FIRST HALF CHAMPS!: With the win over Hill City on June 7, the FredNats secured the Carolina League North's first-half title, the only first-half championship in Fredericksburg history. The title is the first for the franchise since the Potomac Nationals' 2018 win.

EARLY OFFENSE: The FredNats snapped a season long-tying four game losing streak on Wednesday by scoring first for the first time all homestand. On Thursday, early offense struggled, as the FredNats saw just two batters reach safely in the first six innings against Fayetteville starter Jagger Beck. The FredNats scored first again last night, and have now won their last three games when scoring first.

HELLO HARMON: A highlight of the early season rotation, RHP Landon Harmon went to the injured list after just four starts in April. Harmon, a third-round pick from the Mississippi prep ranks last year, carries a sub-1 WHIP and has not allowed a home run in Single-A this year. After two and a half months without appearing in a game, Harmon came back from rehab to Single-A, tossing two scoreless innings.

PITCHING REINFORCEMENTS: After a large crop of FredNat pitching talent has been elevated to High-A over the last few weeks (Grant Manning, Liam Sullivan and Carson Fischer), Tuesday brought reinforcements to the Fredericksburg staff. With the final week of the FCL season upcoming, the FredNats added FCL arms Adam Bogosian, Leodaryl Colon and Juan Reyes. Additionally, Landon Harmon and Noah Millikan have joined the staff this week.

DRAFT RECAP: Washington opened their draft by picking DMV native Chris Hacopian no. 11 overall from Texas A&M. Hacopian, previously a collegian at Maryland, signed an underslot deal earlier this week. The rest of the draft is highlighted by another college bat Chase Brunson from TCU in round two, as well as another top-flight college position player in Daniel Cuvel from University of Miami in round five. In all, Washington signed 18/20 picks from the 2026 draft, missing just two high school draftees from the 16th and 17th rounds.

HOME STRETCH: 38 games now remain in the regular season for the FredNats as they look to defend their second-half title from last year. The rest of the season will be played predominantly at home by the FredNats, who are guaranteed to host game two and three (if necessary) of both the division and league championship series.

ABOUT FAYETTEVILLE: Single-A affiliate of the Houston Astros, Fayetteville has battled for the Carolina-League lead in the second-half. Beginning the season with the top two prospects in the Astros organization, no. 2 prospect Xavier Neyens was called up to High-A Asheville last week. A member of the Carolina League since 2017, the Woodpeckers are owned by the same group as the FredNats, Diamond Baseball Holdings.

A RECORD BREAKING SEASON: Clinching a title on June 7 with a win against Hill City, the FredNats followed their title by winning their 46th game of the first half the following Wednesday, besting the 1982 Alexandria Dukes' 45-20 first half to break the franchise record.

ANOTHER RECORD FALLS: The FredNats broke another record during their last homestand, as the fastest team in franchise history to 50 wins. The previous record (as far back as game-by-game data exists to 2004), was set by 2013 Potomac, who needed 80 games. The record since relocation belonged to the 2024 team, who needed 85 games, with current FredNats Austin Amaral and Travis Sthele winning games 49 and 50.

ABOUT LAST YEAR: The FredNats finished last season at 65-64 overall, winning the North division's second-half title to advance to the playoffs for the second straight year. The FredNats' season ended in a 2-0 series loss to Hill City in the Division Series.

FREDNATS BASEBALL NETWORK IS BACK: Once again, all 132 FredNat games this season will be broadcast live on the FredNats Baseball Network, with Luke West Poley and Adam Gotkin beginning their first seasons calling the action in Fredericksburg. Home games are broadcast on MiLB.tv and the Bally Sports Live App to go along with the audio-only stream at frednats.com/broadcast or the MiLB App. For road games, the radio broadcast is available at the same link. In addition, all FredNats games preceded by a 20 minute pregame show and postgame coverage following each night of action.

A LASTING LEGACY: The Fredericksburg Nationals adopt the franchise history of their predecessors in the Carolina League dating back to 1978...the Alexandria Dukes (1978, 1980-83) and Alexandria Mariners (1979) played at Four Mile Run Park in Alexandria, Virginia...the Prince William Pirates (1984-1986), Prince William Yankees (1987-1988), Prince William Cannons (1989-1998), Potomac Cannons (1999-2004) and Potomac Nationals (2005-2019) played at G. Richard Pfitzner Stadium in Woodbridge, Virginia...the franchise has won six Carolina League championships, as the Dukes in 1982, as the Yankees in 1989, and as the Potomac Nationals in 2008, 2010 and 2014. The franchise won its first league title as the Fredericksburg Nationals in 2024, defeating the Kannapolis Cannon Ballers and winning the title at Virginia Credit Union Stadium. The franchise has appeared in the Carolina League playoffs in three out of the last four seasons, and are playoff bound again in 2026 after the team's first-half division title.

Chris O'Neill - MANAGER

1st Season | Previously: Hitting Coach/Recruiting Coordinator, Virginia Commonwealth University

O'Neill, 36, joins the Nationals organization after two seasons (2024-25) as a hitting coach/recruiting coordinator at Virginia Commonwealth University. Prior to that, he served as an assistant coach and assistant recruiting coordinator at George Washington from 2022-24.

O'Neill is credited with helping fuel major offensive surges at both VCU and George Washington, as both schools set offensive records and contended for Atlantic 10 championships under his watch. O'Neill spent the 2021 season as the director of operations at Duke University and prior to that, he served as an assistant coach at Bucknell University (2020), Marshall University (2018-19) and the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore (2017).

This season will be O'Neill's first time managing since he led the Grand Lake Mariners (Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League) in the summers of 2016 and 2017. A Pennsylvania native, he received his Bachelor's degree in Education from King's College in 2012. O'Neill and his wife Kate have two boys, Easton and Callum.



Luke Dziados - PITCHING COACH

1st Season | Previously: Pitching Trainer - Driveline Baseball (Tampa, Fla.)

Dziados (D-Zay-Dis), 27, comes to the Nationals organization after spending the last two years as a pitching trainer at Driveline Baseball in Tampa, Fla. He capped his college pitching career at Villanova University in 2023 after pitching at Binghamton University from 2018-20. Dziados earned his Bachelor's degree from Binghamton in 2021 and also earned a Graduate Certificate in Leadership from Villanova in 2023.



Jake Scheiner - HITTING COACH

Scheiner, 30, played seven seasons (2017-23) in the Phillies and Mariners organizations. He appeared in 658 Minor League games before signing in 2024 with Hiroshima Toyo Carp of Nippon Professional Baseball in Japan. A native of San Mateo, Calif., Scheiner was drafted in the fourth round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft by the Phillies out of the University of Houston.

Villanueva, 24, was a performance coach at LAVR Performance where he designed and led throwing programs to improve overall pitching performance for more than 50 athletes prior to joining Washington's coaching ranks. Anthony Ray - DEFENSIVE COACH

SP - Andrew Alvarez



FredNats Career:

Andrew Alvarez, drafted in the 12th round of the 2021 MLB draft by the Washington Nationals out of Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, spent his draft year, and the first part of his full professional season with the Fredericksburg Nationals. Post draft in 2021, Alvarez was excellent, pitching five scoreless outings in the FredNats debut season. In his second year with the team, Alvarez became a part of the rotation and showed elite strikeout stuff, fanning 72 in 55.2 innings before a midseason call up to High-A Wilmington.

Current Success:

Alvarez, now in his second season in the big leagues, has become a regular member of Washington's major league pitching staff. The southpaw has split time between a starting role, and a bulk bullpen arm. He has continued to strikeout batters at a solid rate, with a 9.3 K/9 and 2.20 SO/BB rate. Alvarez has the 5th highest WAR of any Nationals pitcher at 0.7.

- Austin Bergevine Amaral...returns for his fourth stint in Fredericksburg after beginning the year with Double-A Harrisburg. Previously pitched for the FredNats in various stints from 2023-2025.
- Assigned to Fredericksburg from High-A Wilmington on June 1, carrying a 5.91 ERA with 14 K/14 BB in 10.2 IP across eight relief appearances for the Blue Rocks.
- Selected in the 16th round, 465th overall by Washington in the 2023 MLB Draft from Stetson University, the alma mater of multi-time Cy Young winners Jacob DeGrom and Corey Kluber.
- Pitched in the Arizona Fall League in 2025 for Scottsdale, holding a 6.75 ERA in nine appearances.
- Pitched a dominant 2025 across three levels, including a 4.05 ERA in 11 appearances with Fredericksburg, a 1.96 ERA in 23 appearances often as a closer for Wilmington, and a 2.40 ERA in 10 appearances for Harrisburg.
- Began career as a starter for the FredNats post-draft in 2023, holding a 3.38 ERA in 8.0 IP. Moved to the bullpen in 2024, with a 4.03 ERA across three levels, mostly in Fredericksburg.
- Pitched three collegiate seasons at Stetson, beginning as a reliever before moving into the rotation. ERA 3.30 or lower each season, holding a career 3.15 ERA in 142.2 IP collegiately for the Hatters.
- Pitched during three summers for the North Shore Navigators (NECBL), Hyannis Harbor Hawks (Cape Cod League) and Trenton Thunder (MLB Draft League) while in college.
- Enters Fredericksburg posting the highest K/9 of his career for a full season so far in 2026.
- Attended University High School in Florida, becoming the second ever alum to be drafted after current Guardians Major Leaguer and Panama WBC Pitcher Logan Allen.

- Adam Bogosian... signed by Washington as a Minor League Free Agent on May 25, assigned to Fredericksburg on July 7.
- Appeared in 7 games in the Florida Complex League, pitching to a 7.20 ERA in 10 innings. Bogosian allowed 10 hits, walked just four, and struck out nine.
- Pitched for the Oakland Ballers of the Pioneer League last year, appearing in 31 games, with an ERA of 5.33. In 49 innings, he allowed 59 hits, but only walked 14 while striking out 53.
- The Brooklyn, N.Y. native started his professional career in the MLB Draft League in 2024 with the Trenton Thunder, recording a 1-0 mark in 20.0 innings pitched.
