LAST TIME OUT: Once again, the Saints got dominant starting pitching from Randy Dobnak in a 5-2 victory over Omaha. Dobnak fired 7.0+ innings, allowing his lone run against to score in the eighth. The offense gave him plenty of support, taking a 3-0 lead after two innings. Alex Isola and Patrick Winkel hit RBI singles in the first to start the scoring. Winkel inished the day 3-for-4. Jose Miranda hit an RBI double in his second game of Major League rehab, also drawing a pair of walks. The Saints went 4-for-10 with runners in scoring position in the win

STARTING STRENGTH: Starting pitching has been a strength for the Saints all season long and has come through as of late. Over the last eight games, Saints starters are $5-0$ with a 1.91 ERA (42.1 IP, 9 ER). They have walked eight while striking out 42 in that span, sporting a 0.97 WHIP. They lead Triple-A in wins, ERA, K/BB ratio and rank second in innings in that stretch. The Saints four starts this season of 7.0 innings and zero walks are the second most in the International League (Memphis - 5)

RISPY BUSINESS: Coming out of the All-Star Break, the Saints have been able to capitalize with runners in scoring position. The Saints have hit a league-best . 382 (26-for-68) with RISP since the break. Their 26 hits with RISP are five more than any other IL team in that span. Of those 26 hits, 23 of them are singles.

LOOKING FOR LONG BALLS: The Saints have gone their last three games without a home run, tying a season-long streak for the third time (March 31-April 3, July 11-13). The team has gone four games without a home run three times in franchise history, most recently April 13-16, 2023.

TRIPLES IS BEST: Anthony Prato logged his fifth triple of the season on Wednesday, four of which have come in July. His four July triples tie the most for any Saints batter in any month in franchise history, matching the five hit by Jake Cave in June of 2022. Prato is the fourth International League batter to collect four triples in a month this season. His five triples on the season are now tied for the second-most in the IL. The Saints five triples in July are ties for the most in the league.
WILLIAMS RECORD WATCH: Chris Williams hit his $12^{\text {th }}$ home run of the season on Sunday and the $43^{\text {rd }}$ of his Saints career. He has tied Mark Contreras for the career franchise lead at 43 long balls. His 43 home runs since his Triple-A debut on July 17, 2022 are tied for the $11^{\text {th }}$-most in he International League.

5 In the month of July, Williams has clubbed seven home runs, the
most in the International League. He also leads the league in July
with his .732 slugging percentage, ranking second with 10 extra-base hits and third with his 41 total bases. His 1.129 OPS is the fourthbest in the IL this month. It is also the best of any month he's had in 2024 and over double his . 544 OPS in June.

ELECTRIC EELES: Since joining the Saints on July 4, he has constantly found ways to get on base, sporting a . 419 on-base percentage in TripleA. He's reached base in 14 of the 16 games he's played in, drawing 10 walks and been hit by a pitch four times. He is second among full-season minor leaque players in on-base percentage at .449 across three levels.

SUMMERTIME SEVERINO: In Yunior Severino's 48 games since May
21 , he has hit .341 (62-for-178), with 10 home runs, drawing 35 walks to 9 strikeouts, owning a 1.021 OPS. Since June 1, Severino is tied for the eague lead with 51 hits, second in batting average at .357, on-base percentage at .466 , and third in OPS, at 1.032 . His 30 walks since the start of June are the fifth-most in the league.

TWINS UPDATE: The Minnesota Twins were off yesterday and open a hree-game series tonight in Detroit. Pablo López (8-7, 4.86) will square off against Keider Montero (1-3, 5.97).

LAST APPEARANCE: 7/20 @ TOL...made ninth start of the season, allowing two runs on six hits over 5.1 innings...tied season high with six strikeouts (June 30 @ lowa)...retired the side in order in the first inning...allowed a double to Bligh Madris that scored the first run allowed...two batters later allowed a single to Justice Bigbie that plated second run...did not allow another runner to reach scoring position until the fifth inning, stranding runners at second and third...five of six hits allowed were singles...received fourth win in 11-3 Saints victory

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 7/12 @ LOU...made first relief appearance of the season, entering the game in the fourth, throwing the final 5.0 innings of the game...allowed one run on a solo home run, giving up two hits, walking none and striking out two...retired 15 of the 17 batters that he faced, allowing a solo home run to Jacob Hurtubise with one out in the fourth... only other batter to reach was PJ Higgins on a two-out single in the fifth... went on to retire the final 10 batters faced...recorded eight outs in the air and three on the ground....primarily used his cutter, throwing it $27 \%$ of the time, getting four of his five whiffs on it. . .did not factor into the decision in a 5-1 Saints loss.

FROM THE TWINS TO THE TWINS: The last 2 seasons for Plutko have been spent in the KBO, where he has dominated for the LG Twins, going 26-8 between the 2022 and 2023 seasons. After signing for $\$ 500,000$ in 2022, he went 15-5 in his first season, re-signing for $\$ 1.4$ million in 2023 . He followed that campaign with a season that saw him go 11-3, but did not make it to the championship series due to a hip injury.

REMEMBER THE PAC 12: Plutko finished his career as one of the best pitchers in program history at UCLA, where he finished his three-year stint there with second-most wins (29), starts (52) and IP (351.1) in school history. His career ERA of 2.25 and 272 career strikeouts both rank 7th on UCLA's all-time lists. His sister, Sara, was a three-year soccer letterwinner at University of Oregon and his wife, Allison, was a four-year gymnast at UCLA and was on same team as gold medalist Carly Patterson.

LEAVE A MESSAGE AFTER THE TONE: When he was promoted to Triple-A Columbus (Cleveland organization) in September, 2021 he missed the phone call from Cleveland's Director of Player Personnel Carter Hawkins because he was at a friend's wedding. They had just got done saying, "I Do" and got done taking the bridal party photos. Got a call from Cleveland and he put it straight to voice mail. When the call came again his wife Allison prodded him to answer because it could be important, so he did.

NOT PERFECT, BUT STILL PRETTY GOOD: On June 2, 2018, Plutko was spinning a gem with Columbus, not allowing a baserunner until the ninth inning at Syracuse when he issued a one-out walk. He followed that with a fly out and a strikeout to finish off the no-hitter. It was just the ninth complete-game no-hitter in the IL since 2005. It continued a stellar stretch for Plutko, who took a no-hitter into the sixth just two starts prior with Cleveland against the Chicago Cubs
