Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Trenton Denholm** to the mound tonight, looking to become the first in the IL to reach 10 wins. The Storm Chasers will counter with RHP **Vince Velasquez**. Columbus is 48-33 (.593) versus right handers this year. Velasquez has pitched against the Clippers twice in his career, going 0-0 with a 5.87ERA (7.2IP, 7H, 5R, 5ER, 9BB, 11K).

vs. the Storm Chasers

Columbus has lost 50 of the last 82 regular season games against Omaha, dating to 5/5/22. Of those 82G, the Clippers are 11-47 (.190) when they allow at least four runs to Omaha (4-4 in last 8G), while going 21-3 (.875) when they hold the Storm Chasers to three or fewer. Individually, **Ralph Velazquez** has played 10G against Omaha in his career, hitting .310 (13x42) with 2HR and 5RBI.

If These Trends Continue

Over the last couple weeks, the Clippers gained a couple games in the standings, as they entered the final six weeks 6.0 games off the lead. Of the next six series, four will come against teams above Columbus in the standings (Omaha, Indianapolis and St. Paul twice) and two will be against the bottom of the IL (Iowa and Louisville). The Clippers have gone 34-31 (.523) against that quintet of teams this year.

Getting Offensive

Over the last 12G, the Clippers have plated a total of 91 runs (most in the IL, 7.6 per game), after coming out of the All-Star Break with 35 runs in the first 9G (16th in the IL, 3.9 per). Columbus had 2HR in 288AB of those first 9G, but have shaken off the rust to the tune of an IL-best 32HR (+10 on 2nd) in the last 390AB. They have scored at least five in 12 straight (3rd longest stretch in pro baseball this year).

In the Club

On Sunday, the Clippers became the eighth team in the IL to accumulate 60 wins and they are the only team in that group with negative differentials in runs (-15; all others at least +40, averaging +61), hits (-40, all others average +40) and homers (-3, others average +20). Columbus has gained 10 in the homer column over the last 12G (32-22; out-homered 36-21 in 19G prior), going deep in 11 of 12.

Ingle is Back

In 23G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 35x96 (.365), drawing 15BB (.446OBP) with 15XBH (6HR, .646SLG). He is one of two in the IL (**Max Anderson**, Toledo), hitting .300/.400/.500, but is 1x16 (HR) since his 11G hit streak was snapped last Wednesday (15G on base streak, .446OBP since 7/23). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.317OPS (15HR) in 40G (.660OPS and 3HR in 33G between DH and LF).

Extra Base Machine

Kyle Manzardo homered Saturday night for his 100th career hit as a Clipper (108G). Though he is hitting just .260 in a Columbus uniform, he boasts a .549SLG as 56% of his hits have gone for extra bases (only 22XBH outside of Huntington Park, .457SLG; 34XBH and .647 at home). In addition, he has put together a walk rate of 16% (75BB in 473PA) against a strikeout rate of 18% (84K).

Bring it on Home

Ralph Velazquez had 4HR in 5G at Syracuse (21AB; had 2HR in 100AB of previous 25G on the road), boosting his OPS away from Huntington Park to .709 (.883OPS in 29G at home). Velazquez also had 3HR two weeks ago vs. Toledo, as he leads the IL with 7HR and an .810SLG since 7/28 (2nd with 14RBI). Aside from the trip to St. Paul (0x21 in 6G), he is hitting .315/.392/.589 since 6/18.

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 32x107 (.299) in his last 35G, collecting 20XBH (.636SLG) and 24RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Along with **Kahlil Watson**, he is one of 11 in the IL with at least 13HR and 13SB, (one of five that are 30-30 since the start of 2025). Tolentino has the 2nd most HR in the IL since the start of last year (36; 1HR off LHP).

Problems on the Back End

Since allowing 7ER in 4.1IP at Lehigh Valley on 7/12, the Clipper bullpen has registered an IL-worst 7.71ERA in 22G (88.2IP, 76ER). Clipper relievers have surrendered 18HR in that time (2nd most in the IL), allowing a line of .279/.397/.50. The bullpen has not put together a scoreless outing since back to back games vs. Louisville from 7/4-7/5 (90ER in 27G since; 58ER in 27G prior).

This Date in Clipper History

8/12/2003

Jorge DePaula took a no-hitter into the 9th before allowing a single to lead off the inning in a 3-0 win over Louisville. **Sam Marsonek** was called upon to close out the game, throwing a perfect inning of relief. DePaula led the Clippers in wins (10), innings (167.2) and strikeouts (125) in 2003, while Marsonek paced the club with 18 saves. DePaula would be rewarded with a September call up at the end of the year.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,469 to 1,414).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 165-129 (.561) in pitch reviews, with batters going 84-79 (.515) and pitchers/catchers going 81-50 (.618). They have run out of challenges in 45G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 827, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 129 through 113G (on pace for 170SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 39CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (51; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 160 runs while crafting an .887OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 105 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +55 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 259-163 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,978RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.45 through 113G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 200HR (2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 61G this season (36-25, .590), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 5th most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 8th most games decided in the last at bat (27, Norfolk has 32). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 101G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-53 (.475, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 446-459 (.492), 416-413 with Columbus (.502).

500K:

On 8/1 vs. Toledo, Denholm racked up 8K for the third time this year, crossing 500 in his career in the process (8.3K/9IP). He has seen that rate bump slightly this season (8.9K/9IP), while his 3.73K/BB ratio ranks 4th in the IL among 106 pitchers with at least 50.0IP (0BB to 67BF from 7/21-8/7).

Great Start:

Denholm's season debut, 4/1 vs. Indianapolis, was his 100th career game and his second at the Triple-A level (367 days between Triple-A games). He needed only 69 pitches to record a quality start (6.0IP, 1ER), giving the Clippers their first of the season (5th game, did not have a quality start until 41st game last season). Columbus has 16QS on the season (17QS through this point last year, on the way to 23), with **Rorik Maltud** (6), **Logan Allen** (4) and Denholm (3) accounting for 81%.

In Relief:

Denholm pitched exclusively in relief during May and June, but each appearance came on starter's rest, as he averaged 56.0 pitches per outing (ranged from 38-84, while recording 2.0-5.0IP). In total, he was 7-0 with a 1.95ERA over 9G (32.1IP, 30H, 9R, 7ER, 5BB, 35K). He led the IL in wins from May-June and, among 76 pitchers with at least 30.0IP, his ERA was 2nd best (also 2nd with 7.00K/BB and 6th with a 1.08WHIP). On 5/20 vs. Louisville, Denholm notched his first save in Triple-A (4.0IP, 1ER) and the fifth of his pro career.

Tough Ones:

On 4/12, Worcester hung 7ER on Denholm, tying a career high (third time), while also connecting for 2HR (eighth career game giving up 2HR, first time allowing both to same batter, Allan Castro). He followed up with a quality outing next time out, 4/18 vs. Iowa (6.0IP, 3ER), throwing a season high of 92 pitches. Denholm closed out April by giving up 7ER again (fourth time), this time to Toledo on 4/30, while giving up 3HR for the first time in his career.

Limiting the Longballs:

From 4/12-4/30, Denholm surrendered 7HR to 90BF (one per 12.9BF), accounting for 15 of 19ER (6HR with men on base, including a grand slam on 4/12 at Worcester). He allowed only 2HR to the next 188BF from 5/7-7/12 (94.0BF per) before surrendering a pair in the 3rd inning at Lehigh Valley on 7/12. Including those IronPig homers, Denholm surrendered bombs in each of 3GS from 7/12-7/26, giving up 5HR to 57BF (one per 11.4BF).
