FRIDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the SeaWolves, 8-6. It was the first time this year the Flying Squirrels have lost consecutive games. In the second, **Diego Velasquez** hit a two-run double and **Ty Hanchey** added an RBI single for a 3-0 Richmond lead. Erie scored four runs in the third, including a three-run homer by **Thayron Liranzo**, to take a 4-3 lead. The SeaWolves added a run in the fifth and three in the sixth to extend the lead to 8-3. **Scott Bandura** doubled home a run in the seventh to close the score to 8-3. In the ninth, Bandura brought in a run with a groundout and **Jonah Cox** hit into a sacrifice fly to pull Richmond within two, but they stranded the tying run in the batters box.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the fifth and sixth of a six-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. This series is the second between the two teams this year, both at UPMC Park. From April 3-5, the Flying Squirrels won two-of-three to open the 2026 season and are 4-3 against the SeaWolves this year.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 27-9 start is the best in team history through 26 games, passing a 22-14 start in 2010. Richmond has won five series and split one so far this year. Five-of-nine Richmond losses have been by one run.

RELENTLESS: In their 27 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 14 of them. In nine of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS have the second-best record of all 150 teams across Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball, behind only a 29-9 record for High-A Eugene (Giants). The Richmond offense leads all 120 full-season MiLB teams in batting average (.296) and doubles (88). Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average, runs (257), hits (369), doubles, RBIs (237), OBP (.377), OPS (.858) and sacrifice flies (17) and are tied for first in triples (13). In 18 road games this year, the Flying Squirrels are batting .309 (206-for-667) and have scored 142 runs (7.9 runs per game). In 18 home games at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .281 (163-for-580) and have scored 109 runs (6.1 runs per game).

THE SEAWOLVES are in fourth place in the Southwest Division. They won eight consecutive games through last Friday, including the first four of their series in Harrisburg before dropping their next four. Erie has won the Southwest Division championship and reached the Eastern League Championship Series each of the last four seasons and won EL titles in 2023 and 2024. Erie's roster features two players in Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects list, including SS John Peck (No. 15) and C Thayron Liranzo (No. 20). MLB.com's top-30 Tigers prospects list features four Erie players, including Liranzo (No. 6), Peck (No. 14), 3B/1B Izzac Pacheco (No. 20) and OF Brett Callahan (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Greg Farone** makes his eighth Double-A start and his second against the SeaWolves. In his last start, Farone was charged with his third straight loss, allowing a season-high six runs over four innings against Akron last Saturday. He was Richmond's Opening Day starter on April 4 at Erie in his Double-A debut and allowed one run over 4.2 innings. He had eight strikeouts, tying the franchise record for the most strikeouts on Opening Day. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene. He made 12 starts for San Jose, going 2-1 with a 3.73 ERA. At the time of his promotion in June, he ranked third in the California League in strikeouts (73). Farone closed the year with 11 starts at High-A, going 4-2 with a 4.25 ERA. Farone began his college career at Herkimer College in New York, where he led the team to the program's first NJCAA national title in 2022, going 7-0 with a 1.65 ERA and was named the NJCAA Division III Player of the Year and MVP of the World Series. He transferred to the University of Louisville for the 2023 season and pitched at the University of Alabama in 2024 before being selected by the Giants in the seventh round of that year's MLB Draft. **For more on Farone, see page two.**

In Game 2, left-hander **Joe Whitman** makes his eighth start of the season. He last pitched last Sunday and threw five scoreless innings against Akron for his second straight scoreless start. On Monday, he was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week. He started 26 games for the Flying Squirrels last season. In his first Double-A campaign, Whitman ranked tied for second in the Eastern League in games started, fifth in strikeouts (124) and eighth in innings pitched (117.1). He was named EL Pitcher of the Week for a perfect outing against Somerset on May 3 at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced while recording 10 strikeouts. He also recorded 11 strikeouts at Binghamton with five scoreless frames pitched on May 21. Whitman closed his season with seven scoreless innings on September 12, tying the longest outing of his career. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 8 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. **For more on Whitman, see page two.**

FOR ERIE: Left-hander Carlos Peña makes his eighth start of the season in Game 1. He made his two most recent starts for Triple-A Toledo, combining for one run allowed over five innings. Peña is in his fourth season pitching for Erie and is 19-13 with a 3.60 ERA in his 54 career Double-A outings.

In Game 2, right-hander Kenny Serwa makes his eighth start of the season and the fifth of his career against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start last Saturday at Harrisburg, he allowed three runs over 3.2 innings in a no-decision. In his career against the Flying Squirrels, Serwa is 2-1 with a 4.86 ERA (9 ER/16.2 IP). He faced Richmond on April 4 at Erie and allowed five runs while recording two outs in the first inning before being removed. Last year, he made back-to-back five-inning, scoreless starts in August at UPMC Park against Richmond. In his first affiliated season in 2025, Serwa began the year with High-A West Michigan and went 3-1 with a 2.75 ERA in 10 outings (five starts). He was promoted to Double-A on June 5 and made 17 starts for the SeaWolves, posting a 6-6 record with a 3.95 ERA. Serwa began his college career with one season at NCAA DII St. Joseph's (Ind.) College before spending three seasons at SIU Edwardsville. He then pitched one season at the University of Central Florida before spending his final college season at Dayton in 2022. Serwa pitched in independent baseball with the Billings Mustangs in 2022, did not pitch in 2023 and spent the 2024 season with the independent Chicago Dogs.

COX ROCKS: **Jonah Cox** reached base in the first 23 games he played this season to begin his Double-A career before an 0-for-3 outing on May 5. He opened the season on a 12-game hit streak and has at least one hit in 30-of-32 games he has played, adding a 10-game hit streak that was also snapped on May 5. He is currently riding an eight-game hit streak. On May 1 (G1) at Altoona, he became the fifth player in Flying Squirrels history to hit three triples in a single game. He went 3-for-3 on May 6 against Akron with a game-tying, two-run homer in the ninth. For the year, he leads MiLB in batting average (.420), is tied for first in triples (5) and ranks second in SLG (.696), second in OPS (1.164) and 10th in OBP (.468). His 19 steals are third in the Eastern League after swiping 58 bases each of the last two seasons.

WHIT WON'T QUIT: **Joe Whitman** was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on Monday for May 5-10 after throwing two scoreless starts against Akron at CarMax Park last week, totaling 11 innings and 15 strikeouts. In a win on Tuesday, Whitman threw six scoreless innings with seven strikeouts and held Akron hitless until two outs into the sixth for a 5-0 Richmond win. On Sunday, he pitched five scoreless innings and held the RubberDucks to three hits with a season-high eight strikeouts in a 6-0 win. For the week, he led the league in strikeouts, innings and wins (2) while ranking third in BAA (.108) and sixth in WHIP (0.64). It was the second EL Pitcher of the Week award for Whitman in his career.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 287 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Macherer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,342).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.420), first in OBP (.468), first in OPS (1.164), first in triples (5), tied for first in RBIs (31), second in SLG (.696), second in hits (47), third in total bases (78), third in stolen bases (19) and tied for sixth in extra-base hits (18). **Scott Bandura** is first in runs (33), tied for first in RBIs (31), third in hits (44), tied for fourth in walks (24), fifth in OBP (.430) and sixth in batting average (.324). **Darien Smith** is third in BAA (.180), tied for third in wins (4), fourth in ERA (2.84) and fourth in WHIP (1.11). **Joe Whitman** is third in strikeouts (43), tied for third in wins (4), fifth in WHIP (1.11) and ninth in BAA (.211). **Jack Choate** is first in wins (5). **Trystan Vrieling** is seventh in ERA (3.38). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for second in saves (5). **Mitch White** is tied for fifth in saves (3). **Matt Wilkinson** is first in ERA (1.52), first in WHIP (0.84), first in BAA (.165) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (42).

Chris Heston started and struck out six over eight score-less innings. Daryl Maday, Jake Dunning and Brett Bochy combined for six scoreless relief innings. Joel Weeks won the game with a walk-off, bases-loaded walk in the bottom of the 14th inning.

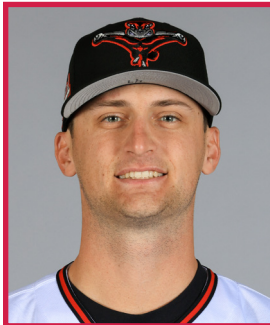
