Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Great Lakes Loons (affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers) in the last game of a six-game series. **Season Series:** Great Lakes 9, Dayton 8 (at Midland: Great Lakes 7, Dayton 4).

After today's game, the Dragons, Loons, and the other 10 Midwest League teams have four consecutive days off in connection with the MLB All-Star break. Games will resume on July 17.

Dragons First Half Summary: Record: 39-27, East Division champs. By winning 8 of their last 9 games in the half including 2 elimination games on the final night, the Dragons overtook Great Lakes and Lake County to win the division by 1 game. The Dragons outscored their opponents 90-26 in those nine games. The Dragons previously won First Half division titles in 2001 and '07. The Dragons First Half winning percentage of .591 tied for second best in franchise history (44-26, .629 in 2007; 39-27, .591 in 2022).

Last Game: Saturday: Great Lakes 3, Dayton 2. Chuck Davalan hit a two-run home run in the bottom of the eighth inning to erase a 2-1 Dayton lead and lift the Loons to their fourth win in the first five games of the series. Dayton had only three hits, led by Tyson Lewis, who had a home run and double. Ty Floyd tossed four no-hit innings as the Dayton starting pitcher.

Current Series: Great Lakes 4, Dayton 1. The Loons have outscored the Dragons 35-23. Dayton is batting .200 as a team (.186 with runners in scoring position) with six home runs, five stolen bases, an 7.46 team ERA, with three errors.

Dragons Team and Player Trending Notes:

- The next Dayton win will give manager Julio Morillo 200 for his career.
- The Dragons have hit 13 HR in 11 G (1.18 HR/G) since the promotions of four key hitters on June 30. While this is below their pre-June 30 home run pace (1.30 HR/G), the post-June 30 pace is still near the pace of the club record set in 2022 (1.19 HR/G).
- The Dragons have hit 109 HR in 85 G, on pace to finish the year with 168 (club record: 152 in 2022). In 17 of the Dragons first 25 seasons (2000-2025), they did not reach 109 home runs for the year.
- The Dragons are 34-24 (.586) since May 5. They lead the MWL in home runs during that time period (95 in 58 games).
- The Dragons have scored 503 runs, on pace to finish the year with 775 (club record is 730 in 2000). The Dragons did not reach 503 runs in 2025 until August 31, finishing the year with 542.

Dragons Hottest Hitters:

Julio Carreras in his first 11 G with the Dragons is 13 for 45 (.289) with 4 2B and 6 RBI. He began this season in independent ball (Lake County, Amer. As).

Tyson Lewis (Reds #4 prospect re: MLB Pipeline) in his first 9 G with the Dragons is batting .300 (12 for 40) with 2 HR.

Marcus Smith in his first 11 G with the Dragons is 11 for 39 (.282), 4 HR, 10 RBI.

Peyton Stovall in his last 30 G (since May 30) is batting .330 with 7 HR, 7 2B, 3 3B, and 27 RBI with an OPS of 1.081 (3rd in MWL in OPS since May 30).

Dragons Additional Batter Trending Notes:

Victor Acosta in his last 16 G (since June 10) is 6 for 40 (.150).

Alfredo Alcantara had his best month of 2026 in June, batting .265, 6 HR, 17 RBI, .884 OPS. He is 5 for 42 (.119) in his last 13 G (6 BB in this series at GL).

Ariel Almonte in his last 3 G is 3 for 10 with a HR, 2B, and 3 RBI to break a 2 for 29 skid.

Johnny Ascanio is 1 for 10 in 4 G since returning to the Dragons from Chattanooga on June 30. This is his third stint of this season with the Dragons.

John Michael Faile since June 1 (25 G) is 14 for 84 (.167). Faile hit .322 in April and May for the Dragons. In this series at GL, he is 4 for 15 (.267).

Jacob Friend in his last 16 G is 8 for 56 (.143) with 13 BB. In 2026 (Dayton/Daytona), Friend has 15 HR (Tied-6th in Reds org.), 57 RBI (3rd in Reds org.).

Ryan McCrystal is 1 for 24 with 9 SO in his last 6 G after going 13 for 20 (.650) with 7 2B in his first 5 G upon returning to the Dragons from Double-A.

Mason Neville has 4 HR in 37 at-bats with the Dragons, but he is batting .162 with the team. Neville has 13 HR w/3 clubs on the year (8th in Reds org.)

Diego Omana joined the Dragons on 5/26 from Chattanooga. He is 3 for 9 (.333) since his arrival.

Esmith Pineda was activated from the injured list on Wednesday after completing an 8 G rehab assignment with the ACL Reds (4 for 19, .211, 1 HR).

Graham Crackin’: Carter Graham was selected as the Midwest League Player of the Month and Cincinnati Reds Minor League Player of the Month for June. He hit 11 home runs for the Dragons in June, the second highest HR total in any month for a Dayton player in franchise history (Austin Kearns had 14 in July, 2000). In June with the Dragons, Graham batted .354, 11 HR, 27 RBI, .829 slugging pct, 1.319 OPS (he also played 1 G with Chattanooga in June and added an additional HR). Graham became the first Dayton hitter to be named MWL Player of the Month since Blake Dunn in April, 2023, and only the fourth since the award’s inception in 2005 (others were Jose Siri in 2017; Brian O’Grady in 2015).

Tyson Lewis Joins Dragons:

The Dragons roster includes high-level prospect Tyson Lewis, ranked at #4 on the Reds top-30 Prospects list by *MLB Pipeline*. He is #8 on the *Baseball America* list. Lewis spent the first three thmonths of this season with the Single-A Daytona Tortugas. Last season, Lewis was a Full-Season All-Star in the Arizona Complex League with the Reds club, batting .340 with six home runs and 35 RBI in 46 games. He was the 2024 Gatorade Nebraska Player of the Year as he led Millard West High School in Omaha to the state championship. He was the highest-drafted position player ever from the state of Nebraska, taken in the second round by the Reds that summer. Lewis was also named by *Baseball America* as the Reds organization’s Best Power Hitter in their list of players with the best tools.

Notes on Dragons hitters who were promoted since start of Second Half. **Carter Graham** batted .322, 17 HR, 60 RBI in three months with the Dragons and was on pace to finish the year with 30 home runs and 106 RBI. Graham broke the Dragons club record for highest batting average in a First Half season at .330 and also broke the club record for most grand slam home runs in a season with three. Graham has three 2-homer games, five 4-hit games, and five games with at least 5 RBI. He tied the club record on May 28 for most RBI in a game with 8 (a record that was also tied on June 18 (Game 2) by Jacob Friend. Graham ranked first in the MWL in RBI and second in home runs at the time of his promotion. **Carlos Sanchez** batted .313, 9 HR, 36 RBI with the Dragons this season. He was leading the MWL in hits and ranked second in runs. **Alfredo Duno** batted .260 with 16 HR and 47 RBI. He was third in the MWL in home runs, eighth in extra base hits, and 10th in slugging percentage. **Kien Vu** batted .266, 12 HR, and 45 RBI. He was third in the MWL in runs, tied for second in triples, tied for fifth in extra

base hits, and fifth in stolen bases including a game-winning steal of home. **Yerlin Confidan** hit .251, 7 HR, 45 RBI. He was leading the team in games played and games started when he was promoted after Wednesday’s game.

Current Player Notes:

- John Michael Faile** is the NCAA Division II all-time career leader in both home runs (81) and RBI (337). Faile has hit 17 home runs in his Dragons career and would equal the team’s career record of 30 this season if he matches his home run with the Dragons in 2025 (13).
- Peyton Stovall** was selected 3rd Team All-American by ABCA/Rawlings in 2024 at the University of Arkansas.
- Mason Neville** tied for the NCAA D1 lead in home runs in 2025 with 26 with Oregon. He was a First Team All-American and First Team All-Big Ten selection.
- Starting pitcher **J.P. Ortiz** had the best ERA (2.81) in the Reds farm system in 2025 with Daytona among pitchers with at least 80 innings.

All-Time Best Dragons: The team named their 12 Greatest Dragons in franchise history as part of last season’s 25-year celebration. Those players, listed alphabetically, are Homer Bailey, Jay Bruce, Zack Cozart, Johnny Cueto, Elly De La Cruz, Adam Dunn, Todd Frazier, Hunter Greene, Billy Hamilton, Austin Kearns, Joey Votto, and Jesse Winker.

A total of 160 players have gone from the Dragons to the Major Leagues, and another 45 Reds players have completed injury rehab assignments with the Dragons, including Jose Rijo, Joey Votto (three times), Homer Bailey, Drew Stubbs, Johnny Cueto, Aroldis Chapman, and Brandon Phillips. Three members of the Reds Hall-of-Fame have served as coaches for the Dragons including Ken Griffey Sr., Chris Sabo, and Tom Browning. Every season in Dragons history has featured a future Major League player/s on the Dayton roster. Most recently: Chase Burns in 2025; Sal Stewart and Rhett Lowder in 2024; Blake Dunn, Julian Aguiar, Chase Petty, and Edwin Arroyo in 2023; Elly De La Cruz, Rece Hinds, Noelvi Marte, Andrew Abbott, Connor Phillips, and others in 2022.

Recordkeeping & Highlights

--Carlos Sanchez tied the Dragons club record by stealing bases in six consecutive games, April 17-22 (record shared by Billy Hamilton and Michael Siani; records available since 2005).

--The Dragons hit home runs in 15 consecutive games, May 3-20. The streak was the Dragons longest since MLB assumed record-keeping duties for Minor League Baseball in 2005. The streak was also the longest in the Minor Leagues to date in 2026, and the longest in the MWL since 2022.

--The Dragons broke their club record for most runs in a game on May 20, topping Fort Wayne 22-8. The record of 21 had held up for 25 years after being set in 2001. The Dragons also tied their club record for most home runs in a game on May 20, matching the mark set in 2001 and 2007. In the game on May 20, the Dragons scored five runs in the first inning, keyed by a grand slam home run by Carter Graham, and jumped out to a 13-0 lead over the first two innings. Carlos Sanchez scored five runs, tying the record set by Austin Kearns (2000) and Wily Mo Pena (2001)...The Dragons had 11 extra base hits, most in a game since MLB assumed record-keeping duties in 2005 (no record of this stat prior to that year). Graham became the first Dayton player with four extra base hits in a game since Kevyn Feiner in 2009. Graham had 6 RBI (all in the first two innings)...Graham had his second 4-hit game of the year and the first Dragons grand slam since Anthony Stephan in April of 2025...Sanchez and Alfredo Duno each had two home runs...Sanchez reached base in all six plate appearances, going 4 for 4 with two walks.

--Carter Graham collected eight RBI in one game vs. Great Lakes on May 28, tying the club record set in 2019 by Brian Rey. Graham broke the club record for most RBI in a home game, topping Juan Francisco's seven RBI in 2007. On June 18 at Peoria, Jacob Friend also tied the record with eight RBI in the final game of the half.

--In one of the most amazing endings to a game in Dragons history, Kien Vu completed a "true" steal of home to break a 4-4 tie with two outs and two strikes in the bottom of the ninth inning to give the Dragons a walk-off win over Fort Wayne on June 11.

--On June 14 vs. Fort Wayne, the Dragons tied a club record for most home runs in a game with six (second time in 2026—fourth time in team history). The Dragons finished the 6-game series with Fort Wayne with 18 home runs, 61 runs, and 32 extra base hits, all team records for a series (MWL went to 6-game sets in 2021).

--Alfredo Duno hit two grand slams in a three-game period June 12-14.

--On June 16 at Peoria, Carter Graham connected on his third grand slam home run of the season to establish a team record for most grand slams in a season and career with the Dragons. Since records on the topic became available in 2005, only five other Dragons players have hit two grand slams in one season (Jeremiah Piepkorn in 2005; Denis Phipps in 2007; Beau Amaral in 2013; Jack Rogers in 2023; Alfredo Duno in 2026). Tyler Stephenson hit two career grand slams with the Dragons over two different years (one in 2016, one in 2017).

--On June 18 at Peoria, the Dragons swept a doubleheader to clinch their third First Half East Division title in team history, and their first since 2007. In the second game, the Dragons beat the Chiefs 18-1 as Jacob Friend tied a club record with eight RBI while hitting two home runs including a grand slam. The Dragons hit six home runs in a game to tie their club record (for the third time in 2026).

--On June 18, the final game of the first half, the Dragons broke a club record (stats available since 2005) for most multi-home run games by a player over a single season when Jacob Friend had the Dragons 10th 2-homer game. The number of occurrences has since increased to 11. Dragons with two home runs in a game in 2026 include Carter Graham (3 times), Carlos Sanchez (2 times), Peyton Stovall, Alfredo Duno, Alfredo Alcantara, Yerlin Confidan, Jacob Friend, and Mason Neville.

--Carter Graham hit 11 home runs for the Dragons in June, the second highest HR total for a Dayton player in franchise history (Austin Kearns had 14 in July, 2000). Graham was selected as the Midwest League Player of the Month and Cincinnati Reds Minor League Player of the Month for June. He became the first Dayton hitter to be named MWL Player of the Month since Blake Dunn in April, 2023, and only the fourth since the award's inception in 2005.
