**LAST WEEK:** The TinCaps beat the Lugnuts, 9-1, on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July in front of 9,337 fans at Parkview Field – the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest crowd in franchise history – however, Lansing still took 4 of 6 in the series, including a 7-5 win Saturday.

**FORT WAYNE FAITHFUL:** Parkview Field has hosted 10 sellouts so far in 2024. For the year, Fort Wayne's averaged 5,201 fans per home game, which ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> out of 60 clubs at the Single-A and High-A levels and is greater than 23 Double-A and even 11 Triple-A teams.

**260 TO THE SHOW:** Since Fort Wayne's franchise was founded in 1993, the club has had 224 alumni go on to reach the big leagues, including 46 in MLB so far this year. **Fernando Tatis Jr.** (2017, Padres) and **Trea Turner** (2014, Phillies) have been voted National League All-Star starters, while **Jackson Merrill** (2023, Padres) and **CJ Abrams** (2019, Nationals) are NL reserves.

**PITCHING PROWESS:** Over the last 11 games, TinCaps pitchers have 114 strikeouts in 96 innings, with a 3.56 ERA. That's 6 more Ks than any other staff in the league since June 26. Opponents are also hitting just .215 off Fort Wayne pitchers in this span... More specifically, in this stretch, Fort Wayne's starters have had a sub-2 ERA during this time.

**CLOSE CALLS:** The 'Caps have played 15 extra-inning games, more than anyone else in MiLB and MLB... The TinCaps have also played 27 one-run games, most in the MWL.

**RALLY CAPS:** The TinCaps have overcome a deficit in 18 of their 33 wins, including overcoming a 5-run deficit 3 different times.

**HOMER BUSH JR.:** 40 stolen bases, 2<sup>nd</sup> most in the MWL, and 5<sup>th</sup> overall in MiLB... 12 HBP, 4<sup>th</sup> most in MWL... On a 6-game hitting streak.

**ETHAN SALAS:** Has been selected to play in MLB's All-Star Futures Game on Saturday at Globe Life Field in Arlington, Texas, home of the Rangers. This marks the 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive year a TinCap has been included in the showcase, following **Jackson Merrill** (2023) and **Robert Hassell III** (2022).

**ROMEO SANABRIA:** Ranked today by *Baseball America* as the Padres' 21<sup>st</sup> best prospect (was previously unranked)... On a 5-game hitting streak.

**DEVIN ORTIZ:** On a 5-game hitting streak.

**JAY BESHEARS:** Since High-A debut on May 15, leads MWL in doubles (15).

**KAI MURPHY:** 17 doubles, 4<sup>th</sup> in MWL.

**GRIFFIN DOERSCHING:** 9 homers, 9<sup>th</sup> in MWL.

**DEFENSE:** TinCaps catchers rank 2<sup>nd</sup> in the MWL in caught stealing % at 30% (league average is 22%). Individually, **Anthony Vilar** ranks 5<sup>th</sup> in CS (19) and **Ethan Salas** ranks 8<sup>th</sup> (17).

**FACES IN THE CROWD:** On the 4<sup>th</sup> of July, the TinCaps hosted a group from Germany and a little league team from Toronto... **Belinda** and **Arnold Wilson** were in attendance also, visiting from The Bahamas. Arnold's grandfather, **George Wilson Sr.**, father **George Jr.**, and uncle **Joseph** (aka "Jelly") played for the Fort Wayne Giants, a Black baseball team that existed from 1908-51.

## More News, Notes & Season Storylines

[HOME RUN DERBY X: Coming to Parkview Field on Saturday, Aug. 10. Tickets on sale now. The event is set to feature MLB legends Nick Swisher and Jake Arrieta, as well as softball/women's baseball stars Jocelyn Alo and Alex Hugo. More names will be announced in the coming weeks.](#)

**YU HAD TO BE THERE:** 5-time MLB All-Star **Yu Darvish** made a rehab start for the TinCaps at Parkview Field on June 19 against Wisconsin.

**ROAD TO OMAHA:** TinCaps manager **Mike Daly** was a member of LSU's national title teams in 1997 and 2000... Hitting coach **Jed Morris** also competed in the College World Series with Nebraska in 2001 and '02... Pitching coach **Thomas Eshelman** pitched in the CWS for Cal State Fullerton in '15... 11 players on the roster appeared in the NCAA Tournament, including **Devin Ortiz** (Virginia) and **Lucas Dunn** (Louisville), who made it to Omaha.

**DAISIES:** The TinCaps wore special jerseys on June 8 as a tribute to the Fort Wayne Daisies of the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League. During their existence from 1945-54, the Daisies won 3 regular season titles and reached the championship series 4 times. Former Daisies pitcher **Dolly Vanderlip Ozburn** and utility player **Katie Horstman** were in attendance, along with **Jeneane DesCombes Lesko** (Grand Rapids Chicks LHP/OF) and **Mary Moore** (Springfield Sallies and Battle Creek Bells 2B). They'll be recognized during the game, along with the relatives of 9 late members of the Daisies. The jerseys are being auctioned off at [TinCaps.com/auction](https://www.tincaps.com/auction) through Sunday night, with proceeds going to honor the Daisies' legacy. Last year, in partnership with FW Parks & Rec, the TinCaps unveiled new monuments at nearby Memorial Park, where the team used to play... Additionally tonight, the women will sign autographs and take photos with fans. The South Bend History Museum, which features a collection of AAGPBL items, had a kiosk at the ballpark, too... Peoria also had a team in the AAGPBL, the Redwings, from '46-51.

**'CAPS IN THE COMMUNITY:** On May 24, TinCaps players and staff volunteered with The Rescue Mission, a local non-profit organization that provides restorative care to those experiencing a homelessness crisis. One group served lunch and helped with other chores at the Life House building downtown, while others assisted at Charis House, a shelter for women and children, and yet another group offered aid at Treasure House, a thrift store.

**SLAM FACTOIDS:** Fort Wayne hit a grand slam in 3 consecutive games (May 18-21) for the first time in franchise history. (Research credit: **Dylan Sinn** from *The Journal Gazette*.) The MLB record for consecutive games with a slam is 4 (Padres, 2020).

**MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS NIGHT:** In May, MiLB and RADical Hope announced a new partnership aimed at addressing the mental health crisis across the United States by empowering young adults with skills and resources so they're equipped to cope *before* they reach a crisis point. As part of Mental Health Awareness Month, the TinCaps are one of select teams offering a free workshop at Parkview Field where RADical Hope is sharing mental health resources, skills, and exercises for building resiliency, as well as discussion-based activities to further the conversation on mental health... In partnership with Parkview Sports Medicine as well, the TinCaps invited local middle school, high school, college, and club team captains and coaches for a wellness training on Saturday. Participants also received a free ticket and food voucher for that night's game... Additionally, the following non-profits have kiosks on the concourse: Fort Wayne's chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness; Remedy Live; Samaritan Dog; Sunny PATHH; and Great Kids Make Great Communities.

**BACK AT PARKVIEW FIELD:** While the TinCaps were on the road in May, the Parkview Sports Medicine Baseball Classic concluded with the 3<sup>rd</sup> night of high school baseball doubleheaders. **Kylar Decker**, a TinCaps Grounds Crew intern, threw a 3-hit shutout for Leo over Columbia City, while **Grant Peters**, also a member of the Grounds Crew's gameday staff, tossed a 2-hit shutout for Carroll over Homestead... Last week New Haven beat Woodlan and Northrop took on North Side... The series also saw matchups between Wayne and South Side, and Snider versus Blackhawk Christian.

**PROSPECTS:** Catcher **Ethan Salas** isn't just the top-rated Padres prospect, he's also the top catching prospect in baseball, according to MLB.com. They also rank Salas as the No. 6 overall prospect. Starting pitcher **Dylan Lesko** is the top righty in San Diego's system. Meanwhile, *Baseball America* included outfielder **Tyler Robertson** and first baseman **Griffin Doerschling** on their pre-season "top 40." *BA* also highlighted reliever **David Morgan** on a list of prospects who impressed during spring training and ranked him as San Diego's 23<sup>rd</sup> best prospect... *Baseball America* ranked Fort Wayne's roster as 1 of the 10 most talented in all of MiLB.

**WEATHER WOES:** 3 of the first 7 home dates at Parkview Field were rained out... April also featured another game delayed more than 70 minutes by rain. Before April 10-11, Fort Wayne hadn't had consecutive home games postponed since May 30-31, 2006. That was at Memorial Stadium. Parkview Field opened in 2009. **Ethan Salas** was born June 1, 2006.

**FUN FACT:** The first game in Fort Wayne's franchise history was April 10, 1993 on the road against the Waterloo Diamonds (then a Padres affiliate). Waterloo's starting second baseman was **Homer Bush Sr.**, who went on to be a MWL All-Star... The current voice of the Dragons, **Tom Nichols**, was on the radio call for the Wizards then.

**PREMIER PLAY:** **Lucas Dunn's** 10<sup>th</sup>-inning diving catch and outfield assist from left field on Opening Day at Great Lakes was 1 of 5 finalists for MiLB's Premier Play of the Week.

**BASEBALL HISTORY:** On May 4, 1871, the Fort Wayne Kekiongas played the Cleveland Forest Citys in the first ever professional baseball league game. The game, played at present-day Camp Allen Park just outside of Downtown Fort Wayne, marked the start of the National Association, which later became the National League. Fort Wayne won, 2-0, led by starting pitcher **Bobby Mathews**... On May 6, 1927, the Yankees played an exhibition game against the Lincoln Lifers semi-pro team at League Park in Fort Wayne (where Headwaters Park is now downtown). New York was in between traveling from Washington D.C. to Chicago. The exhibition was tied, 3-3, through 9 innings until **Babe Ruth** hit a 2-run homer in the 10<sup>th</sup> to lead the Yankees to a 5-3 win in front of a crowd of more than 3,000... **Tony Gwynn** was born May 9, 1960. Gwynn and the Padres twice visited Fort Wayne for exhibition games (May 13, 1999 and April 27, 2001).

**WHAT'S NEW AT PARKVIEW FIELD:** During the off-season, as part of a \$1.2 million project to comply with MLB specifications, Parkview Field's playing surfaced was replaced. Additionally, the front steps of the ballpark were improved, as was the flooring of the PSM Treetops, while other areas of the yard were freshly painted... New concessions options include popcorn in a batting helmet, elote, and Bloody Marys.

**15<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY:** This season marks a decade and a half of TinCaps baseball at Parkview Field. During the year, the team is celebrating with special edition jerseys for select home games, among other promotions.

## 15 Mike Daly      Manager      Age: 46

- **FROM:** Atlanta, GA / Cincinnati, OH
- **COLLEGE:** LSU (1997, 2000 National Champion)
- **CAREER:** Daly began in the Cleveland Guardians organization where he worked in their baseball operations department from 2001-2002 and as an area scout from 2003-2006. After 6 seasons with Cleveland, Daly moved to the Texas Rangers organization and was promoted to their Director of International Scouting in 2009. He spent 4 years in that position and became the Senior Director of Player Development in 2014. Eventually Daly was the assistant general manager from 2016-2021. In the fall of 2021, Daly was named the Assistant Director of Player Development for the San Diego Padres. He remained in that position until being hired as Fort Wayne's manager in January 2024.

## 45 Thomas Eshelman Pitching Coach      Age: 29

- **FROM:** Carlsbad, CA
- **COLLEGE:** Cal State Fullerton (3 seasons with a sub-2.00 ERA)
- **DRAFTED:** 2015, 2<sup>nd</sup> RD (Houston)
- **CAREER:** Eshelman played in the minor leagues from 2015-2019 with the Astros, Phillies, and Orioles organizations. He made his major league debut with the Baltimore Orioles in 2019. Eshelman pitched in the majors from 2019-2021 in 31 games, all with the Orioles.
- **COACHING:** After retiring from playing in 2022, Eshelman began his coaching career last season as the pitching coach of the Lake Elsinore Storm.

## 24 Jhonaldo Pozo Bench Coach      Age: 35

- **FROM:** San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic
- **CAREER:** Pozo was a utility player that mostly played catcher. He played in the Padres organization from 2007-2011 and made a stop in Fort Wayne for 6 games in 2011.
- **COACHING:** 2024 marks Pozo's second stint as bench coach of the TinCaps. The former catcher was on staff in 2022 under manager Brian Esposito. Last year, Pozo served as the bench coach of the Lake Elsinore Storm. He spent the 2010 and 2011 seasons playing in Lake Elsinore before retiring and becoming a minor league coach.

## 13 Jed Morris Hitting Coach      Age: 44

- **FROM:** Eugene, Oregon
- **COLLEGE:** University of Nebraska (2002 BIG12 Player of the Year, .382AVG, 23 HRs, 90 RBI, led Nebraska to the College World Series back-to-back seasons.)
- **DRAFTED:** 2002, 36<sup>th</sup> round (Oakland)
- **CAREER:** Morris played in the minors from 2002-08, all with the A's organization. He was diagnosed with Leukemia in 2006 and missed almost all the 2007 season. After undergoing treatment, Morris returned in 2008. He played 2 years of independent league ball in 2009 and 2010
- **COACHING:** Morris was the head coach of Eastern University from 2012-2018. He's been a hitting coach in the Padres organization since 2018.

### About Parkview Field

- **BACKGROUND:** In 2007, the Fort Wayne City Council approved the Harrison Square Project to build a new ballpark downtown as well as other amenities.
- **DEBUT:** Opening Day for Parkview Field took place on April 16, 2009. The TinCaps played in front of a sold-out crowd and beat the Dayton Dragons 7-0.
- **CAPACITY:** 8,100
- **RECORD CROWD:** 9,508 (July 4, 2019)
- **DIMENSIONS:** 336 feet to the left-field foul pole... 377 feet to left-center field... 400 feet to straight-away centerfield... 383 feet to right-center field... and 318 feet to the right-field foul pole.
- **WALLS:** Range from 10 feet tall, from center to right-center field, up to 15 feet tall in the outfield corners as well as a small section of left-center field.
- **MORE THAN BASEBALL:** Parkview Field hosts hundreds of special events yearly, including concerts such as Florida Georgia Line, Dierks Bentley, Zac Brown Band, and Nelly.
