#### HILLCATS COLLECT LEAGUE AWARDS

The Lynchburg Hillcats have racked up the awards after several impressive weeks from their players.

In the first six weeks of the season, the Hillcats won five weekly awards and one monthly award. Ralphy Velazquez, Matt Wilkinson, Esteban Gonzalez, Angel Genao, and Alonzo Richardson have all won weekly awards for their performance this season. Wilkinson brought home a monthly award as well.

Velazquez was the first to win the Carolina League Player of the Week for his performance from April 8-14. During this stretch, he hit his first career home run, while following it up with a second during the same game. Leaving the week, he was hitting well above .300 and making his mark on the Carolina League.

Ralphy, the Guardians 1st round pick from the 2023 MLB Draft, is in his first professional season of baseball. Drafted straight out of high school, Velazquez is in the process of transitioning from a catcher to a full time first baseman.

Wilkinson would take home his pitcher of the week award after a historic start at the end of April. Against Myrtle Beach, he would go six no-hit, shut out innings, striking out 15. He was the fourth pitcher in Minor League Baseball history to accomplish that feat.

Tugboat, as he is affectionately known, burst on the scene after this start due to his unique nickname and flair on the mound. He quickly became a fan favorite in Lynchburg and across the country due to his style. He was the 10th round pick of the Guardians in 2023.

Wilkinson would finish the month of April with a sub-one ERA, tied for the Minor League lead in strikeouts alongside Paul Skenes. He also led the Carolina League in WHIP.

In the month of May, Lynchburg would tack on three more weekly awards, starting first with Esteban Gonzalez. In his series against Down East, he picked up three home runs, bringing his season total to 4. In the series, he would boost his average from .290 to .326.

Gonzalez, one of the more unheralded prospects on the Hillcats roster, was born in Venezuela in 2003. He signed with the Guardians in 2019 and is in his first full season of Minor League Baseball after spending last season in the complex league.

Angel Genao and Alonzo Richardson would sweep the weekly awards for their performances from May 13-19 against the Delmarva Shorebirds.

Richardson received Carolina League Pitcher of the Week after a dominating performance against Delmarva. In game one of a doubleheader, Richardson would fire a complete game, striking out three, while only surrendering one hit.

Richardson has been in Lynchburg in some capacity since 2022 but has begun to find his stride this season. The right-hander is a converted shortstop from California and signed as an undrafted free agent in 2020.

Wrapping up the weekly awards was Angel Genao, who received Player of the Week honors. The middle-infielder would wrack up four multi-hit performances, including two three-hit games. He would also notch six RBI's over the course of the series.

Genao is in his second full season in Lynchburg but debuted with the team at the end of 2022. The 20-year-old was born in the Dominican Republic and is currently ranked 11th in the Guardians prospect rankings.

The Hillcats and their prospects will look to continue their momentum in the month of June as they face Salem, Delmarva, Augusta, Charleston, and Carolina.

Remembering the Legacy of David Elmore: A Visionary and Inspirational Leader



Through these teams, he created opportunities for aspiring players, entertained countless fans, and contributed to the growth and development of the sport. He was inducted into the Pacific Coast League and Texas League Halls of Fame and was recognized as King of Baseball in 2016.

Beyond his involvement in professional baseball, David Elmore's visionary leadership extended to various sports ventures. Dave Elmore had a passion for hockey, owning the Utah Grizzlies and the Idaho Falls Spud Kings. Dave along with his wife, Donna Tuttle, moved the Grizzlies from Denver to Utah, and aided West Valley City in the development of the Maverik Center in Salt Lake City, a state-of-the-art sports and entertainment arena which hosted the 2002 Winter Olympics. This multi-purpose facility became a hub for sporting events, concerts, and community gatherings, providing an unforgettable experience for attendees and contributing to the local economy.

As we mourn the loss of David Elmore, let us also celebrate his profound contributions to professional baseball, the sports industry, and the Olympic movement. His visionary leadership, unwavering commitment, and entrepreneurial spirit have left an indelible mark, igniting the passion for sports in communities and fostering a legacy of excellence and inclusivity.




