Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Rorik Maltrud** to the mound tonight, looking to start the series 2-0 (3-1 in last 4G after winning the series opener). The Saints will counter with LHP **Aaron Rozek**. Columbus is 11-17 (.393) versus left handers this year. Rozek has pitched against the Clippers five times in his career, going 0-1 with a 5.66ERA (20.2IP, 24H, 16R, 13ER, 6BB, 16K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus went 4-2 against the Saints in Minnesota last year, on the way to a 9-7 series record, and has won 49 of the last 78 overall opposing the Saints (432-334 run differential; 13 of 29 losses by a single run, only 10 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **Angel Genao** has hit .333 (9x27) with 3HR and 8RBI in 7G against St. Paul in his career (**Kody Huff** has 3HR and 14RBI in 17G).

Outliers

The Clippers reached 50 wins on 7/10, having done so with negative differentials in runs (-18; of eight teams with at least 50 wins, only team in the red, all others at least +30 and averaging +53), homers (-4; only team in the red, all others average +23) and hits (-16, others average +42; St. Paul brings up the rear, -56). In the second half, Columbus is being outscored 120-108 and outthomered 33-24.

Ingle is Back

Cooper Ingle was slumping heading into a two week stint in the Majors, hitting .214/.281/.429 over 14G with the Clippers from 6/5-6/24, before slashing .095/.208/.095 in 7G with Cleveland (6/26-7/8). In 7G since his option, Ingle is 11x28 (.393), drawing 6BB (.500OBP) with 6XBH (1HR, .679SLG). At catcher, Ingle has a 1.289OPS (11HR) in 32G (.651OPS and 2HR in 25G between DH and LF).

Angel Ascendant

Angel Genao saw his 14G hitting streak snapped on Sunday (.480, 24x50 from 6/27-7/18), but rebounded with a multi-hit game last night (16G on base streak, .566OBP). Since 6/18, he owns an 1.131OPS in 25G, drawing 21BB in 113PA (19%; 11BB in 139PA, 8%, in first 35G with Columbus). Genao has only 6K in the last 25G (1K in each of 3G from 6/19-6/21 and 7/4-7/7; 29K in 139PA prior).

Serious Growth

Kody Huff clubbed his 13th homer of the season last night, equaling his total from the last two seasons combined. Having already also established career bests in runs, triples, RBI and walks, Huff is a steal away from breaking a tie for his personal best there and he is 12 hits away from a career high (82 with Akron in 2024). His .896OPS stands as 10th best in the IL (.682OPS in MiLB career prior).

In a Slump

After doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** hit .107 (6x56, all singles) with only 6BB and 3RBI in his next 15G. Last night he doubled, drew a pair of walks and had 2RBI (first multi-RBI game since 5/30, 26G between). His next RBI will be his 150th as a Clipper (38th, **Juan Brito** is at 147). Valera has not homered since 5/19 vs. Louisville (109AB) and has 2HR in his last 48G (171AB, .298SLG).

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 24x75 (.320) in his last 23G, collecting 12XBH (.600SLG) and 15RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 16G, Tolentino has drawn 14BB to 14K (63PA; 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He is one of nine in the IL with at least a dozen HR and SB, along with **Kahlil Watson** (Columbus and Omaha are only teams with two).

Frias Feeling It

Dayan Frias hit a 2-run double on Sunday after watching his 16G on base streak get snapped on Friday (.369OBP from 6/18-7/12). He is hitting .277 (18x65) over his last 19G, after having gone 2x27 (.074) in his previous 15G (.194OBP from 5/6-6/16). Additionally, he has a .431SLG in his last 19G (.220SLG prior). Heading into the All-Star Break, Frias was at season highs with a line of .210/.304/.293.

Rough Relief

Columbus is 2-6 in the last 8G, with the bullpen producing an 8.29ERA over that span (38.0IP, 35ER; at least 4ER on six occasions, had at least 4ER twice in previous 16G). However, the bullpen has blown only one lead in that time (7/9 at Lehigh Valley). During the 5G losing streak, the Clippers led after three innings (7/17 vs. Indy) while trailing after 36 innings (tied for four). They led all nine last night.

This Date in Clipper History

7/22/1984

The Clippers shutout the Pawtucket Red Sox 5-0 thanks to a complete game, 2-hitter from **Jim Deshaies**. Former Boston slugger, **Butch Hobson**, knocked in three Clipper runs. Deshaies would throw a franchise-best four shutouts in 1984, a number that, by itself, still ranks as second on the all-time career list. Deshaies also led the team in ERA (2.39), strikeouts (117) and innings pitched (135.2).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,458 to 1,401).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 140-114 (.551) in pitch reviews, with batters going 74-73 (.503) and pitchers/catchers going 66-41 (.617). They have run out of challenges in 40G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 812, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 115 through 96G (on pace for 178SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 31CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (48; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 149 runs while crafting a .920OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 76 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +73 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 230-143 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,961RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.36 through the first 96G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 185HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 52G this season (31-21, .596), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Memphis, Syracuse and Worcester) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (25, Memphis has 27). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 98G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-50 (.490, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 437-451 (.492), 407-405 with Columbus (.501).

June Swoon:

In his first 10G of the year (March-May), Maltud gave up 15ER in 50.2IP (2.66ERA), holding the opposition to a .195 average (38x186, 4HR). In 5G during June, he gave up 15ER in 17.1IP (7.79ERA), while opposing hitters batted .301 (22x73, 1HR). Maltud has rebounded in 3G of July with 4ER in 14.0IP (2.57ERA), but he has surrendered 3HR in 55AB (all solo).

Undecided:

Among 48 pitchers in the IL with at least 12GS, Maltud is the only one that has yet to take a loss and his troika of wins makes him the only starter with just three decisions (had one in his first 13GS). Despite a 3.60ERA as a starter and run support of 5.8 per game, Maltud has left with the lead only seven times because the offense is averaging 2.4 runs while he is the pitcher of record, including 10G with two runs or fewer (4G with zero runs).

Efficiency is Key:

Through 83 innings started in 18G, Maltud has retired the side with fewer than 10 pitches on 12 occasions, including a 4-pitch inning on 4/3 vs. Indianapolis, while turning in 16 innings of more than 20. He has hit 30+ thrice, thanks to an 11-pitch battle vs. Iowa's **Pedro Ramirez** on 4/17 (walk, 34 in the inning) and a 14-pitch skirmish with Buffalo's **Yohendrick Pinango** on 4/23 (groundout, 30 total). He ranks 3rd in the IL with 15.2 pitches per inning.

Among the Leader Beans:

Entering today's game, Maltud is 4th in the IL with a 3.73ERA (over half a run better than all other Clipper starters with at least 10GS). From his quality start win on 4/11 at Worcester through his quality start on 5/25 at Toledo, he crafted the 2nd best ERA in the IL, at 2.14ERA (42.0IP, 10ER). Additionally, Maltud's 0.95WHIP in that time ranked 2nd best (1.22WHIP on the season places 4th).

Pitch to Contact:

Maltud's Triple-A debut on 3/28 at Iowa was the 44th game of his career and marked his 37th consecutive start (reached 41GS before relief appearance on 4/30 vs. Toledo, all 6G in relief have come on starter's rest and been at least 3.0IP). He did not punch out any Cubs in that game (15BF), marking his second straight game without a strikeout (37BFwith 0K from, 9/10/25-4/3/26; had at least 1K in all 42G prior). Among 112 pitchers in the IL that have at least 190BF this year, Maltud has the 17th best walk rate (7.3%; 25BB to 342BF) and the 54th best strikeout rate (21.6%, 74K; had worst rate, 11.9%, prior to 62K in last 13G).

In Relief:

Maltud has pitched twice in relief this season (previous 5G out of the bullpen came among first 7G as a pro), piggybacking **Trenton Denholm** on 4/30 vs. Toledo (3.0IP, 40 pitches) and **Daniel Espino** on 6/2 vs. Omaha (4.0IP, 81 pitches). He has registered a 5.14ERA out of the bullpen (7.0IP, 11H, 4R, 4ER, 2BB, 13K).
