### Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Ryan Webb** to the mound tonight, making his first opening day start since 6/6/22 with the AZL Guardians (started last year's season finale for Columbus). Iowa will counter with RHP **Javier Assad**. Columbus was 50-62 (.446) versus right handers last year. Assad has never pitched against the Clippers in his career (16G in the IL from 2022-23, '25).

### vs. the Cubs

Since a 5G win streak against Iowa from 5/12-6/14/24, the Clippers are 11-12 opposing the I-Cubs (26-19 in the last 45 matchups). In Des Moines, the Clippers were 5-4 (started 4-1). Individually, **Nolan Jones** has hit .317 (26x82) with 7HR and 23RBI in 23G against Iowa in his career (.409, 3HR and 15RBI in 12G at Principal Park), while **Milan Tolentino** has hit .317 (13x41) with 4HR and 9RBI in 11G.

### Opening Day

The Clippers are 30-18 (.625) all-time on opening day, having won 14 of the last 20 (1G win streak). They are 15-11 (.577) when opening on the road (sixth straight road opener; 0-1 at Iowa, losing 11-5 in 2023). The largest margin of victory for Columbus in the season's opening game is 13 runs, in a 17-4 thumping vs. Indy in 2010, while the most lopsided loss came at Richmond in 1992 (10-1).

### Shades of '24

Just like the 2024 lid-lifter, all nine hitters in tonight's lineup have Triple-A experience, with eight of the nine having played for Columbus before (**Stuart Fairchild**). Last season's opening lineup saw four Triple-A rookies (**Kody Huff**, **Petey Halpin**, **Dayan Frias** and **Milan Tolentino**). On the pitching side, only eight of 17 pitchers have Triple-A experience (all with Columbus).

### Room for Improvement

Last season's edition of the Clippers finished with a batting average below .240 for the first time in team history. Additionally, they set the franchise mark for strikeouts in a season (1,397 in 145G; had 1,392K in 140G of 2019). While the strikeout rate remained consistent throughout the year (9.7 per game in the first half, 9.6 in the second), the average dropped 22 points from front to back (.250 to .228).

### Cannon Ball

**Petey Halpin** cut down an IL-high 19 runners from the OF year (12 in last 45G). Since the start of 2009, Halpin's total was tied for 2nd most in an IL season with former Clipper, **Matt Carson** (2023; only former Clipper, **Carlos Moncrief**, had more, 22 in 2014). Halpin played error-free in his last 113G (longest streak in the IL since 2014), as the team set a club record for fielding percentage (.985, 75E).

### Top Bazzana

**Travis Bazzana** enters the season ranked as the #1 prospect in the Cleveland organization for the second year in a row. Last year he became only the second player drafted 1st overall to suit up for the Clippers (**Darryl Strawberry**, taken in 1980, played for the Clippers from 1995-97 and '99). Bazzana drew a walk in 24% of his PA with Columbus last year (29BB from debut to injury, 8/12-9/11, led the IL).

### Big Dogs

**Nolan Jones** (349) and **Stuart Fairchild** (227) account for 576 of the 769G played in the Majors by the current collection of Clippers. Fellow outfielder, **Petey Halpin** (6), and **Dom Nunez** (113) are the only other position players with big league time and **Logan Allen** (74) owns all the pitching experience. Jones has a career .804OPS with Columbus ('21-22) with 22HR and 91RBI in 154G.

### On the Upswing

After a slow start to his Triple-A career (.183/.299/.402 with 5HR and 11RBI in 25G), **Kahil Watson** hit safely in 16 of his last 18G to end 2025 (.343, 23x67) while reaching base in each of his last 23G (.430OBP since 8/19/25). He was active on the basepaths in that time, collecting 9SB (1CS) and scoring 17 runs. Between Akron and Columbus, he slugged .467 last year (.407SLG in career prior).

### That's a First

**Milan Tolentino** collected 3SB in the last 4G of 2025 (had 3SB in previous 44G) to establish the first 20-20 season in Clipper history (hit 20th HR, a grand slam, with 9G left). Tolentino was the only player in the IL to hit more than 20HR last season and not have a single one come off LHP (last: 7/3/24 with Akron; 4HR, .285SLG in 376AB vs. LHP in his career; 42HR, .415SLG in 1,381AB vs. RHP).

### This Date in Clipper History

3/27/2026

Tonight will be the first ever regular season game played on March 27th.

### Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top, with 2.96 being hit per game in Columbus (108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,404 to 1,346).

### Challenging Times

The Clippers were 132-174 (.431, 2nd worst in the IL) in pitch reviews last season, with batters going 79-117 (.403) and pitchers/catchers going 53-57 (.482). They ran out of challenges in 57G and did not challenge in 13G.

### Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus was 5-5 in extra innings last season, following a 9-loss campaign in 2024 (most losses since 2013, 12). Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 50-33 when playing past regulation (.602, best in the IL; no other team above .580), including 26-16 at home (.619, have won 17 of last 27). Of the 83G to require extra play, 66 have needed only one frame (including seven DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 innings on 9/20/22 at Toledo). From 7/31/19-6/26/21, Columbus played 85 straight within the allotted innings.

### Didn't Add Up

The first half of the 2025 season saw the Clippers finish 12th with a 34-38 record (.472), despite ranking 10th in run differential (+3), 10th in pitching (4.61ERA) and 2nd in defense (.984; ranked 13th in batting, .250). Such a result was the product of a league-high 27 losses by three runs or fewer (22-27, .449, 13th), as they played in the fewest games decided by at least four runs (12-11, .522, 9th). In the second half, they went 19-21 in close games, while going 11-22 in blowouts.

### Hits the Spot

When turning in as many or fewer hits than their opponents last season, the Clippers went 18-64 (.220), coming in 13th out of 20 in the IL. The 2024 season saw them post an IL-worst .185 (12-53) winning percentage in such games. When allowing at least 10 hits last year, Columbus was 7-41 (.146, 20th in the IL; started the season 1-20).

### Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 76 grand slams and 1,872RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

### Not So Fast

On the basepaths, the 2024 Clippers established a franchise record of 200SB, (80% success rate) with four players topping 20 for the first time in club history. As a team, they were successful on 30 consecutive attempts (6/16-6/30/24) and 36 straight tries (7/23-8/7/24, including 8SB on 7/31/24 vs. Syracuse). Last season was a different story entirely, as they finished with the worst stolen base percentage in the IL (72%, 127SB and 49CS).

### Three True Outcomes

While not breaking records last season, the Clipper pitching staff topped 660BB for the third time ever (all in last three years, franchise record of 767BB in 2023) and cleared 1,300K for the fourth time (all in the last four years, franchise record of 1,392K in 2024). The homer rate was down considerably last year, but the three true outcome rate still ended around 39% (the 2024 season saw franchise high of 40.5%; last six seasons have all been at least 37.0%, no seasons above 33.4% prior).

### Return of the Defense

The Clippers were 1st in the IL in defense (.985), a season after turning in their worst fielding percentage (.978) since 2009. They had only two series with more than 5E (8/26-8/31 at Louisville, 9/17-9/21 vs. Omaha), topping out at 3E in a game twice and playing flawlessly 86 times on the year (44-42, .512; 16G errorless streak from 6/20-7/8, longest in the IL over the last 20 years). Behind the plate, Clipper catchers did not have a passed ball from 9/22/24-5/28/25 (53G; 3,949 pitches with men on base between).

### Key to Victory

From 2022-23, Columbus owned the best record in the IL when holding opponents to three runs or fewer, going 95-8 (.922, no other team was above .880). The Clippers were 43-10 in such games in 2024 (.811, 13th in the IL), accumulating four losses by 4/14, and were just 47-10 (.825, 9th) last year, collecting four losses over 14G from 4/23-5/9 (had four losses total in both 2022 and 2023).

### Good Baseball

**Christian Cairo** moved a pair of runners into scoring position with a bunt single on 9/16/25 vs. Omaha and those men came around to score in the win. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 83-21 (.798) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 14-6 (.700) mark last season (went 23-2 in 2018).

### To the End

The Clippers had the 6th most last at bat losses this season (17), after pacing the circuit with 23 in 2024 (tied with Toledo). They also suffered the 4th most walk-off losses (8), watching three in a row slip away at Rochester from 5/29-5/31. The 2024 season saw 41G decided in the last at bat (tied for 2nd most in the IL, one off lead), with Columbus going 18-23 in those contests (t-17th, .439).

### Manager Profile

**Andy Tracy** made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 386-406 (.487), 356-360 with Columbus (.497).
