TODAY'S GAME: The Aviators hold a 3-1 series lead after a 7-6 win last night ... Albuquerque needs to win the final two games of the series to avoid their eighth series loss of the year, sixth on the road and fourth-straight ... Bradley Blalock is expected to start for the Isotopes while Ken Waldichuk is slated to toe the rubber for the Aviators.

TOUGH STRETCH: With the loss yesterday, the Isotopes are 5-16 in their last 21 games after winning eight of 10 from May 23-June 3.

@ LAS VEGAS: Since 2018, Albuquerque is 13-28 in Las Vegas and have not won a series or more than two games in a set since July 13-16, 2017, when they won three of four ... With a victory today, the Aviators would clinch their fifth consecutive overall series victory over Albuquerque.

ONE-RUN GAMES: The Isotopes dropped to 12-13 in one-run games, with this being their first such contest involved in since June 14 vs. Oklahoma City, an 8-7 defeat.

RUNS ALLOWED: Las Vegas has produced 40 runs through four games this week, Albuquerque's sixth occassion allowing at least 40 tallies in a series (also: vs. ELP, at RNO, vs. TAC, at ELP, at TAC). Their most was when they lost four of six games to Reno from April 22-27, relenting 51 runs.

-Over the club's last seven games, they have allowed 67 runs—the most in all of MiLB during that span.

TWO-RUN SAC FLY: The last occurrence of a two-run sacrifice fly prior to last night for the Isotopes had been Aug. 23, 2013 against Nashville, when Elian Herrera and Tony Gwynn Jr. both scored after Nick Buss hit a drive to the hill in center field. Sounds center fielder Kentrail Davis was able to make the catch falling down, before Herrera and Gwynn came across.

FREE PASSES: Albuquerque drew one walk last night, their 13th game with one or fewer in 2025. Five of the 13 instances have taken place during this road trip, which has 10 contests in the books

GIDP: The Isotopes turned at least three double plays in a game for the sixth time this year yesterday (last: June 19 at Tacoma, four)

LEADOFF DINGER: Rehabbing Athletics infielder Zack Gelof homered to start the bottom of the first, the fourth leadoff homer of 2025 against Albuquerque and first that was not an Oklahoma City player (Esteury Ruiz – May 7, James Outman - June 12-13).

KESTDADDY: Keston Hiura went 3-for-3 with a walk yesterday to extend his on-base streak at Triple-A to 29 games, a season-high by an Isotope, the longest in the PCL and the fourth-longest active streak in MiLB.

-Slashing .336/.437/.692 with nine doubles, one triple, nine homers, 25 RBI, 13 walks and six hit-by-pitches during the stretch. Has at least one hit in 25 of 29 games ... Longest by Isotope since Sam Hilliard's 32-game streak from June 11, 2024-May 6, 2025.

-Recorded three hits last night for the second time this season (also: May 16 vs. Tacoma), his 14th multi-hit performance in 2025.

MILLER TIME: Owen Miller went 1-for-4 last night to extend his on-base streak to 21 games, fourth-longest active streak in the PCL. Slashing .341/.364/.516 with eight doubles, one triple, two homers, eight RBI and four walks. Has a hit in 20 of 21 games during streak ... Eight of his 12 doubles on the year have come since June 1.

VEEN; VEEN: Zac Veen recorded four hits last night, the last Isotope to produce back-to-back four-hit games was Josh Fuentes on May 9-10, 2018 at Reno ... Has hits in eight of his last nine plate appearances ... Has recorded as many hits in his last two games as the previous 13 contests at Triple-A combined. Additionally, Friday was his third game in 2025 with two doubles (also: April 5 vs. Salt Lake, May 6 at Oklahoma City).

-Has a hit in six-straight contests, slashing .522/.538/.783 with three doubles, one homer and four RBI (12x23).

YF: Yanquiel Fernandez has a hit in 11 of his last 13 contests. During stretch is slashing .396/.411/.642 with four doubles, three homers and 12 RBI.

-Since May 16 (27 games), is slashing .374/.419/.579 with 10 doubles, four homers and 18 RBI.

IT'S DREW: Drew Romo launched a solo homer last night, his second of the year. It was only his seventh extra-base hit in 78 at-bats in Triple-A this season.

AMADOR: Adael Amador swatted his sixth homer of the year last night ... It was his first extra-base hit since a homer on June 20 at Taroma

PCL LEADERBOARD: Warming Bernabel is 3rd in average (.323) ...Sterlin Thompson is T-2nd in triples (5).

-Has a hit in six three doubles, or rifice

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

AARON MUNOZ: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
