ABOUT LAST NIGHT: In 10 innings the Brooklyn Cyclones survived the Jersey Shore BlueClaws 5-4 to win the second game of the series and their ninth straight against the BlueClaws. INF **Shervyen Newton** and OF **Stanley Consuegra** each homered, while OF **Matt Rudick's** sacrifice fly in the top of the 10th to give Brooklyn the lead for good. RHP **Daison Acosta** stranded the bases loaded in the bottom of the 10th. With the win, the Cyclones are still a half game behind Hudson Valley for the top spot in the North Division of the South Atlantic League tied with the Aberdeen IronBirds.

EDUARDO IS HERE: INF **Eduardo Escobar** makes a rehab start tonight for the Brooklyn Cyclones. Escobar is on the Mets 10-day injured list retroactive to August 16 with a left oblique strain, meaning he is available to come off the IL tomorrow.

DIVISION ON THE LINE: Including today, the Cyclones have 16 games remaining and three series: four at Jersey Shore, six vs. Wilmington, and six at Winston-Salem. Brooklyn is vying for a playoff spot with a second half division title in the North Division of the South Atlantic League, sitting in tied for second place 0.5 games behind Hudson Valley who plays Hickory this week at Dutchess Stadium.

OLD BAY SEASONING: The last time the Cyclones played Jersey Shore, OF **Alex Ramirez** hit two home runs in a three-game weekend series after the MLB All-Star Break, going a whopping 8-for-13 (.615). Ramirez currently leads all Mets minor leaguers with 119 hits.

2021 CYCLONES TAKEOVER QUEENS: With Monday's promotion of RHP **Connor Grey** to the Mets roster, the Cyclones saw three 2021 members of the roster earn the callup. 3B **Brett Baty** has played with the big club since last Wednesday and RHP **Jose Butto** made his MLB debut Sunday in Philadelphia.

vs. JERSEY SHORE: The Philadelphia Phillies High-A affiliate sits in last place in the North Division of the South Atlantic League at ShoreTown Ballpark in Lakewood, New Jersey. Against the BlueClaws, the Cyclones are 18-5. Jersey Shore hosts four of Philadelphia's Top 30 prospects, according to MLB Pipeline, including No. 8 OF Ethan Wilson, No. 14 INF Luis Garcia, No. 21 RHP Christian McGowan, and No. 27 INF Casey Martin.

PEROZA PRODUCING: Since July 9, INF **Jose Peroza** has a OPS of .908 over his past 36 games with a 23-game on-base streak. The 22-year-old Venezuelan has been on base in 34 of the past 36 games, hitting .328 with a .419 OBP. The current active streak leader is Hickory OF **Jayce Easley** who has a 25-game on-base streak.

MASTERS OF THEIR DOMAIN: The Cyclones have allowed the fewest runs in the league in the second half sixth-fewest in Minor League Baseball overall, having allowed 463 runs in 116 games (4.0 runs/game).

THAT'S OFFENSIVE!: The Cyclones have scored just 456 runs in 116 games (3.9 runs/game) which ranks second-to-last in the South Atlantic League and third-worst in MiLB in fewest runs.

BRETT THE BAT: Former Brooklyn Cyclones 3B **Brett Baty** made his MLB debut Wednesday with the Mets in Atlanta, hitting a two-run home run in his first at-bat en route to a 9-7 Mets victory. Baty played with Brooklyn in 2019 and in 2021 and becomes the 91st former Cyclones player to make the major leagues.

HELLO: Mets No. 28 prospect Christian Scott makes his second High-A start and first against Hudson Valley.

WILMINGTON DEBUT: Scott tossed four scoreless innings at Frawley Stadium last week, departing with a 1-0 lead. Scott was held to his pitch count, throwing 49 pitches -- 32 for strikes.

GATOR BLUE TO MET BLUE: Scott was drafted by New York in the fifth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of the University of Florida, signing for around the slot value of \$350,000. At Florida, pitched as a reliever for his three years on campus, sitting mid-90s while touching 98.

COPYING MAD MAX: Christian Scott emulated New York Mets starter Max Scherzer's slider grip. He uses his repertoire of fastball and slider while trying to incorporate a change-up.

CONTROL FREAK: The Floridian posted a 4% walk rate as a junior at Florida ahead of his draft selection. During his time with St. Lucie, Scott posted a 7% walk rate.

HIGH SCHOOL: Scott went undrafted out of Calvary Christian High School in Fort Lauderdale, FL -- a school that produced current No. 1 Philadelphia prospect Andrew Painter who is on the Jersey Shore roster.
