LUG-NOTES

Streaking: Outfielder **Jake Reinisch** went 1-for-4 with a triple last night, extending his on-base streak to 29 games, the longest of the Nuts' season. Reinisch is batting .293/.435/.525 with 29 base hits and 23 walks during the streak.

No Place Like Home: With yesterday's win, the Lugnuts are 9-1 in their last 10 home games. For the year, the Nuts are 6-2-2 in home series and are averaging 6.28 runs/game, the best run-scoring home rate in the Midwest League. Lansing's overall 30-23 home record trails only Great Lakes (33-25) and South Bend (33-19) among MWL teams; not coincidentally, those are the top two teams in the league.

Roll Call: Second baseman **Jared Davis** is poised to make his Lansing Lugnuts debut today, becoming the 1,010th all-time Nut and the 50th different Lugnut of 2026. Davis, 22, was the Athletics' 17th-round selection in 2025 from Virginia Tech, where he batted .283 with 14 doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 14 steals and 44 RBIs in 54 games as a junior. A native of Orlando, Davis was batting .300 with a .459 OBP and 10 steals in 48 games in the Arizona Complex League. His older brother, Austin, played five years at West Virginia and is currently in his second year as a regular for Sioux City (American Association).

Movin' on up:

- Infielders **Ali Camarillo** and **Jared Sprague-Lott** earned promotions up to Double-A Midland to start the week. Camarillo, 23, had just been named to the A's Top 30 Prospects list in MLB Pipeline's re-ranking of the organization, incorporating the 2026 Draft class and breakout prospects. He exits the High-A level with the following Midwest League ranks: No. 4 in doubles (23), No. 6 in base hits (97), No. 7 in batting average (.284). Camarillo further leads the Lugnuts in at-bats (342), total bases (135), RBIs (58), HBPs (8) and steals (20 in 21 attempts), all the while drawing 32 walks and striking out only 56 times in 86 games. slashed .284/.355/.395 with 23 doubles, five home runs and 20 stolen bases. Over two stints with the Lugnuts in 2026, Sprague-Lott hit .250/.365/.357 with 10 doubles, one triple, five home runs and 17 stolen bases. Both players were hot in July, with Camarillo hitting .313 and Sprague-Lott batting .306.

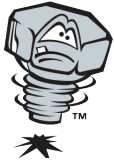
Cooperstownian Nut: A member of the very first Lugnuts lineup on April 5, 1996, **Carlos Beltrán** was inducted on July 26 into Cooperstown alongside Jeff Kent and Andruw Jones. In his 11th game with the Lugnuts (batting .143, 6-for-42, with one walk and 11 strikeouts), Beltrán suffered a right knee in an outfield collision. He flew back to the Royals' complex in Florida and never returned to Lansing, making his MLB debut on September 14, 1998, against the Oakland Athletics. A year later, Carlos was voted 1999 American League Rookie of the Year, and was on his way to a 20-year MLB career with 2,725 hits, 565 doubles, 78 triples, 435 homers, 312 homers, nine All-Star appearances, three Gold Gloves, two Silver Sluggers, the Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award, and a 2017 World Series ring as a member of the Astros.

AUGUST 19 IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2011: LF Marcus Knecht hit the Lugnuts' first grand slam of the year in a 6-2 win at Bowling Green. He would follow up with another grand slam the next day back in Lansing, the Nuts' only grand slams of the season.

2016: Manager John Schneider mandated that the Lugnuts show up only two hours before Saturday's series opener against South Bend at Cooley Law School Stadium. The offense showed up late during the game – but scored five runs in the bottom of the 8th for a 5-2 victory, ending a four-game losing streak, before a roaring crowd of 8,404. The rally included two run-scoring wild pitches from Cubs reliever Jared Cheek and a two-run tie-breaking triple from Justin Atkinson.
