton Wilkes/Barre. The Saints are tied for fourth in the International League with nine sacrifice flies this season.

WALK THIS WAY: After drawing a season-high 10 walks in Tuesday's 15-9 victory, the Saints moved to 21-2 all-time when drawing at least nine walks. The Saints are ninth in the IL with their 102 walks drawn this season.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins offense broke out in a big way on Saturday night, beating Los Angeles (AL), 16-5. Seven of the nine Twins starters registered multi-hit efforts, as the Twins amassed 17 hits on the night. Ryan Jeffers, Max Kepler and Carlos Santana each homered in the win. Chris Paddack picked up his second win of the season, allowing four runs over 5.0 innings.

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 4/17 @ IND...made fourth start of the season, throwing 4.0 shutout innings, allowing two hits and two walks while striking out five...first hit allowed was a bunt single in the first inning, second was a line drive single in the fourth...did not allow a runner past second base...registered 14 whiffs, nine with slider, which was his most used pitch (42%)...did not factor into decision in 1-0 Saints loss

A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES: In just his ninth professional pitching appearance, Festa was a major part of a no-hitter. On May 10, 2022 with Fort Myers, he threw 6.0 no-hit innings, striking out a career-high 11 batters in a combined no-hitter for the Mighty Mussels. Jaylen Nowlin followed with 2.0 perfect innings and struck out three. Hunter McMahon tossed 1.0 hitless inning to finish it off, a 3-0 win.

ONE, TWO, THREE, YOU'RE OUT!: On July 24, 2022, Festa allowed three consecutive singles between the third and fourth innings. The final two batters of the third inning reached, as did the first of the fourth. Festa got three outs, but did not retire a batter because promptly picked off each of the three batters, one after the other.
