Today's Game
The Fightin Phils are home and continue a six-game series against the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. It is the 11th-of-12 matchups between the teams this season and fifth-of-six at FirstEnergy Stadium. The teams split their series in Bowie from July 8-13 and Chesapeake leads the season-series 6-4.

Game 122 Recap
The Fightin Phils snapped a five-game losing streak, and eight-game skid at home at home, with a 6-4 win over Chesapeake on Friday night. The Baysox started the scoring with a run in the top of the second on a sac fly from Douglas Hodo III to score Ethan Anderson. Reading responded with two runs in the bottom of the second, as Felix Reyes scored on a passed ball and a sac fly from Cade Fergus put the Fightin Phils up 2-1. From there, it was a battle between the pitchers. Braydon Tucker allowed one run over 5.1 innings in his second Double-A start, and home debut. Luis De Leon surrendered two runs, but none earned, over 5.2 innings and eight strikeouts in his first Double-A start. Chesapeake managed to tie the game in the top of the seventh due to two passed balls on catcher Lou Albrecht. Reading took the lead for good in the bottom of the eighth inning thanks to back-to-back two-run doublers from Erick Brito and Robert Moore. The Baysox did not go down quietly, as Tavian Josenberger hit a two-run home run in the top of the ninth off Andrew Bechtold to make it 6-4. But, Bechtold was able to retire the side and hand Reading their first win since last Friday and first home win since Tuesday, August 12, against Akron.

The 50 Club
Aidan Miller stole his 50th base of the season on Tuesday night against Chesapeake. Miller is the first Fightin Phil since Jose Leiva in 1987 to steal 50 bases in a season. Entering play tonight, Miller ranks tied for seventh for most stolen bases in a single season in R-Phils history. Miller currently leads the Eastern League and Phillies organization in stolen bases. He also ranks second in Double-A in stolen bases. The last time an R-Phil led the Eastern League in stolen bases was Anderson Machado (49) in 2003. Since 1967, four Reading players have finished the year leading the league in stolen bases.

It's Miller Time
For the second time in three weeks, Phillies No. 2 prospect Aidan Miller was named Eastern League Player of the Week on Monday. It was also the third-straight week a Fightin Phil received league honors, as Griff McGarry was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week last Monday. Over six games at Altoona last week, Miller posted a .522 average (12-23), along with a 1.621 OPS. He added five runs, five doubles, two home runs, seven RBI and two stolen bases. Over 22 August games, the 2023 first round pick is slashing .348/.454/.629 (1.083 OPS), with 22 runs, 13 doubles, four home runs, 16 RBI and 13 stolen bases. Miller's Eastern League ranks are: 5th OBP (.369), 10th OPS (.786), 8th 2B (24), 2nd BB (64), T-9th XBH (38), 3rd runs (65) and 1st SB (50).

King Felix
Felix Reyes' red-hot August continued with another hit on Thursday night. Over 26 August games, Reyes is slashing .380/.407/.583 (.990 OPS), with 23 runs, 13 doubles, three homers and 23 RBI. He has multiple hits in 11-of-26 games he's played in this month, with six of those games having three-or-more hits. Reyes now qualifies to be ranked amongst the Eastern League leaders and holds the following ranks on the season: 1st AVG (.333), 6th OBP (.367), 1st SLG (.565), 1st OPS (.932), 7th hits (105), 3rd 2B (28), T-2nd XBH (44) and 4th total bases (178). Reyes is riding a 16-game on-base streak and snapped a 13-game hitting streak on Friday night, both of which are season highs.

Batting Title on the Horizon
Felix Reyes currently would qualify for the Eastern League batting title, as his .333 average leads second place in the Eastern League by 27 points. He also leads all of Double-A and is tied for third in all of Minor League Baseball in batting average for the season as well. To qualify, MiLB rules state a player needs 2.7 plate appearances per team games played, so if Reading is to play out its remaining games to 136 total, Reyes would need to finish the season with 368 plate appearances and he is currently at 341 with 14 games left in the season. Reyes' .333 average would be tied for the fifth highest single-season batting average in R-Phils history. The last R-Phil to win an Eastern League batting title was Tagg Bozied in 2010. A R-Phil has won a batting title four times, dating back to 1967.

Ricketts Rolling
With a base hit on Wednesday night, Caleb Ricketts extended his hitting streak to 16 games (since Aug. 3). It is the longest hitting streak by a Fightin Phil this season, surpassing Keaton Anthony's 12-game hit streak from May 22-June 4. Over his 15-game hit streak, Ricketts is slashing .343/.389/.537 (.926 OPS), with 10 runs, seven doubles, two home runs and 14 RBI. Ricketts' hit streak is Reading's longest since Damek Tomscha (5/29-7/25) and Austin Listi (6/26-7/14) had 16 game hit streaks in 2018. The last Fightin Phil with a 17+ game hit streak was Rhys Hoskins (19) in 2016, from Apr. 10 to May 2.

This Day in Baseballtown History
August 30, 2012: At Reading, in the final home game of the regular season, Darin Ruf homers for the 38th time, setting the franchise record for home runs in a single season. Ruf's dinger is a 3-run shot in a 6-run 2nd inning and comes off Kutztown University product Darin Gorski. It is also his 20th HR in August, tying him with Sammy Sosa for the professional record for homers in a month.

Coming from the Bay
Chesapeake enters tonight with a 53-69 overall record and 22-33 mark in the second half, which is last in the Southwest Division. The Baysox finished off a two-week homestand against Richmond last week, splitting the series with the Flying Squirrels. After this week, Chesapeake returns home and takes on Harrisburg in its final homestand of the season. The Baysox roster features nine of the Baltimore Orioles' top-30 prospects: Enrique Bradfield Jr. (4), Michael Forret (11), Juaron Watts-Brown (13), Nestor German (14), Braxton Bragg (15), Levi Wells (22), Patrick Reilly (23), Aron Estrada (25) and Austin Overn (30).

On the Mound for Chesapeake
Righty Juaron Watts-Brown makes his 16th Double-A start tonight and fourth appearance for Chesapeake. On the season, he's 3-3, with a 4.22 ERA (33 ER, 70.1 IP). Watts-Brown last pitched last Saturday vs Richmond, allowing two runs over 4.1 innings, with four strikeouts. He was traded to the Orioles from Toronto in exchange for Seranthony Dominguez (2018 & '21) on July 30. Watts-Brown pitched at Reading on June 11 with New Hampshire, allowing three runs over five innings. The 23-year old was drafted by Toronto in the third round of the 2023 draft out of Oklahoma State.

2025 Season:

- Non-roster invitee to Phillies spring training
- Participated in Spring Breakout Game on March 14 vs Pirates
- Began season with Reading (AA), as he was transitioning back to starter after spending all of 2024 as relief pitcher
- Named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 7 after throwing four-perfect innings with eight strikeouts on Apr. 6, which was first start since Augut of 2023
- Over first two starts, did not allow a hit over 8.0 IP, with 13 strikeouts; did not allow a hit over the first 27 outs he recorded to begin season
- Walked a season-high four batters in final start before going on IL Apr. 18 vs Binghamton
- On 7-day IL from Apr. 22-June 19 with right elbow inflammation
- Made three-rehab starts with Clearwater (A), going: 0-1, 6.75 ERA (5 ER, 6.2 IP), 2 BB, 13 SO (18.47 SO/9.0 IP)
- In first start back with Reading on June 19 vs HFD, allowed two-earned runs on one hit in a no-decision
- Did not surrender an earned run with Reading over first four starts (15.1 IP)
- Allowed first earned runs of season June 25 at Richmond (4.0 IP, 5 H, 3 ER, 2 BB, 2 SO); also allowed first home run of season in same outing

- Bounced back by allowing one run over four innings on Aug. 1 at Hartford, while striking out four in a no-decision
- Struck out a season-high 11 batters on Aug. 7 at New Hampshire; was first 10+ strikeout game since 7/21/23 at Altoona. It was his fifth career 10+ strikeout game.
- Named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week for Second Time after striking out Double-A high 12 on Aug. 13 vs Akron. Fell one shy of career-high and was sixth-career 10+ strikeout game; retired final 15 batters of game and was the first time he went 6.0+ innings in a game since 7/21/23 at Altoona
- Has 34 strikeouts over 18.0 IP across last three starts (17.00 SO/9.0 IP)
- From Aug. 1-19, McGarry had a 1.96 ERA (4 ER, 18.1 IP), with 33 strikeouts.
- In August, McGarry is tied for the Eastern League in strikeouts (38) and is 7th in BAA (.203)
- Opposing hitters are hitting .183 against (37-202)

- Was a non-roster invitee to Major League spring training for the second-straight season
- Spent season with Lehigh Valley (AAA) and made one rehab appearance for Jersey Shore (A+)
- Pitched exclusively in relief for the first time in his career
