LAST START: 9/6 vIOWA...made fifth AAA start, allowed one run on two hits, one walk and six strikeouts...recorded three strikeouts in the first inning, allowing a two-out double...allowed a single and walk in the second inning before getting a fielder's choice and a double play to end the second...retired the side in order in the third inning...retired the first two batters of the fourth inning before hitting Matt Mervis with a pitch and was lifted...Mervis eventually scored as part of a six-run inning against Ryan Jensen...did not factor into the decision in an 8-4 Saints loss.

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 8/30 @OMA...made fourth AAA start, pitching in the second game of a doubleheader...pitched 5.0 shutout innings, allowing four hits and two walks, while striking out four...allowed a pair of singles in the first inning...allowed a single and a walk in the second inning before going on to retire eight of the final 10 batters he faced...threw 28 sliders (37%), 26 fastballs (35%), 11 curveballs (15%) and 10 changeups (13%)...received first AAA win in 8-3 Saints victory in seven innings.

ON THE FAST TRACK: Morris will be pitching at his third different level of minor league baseball with the Saints in 2024, but it won't be the first time he's accelerated at a faster pace than his peers. He graduated high school at only 16 years old, starting his freshman season of college at just 17. He was born on the cutoff date of September 1 for starting school and his mother chose to start him in kindergarten a year ahead. Not only that, he also skipped second grade as he was being homeschooled in Alaska.

BUILDING UP TRAVEL POINTS: Although he was born in Manhattan, Morris claims Boulder, Colorado as his hometown. He moved from New York as a child to Oregon, then to Alaska and then to Colorado, where he attended Monarch High School in Boulder. He tells people Boulder is where he's from as that is where he lived the longest.
