Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Trenton Denholm to the mound today, needing a win to salvage a series split (7-0 in last 7G when faced with a series loss). Lehigh Valley will counter with RHP Drake Fellows. Columbus is 40-24 (.625) versus right handers this year. Fellows has faced the Clippers five times in his career (24-25 with Ind), going 1-0 with a 4.82ERA (18.2IP, 18H, 10R, 10ER, 8BB, 14K).

vs. the IronPigs

Columbus has won 47 of the last 81G (.580), including playoffs. All-time in Allentown, the Clippers are 35-27 (.565), including playoffs (2-0 in '11 GC Finals). This year marks the second straight season the Clippers have travelled to Allentown and the third time since the expansion of the IL (Lehigh has been to Columbus once, 2024). Dom Nunez has 2HR and 7RBI in 8G against the Pigs in his career.

Outliers

The Clippers reached 50 wins last night, having done so with negative differentials in runs (-3; of nine teams with at least 47 wins, only team in the red, all others at least +17 and averaging +53), hits (-3; other eight teams average +40) and homers (-1; other eight at +23). Friday's victory saw Columbus allow 12 hits, marking the 16th win when the opponents reach double digits (16-16, .500, 1st in IL).

Ingle is Back

Cooper Ingle's two week stint in the Majors (.095/.208/.095 in 7G) dropped him below qualification for rate statistics in the IL this year (debuted as the leader on 6/7). Including a 4x4 (3HR) game on 6/18 vs. Scranton/WB, he has slumped to a line of .228/.314/.485 in his last 25G with Columbus. At catcher, Ingle has a 1.293OPS (11HR) in 31G (.574OPS and 2HR in 21G between DH and LF).

Bumpy Ride for Brito

Juan Brito was hitless last night to drop his July average to .205 (8x39), however, he has managed a .487SLG as he has connected for 7XBH (hit .221, 19x86, in 23G during June with only 3XBH, .279SLG). Dating to 6/4, Brito has hit .188 (22x117), going hitless in 15 of 31G, and averaging almost a strikeout per (30K in 142PA, 21%; at 16% in Columbus career prior), but his walk rate is up (18%, from 14%).

Free for All

CJ Kayfus collected the first multi-steal game of his career on Wednesday, when the Clippers had 7SB as a team, and he added another last night to establish his career high (6). Columbus has 9SB in the last 4G, following 16SB in the 28G prior (had 87SB in first 59G before the slowdown). In his last 8G, Kayfus is 8x29 with 4XBH (.552SLG; was 10x56, .179, with 2HR and a .286SLG in 15G prior).

Roughing It

Since doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, George Valera is hitting .111 (5x45, all singles), while scoring twice and driving in a pair over his last 12G. He has drawn only 5BB during the slump (3BB last Sunday) against 12K in 50PA. Valera has not homered since 5/19 vs. Louisville (95AB since) and has just 2HR in his last 44G (157AB, .306SLG). Additionally, he has no multi-RBI games since 5/30 (23G).

Another Personal Best

Kody Huff tied his career high in steals (7) on 6/28, having already hit top marks in triples (4), homers (12), runs (52), RBI (51), hit streak (12G, 5/1-5/16) and on base streak (20G, 6/2-6/28). He enters today a pair of walks short of his personal best (44BB in 2024 with Akron). All of that damage has come in just 294PA (averaged 398PA from 2024-25, when he set all his prior career highs).

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, Milan Tolentino is 20x58 (.345) in his last 18G, collecting 10XBH (.603SLG) and 12RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 11G, Tolentino has drawn 11BB to only 7K (47PA; had 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He played in his 200th game as a Clipper on Thursday and is one of five with at least 30HR and 30SB (only two are 40-40).

Frias Feeling It

Dayan Frias singled and walked last night to extend his on base streak to 15G (.361OBP since 6/18). He is hitting .278 (15x54) during the streak, after having gone 2x27 (.074) in his previous 15G (.194OBP from 5/6-6/16). Additionally, he has a .426SLG in his last 15G (.220SLG prior). Frias has been sitting in the .290s with his season OBP for the last three weeks, having last been above .300 on 4/12.

This Date in Clipper History

7/12/1983

The Clippers beat the Charleston Charlies on the road 11-1 while setting a franchise record by homering in their 24th consecutive game. **Brian Dayett** hit a pair of long balls and **Mike Patterson** added a grand slam for Columbus. The '83 Clippers hit 182HR, the most in team history (until 2019), with Dayett leading the way with a Clipper record 35. **Matt Winters** hit 29 and **Steve Balboni** had 27.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,453 to 1,400).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 135-109 (.553) in pitch reviews, with batters going 69-71 (.493) and pitchers/catchers going 66-38 (.635). They have run out of challenges in 39G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 812, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 112 through the first 91G (on pace for 183SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 30CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 2nd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (49; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 139 runs while crafting a .914OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 74 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +65 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 208-135 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,960RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.22 through the first 91G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 178HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 50G this season (30-20, .600), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Syracuse) while playing in the most games decided in the last at bat (25). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 98G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-50 (.490, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 436-447 (.494), 406-401 with Columbus (.503).

Great Start:

Denholm's season debut, 4/1 vs. Indianapolis, was his 100th career game and his second at the Triple-A level (367 days between Triple-A games). He needed only 69 pitches to record a quality start (6.0IP, 1ER), giving the Clippers their first of the season (5th game, did not have a quality start until 41st game last season). Columbus has 14QS on the season (12QS through this point last year, on the way to 23), with **Rorik Maltrud** (5), **Logan Allen** (4) and Denholm (3) accounting for 86%.

In Relief:

Denholm pitched exclusively in relief during May and June, but each appearance came on starter's rest, as he averaged 56.0 pitches per outing (ranged from 38-84, while recording 2.0-5.0IP). In total, he was 7-0 with a 1.95ERA over 9G (32.1IP, 30H, 9R, 7ER, 5BB, 35K). He led the IL in wins from May-June and, among 76 pitchers with at least 30.0IP, his ERA was 2nd best (also 2nd with 7.00K/BB and 6th with a 1.08WHIP). On 5/20 vs. Louisville, Denholm notched his first save in Triple-A (4.0IP, 1ER) and the fifth of his pro career.

Tough Ones:

On 4/12, Worcester hung 7ER on Denholm, tying a career high (third time), while also connecting for 2HR (eighth career game giving up 2HR, first time allowing both to same batter, Allan Castro). He followed up with a quality outing next time out, 4/18 vs. Iowa (6.0IP, 3ER), throwing a season high of 92 pitches. Denholm closed out April by giving up 7ER again (fourth time), this time to Toledo on 4/30, while giving up 3HR for the first time in his career.

Limiting the Longballs:

From 4/12-4/30, Denholm surrendered 7HR to 90BF (one per 12.9BF), accounting for 15 of 19ER (6HR with men on base, including a grand slam on 4/12 at Worcester). He has allowed only 2HR to 176BF since (88.0BF per) and both of them were solo shots (last on 6/20 vs. Scranton/WB, 70BF since).
