YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Curve, 5-1. Altoona jumped to a 5-0 lead over the first three innings. In the first, Duce Gourson hit a two-run homer. In the second, Titus Dumitru hit a two-run double. Shalin Polanco added an RBI single in the third. **Parks Harber** drove in Richmond's only run with a groundout in the fifth. Richmond stranded 10 runners on base, including leaving the bases loaded in the ninth.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels conclude their 12-game road trip to Pennsylvania (shortened to 11 games with the July 4 rainout in Harrisburg) with the finale of six games against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. This is the final series between Richmond and Altoona this season. Richmond needs a win to avoid their third series loss of the season and their third straight road series loss.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021; also beginning with the second game of the season. The 52-32 record is the best in team history through 84 games, passing a 50-34 start in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split five and lost two so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 24-25 in their last 49 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 52 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 26 of them. In 17 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have nine walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in each home series. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber**, **Dayson Croes** and **Diego Velasquez** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has three wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.270). The team also ranks third in hits (760), third in doubles (162) and fifth in total bases (1,254). The team has combined for 96 homers this year, surpassing 10 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS, sacrifice flies and hit by pitches. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown eight shutouts this season, which leads the Eastern League and ranks second in Double-A.

THE CURVE are in sixth place in the Southwest Division overall standings and in fifth place in the second half. Altoona started the season 0-12, including getting swept by Richmond in the first-ever series at CarMax Park. Since then, the Curve are 38-36. In their last 15 games since June 25, Altoona is 5-10. The Altoona roster features two players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects list, including RHP Wilber Dotel (No. 10) and 2B Duce Gourson (No. 21). MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list features three Altoona players, including Gourson (No. 27), 1B Callan Moss (No. 28) and OF Lonnie White Jr. (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Trystan Vrieling** makes his 17th start of the season and the ninth outing of his career against the Curve. He started the first game of the series on Tuesday and allowed one run over five innings in a win, his second straight winning decision and second start in a row allowing one run. Against the Curve this year, Vrieling has a 2.94 ERA (5 ER/15.1IP) in three starts. On June 12, he threw a five-inning, complete-game shutout in a rain-shortened win over the Senators as the Flying Squirrels clinched the first-half title. Last year, he missed the start of the season before joining Double-A Somerset in May. After going 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA in 12 outings, he was traded at the deadline on August 1 to the Giants from the Yankees reliever Camilo Doval. The trade happened in the middle of a Richmond series at Somerset. In 2024, he made professional debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 7 at TD Bank Ballpark to close opening weekend and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with six strikeouts. Vrieling was selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga. **For more on Vrieling, see page two.**

FOR ALTOONA: Left-hander Connor Oliver makes his sixth Double-A start and his second against the Flying Squirrels. He pitched the first game of the series on Tuesday and allowed three runs over six innings, the longest outing of his career. After going 4-0 with a 2.27 ERA in 12 outings (six starts) with High-A Greensboro to open the year, he was promoted to Double-A on June 9. He posted a 2.63 ERA (4 ER/13.2 IP) in his first three Double-A starts before allowing seven runs in a win at Portland on July 7, all in the fifth and sixth after beginning his outing with four scoreless frames. Oliver was selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 17th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Miami University. He was traded to the Pirates on April 7, 2024 for Chesapeake native and former Randolph-Macon College RHP Colin Selby.

IT'S BO TIME! In his last 33 games since June 2, **Bo Davidson** is batting .308 (41-for-133) with 13 homers, five doubles and 27 RBIs, adding 16 walks and 11 stolen bases. From June 4-7, he homered in four consecutive games, a new Flying Squirrels franchise record. From June 2-7, he picked up at least one RBI in six consecutive games, one shy of the franchise record. His 11 homers in June were the most in a calendar month in franchise history, passing eight by Jarrett Parker (May 2013) and Sean Roby (April 2022). His 19 homers are the fourth-most in a season in franchise history, trailing Sean Roby (25, 2022), Tyler Fitzgerald (21, 2022) and David Villar (20, 2021). Davidson has 27 career homers with Richmond since being promoted to Double-A last July, which ranks tied for fifth in franchise history. Last Monday, Davidson was named Eastern League Player of the Month for June. He is the fourth player in team history to win an Eastern League Player of the Month award, joining Mark Minicozzi (May 2013), Ricky Oropesa (May 2015) and Tyler Fitzgerald (April 2023).

PARKS & WRECK: In eight games since last Thursday, **Parks Harber** is batting .333 (11-for-33) with four homers, a double and 12 RBIs. On July 3, he had three hits, a homer and four RBIs. Harber hit a pair of homers his next game on July 5 and totaled three RBIs. He hit a three-run homer on Tuesday in a 3-2 win. After going homerless over 13 games from June 18-July 2, he has hit four homers in three games from Friday through Tuesday.

SECOND-HALF SABIN: In the first 14 games of the Eastern League's second half, **Sabin Ceballos** is batting .255 (13-for-51) with six homers, a double, 12 RBIs and seven walks. He hit three homers over a four-game span from June 24-27. This week, he homered on Wednesday and hit two homers on Thursday. In the first half, Ceballos batted .223 (46-for-206) with seven homers, 11 doubles and 22 RBIs in 59 games. In the first half in 2025, Ceballos hit .184 (36-for-196) with one homer and 18 RBIs in 48 games but batted .290 (47-for-162) with five homers and 29 RBIs in the second half. In his first full professional season in 2024, Ceballos hit .267 (58-for-217) with a homer and 16 RBIs in the first-half with High-A Rome before batting .270 (63-for-233) with nine homers and 44 RBIs in the second half with Rome and High-A Eugene after being traded to the Giants.

JACK ATTACK: In his last 25 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .367 (33-for-90) with a homer, five doubles, a triple, 10 RBIs, eight walks and 12 runs scored. He has 10 multi-hit performances in his last 21 games dating back to June 9, including seven two-hit games and three three-hit games.

GO, DIEGO, GO! In his last 11 games since June 28, **Diego Velasquez** is batting .455 (15-for-33) with a homer, two doubles, six walks, five RBIs and three stolen bases. He had eight hits in five games against the Senators last week, including a three-hit game last Thursday and a pair of two-hit games. He went 3-for-4 on Friday at Altoona. Since joining the Flying Squirrels in July 2024, Velasquez has played 239 games. In Richmond's franchise history, Velasquez ranks second in sacrifices (18), third in walks (117), sixth in OBP (.371, min. 400 PA), tied for fifth in stolen bases (39) and sixth in hits (234).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 312 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Bo Davidson** is tied for second in homers (19), fifth in RBIs (53), eighth in total bases (144) and ninth in SLG (.520). **Parks Harber** is tied for seventh in doubles (19). **Jonah Cox** is tied in triples (5) and fifth in stolen bases (27). **Diego Velasquez** is eighth in batting average (.288) and eighth in OBP (.380). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for first in saves (12) and tied for seventh in wins (6). **Mitch White** is tied for eighth in saves (5). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1), eighth in ERA (4.26) and eighth in BAA (.241). **Cesar Perdomo** is first in WHIP (1.11), second in BAA (.216), tied for third in strikeouts (89) and fifth in ERA (3.98).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 29). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 6), Harber (No. 13) and INF **Mauai Ahuna** (No. 18) and Marte (No. 25).

STARS OF THE SHOW: Two Flying Squirrels alumni have been named All-Stars in the majors this year. San Francisco Giants right-hander **Logan Webb**, who pitched in Richmond in 2018 and 2019, earned his third consecutive National League All-Star nod. He is the second player in Richmond franchise history to earn three All-Star selections. On Saturday, it was announced that Chicago White Sox outfielder **Tristan Peters** was added to the American League All-Star roster as a replacement for injured Nick Kurtz. Peters played with Richmond in 2022 after being traded from the Milwaukee Brewers. Richmond has produced eight MLB All-Stars in the franchise's history, including **Brandon Crawford** 2015, 2018, 2021), **Joe Panik** (2015), **Brandon Belt** (2016), **Adam Duval** (2016), **Heliot Ramos** (2024) and **Randy Rodriguez** (2025) along with Webb and Peters.

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1954: The Richmond Virginians beat the Rochester Red Wings, 1-0, at Parker Field in 13 innings. Bob Habennicht pitched a complete game for the Vees, allowing nine hits, including only five after the fourth inning. Gary Blalock matched him, holding the Vees to six hits in the 12 innings before being replaced by a pinch-hitter. In the bottom of the 13th inning, Joe Lutz walked and Ken Wood attempted a sacrifice bunt, but the lead runner was thrown out at second. Eddie Kaso hit a ball to third and reached on a dropped throw to second, moving wood to third. Marty Tabacheck dropped a bunt down the third-base line, scoring Wood from third to win the game. **2012:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 12-3, on City Island. Richmond scored seven in the second inning. Juan Perez hit a two-run homer. Gary Brown added an RBI double and Tommy Joseph hit a grand slam in the frame. Daniel Mayora hit a three-run homer in the top of the ninth inning. Perez and Mayora each had three hits. Mike Kickham started on the mound and allowed one unearned run over 7.2 innings to pick up his seventh win of the season.

- Attended Kamiakin HS in Kennewick, where he was named MCC Pitcher of the Year and also played outfield

- Played basketball (shooting guard) in high school and played football (wide receiver) growing up

- Attended Gonzaga University, where he was teammates with former Flying Squirrels pitcher William Kempner

- Selected by the Yankees in the third round (100th overall) of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga

- Traded from the Yankees to the Giants on July 31, 2025 along with C Jesus Rodriguez, INF Parks Harber and LHP Carlos De La Rosa in exchange for RHP Camilo Doval

- Had 14 wins with Somerset over two seasons, setting the record for the most career wins in the franchise's Double-A history
