Storey, 35, enters his fifth year as the manager of the Astros Triple-A affiliate and second in Sugar Land. He was named Sugar Land's manager prior to the 2021 season and led the team to a 75-55 record and a Triple A West, East Division title in the franchise's first campaign as an Astros affiliate. The Skeeters tied for the sixth-best record in all of Triple A with Storey at the helm.

During the pandemic-shortened 2020 season, Storey was the manager for the Astros Alternate Training Site squad in Corpus Christi. He also led the Astros Alternate Training Site at the beginning of the 2021 season, prior to the Minor League Baseball Opening Day.

The former Major Leaguer helped lead Triple-A Round Rock to the top record in the Pacific Coast League in 2019 (84-56), winners of the American Southern Division. The team went on to advance to the Pacific Coast League Finals.

Storey first began coaching in the Astros system in 2016 as a development coach for Class A Advanced Buies Creek. He received his first managerial job in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities. He led Class A Quad Cities to an 81-59 record his lone season as the manager, which was the second-best record in the Midwest League and led the team to winning the Western Division.

Prior to his coaching career, Storey logged a nine-year professional career as a right-handed pitcher. He made his Major League debut in 2012 with the Astros and appeared in the Majors in 2013 as well as a member of the Toronto Blue Jays. He made a total of 29 appearances at the Major League level (all in relief), including 26 with the Astros. Storey had his best Major League season with the Astros in 2012, going 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA and striking out 34 batters through 30 1/3 innings pitched.

The Oakland A's selected Storey in the 31st round of the 2008 MLB Draft from Florida Atlantic University. His professional career spanned from 2008-16, appearing with the A's (2008-11), Astros (2011-12), Blue Jays (2013-14), Los Angeles Dodgers (2015) and independent Somerset Patriots of the Atlantic League (2015-16). Storey also appeared in the Mexican Pacific Winter League, the Venezue-lan Winter League, Dominican Winter League and the Arizona Fall League. He amassed a total of 385 appearances at the professional level, recording a career 3.52 ERA (682.1IP) with 44 saves.

Storey finished his career at Florida Atlantic second on the school's all-time strikeout list and tied for second in wins. He also finished top 10 in school history in strikeouts per nine innings, games started, fewest walks per nine innings and innings pitched. He was selected by the Minnesota Twins in the 22nd round of the 2007 MLB Draft out of Florida Atlantic as well.





Abreu is set to begin his ninth season with the Astros and his second as the pitching coach for the organization's Triple-A affiliate. In 2021, Sugar Land posted the lowest team ERA in Triple A West and the seventh-lowest ERA of all Triple A teams. He previously worked as a pitching coach for Class A Quad Cities (2019-20), Short-Season Tri-City (2018), Rookie League Greeneville (2017), the GCL Astros (2016) and the DSL Astros (2014-15). He's also worked as a coach in the Dominican Winter League, most recently as the pitching coach for the Leones del Escogido for their 2020-21 season. He was the bullpen coach for the Estrellas Orientales in the 2018 offseason, helping the team snap a 51-year Dominican Winter League Championship drought.

The right-hander from Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, owns 12 seasons of professional playing experience. He's spent time in the Minor League systems of the Astros and New York Yankees, reaching up to the Triple-A level. He appeared in the Astros minor league system from 2008-12. He's also appeared in the Mexican League, Mexican Pacific Winter League and Dominican Winter League. Abreu was 40-32 with a 3.83 ERA in 219 career minor league appearances (74 starts) from 2003-13. He is the Corpus Christi Hooks all-time leader in wins (23), strikeouts (304) and appearances (128).

Sutil enters his first season as a coach for the Astros' Triple A affiliate. He's coached or managed within the Astros system since 2014, most-recently with the organization's Florida Complex League team in 2021. He managed Short-Season Tri-City in 2020 and the Gulf Coast League Astros from 2017-19.

The Caracas, Venezuela native joined the Astros organization as a coach in 2014 with their Appalachian League affiliate, the Greeneville Astros. He was a member of the Greeneville coaching staff up until being hired to manage the GCL Astros in 2017.

Sutil had a 10-year professional career as an infielder, spending eight seasons in the Astros system and one within the Arizona Diamondbacks system. He reached up to the Triple A level with both the Astros and Diamondbacks. Sutil also had stints in the Venezuelan Winter League and the independent Atlantic League. While in the Astros minor league system, Sutil was named to five All-Star teams, being named a Texas League Midseason All-Star on three occasions, as well as a Texas League Postseason All-Star and New York Penn-League All-Stae. Sutil was also selected to the Atlantic League All-Star game while with the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs. Sutil was a base-stealing threat throughhit career, surpassing 20 stolen bases in five of his seasons within the Astros minor league system. He hit .269 with 261 RBI, 194 stolen bases and a .337 on-base percentage throughout his MiLB career.







2022 SPACE COWBOYS REBRAND

On January 29, 2022, the Astros' Triple A affiliate rebranded to the Sugar Land Space Cowboys from the previously-named Skeeters with a Launch Party at Constellation Field. The event, which attracted over 5,000 fans, included a hype video to introduce the new name, logos and uniforms, appearances and autograph session with Astros prospect, including No. 1 prospect, Korey Lee, and a fireworks show to close out the night. The Space Cowboys brand pays respect to elements that define the Greater Houston Area and the Houston Astros. The space element of the brand ties the Sugar Land franchise closer to its parent club, the Astros. Houston also serves as a hub for space exploration as home to the NASA Johnson Space Center. The cowboys element of the brand is a nod to Houston's rugged Western and cowboy roots as the largest city in Texas. As part of the Launch Party, the Space Cowboys introduced Orion, a "Cosmic Canine" as the organization's new mascot. "We are excited to be launching the new identity for our Triple A affiliate, the Sugar Land Space Cowboys," Anita Sehgal, Astros Senior Vice President, Marketing and Communications said on Jan. 29. "Today represents a new chapter of professional baseball in Sugar Land and the next step to take as the team moved from its independent ball roots to affiliated Triple A baseball. Our goal was to clearly reflect a strong connection to the Astros family, but also stand out as a unique identity aligned with the vibrant, progressive, and family focused values of the City of Sugar Land community."

KEY ELEMENTS

Colors/Horizon Gradient: Inspired by a shot of the horizon of the earth from space, the color palette and gradient feature light blue, navy, orange, gray and black notes that are prominent in the franchise's logo and uniforms. The colors represent the ever-expanding Sugar Land community and an exciting new chapter on the horizon for the Triple-A Affiliate of the Houston Astros at Constellation Field.

Primary Logo: The primary logo features the Space Cowboy donning a traditional cowboy hat, a bandana and a blast shield over his face that is peppered with space dust and has a starburst at the eye. The words Sugar Land Space Cowboys are displayed in a medallion on the outside of the logo.

Mission Patch: This patch will be featured on all thee uniforms and serves as an alternate logo. It intertwines elements from the Texas state flag, with a rocket superimposed over the front ready to launch.

2021 CLUB NOTES

GOT THE CALL: The Skeeters completed their first season as the Triple A affiliate of the Houston Astros, as well as their first season in affiliated minor league baseball. The Skeeters were one of three teams to make the transition from independent professional baseball to the affiliated minor leagues, along with St. Paul (MIN, AAA) and Somerset (NYY, AA). The Skeeters spent their first nine years in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball, winning league titles in 2016 and '18.

DIVISION WINNERS: The Skeeters won the Triple A West East Division title, finishing the season 7.5 games in front of Oklahoma City and Round Rock for first place in the division. The Skeeters finished second in all of Triple A West at 75-55 (.577), behind only Tacoma at 78-52 (.600). The Skeeters were one of six teams in all of Triple A to reach the 75-win mark.

HEY NOW: Five Skeeters were named to the Triple A West All-Star team, including RHP Peter Solomon, who was also named the Triple A West Pitcher of the Year. Along with Solomon, RHP Ronel Blanco, IF CJ Hinojosa, OF Jake Meyers and OF Jose Siri. The Skeeters' five All-Stars were the most of any Triple A team.

MiLB HONORS: The Skeeters had three players take home the Triple A West Player/Pitcher of the Month Award this season. RHP Brett Conine was named the May Pitcher of the Month, RHP JP France the July Pitcher of the Month and OF Jose Siri the August Player of the Month. Additionally, France (Aug. 23-29), LHP Jonathan Bermudez (Sept. 13-19) and IF Jeremy Peña (Sept. 20-26) all won Triple A West Player/Pitcher of the Week honors.

Meyers hit .343 with 16 home runs, 51 RBI and 10 stolen bases in 68 games with the Skeeters before being promoted to the Houston Astros on July 31, which was his first Major League call-up. He finished tied for the team lead in home runs and was third in RBI and stolen bases. His batting average and OPS were tops of Skeeters players with at least 200 at-bats. Solomon went 8-1 with a 4.70 ERA (51 ER/97.2 IP) in 21 games (18 starts) with the Skeeters this year. He was tied for third in Triple A West with the eight wins and was third with 112 strikeouts. Solomon held opponents to a .235 average while logging a 1.34 WHIP.

BY THE POWER OF PEÑA: Jeremy Peña had a historical night in the Skeeters' 8-7 win over Albuquerque on Sept. 21. Peña had three home runs, including a walk-off two-run homer:

 Peña joined Jake Meyers as the only other player in Skeeters history to hit three home runs in a game (including their nine seasons as an independent franchise). Meyers accomplished the feat on June 20 in El Paso

• Peña hit an inside-the-park home run as part of his three-homer night. It was the Skeeters' first inside-the-park home run as a

Triple A franchise

• Peña's walk-off home run was the Skeeters' first walk-off home run as a Triple A franchise and was their seventh walk-off win of the season.

HINO'HERO': CJ Hinojosa finished fifth in Triple A West in batting average (.316), fourth in hits (131), first in doubles (35), 10th in extra-base hits (46) and tied for seventh in total bases (199). His 36 doubles also were tied for the sixth-most in all of Minor League Baseball. Hinojosa went on a 20-game hitting streak from Aug. 16-Sept. 26, hitting .407 (35x86) with a home run and 16 RBI throughout the stretch. It was the longest hitting streak from a Skeeters player this season and was the second-longest in Triple A West.

ORGANIZATIONAL AWARDS: The Astros named LHP Jonathan Bermudez their 2021 Minor League Pitcher of the Year. Bermudez was promoted to the Skeeters on Aug. 18 and went 2-1 with a 3.06 ERA (11 ER/32.1 IP) in 7 G (5 GS). Including his time with Double A Corpus Christi, Bermudez went 3-5 with a 3.32 ERA (29 ER/78.2 IP) in 18 G (15 GS) in 2021. The 25-year-old was second of Astros minor leaguers in total strikeouts (146) and innings pitched (111.0). His combined 3.32 ERA and 4.29 strikeout-to-walk-ratio were tops of any Astros minor leaguer to log at least 70 innings pitched. His ratio of 11.8 strikeouts-per-nine-innings was second-best of Astros minor leaguers with at least 70 innings pitched.

BLANCO FUEGO: Ronel Blanco was second in Triple A West and all of Minor League Baseball with a career-high 22 saves in 2021. Blanco's 1.00 WHIP was tied for the second-lowest of Triple A West relievers (min. 45 IP). Blanco also completed an Immaculate Inning on Sept. 20 vs. Albuquerque. He was the first player in Skeeters Triple A history to achieve an Immaculate Inning (striking out all three batters in an inning, using the minimum number of nine pitches).

SUPER 'SIRI'OUS: Jose Siri set a Skeeters franchise record with seven RBIs in a 10-4 win on May 13 at Round Rock. Five players had logged six-RBI games in the Skeeters nine seasons as an independent franchise in the Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. Siri's seven RBI were tied for the third-most in a Triple A game in 2021.

LET THEM EAT K'S: RHP JP France led Astros minor leaguers and was tied for eighth in Minor League Baseball with 157 strikeouts this season. He struck out 11 batters on May 5 vs. San Antonio while still with Double A Corpus Christi, which also matched their team high for the year. PB&JJ: JJ Matijevic set his career high with a combined 25 home runs, including 16 after joining the Skeeters from Double A Corpus Christi. His 25 home runs were second-most of Astros minor leaguers, trailing only Emmanuel Valdez (26). His 16 homers with the Skeeters tied Jake Meyers and Jose Siri for the team high.

HE GETS ON BASE: Michael Papierski led Triple A West with 64 walks and was 10th in the league with a .379 on-base percentage. Papierski was second of Astros minor leaguers (min. 300 ABs) with his .379 on-base percentage, trailing only Marty Costes (.419)

K-MART: RHP Seth Martinez, who the Astros acquired in the minor league phase of the 2020 Rule 5 Draft, was second of Triple A West relievers (min. 50 IP) with a 2.81 ERA this season. He was also tied for second of the league's relievers with 78 strikeouts and was fourth with 57.2 innings pitched.

OH SO SWEET: The Skeeters' 4.13 team ERA was the lowest of Triple A teams. Their bullpen posted a 3.58 ERA, which was also the lowest of all Triple A West teams and the fifth-lowest of all Triple A teams.

CLOSE TO HOME: Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out of Triple A teams. The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey completed his first season as the manager of the Skeeters, and third for the Triple A affiliate of the Houston Astros. He won his third straight divisional title as a minor league manager. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University. He finished his career second all-time in strikeouts, tied for second in wins and finished top 10 in strikeouts per nine innings, games started, fewest walks per nine innings and innings pitched. A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the postseason in five of nine seasons. The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their '13 season. The Skeeters have been managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, the Skeeters went 601-502. 

GARY GAETTI NO. 8

Gary Gaetti, a 20-year Major League veteran and the first manager of the Sugar Land Skeeters, had his No. 8 retired on August 21, 2021. Gaetti managed the Skeeters from 2012-17, their first six seasons as an independent franchise. He led the Skeeters to their first Atlantic League Championship in 2016 and was twice-named the Atlantic League Manager of the Year. Under Gaetti's direction, over 50 players had their contracts purchased from the Skeeters led by Major League organizations. That included former Astros outfielder Jason Lane, who made a return to the Majors as a pitcher, as well as Houston native Scott Kazmir, who went on to make an MLB All-Star appearance after playing for the Skeeters. As a player, Gaetti was named to two All-Star teams, won four Gold Gloves, a Silver Slugger award and was named the MVP of the 1987 American League Championship series with the Minnesota Twins.

DEACON JONES NO. 4

Deacon Jones had his No. 4 - worn during his playing career - retired on August 3, 2019. It was the first number retired in Skeeters history. All Skeeters players wore the No. 4 during the game in a special-edition jersey that featured some of Jones' favorite and iconic sayings. Jones, who had a three-year MLB career and coached in the Major Leagues for over two decades, was an integral part of bringing professional baseball to Sugar Land. Jones brought credibility to the process of creating the Skeeters with his vast baseball knowledge, along with his reputation as a community leader. Since 2012, Jones has served as an ambassador for the organization, greeting fans at Constellation Field throughout the season to go with grassroot efforts marketing the team throughout Houston. Jones played for the Chicago White Sox from 1962-63, '66, and was a hitting coach for the Houston Astros and San Diego Padres.





All Space Cowboys games can be seen with a subcription to MiLB.TV, which can be purchased by visiting the Space Cowboys' official website or MiLB.com. The Space Cowboys agreed to radio partnership deal with Gow Media through the 2022 season, making ESPN 92.5 FM the organization's flagship station. All 150 Space Cowboys games can be heard live on ESPN 92.5 FM throughout the season.

BROADCASTER INFORMATION

Longtime Houston area broadcatser Gerald Sanchez is back for his second season as the voice of the Space Cowboys. Sanchez joined the organization as its broadcaster in 2021, which was the first season of Triple A baseball in Sugar Land. Sanchez was on the call as the Skeeters clinched the East Division of Triple A West, while racking up the second-best record in all of Triple A West. Sanchez, a native of Victoria, Texas, has previous broadcast experience with University of Houston baseball and softball, as well as Rice University baseball and softball. Sanchez also has a lengthy career broadcasting prep sports all throughout the Houston area, and continue to do so with his work for Legacy Sports Network. Sanchez is a graduate of the University of Houston.



The 2022 season is set to mark Constellation's 11th season hosting baseball in Sugar Land and the second season hosting the Triple A affiliate of the Houston Astros. Constellation Field has hosted Atlantic League All-Star Games, collegiate baseball games from prestigous programs such as the University of Texas, Rice and University of Houston and numerous special events. The venue has in the past hosted JJ Watt's charity softball game and routinely hosts cultural festivals, weddings, exteme sporting events and graduations.

Since 2014, Constellation Field has also hosted Sugar Land Holiday Lights, a nearly three-month event that features over 3.5 million lights displayed around the ballpark. Sugar Land Holiday Lights has become the signature non-baseball event at Constellation Field.



Constellation Field was the home of the Sugar Land Skeeters form 2012-19 as a member of the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. In 2020, it hosted the four-team independent Constellation Energy League after the COVID-19 pandemic caused the cancellation of the Atlantic League season.

In December 2021, it was announced thaty the Astros and Constellation reached a long-term agreement to keep Constellation as the naming rights partner for Constellation Field.

LOCATION: Constellation Field is located on 1 Stadium Dr. near the intersection of US Route 90 and HWY 6. It's located just over a mile away from the original Imperial Sugar factory and less than five miles from Sugar Land City Hall and Town Square. It's located approximately 20 miles from Minute Maid Park, making the Space Cowboys one of the closest minor league affiliates in terms of mileage to their parent club.

INDEPENDENT HISTORY: Constellation Field hosted over 2.5 million fans through nine seasons hosting the independent Sugar Land Skeeters. The ballpark set Atlantic League records for full-season attendance (465,511) and average attendance (6,650) in its innaguaral season in 2012. It also set the league record for single-game attendance on July 4, 2016 (8,606). Constellation Field was named Atlantic League Ballpark of the Year in 2012 and '18 and reached the Final Four of the Ballpark Digest's "Best of Ballparks" in 2018. The ballpark hosted its one and only Atlantic League All-Star game in 2014 as the Skeeters took on a collection of All-Stars from other Atlantic League teams, with NBA legend Tracy McGrady appearing in the game for the Skeeters.



RENNOVATIONS: The City of Sugar Land and Houston Astros agreed on a lease for Constellation Field prior to the 2021 season. As part of the lease, over \$10 million were invested in rennovations to improve the facilities player development areas. The rennovations included completely reconstructed home and visitor clubhouses, batting cages, weight room, home and visitor dugouts, wall padding and playing surface. It also included the additions of



a kitchen and dining area for the home clubhouses, a video/meeting room, a staff locker room and a female locker room and the Bullpen Patio, located in right-center field. Ahead of the 2022 season, a new phase of rennovations are underway that include the reconstruction of Constellation Fields club/suite level, a new dining and entertainment area in left-center field, a reconstructed playground area, a reconstructed team store and the addition of loge boxes throughout the field-level seating.

CLUB LEVEL: Constellation Field features a world-class club level on the second level of the stadium, including a banquet seating area with a gourmet buffett for all games and access to a full-service bar. The Constellation Field club level also features an exclusive balcony seating section. The club level went under a full rennovation heading into the 2022 season to match the Space Cowboys brand. AllI skybox suites at Constellation Field on the club level were rennovated as well.

GRASSLAND: The berm in right field provides a unique lawn-style seating area just above the home and visitor bullpens.

BULLPEN PATIO: New to Constellation Field in 2021, the bullpen patio features 4-Topps tables on field level directly beside the home and visitor bullpens. It provides an up-close look at pitchers getting ready to enter the game. The bullpen patio is convienently located next to the Bud Light Icehouse and ticket packages for the patio include food and beverage add-ons.

VIDEOBOARD: Constellation Field had its new LED high-definition videobard — located in center field — installed prior to the 2020 season. The videoboard measures approximately 25 feet high by 57.5 feet wide. It provided a 17-percent increase in resolution over the previous videoboard.

2012

The Sugar Land Skeeters play their first season as an independent franchise in the Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They played their first-ever game on April 26, 2012, with a 3-2 loss to the York Revolution. The franchise set Atlantic League records for total season attendance and average attendance for a season. Seven-time Cy Young Award winner and former Houston Astros great Roger Clemens made his final professional appearance with the Skeeters on Sept. 7, with his oldest son, Koby, serving as the team's catcher. Roger Clemens received the win, throwing 4 2/3 scoreless innings in a 4-0 victory over the Long Island Ducks. Constellation Field was named the Atlantic League Ballpark of the Year and former Astros outfielder Jason Lane was named the Skeeters Most Valuable Player. Lane spent the majority of the season converting to a





pitcher, going 8-4 with a 2.98 ERA through 17 starts. He also hit .275 with nine home runs and 31 RBIs through 229 at-bats. Houston native and former first-round pick Scott Kazmir made 14 starts with the Skeeters before having his contract purchased by the Cleveland Indians. Kazmir went on to appear in five more seasons as a Major Leaguer following his stint with the Skeeters, including an All-Star selection in 2014 while with the Oakland A's.

2013

The Skeeters set Atlantic League records, winning 95 games and accumulating a .679 winning percentage (95-45). The Skeeters were swept in the first round of the Atlantic League postseason by the Somerset Patriots. Koby Clemens became the first player in franchise history with a 20-homer seaoson, hitting 21 homers on his way to being selected second team All-Atlantic League. Gary Gaetti was named the Atlantic League Manager of the Year.

2014

The Skeeters made headlines as former Houston Rockets icon and Naismath Memorial Basketball Hall-of-Famer Tracy McGrady made the team's opening day roster as a

right-handed pitcher. McGrady made four starts, recording a 6.75 ERA through 6 2/3 innings pitched. McGrady also started the Atlantic League All-Star Game, which was played at Constellation Field for the first and only time in Atlantic League history. Rather than a traditional All-Star Game, a selection of Atlantic League All-Stars took on the Skeeters. McGrady picked up a strikeout through 1 1/3 innings pitched and the Skeeters won the game, 5-3. The Skeeters advanced to the Atlantic League Championship Series for the first time in franchise history. They defeated



the York Revolution in five games in the best-of-five opening round before being swept by the Lancaster Barnstormers in the Championship Series.

2015

Another marquee Major League Baseball name appeared with the Skeeters. Fourtime All-Star and three-time Gold Glover Rafael Palmeiro went 2-for-4 with an RBI in a 10-4 Skeeters victory over the Camden Riversharks on Sept. 18 at Constellation Field. Palmeiro's son, Patrick, played third base in the game while Rafael served as the designated hitter. Patrick went 2-for-5 with a home run and four RBIs playing alongisde his father. Patrick appeared with the Skee-



ters in both the 2015 and '16 seasons. The Skeeters were awared Atlantic League Grounds Crew of the Year. Chris Wallace and Delwyn Young were named Atlantic League Postseason All-Stars. The Skeeters had their two-season playoffs streak snapped.

2016

The Skeeters won their first Atlantic League Championship, sweeping the Long Island Ducks in the best-of-five Atlantic League Championship Series. The Skeeters made a late push to enter the postseason, winning the Freedom Division Second Half Title. The Skee-

ters swept the York Revolution in the opening round of the playoffs before defeating Long Island. Juan Martinez was named the Atlantic League Championship Series Most Valuable Player, going 3-for-10 (.300) with a home run and four RBIs in the series. Jeremy Barfield, son of former Major League All-Star Jesse Barfield, became the first player in Skeeters history to win the Atlantic League MVP Award. Barfield led the league and set the Skeeters' single-season record with 27 home runs, while also collecting 85 RBIs. Barfield also set the Skeeters' independent record for slugging



percentage (.533), while also posting the third-highest batting average in the team's single-season history (.306). Barfield and right-hander Andrew Johnston were named Atlantic League Postseason All-Stars and the Skeeters were once again awarded Atlantic League Grounds Crew of the Year. The Skeeters' mascot, Swatson, was named Atlantic League Mascot of the Year as well.

2017

In their final season under manager Gary Gaetti, the Skeeters were unable to reach the postseason and defend their Atlantic League Championship. Josh Prince was named an Atlantic League Postseason All-Star and set the Skeeters' independent single-season record with 55 stolen bases. Skeeters President Jay Miller was named Atlantic League Executive of the Year and the Skeeters were awarded the league's Club Community Service Award for the organization's charitable efforts in response to Hurricane Harvey.

2018

The Skeeters hired College Baseball Hall-of-Famer and former Major Leaguer Pete Incaviglia as the second manager in the organization's history. In his first season, Incaviglia led the Skeeters to their second Atlantic League Championship while also overseeing a franchise-record 12 players having their contracts purchased by Major League organizations. The Skeeters won both First Half and Second Half Freedom Division Title. They defeated the Lancaster Barnstormers in five games in the best-of-five opening series

before once again defeating the Long Island Ducks in five games in the best-of-five Atlantic League Championship Series. Left-hander James Russell, who tossed a complete game in Game 5, was named the Atlantic League Championship Series Most Valuable Player. Incaviglia was named Atlantic League Manager of the Year, Constellation Field was named the Atlantic League Ballpark of the Year and the Skeeters were once again awarded the Atlantic League Grounds Crew of the Year. Matt Chavez set the Skeeters single season record with a .320 batting average and was named an Atlantic League Postseason All-Star. Former Astros



right-hander Felipe Paulino collected 33 saves, setting the organization's single-season record, and was named an Atlantic League Postseason All-Star. Outfielder Anthony Giansanti rounded out the Skeeters' Atlantic League Postseason All-Stars.

2019

In their final season competing in the Atlantic League, the Skeeters reached the Atlantic League Championship Series in back-to-back seasons but were defeated by the Long

Island Ducks in their quest to repeat as league champions. Under manager Pete Incaviglia, the Skeeters re-set their organizational record with 13 contracts purched by Major League Baseball organizations. For the first time in the organization's history, a player appeared with the Skeeters and in the Major Leagues in the same season. Infielder Ryan Court began the season in Sugar Land and went on to make his Major League debut with the Seattle Mariners on July 26. The Skeeters defeated the York Revolution in four games in the opening series before losing in five games to Long Island in the best-of-five Championship Series. Denis Phipps paced the offense with 21 home runs, tying Koby Clemens for the second-most in a single season in Skeeters history. Major League veteran and Houston native James Loney made the Skeeters Opening Day roster and spent the first month of the season as a pitcher and position player before announcing his retirement. During the second half of the season, the Atlantic League made history, using an automated ball-strike system





to call balls and strikes rather than a traditional home-plate umpire. The automated ball-strike system was one of many rule changes implemented in the Altantic League in 2019, along with rules on shifting, the duration a relief pitcher must stay in the game, the size of the bases and others.


2020

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Atlantic League cancelled its 2020 season. Without an Atlantic League season, the Skeeters hosted their own four-team independent league hosted exclusively at Constellation Field – called the Constellation Energy League. Along with the Skeeters, other team names included the Lightning Sloths, Team Texas and Reyes Del Tigre. Each team was scheduled to play 28 games throughout the two-month season. Former Major Leaguers Greg Swindell and Dave Eiland managed the Lightning Sloths and Reyes Del Tigre, respectively. Koby and Roger Clemens managed Team Texas. Pete Incaviglia returned to manager the Skeeters. Kody and Kacy Clemens played for Team Texas, joining their father and brother. Due to the cancellation of the Minor League Baseball season in 2021, teams allowed their minor leaguers under contract to take part in the Constellation Energy League. Tampa Bay Rays prospect Ford Proctor was named the league's Most Valuable Player after hitting .346 on the season. Other notable players that participated in the league included: Trei Cruz (son of Jose Cruz Jr.), Brantley Bell (son of Jay Bell), David Huff (8-year MLB veteran), Scott Kazmir (3-time MLB All-Star), RHP





Adam Kloffenstein (Top-10 Toronto Blue Jays prospect), Preston Palmeiro (son of Rafael Palmeiro), Ryan Reynolds (son of Shane Reynolds, Fernando Rodney (17-year MLB veteran), Robbie Ross (6-year MLB veteran), Cameron Rupp (5-year MLB veteran), Robby Scott



(4-year MLB veteran), Joe Wieland (4-year MLB veteran). Rodney, RHP Chase De Jong, RHP Brett Eibner, LHP Matt Dermody and LHP Zac Rosccup each had their contracts purchased by MLB organizations during the season. Eibner, De Jong and Dermody each reached the Major Leagues in 2020. Despit the ongoing pandemic, the league was able to complete its season without any stoppages due to a COVID-19 outbreak. Unlike in 2019 with the Skeeters, there were not any rule changes enacted for the Constellation Energy League. The only non-traditional baseball rule that was adopted was that games that exceeded nine innings were decided by a home run derby between the two teams,

rather than extra innings. The league's opening day was broadcasted nationally through AT&T and was broadcasted locally on AT&T SportsNet Southwest. Over 50,000 fans were in attendance throughout the Constellation Energy League, which was one of a handful of professional sporting leagues that were active in the summer of 2020.


