Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Heath Fillmyer to the mound tonight, looking to get back on track (18ER in 10.2IP over last 3GS, 0ER in 11.0IP in 2GS prior). Omaha will counter with LHP Marcelo Martinez. The Clippers are 5-8 (.385) against left handers this year. Martinez has never pitched against the Clippers in his career (made Triple-A debut in mid June).

vs. the Storm Chasers

After a series opening shutout on 5/11, the Clippers dropped four of the next five against Omaha in the season's first matchup (Omaha has scored at least four runs in each of 7G since, averaging 6.7 per game). Individually, Gabriel Arias has hit .333 (9x27) with a HR and 4RBI against Omaha in 8G and Nolan Jones is hitting .115 (3x26) with 2RBI in 7G.

Here We Go Again

The Clippers have allowed at least four runs in each of 2G (15 total) since back to back shutouts on 7/31-8/1 at Nashville (second time this year; all other IL staffs have three instances of consecutive shutouts combined). After blanking Indianapolis from 7/6-7/7, the Clippers allowed 147 runs in the next 19G (7.7 per). When they hold opponents to three runs or fewer, they are an IL-best 22-2 (.917).

Career Years Already

Alex Call launched his 13th homer of the season last night, establishing a new career best (8HR with Columbus, most with any one team in a given year) and Andres Gimenez drilled his 10th with Columbus (8HR in Huntington Park) to build on his career best (also has 2HR for Cleveland). Call has multi-hit games in each of the last two, marking his first such streak with Columbus (four times in Akron).

Hammering Gimenez

Andres Gimenez missed over two weeks due to injury (7/4-7/19), but is hitting .370 (17x46) with 2HR and 8RBI in 12G since his return (0x12 in last 3G prior to injury). In addition, he has 4BB and a trio of HBP in the last 12G, good for a .453OBP (only 13K, had 28K to 4BB in last 21G prior to injury). Gimenez has reached safely in each of the last 12, his longest on base streak of the year (has hit in 10 of 12).

Three Left Turns

Gabriel Arias has scored in only nine of his last 25G, totaling 10 runs (only multi-run game came on 7/14 at St. Paul, 18G since). following a streak of 22 runs in 15 of 18G (6/12-7/4). Still, beginning with a 3-run game on 6/12 at lowa, Arias has scored 32 runs in his last 43G, tied for 2nd in the IL in that time (hitting .327, 54x165, since 6/12). On the season, Arias is tied for 6th in the IL in runs (45).

Double Drought

Nolan Jones ended his double drought at 13G last Thursday (tied for longest of the year, 5/6-5/22; leads IL with 21 doubles). Since reaching a season high of .241 on 7/4, Jones is hitting just .172 (15x87) in 25G (two doubles). His batting average has fallen 23 points in those 25G, with his slugging dipping by 21 (.431 to .410). In the 25G prior to his slump, Jones hit .321 with a .617SLG (6/8-7/4).

Bus Driver

Oscar Gonzalez drove in another run last night, giving him 9RBI in his last 9G. He now has 13RBI, more than a third of the way to the team lead, in just 24G (Nolan Jones, 36RBI in 77G). With Columbus, Gonzalez is batting .345 (10x29) with RISP (.352, 19x54, in Akron) and has gotten plenty of chances in his last 9G (16PA, 3rd most in IL since 7/25; Jones leads with 18PA, hitting .176 to Oscar's .429).

D-Fence

The Clipper defense is in the midst of its best effort of the season, committing just 2E in the last 11G (had five straight errorless games before last night; tied for season best, 5/11-5/15 vs. Omaha). Columbus had made 22E in 26G prior to the current run, dropping to 11th in the IL in fielding, but they now place 6th. Dating to 7/18 at St. Paul, the Clippers have 5E in 15G, compared to 16E from the opponents.

Group Effort

The bullpen provided 6.0IP of scoreless work completing Saturday's suspended game (added 2.0IP in the regularly scheduled game), marking the 11th game this season with at least 5.0IP and 0ER (only 6G in all of 2019; no other IL team has more than 6G this year). Despite that success, the bullpen ranks 13th in the IL with a 4.95ERA (15G with at least 5ER; 2nd most in the IL, trailing Charlotte's 20G).

This Date in Clipper History

Columbus pounded Louisville 17 4, slugging 3HR at Louisville Slugger Field. Jesus Aguilar was 3x5 with a pair of doubles, a HR and 5RBI, while Yandy Diaz and Guillermo Quiroz each went 2x5 with a HR and 4RBI. Both Bradley Zimmer and Giovanny Urshela recorded 4-hit games. For Aguilar, he would club 10HR and drive in 27 over his final 28 games, leading the IL in both categories for the

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (988 to 947).

Homers, Homers and More Homers

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.29 per game, putting them one off of the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). On the mound they are allowing 1.50 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 36, even with the shortened season.

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 15-43 (.259) in games in which they trail, ranking 11th.

Not Close

The Clippers have suffered the most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (26; six in 10G from 7/8-7/19) and rank tied for last in wins by at least that many (11, Norfolk). That poor ratio has led to a -85 run differential (had a -50 differential over 10G from 7/8-7/19), a figure that places them 12th in the IL (Charlotte, -89; Norfolk, -91).

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; current 5G losing streak in extra-innings following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.51 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.87ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Under Control

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is not threatening for a fourth, as they are currently 71K off the lead. To begin the season, they were averaging as many as 10 per game through the first 38G, but that has cooled considerably in recent weeks (8.36K per game since 7/6). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G).

Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is almost 100 points higher (.488, 20-21) than when they make a mistake in the field (.405, 15-22). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 90 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .982.

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 51% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 24 times (on pace for 39HR).

Andres Gimenez advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 7/25 vs. lowa and the runner came around to score in the win (4-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

No Difference

Through the first half of the season, in which the IL played with 18-inch bases (shortening the distance between bases by a whopping 4.5 inches), the Clippers saw a combined average of 1.71 stolen base attempts in their games (averaged 1.73 attempts per game over five seasons from 2015-19). However, since going back to normal bases, steal attempts are... at 1.70 per game.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 65-89 (.422), 35-43 with Columbus (.449).

In Like a Lion, Out Like a Lamb:

To start July, Fillmyer put 12 consecutive bagels on the board, turning in the longest scoreless innings streak for a Clipper this season. Over those 12.0IP, from the 1st on 7/1 through the 1st on 7/17, opponents batted .098 (4x41; 0x5 with RISP) with 0XBH and 1BB to go against 13K. Unfortunately for him, the Clipper offense was just as limp, hitting .150/.209/.200 with zero runs over that same period. Starting with the 2nd inning on 7/17 at St. Paul, the rest of Fillmyer's July took a 180 degree turn, as he was battered to the tune of .404/.596/.830 and 18ER over 9.2IP (5HR to 56BF).

Devastating Blows:

On the season, Fillmyer has surrendered 9HR over 169BF, with six of those bombs putting multiple runs on the board (each of the last four). Fillmyer is one of four Clippers to have allowed at least six multi-run homers this year (**Kirk McCarty** has given up seven, **Logan Allen** and **Kevin Herget** have six apiece), but he is the only one with fewer than 90BF with runners on (75BF, Allen is next at 94BF). As a team, the Clippers have allowed the most homers (118) and the most with men on base (57, 49% of homers allowed), but Norfolk has a higher percentage of multi-run taters allowed (50%).

In Relief:

Following a start in his Clipper debut, Fillmyer pitched three times out of the bullpen to mixed results. He had a pair of perfect innings (2K, 26 pitches) at lowa on 6/8, then allowed 4ER in 2.0IP at lowa on 6/11 (37 pitches). In his most recent outing as a reliever, he gave up 1ER in 1.0IP vs. Toledo on 6/15 (20 pitches).

Barnstorming:

Fillmyer made his 2021 season debut on 5/27 with Lancaster in the Atlantic League, picking up the win at Gastonia with a quality start on 102 pitches (6.0IP, 3H, 1R, 1ER, 2BB, 9K). Notable Atlantic League Alumni that went on to play for the Clippers include (years in AL; years in Columbus): **Ruben Sierra** ('99; '05), **Curtis Pride** ('99-00; '03), **Kenny Ray** ('02; '09), **RJ Swindle** ('07; '09), **Michel Hernandez** ('07; '11-12), **Scott Kazmir** ('12; '13) and **Jarrett Grube** ('09-10; '15-17). Additionally, former manager, **Chris Tremie** ('13-18) had a playing stint in the Atlantic League ('00).
